OAKLAND ATHLETICS (67-48) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (40-75)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have won seven straight and 11 of the last 13 games to improve to a season-high 19 games over .500 at 67-48 (.583)...that is the fourth best record in the American League and seventh best in the majors... are 8-1 (.889) in August, which is the best record in the majors...are in second place in the AL West for the 49th consecutive day (dating back to June 21) and trail first place Houston by 1½ games...that is the closest the A's have been to first place in the West since July 1 when they were also 1½ back... were ½-game back on June 30...are in first place in the AL Wild Card, two games ahead of the second Wild Card (Red Sox) and four games ahead of the third place team (Yankees)...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 49 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in 6fth

A RECORD SETTING DAY: The A's shutout Cleveland 17-0 yesterday for the largest margin of victory in a shutout in Athletics history...the previous mark was 16-0 six times (three in Oakland, one in Kansas City, two in Philadelphia), most recently on June 1, 2018 at Kansas City...Matt Chapman walked five times to tie the Athletics record for walks in a game (eighth time, last: Mark McGwire vs. Kansas City, April 26, 1997).

SEVEN-GAME WINNING STREAK: The A's have a seven-game winning streak, which matches their second longest winning streak of the season (June 11-18)...the season high is 13 (April 9-24)...this is the sixth time in Oakland history the A's have at least three winning streaks of seven or more games in one season (1971, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2005)...have outscored the opposition 54-17 during the streak...are batting .286 (70-for-245) with 16 doubles, 10 home runs, 35 walks, 11 hit by pitches (2 sf, .397 on-base percentage) and seven stolen bases...have a 2.01 ERA (15 er in 67.0 ip) and .179 (41-for-229) opponents batting average.

PITCHING: The A's had their third shutout in the last 12 game yesterday and their 11th of the season, which is tied with the Blue Jays for the most in the American League...have a 2.19 ERA (27 er in 111.0 ip) over the last 12 games and now have a 3.59 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...also have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.376), the second lowest OPS (.674) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.298)...have issued the fewest walks (309), allowed the fewest home runs (117) and averaged the fewest pitches per inning (15.8).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 7-2 with a 2.51 ERA (21 er in 75.1 ip) and .207 (56-for-271) opponents batting average over the last 13 games...are 45-37 with a 3.61 ERA (265 er in 660.2 ip) overall...are tied for second in the American League in wins, rank third in ERA and fourth in opponents OPS (.682)...lead the majors in innings pitched (660.2) and are tied for third in complete games (3)...have used just eight starting pitchers, which is tied with the Reds and Astros for second fewest in the majors (Red Sox, 6).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has a 1.73 ERA (17 er in 88.1 ip) and .177 (55-for-310) opponents batting average over the last 28 games dating back to July 7...has a 3.55 ERA overall, which is second lowest in the American League... also has the second lowest opponents OPS (.660)...has converted each of its six save opportunities dating back to July 19 and is 29-for-44 (65.9%) for the season, which is the fifth best save percentage in the AL...is tied for fifth in saves...has 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.426) and the third highest batting average (.244).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .283 (90-for-318) in August, which is second best in the majors (Rockies, .294)...have the highest on-base percentage (.386) and fewest strikeouts (63) in the majors this month, are tied for the lead in stolen bases (14) and rank third in OPS (.851)...are now batting .237 overall, which is fifth lowest in the American League but one point shy of the season high of .238 (last on June 25)...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 23 times in the last 22 games and 73 times for the season, which is the most in the AL, third most in the majors and fourth most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019, 76 in 2018)...rank third in the AL in stolen base percentage (81.9%), fourth in fewest grounded into double plays (70), tied for fourth in sacrifice flies (35) and fifth in walks (396) and sacrifice hits (14)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (24), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (108), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in RBI (17) and extra base hits (6) and tied for second in doubles (3).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one error in each of the last four games but have just 49 for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to the Astros (48)...are on pace for 69 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...are tied for the second few-

est outfield assists in the American League (10) and have the fourth fewest double plays (85).

CLOSE CALLS AND NOT SO CLOSE: Five of the A's seven wins during the current winning streak have been by three or more runs...are 42-21 (.667) in games decided by three runs or more compared to 25-27 (.481) in games decided by two runs or fewer... are 17-19 (.472) in one-run games, which includes 11-7 at home and 6-12 on the road...lead the American League in one-run losses (19) and are tied for second in games (36)...have played three extra inning games in the last five games and have a five-game winning streak in extra inning contests...are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with the Red Sox for the second best record in the American League (Mariners, 10-4/.714)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 15-7 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Colorado for the most walk-off wins in the majors (10) and have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-0 on this 10-game road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (three games) and Chicago-AL (four games)...have a four-game road winning streak and are now 33-23 (.589) in away games, which is the second best record in the American League...this is the A's second consecutive 10-game road trip as they went 5-5 on the last trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-1)...this trip concludes a stretch that began on July 6 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...after this trip, the A's have 22 home games and 18 road games remaining...went 4-1 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (3-0) and have won six of their last seven home games...are 34-25 (.576) at home.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's have a 3.45 ERA (187 er in 487.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...are batting .247 (481-for-1947) with a .740 OPS on the road compared to .226 with a .707 OPS at home...have the third best road batting average and fourth best road OPS in the AL but the second lowest home batting average and third lowest home OPS.

FRIDAY THE 13th: The A's have a 20-26 record on Friday the 13th since moving to Oakland in 1968...are 12-10 on the road and 8-16 at home...the A's last Friday the 13th game was a 14-9 win at Texas in September of 2019...are 2-3 against the Rangers on Friday the 13th.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 8-5...are 4-2 in Oakland and 4-3 in Texas...have a five-game winning streak...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their fourth consecutive season series victory over the Rangers, which is just the second time the A's have won four consecutive season series against Texas (2002-05)...are 52-28 (.650) against the Rangers over the last five years...are 22-9 (.710) dating back to July 27, 2019, including 11-3 (.786) in Oakland...are 393-381 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 207-178 in Oakland and 186-203 in Texas...are 8-6 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 490-465 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks third among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.436), fifth in batting average (.152), on-base percentage (.221) and slugging percentage (.215) and seventh in ERA (1.76)...Starling Marte is batting a ML leading .436 (41-for-94) since the All-Star Break...also leads the majors in steals since the break (14) and ranks third in on-base percentage (.486)...Matt Olson ranks third in the American League in OPS (.941), fourth in slugging percentage (.566), tied for fourth in home runs (28) and extra base hits (56), sixth in on-base percentage (.376), tied for seventh in doubles (28), eighth in RBI (76), tied for ninth in walks (56) and tied for 10th in runs (73)...Sergio Romo has not allowed a run in his last 17 games dating back to June 29 (17.2 ip, 3 h, 4 bb, 19 so) and opponents are 3-for-53 (.057) over that span...Lou Trivino has converted each of his last 12 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 0.93 ERA (3 er in 29.0 ip) and .188 (19-for-101) opponents batting average in 28 games over that span.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1977 Mitchell Page steals his 26th consecutive base without being caught, setting an American League record...the record comes to an end two days later when he is picked off by Cleveland's Rick Waits...in 1989 Dave Parker's first inning home run off California's Bert Blyleven is the 3000th home run in Oakland A's history...in 2005 Dennis Eckersley becomes the fourth player in Oakland history to have his number retired when the A's honor him by retiring number 43.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (8-10, 3.45 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 5-3 with a 2.82 ERA (21 er in 67.0 ip) and four home runs allowed over his last 11 starts dating back to June 5 after going 3-7 with a 4.12 ERA and seven home runs over his first 11 starts...ranks fifth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.365) and sixth in ERA (3.45) and OPS (.662) but is tied for fifth in most losses (10)...is the first A's pitcher to lose 10 games since 2017 when they had three (Gossett, 11; Manaea and Cotton. 10).

DON'T WALK: Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 22 starts, which matches the second longest such streak by a starting pitcher in Oakland history (last: Colon, June 17, 2012-June 5, 2013)...the longest is 26 by Gil Hereida from April 10-Aug. 28, 1999...has issued just 24 free passes in 130.1 innings, an average of 1.66 walks per nine innings...that is the second lowest mark in the American League...ranks 10th in the AL in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.92) but is averaging the fourth fewest strikeouts per nine innings (6.49)... is averaging 14.4 pitches per inning, which are the fewest in the majors (Wainwright, STL 14.7)...has walked just 38 batters in 175.2 career innings (1.95 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed 11 home runs in 130.1 innings and his average of 0.76 home runs per nine innings is third lowest in the American League...eight of the 11 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots... eight have come at home...has hit nine batters, which is tied for fourth most in the AL...opponents are hitting .316 (31-for-98) with runners in scoring position, which is third highest in the AL...has a .236 (45-for-191) opponents average the first time through the order, .254 (46-for-181) the second time and .273 (36-for-132) after that.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 7-3 with a 2.27 ERA (20 er in 79.1 ip) in 13 starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-6 with a 5.01 ERA (26 er in 46.2 ip) in eight starts on four days rest...eight of the 11 home runs he has allowed have come on four days rest.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 3-8 with a 5.23 ERA (38 er in 65.1 ip) and .287 (76-for-265) opponents batting average in 12 starts against American League West competition, 5-2 with a 1.66 ERA (12 er in 65.0 ip) and .213 (51-for-239) opponents average in 10 starts against everyone else...his eight intradivision losses are the most in the majors and the most by an A's pitcher since Bobby Witt went 8-8 in 1993...the last A's pitcher with more is Mike Moore, who was 4-9 against the West in 1990...his 5.23 intradivision ERA is third highest in the majors.

RUN SUPPORT: Received 12 runs of support in his last start after getting a comined 10 runs of support over his previous five starts...has received two runs of support or fewer in five of his last 11 starts...is 8-1 in 11 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-9 in 11 starts with support of two runs or fewer.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and lost each of his first two starts, allowing four runs in each contest for a 7.45 ERA...went 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA over his first two starts on April 3 and 8, both against Houston...did not pitch again until April 17 against Detroit when he combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in a 7-0 win... it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...that began a four-start stretch where he went 3-1 with a 1.42 ERA and .232 opponents batting average through May 4...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his start against the Tigers and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...lost on April 28 at Tampa Bay but then picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102) against the Blue Jays...then went 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA and .284 opponents batting average over his next five starts from May 9 to 30...the losing streak matched his career high (also May 22, 2019-April 8, 2021)...left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of three times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (June 11 vs. Kansas City, July 9 at Texas)...allowed a season-high five runs in an 8-4 loss to Houston on May 20...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings of work in a 4-3 loss to Seattle on May 25...went 1-4 with a 4.46 ERA in six starts in May...tied for second in the American League in losses in May...then compiled a 3-0 record and a 2.64 ERA in five starts in the month of June...the ERA was fourth lowest in the American League and the three-game winning streak was the longest of his career...allowed a run in the first inning on June 5 at Colorado and did not allow another run until the seventh inning of his next start on June 11 against Kansas City for a career-high tying 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and did not allow a run in a 6-2 win at San Francisco on June 27...did not allow a run over the first three innings of his next start on July 3 against Boston for another 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters (13th time, last: Bassitt, April 29, 2021 at Tampa Bay) in a 3-2 loss at Texas on July 9...tossed 4.0 innings in a 4-3 loss at Seattle on July 25...it was the shortest

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 12-3 victory over Texas last Saturday in Oakland...allowed a two-run home run to Garcia in the first inning but then shut out the Rangers on one hit and two walks over his final six innings of work...was relieved by Wendelken to star the eighth inning with a 12-2 lead

2020 RECAP: Had two stints with Philadelphia and was 0-1 with a 17.18 ERA in three relief appearances...opponents went 11-for-21 (.524) but he walked just one and struck out four in 3.2 innings...allowed a .438 (7-for-16) average against right-handed hitters compared to .800 (4-for-5) against left-handers...was 2-0 with a 4.50 ERA in four spring training appearances... was optioned to Lehigh Valley March 26 but was recalled on July 23 and was on the Phillies Opening Day roster...was optioned to Philadelphia's alternate site on Aug. 9, recalled for a second time Aug. 20, pitched the next day and was optioned again on Aug. 22...did not pitch the remainder of the season.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP James Kaprielian (6-4, 3.22 ERA): Was reinstated from the injured list last Sunday and started and won that day against the Rangers, a 6-3 A's win (6.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...was 5-4 with a 3.24 ERA in 13 starts when he was placed on the 10-day IL July 31 retroactive to July 28 with a right shoulder impingement...missed just one start and did not have a rehab assignment...is scheduled to make the 15th start of his career, his fifth against Texas...it will be his fifth start against the Rangers in his last eight games... is 1-1 with a 3.52 ERA (23.0 ip, 18 h, 9 r, 9 er, 8 bb, 18 so, 5 hr) in four career rookies in wins (6), ranks seventh in innings pitched (78.1) and eighth in strikeouts (83) and games started (14)...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, his 3.22 ERA is the second lowest in the AL...has the third lowest opponents batting average (.209)

- Retired the side in order in the 10th inning Tuesday night at Cleveland for his fourth career save, his first since Sept. 27, 2020 against the White Sox.
- Was acquired from the Cubs on July 26 and has not allowed a run in seven games with the A's (6.2 ip, 3 h, 0 bb, 8 so).
- Has not allowed a run in 33 of his last 34 appearances (3 er in 31.0 ip, 0.88 ERA) and 46 of 50 overall.
