## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (67-49) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (41-75)

SATURDAY, AUGUST 14, 2021 — GLOBE LIFE FIELD — 6:05 CDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's snapped a seven-game winning streak last night and have won 11 of the last 14 games...are 18 games over .500 which is one shy of the season...have the fourth best record in the American League and seventh best in the majors...are 8-2 (.800) in August, which is the second best record in the majors (San Francisco; 10-2, .833)...are in second place in the AL West for the 50th consecutive day (dating back to June 21) and trail first place Houston by 2½ games...were ½-game back on June 30...are in first place in the AL Wild Card, one game ahead of the second Wild Card (Red Sox) and 3 ½ games ahead of the third place team (Yankees)...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 50 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

**SEVEN-GAME WINNING STREAK SNAPPED:** The A's snapped a seven-game winning streak last night, which matches their second longest winning streak of the season (June 11-18)...the season high is 13 (April 9-24)...was the sixth time in Oakland history the A's have at least three winning streaks of seven or more games in one season (1971, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2005)...out-scored the opposition 54-17 during the streak...batted .286 (70-for-245) with 16 doubles, 10 home runs, 35 walks, 11 hit by pitches (2 sf, .397 on-base percentage) and seven stolen bases...had a 2.01 ERA (15 er in 67.0 ip) and .179 (41-for-229) opponents batting average.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** This three-game series with Texas concludes a stretch that began on July 19 where the A's were scheduled to play 13 of 17 games against American League West teams...are 8-5 against the West during the stretch...are now 27-25 (.519) against AL West competition overall compared to 36-24 (.600) against all other teams...beginning Tuesday, the A's are scheduled to play 26 of their next 34 games against non-division foes before concluding the season with 16 straight games against the American League West.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .281 (99-for-352) in August, which is second best in the majors (Rockies, .295)...have the highest on-base percentage (.383) and fewest strikeouts (72) in the majors this month, are tied for the lead in stolen bases (14) and rank third in OPS (.852)...they are now batting .237 overall, which is sixth lowest in the American League but one point shy of the season high of .238 (last on June 25)...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 23 times in the last 23 games and 73 times overall for the season, which is the most in the AL, third most in the majors and fourth most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019, 76 in 2018)...rank third in the AL in stolen base percentage (81.9%), tied for fourth in fewest grounded into double plays (71), and fifth in sacrifice files (35), walks (401), and sacrifice hits (14)...Oakland pinch hitters lead the American League in hits (24), sacrifice files (3) and plate appearances (108), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in RBI (17) and extra base hits (6) and are tied for second in doubles (3).

**PITCHING:** The A's surrendered eight runs (six earned) last night...snaps a seven-game streak during which they surrendered four or fewer runs per game...had their third shutoout in the previous 12 games on Thursday and their 11th of the season, which is tied with the Blue Jays for the most in the American League...have a 2.50 ERA (33 er in 119.0 ip) over the last 13 games and now have a 3.61 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...also have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.377), the third lowest OPS (.676) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.299)...have issued the fewest walks (312), allowed the fewest home runs (119) and averaged the fewest pitches per inning (15.9).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 7-3 with a 2.69 ERA (24 er in 80.1 ip) and .217 (64-for-295) opponents batting average over the last 14 contests...are 45-38 with a 3.62 ERA (268 er in 665.2 ip) overall...are tied for second in the American League in wins, rank third in ERA and are fourth in opponents OPS (.682)...lead the majors in innings pitched (665.2) and are tied for third in complete games (3)...have used just eight starting pitchers, which is tied with the Reds and Astros for second fewest in the majors (Red Sox, 6).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has a 1.97 ERA (20 er in 91.1 ip) and .180 (58-for-322) opponents batting average over the last 29 games dating back to July 7...has a 3.59 ERA overall, which is second lowest in the American League... also has the second lowest opponents OPS (.664)...has converted six of its seven save opportunities dating back to July 19 and is 29-for-45 (64.4%) for the season, which is the fifth best save percentage in the American League... is tied for sixth in saves...has 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's committed a season-high three errors last night and have committed at least one error in each of the last five games but have just 52 for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the majors to the Astros (48)...are on pace for 73 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...are tied for the second fewest outfield assists in the American League (10) and are tied for the fifth fewest double plays (86).

**CLOSE CALLS AND NOT SO CLOSE:** The A's lost by two runs last night...five of the A's seven wins during the recently snapped winning streak have been by three or more runs...are 42-21 (.667) in games decided by three runs or more compared to 25-28 (.472) in games decided by two runs or fewer... are 17-19 (.472) in one-run games, which includes 11-7 at home and 6-12 on the road...lead the American League in one-run losses (19) and are tied for second in games (36)...have played three extra inning games in the last six games and have a five-game winning streak in extra inning contests...are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with the Red Sox for the second best record in the American League (Mariners, 10-4/.714)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 15-7 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Colorado for the most walk-off wins in the majors (10) and have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 3-1 on this 10-game road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (1-0) and Chicago-AL (four games)...are 4-1 over their last five road games and are now 33-24 (.579) in away games...this is the A's second consecutive 10-game road trip as they went 5-5 on the last trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-1)...this trip concludes a stretch that began on July 6 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...after this trip, the A's have 22 home games and 18 road games remaining...went 4-1 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (3-0) and have won six of their last seven home games...are 34-25 (.576) at home.

**HOME AND AWAY SPLITS:** The A's have a 3.50 ERA (193 er in 495.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...are batting .247 (901-for-1981) with a .742 OPS on the road compared to .226 with a .707 OPS at home...have the third best road batting average and fourth best road OPS in the AL but the second lowest home batting average and third lowest home OPS.

**A's vs. RANGERS:** The A's lead the season series, 8-6...are 4-2 in Oakland and 4-4 in Texas...are 5-1 over the last six games...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their fourth consecutive season series victory over the Rangers, which is just the second time the A's have won four consecutive season series against Texas (2002-05)...are 52-29 (.642) against the Rangers over the last five years...are 22-10 (.688) dating back to July 27, 2019, including 11-3 (.786) in Oakland...are 393-382 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 207-178 in Oakland and 186-204 in Texas...are 8-7 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 490-466 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Starling Marte is batting a ML leading .424 (42-for-99) since the All-Star Break...also leads the majors in steals since the break (14) and ranks third in on-base percentage (.472)...*Matt Olson* ranks third in the American League in OPS (.949) and slugging percentage (.571), tied for third in home runs (29), fourth in extra base hits (57), sixth in on-base percentage (.378), tied for seventh in doubles (28), tied for sixth in RBI (77), tied for eighth in walks (58) and tied for eighth in runs (74)...*Lou Trivino* has converted each of his last 12 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 0.93 ERA (3 er in 29.0 ip) and .188 (19-for-101) opponents batting average in 28 games over that span.

#### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1933** Jimmie Foxx hits for the cycle and drives in nine runs in the A's 11-5 win over Cleveland...in **1987** Mark McGwire breaks the Major League rookie home run record with his 39th of the season, a two-run shot in the sixth inning of the A's 7-6 win at California...he would go on to hit what was then an Oakland record 49 round trippers...in **2020** the A's trail at San Francisco 7-2 entering the ninth inning but come back to win 8-7 in 10 innnings...Stephen Piscotty hits a game-tying grand slam in a five-run ninth and Mark Canha has a sacrifice fly in the 10th.

### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (6-4, 3.22 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was reinstated from the injured list last Sunday and started and won that day against the Rangers, allowing two runs on three hits in 6.0 innings...was 5-4 with a 3.24 ERA in 13 starts when he was placed on the 10-day IL July 31 retroactive to July 28 with a right shoulder impingement... missed just one start and did not have a rehab assignment...began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and was recalled by the A's on May 12.

**ROOKIE LEADERS:** Ranks seventh among American League rookies in innings pitched (78.1), tied for sixth in wins (6), and is eighth in strikeouts (83) and in games started (14)...based on a minimum of 70.0 innings pitched, his 3.22 ERA is the lowest in the AL and second lowest in the majors...has the second lowest opponents batting average in the AL (.209).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has a .209 opponents batting average, which is eighth lowest among American League pitchers with 70 or more innings...that includes a mark of .179 (27-for-151) with a .561 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .243 (33-for-136) with a .787 OPS against left-handers... has issued 21 of his 29 walks to lefties...has allowed a .173 (9-for-52) batting average with runners in scoring position...eight of the 11 home runs he has surrendered have been solo shots...has a .139 (16-for-115) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .291 (32-for-110) the second time and .194 (12-for-62) after that...has allowed four of his 11 home runs to the opponents clean-up hitter but has held the five hitter to a .061 (2-for-33) batting average.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 2-2 with a 4.91 ERA (22 er in 40.1 ip) and .245 (37-for-151) opponents batting average in eight starts on the road compared to 4-2 with a 1.42 ERA (6 er in 38.0 ip) and .169 (23-for-136) opponents average in six starts at home...has yielded nine of his 11 home runs on the road for an .815 OPS...has a .509 opponents OPS in Oakland.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 4-2 with a 2.17 ERA (11 er in 45.2 ip) and .190 (31-for-163) opponents batting average in eight starts during the day compared to 2-2 with a 4.68 ERA (17 er in 32.2 ip) and .234 (29-for-124) opponents average in six starts at night...has yielded eight of his 11 home runs at night.

**BY INNING:** Has not allowed a run in the second inning (14.0 ip) and has a 1.29 ERA (4 er in 28.0 ip) and .153 (15-for-98) opponents batting average over the first two innings of a game...has a 4.29 ERA (24 er in 50.1 ip) and .238 (45-for-189) opponents average from the third inning on.

*THIS AND THAT:* Has allowed two runs or fewer in 10 of his 14 starts and five hits or fewer 12 times...has left with the lead in three of his four no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the A's are 8-6 (.571) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and went 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA in one start...was the Aviators Opening Day starter on May 6 at Las Vegas and was the losing pitcher in an 8-1 loss to Sacramento (4.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 0 hr, 76 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and made his first Major League start that day at Boston...allowed a run on four hits in 5.0 innings to earn his first ML win in the A's 4-1 victory over the Red Sox...would go 4-1 with a 2.84 ERA and .182 opponents batting average over his first seven starts through June 18...struck out nine batters in 5.2 innings in his second start on May 21 at Los Angeles (AL) but had a no decision in an 8-4 A's win...left with a 3-2 lead and two outs in the bottom of the sixth but Petit allowed a run for the blown save...it was the first of three starts in which he left with the lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (June 23 at Texas and July 10 at Texas)...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings May 26 against Seattle for his second win...that matched his longest outing as a professional... also tossed 7.0 innings for Single-A Tampa at Charlotte on April 16, 2016, his second professional appearance...logged a season-low 3.2 innings May 31 at Seattle but had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss...was charged with the first loss of his career when he allowed two runs in 5.0 innings on June 6 at Colorado, a 3-1 A's loss...pitched 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits on June 12 to defeat Kansas City 11-2...walked a career-high four...tossed 105 pitches, which were his most as a professional, in a 5-4 loss to Texas on June 29...took the loss that day and went 0-2 despite a 3.00 ERA over his final three starts before the All-Star Break...struck out a career-high 10 batters in a career-high tying 7.0 innings on July 4 against Boston but was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss...it was the first 10-strikeout game by an A's rookie since Chris Bassitt on Aug. 9, 2015 against Houston (also 10)...issued a career-high tying four walks in 5.0 innings in a no decision at Texas on July 10...combined with Romo, Moll and Guerra on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Los Angeles (AL) on July 20 as part of a career-high 12.0-inning scoreless streak from July 10 to 27...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high seven hits in 4.1 innings in a 7-4 loss at San Diego on July 27...it snapped a career-opening 14-game streak of 1.2 innings or more and six hits or fewer, which was the longest such streak in Athletics history...singled off Chris Paddack in the third inning for his first Major League hit...was placed on the 10-day injured list July 31 retroactive to July 28 with a right shoulder

*LAST START:* He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 victory over Texas last Sunday in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Lowe in the first inning but the A's came back with three runs in the bottom of the first...retired 11 in a row following the Lowe double and would not allow another run until Kiner-Falefa tripled to lead off the sixth and scored on a Hernandez sacrifice fly...was relieved by Chafin to start the seventh with the A's leading 6-2.

the first no decision came in the A's 5-3 loss at Texas on June 23...blanked the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first four innings before allowing a RBI double to Heim with two outs in the fifth...also surrendered a solo home run to Garcia in the sixth to give Texas a 2-0 lead...Oakland then scored three times in the seventh and he was relieved by Petit to start the bottom of the seventh...Petit allowed two runs for the blown save...then took the loss in a 5-4 A's loss in Oakland on June 29...tossed 105 pitches, which were his most as a professional...the A's scored a run in the first and he retired 11 of the first 12 batters before allowing a two-out solo home run to Gallo in the fourth...Oakland regained the lead with a run in the bottom of the fourth but he allowed a RBI double to Heim in the sixth and another solo home run to Gallo in the sixth...had a no decision in the A's 8-4, 11-inning win at Texas on July 10...issued a career-high tying four walks in 5.0 innings... allowed back-to-back solo home runs to Garcia and Gallo in the first inning but the A's came back with two in the second and one in the fourth...did not allow a run over his final four innings of work and was relieved by Guerra to start the sixth inning with the A's leading 3-2...Diekman allowed a run in the eighth for the blown save...the win came in a 6-3 decision in his last start (see last start above)

**2020 RECAP:** Made his Major League debut and had two relief appearances over five stints with Oakland...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average...allowed two home runs in 3.2 innings, walked two and struck out four...did not pitch during his first stint...joined the club a second time Aug. 16 and made his ML debut that day at San Francisco (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...was recalled as the 29th man for doubleheaders on Sept. 8 and Sept. 14 but did not pitch...recalled for his fifth stint on Sept. 24 and made one appearance in the second game of the Sept. 26 doubleheader against Seattle (1.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...was on the Taxi Squad for the postseason...was rated as the A's number 10 prospect by *Baseball America* following the season.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (8-7, 3.43 ERA): Is 2-5 with a 4.18 ERA over his last nine starts dating back to June 20 after going 6-2 with a 2.99 ERA over his first 14 starts...has received a total of four runs of support in his five losses over his last nine starts...the A's are 7-1 in his no decisions and are 15-8 (.652) in his starting assignments...ranks seventh in the American League in ERA (3.43), eighth in strikeouts (143), tied for fourth in games started (23) and 10th in opponents OPS (.678), ninth in slugging percentage (.381), and 11th in innings pitched (128.2)...has held left-handed hitters to a .180 batting average, which is third lowest in the AL...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 A's win in 10 innings last Tuesday at Cleveland (1.2 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 2 so)...is 7-3 with a 3.65 ERA (79.0 ip, 78 h, 36 r, 32 er, 17 bb, 71 so, 11 hr) in 14 career starts against Texas...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, an 8-3 A's loss in Oakland on July 1 (5.0 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 6 so).

#### **39 LHP ANDREW CHAFIN**

#### Last Outing: 8/10 at Cleveland (S, 1.0 ip, 1 so) Saves/Opportunities: 1-2

Inherited Runners/Scored: 22/7 First Hitters: 7-48 (2 bb)

- Retired the side in order in the 10th inning Tuesday night at Cleveland for his fourth career save, his first since Sept. 27, 2020 against the White Sox.
- Was acquired from the Cubs on July 26 and has not allowed a run in seven games with the A's (6.2 ip, 3 h, 0 bb, 8 so).
- Has not allowed a run in 33 of his last 34 appearances (3 er in 31.0 ip, 0.88 ERA) and 46 of 50 overall.
- Ranks third among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.436), fourth in on-base percentage (.221), fifth in batting average (.152) and slugging percentage (.215), and eighth in ERA (1.76).
