



OAKLAND ATHLETICS (67-49) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (41-75)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's snapped a seven-game winning streak last night and have won 11 of the last 14 games...are 18 games over .500 which is one shy of the season...have the fourth best record in the American League and seventh best in the majors...are 8-2 (.800) in August, which is the second best record in the majors (San Francisco; 10-2, .833)...are in second place in the AL West for the 50th consecutive day (dating back to June 21) and trail first place Houston by 2½ games...were ½-game back on June 30...are in first place in the AL Wild Card, one game ahead of the second Wild Card (Red Sox) and 3 ½ games ahead of the third place team (Yankees)...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 50 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

SEVEN-GAME WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: The A's snapped a seven-game winning streak last night, which matches their second longest winning streak of the season (June 11-18)...the season high is 13 (April 9-24)...was the sixth time in Oakland history the A's have at least three winning streaks of seven or more games in one season (1971, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2005)...outscored the opposition 54-17 during the streak...batted .286 (70-for-245) with 16 doubles, 10 home runs, 35 walks, 11 hit by pitches (2 sf, .397 on-base percentage) and seven stolen bases...had a 2.01 ERA (15 er in 67.0 ip) and .179 (41-for-229) opponents batting average.

AGAINST THE WEST: This three-game series with Texas concludes a stretch that began on July 19 where the A's were scheduled to play 13 of 17 games against American League West teams...are 8-5 against the West during the stretch...are now 27-25 (.519) against AL West competition overall compared to 36-24 (.600) against all other teams...beginning Tuesday, the A's are scheduled to play 26 of their next 34 games against non-division foes before concluding the season with 16 straight games against the American League West.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .281 (99-for-352) in August, which is second best in the majors (Rockies, .295)...have the highest on-base percentage (.383) and fewest strikeouts (72) in the majors this month, are tied for the lead in stolen bases (14) and rank third in OPS (.852)...they are now batting .237 overall, which is sixth lowest in the American League but one point shy of the season high of .238 (last on June 25)...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 23 times in the last 23 games and 73 times overall for the season, which is the most in the AL, third most in the majors and fourth most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019, 76 in 2018)...rank third in the AL in stolen base percentage (81.9%), tied for fourth in fewest grounded into double plays (71), and fifth in sacrifice flies (35), walks (401), and sacrifice hits (14)...Oakland pinch hitters lead the American League in hits (24), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (108), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in RBI (17) and extra base hits (6) and are tied for second in doubles (3).

PITCHING: The A's surrendered eight runs (six earned) last night...snaps a seven-game streak during which they surrendered four or fewer runs per game...had their third shutoff in the previous 12 games on Thursday and their 11th of the season, which is tied with the Blue Jays for the most in the American League...have a 2.50 ERA (33 er in 119.0 ip) over the last 13 games and now have a 3.61 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...also have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.377), the third lowest OPS (.676) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.299)...have issued the fewest walks (312), allowed the fewest home runs (119) and averaged the fewest pitches per inning (15.9).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 7-3 with a 2.69 ERA (24 er in 80.1 ip) and .217 (64-for-295) opponents batting average over the last 14 contests...are 45-38 with a 3.62 ERA (268 er in 665.2 ip) overall...are tied for second in the American League in wins, rank third in ERA and are fourth in opponents OPS (.682)...lead the majors in innings pitched (665.2) and are tied for third in complete games (3)...have used just eight starting pitchers, which is tied with the Reds and Astros for second fewest in the majors (Red Sox, 6).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has a 1.97 ERA (20 er in 91.1 ip) and .180 (58-for-322) opponents batting average over the last 29 games dating back to July 7...has a 3.59 ERA overall, which is second lowest in the American League...also has the second lowest opponents OPS (.664)...has converted six of its seven save opportunities dating back to July 19 and is 29-for-45 (64.4%) for

the season, which is the fifth best save percentage in the American League... is tied for sixth in saves...has 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high three errors last night and have committed at least one error in each of the last five games but have just 52 for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the majors to the Astros (48)...are on pace for 73 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...are tied for the second fewest outfield assists in the American League (10) and are tied for the fifth fewest double plays (86).

CLOSE CALLS AND NOT SO CLOSE: The A's lost by two runs last night...five of the A's seven wins during the recently snapped winning streak have been by three or more runs...are 42-21 (.667) in games decided by three runs or more compared to 25-28 (.472) in games decided by two runs or fewer... are 17-19 (.472) in one-run games, which includes 11-7 at home and 6-12 on the road...lead the American League in one-run losses (19) and are tied for second in games (36)...have played three extra inning games in the last six games and have a five-game winning streak in extra inning contests...are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with the Red Sox for the second best record in the American League (Mariners, 10-4/.714)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 15-7 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Colorado for the most walk-off wins in the majors (10) and have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this 10-game road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (1-0) and Chicago-AL (four games)...are 4-1 over their last five road games and are now 33-24 (.579) in away games...this is the A's second consecutive 10-game road trip as they went 5-5 on the last trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-1)...this trip concludes a stretch that began on July 6 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...after this trip, the A's have 22 home games and 18 road games remaining...went 4-1 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (3-0) and have won six of their last seven home games...are 34-25 (.576) at home.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's have a 3.50 ERA (193 er in 495.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...are batting .247 (901-for-1981) with a .742 OPS on the road compared to .226 with a .707 OPS at home...have the third best road batting average and fourth best road OPS in the AL but the second lowest home batting average and third lowest home OPS.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 8-6...are 4-2 in Oakland and 4-4 in Texas...are 5-1 over the last six games...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their fourth consecutive season series victory over the Rangers, which is just the second time the A's have won four consecutive season series against Texas (2002-05)...are 52-29 (.642) against the Rangers over the last five years...are 22-10 (.688) dating back to July 27, 2019, including 11-3 (.786) in Oakland...are 393-382 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 207-178 in Oakland and 186-204 in Texas...are 8-7 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 490-466 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Starling Marte is batting a ML leading .424 (42-for-99) since the All-Star Break...also leads the majors in steals since the break (14) and ranks third in on-base percentage (.472)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.949) and slugging percentage (.571), tied for third in home runs (29), fourth in extra base hits (57), sixth in on-base percentage (.378), tied for seventh in doubles (28), tied for sixth in RBI (77), tied for eighth in walks (58) and tied for eighth in runs (74)...**Lou Trivino** has converted each of his last 12 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 0.93 ERA (3 er in 29.0 ip) and .188 (19-for-101) opponents batting average in 28 games over that span.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1933** Jimmie Foxx hits for the cycle and drives in nine runs in the A's 11-5 win over Cleveland...in **1987** Mark McGwire breaks the Major League rookie home run record with his 39th of the season, a two-run shot in the sixth inning of the A's 7-6 win at California...he would go on to hit what was then an Oakland record 49 round trippers...in **2020** the A's trail at San Francisco 7-2 entering the ninth inning but come back to win 8-7 in 10 innings...Stephen Piscotty hits a game-tying grand slam in a five-run ninth and Mark Canha has a sacrifice fly in the 10th.

39 LHP ANDREW CHAFIN

Last Outing: 8/10 at Cleveland (S, 1.0 ip, 1 so)

Saves/Opportunities: 1-2

Inherited Runners/Scored: 22/7 **First Hitters:** 7-48 (2 bb)

- Retired the side in order in the 10th inning Tuesday night at Cleveland for his fourth career save, his first since Sept. 27, 2020 against the White Sox.
- Was acquired from the Cubs on July 26 and has not allowed a run in seven games with the A's (6.2 ip, 3 h, 0 bb, 8 so).
- Has not allowed a run in 33 of his last 34 appearances (3 er in 31.0 ip, 0.88 ERA) and 46 of 50 overall.
- Ranks third among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.436), fourth in on-base percentage (.221), fifth in batting average (.152) and slugging percentage (.215), and eighth in ERA (1.76).
- Has not allowed a home run in his last 40 games (37.0 innings) and has yielded just one home run in 46.0 innings overall...his average of 0.20 home runs per nine innings is eighth lowest among ML relievers.
- Has a 0.72 ERA (2 er in 25.0 ip) in 27 appearances on one day of rest or fewer, a 3.10 ERA (7 er in 20.1 ip) in 22 games on two days rest or more.
- Has not allowed a run in the eighth inning (23.2 ip).
- Has not allowed a run in two outings against the Rangers this year (2.0 ip, 4 so), but has a 10.61 ERA (11 er in 9.1 ip) in 11 career outings against Texas.
- Was 0-2 with a 2.06 ERA in 43 relief appearances for Chicago (NL) when he was traded to Oakland along with cash considerations for Greg Deichmann and minor leaguer Daniel Palencia.

Last Year: Combined for a 1-2 record, one save and a 6.52 ERA in 15 relief appearances with the Diamondbacks and Cubs...missed a month of the season from Aug. 19 to Sept. 18 with a sprained left finger.

35 LHP JAKE DIEKMAN

Saves/Opportunities: 7-12

Inherited Runners/Scored: 9/4 **First Hitters:** 8-39, 5 bb, 3 hbp

- Has a 2.75 ERA (6 er in 19.2 ip) and .194 (13-for-67) opponents batting average over his last 23 games dating back to June 4.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .184 (18-for-98) average but they have hit five of the career-high six home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 4.12 ERA (9 er in 19.2 ip) and .240 (18-for-75) opponents batting average in 22 outings on one day rest or fewer, a 1.59 ERA (4 er in 22.2 ip) and .145 (11-for-76) opponents average in 24 appearances on two days of rest or more.
- Has a blown save in four appearances against Texas (2.1 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 6 so) and now has a 8.31 ERA (8 er in 8.2 ip) in 11 career appearances against the Rangers.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

Inherited Runners/Scored: 7/2 **First Hitters:** 6-30, 2 bb, hbp

- Has allowed four runs in his last three games (3.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 5 so) after an eight-game, 7.2-inning scoreless streak.
- Ranks 11th among American League relievers in opponents OPS (.565).
- Has a .149 (10-for-67) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .238 (19-for-80) against right-handers...has issued 10 of his 12 walks and yielded two of his three homers to righties for a .676 OPS...has a .425 OPS against lefties.
- Opponents are batting .179 (5-for-28) with runners in scoring position.
- Has 37 strikeouts which is a career high.
- Has a 2.25 ERA (5 er in 20.0 ip) in 16 games at night, a 5.06 ERA (12 er in 21.1 ip) in 17 day games.

- Leads the majors in games pitched (57)...is tied for the lead among American League relievers in wins (8), ranks second in innings pitched (58.1), third in fewest walks per nine innings (1.54) and eighth in most inherited runners (31)...is averaging the fewest strikeouts per nine innings in the majors among relievers (4.32).
- Opponents are hitting .177 (11-for-62) with runners in scoring position.
- Has allowed seven home runs, four of which have come to his first batter faced in an outing, which is tied for the most in the majors.
- Has a win, a loss and a blown save in seven games against Texas (6.2 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 1 so)

Last Year: Compiled a career-low 1.66 ERA in a team-leading 26 relief appearances...opponents hit .232 and he walked just five batters for a .273 on-base percentage...yielded four runs, three of which scored on solo home runs.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas Tuesday for his second stint with the A's this year and has pitched twice since his return (2.0 ip, 1 bb, 2 so).
- Has faced the Rangers twice in his career, both times in 2019 (3.0 ip 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 so).
- Was first recalled from the A's alternate site on April 5, pitched in relief that day against the Dodgers (3.1 ip, 1 h, 3 bb, 4 so), and was placed on the 10-day injured list April 8 retroactive to April 6 with a strained left biceps...had a five-game rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Las Vegas May 28.
- Had a 1.64 ERA (4 er in 22.0 ip) over his final 13 games at Triple-A dating back to June 26...allowed a .308 opponents batting average with the Aviators overall, including .231 (18-for-78) against left-handed hitters and .374 (34-for-91) against right-handers...surrendered seven of his 10 home runs to righties...his complete 2021 stats with Las Vegas:

Inherited Runners/Scored: 22/11 **First Hitters:** 14-45, bb, 2 hbp

- Gave up a home run last night...had not allowed a run in his previous 17 games dating back to June 29 (17.2 ip, 3 h, 4 bb, 19 so)...opponents were 3-for-53 (.057) over that span...the scoreless streak is his longest since his career-high 21.2-inning streak form June 30-Sept. 23, 2011.
- Has a 0.93 ERA (3 er in 29.0 ip) and .126 (12-for-95) opponents batting average over his last 30 games dating back to May 25 after compiling a 7.63 ERA and .290 opponents average over his first 18 contests.
- Ranks eighth among American League relievers in opponents OPS (.557) and 11th in slugging percentage (.293) and on-base percentage (.264).
- Has a 1.82 ERA (5 er in 24.2 ip) in 25 games on zero or one day of rest, a 5.30 ERA (11 er in 18.2 ip) in 22 outings on two days rest or more.

- Has not allowed a run in four his last five outings (10.1 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 4 so, 1.74 ERA).
- Has stranded all eight of his inherited runners this year and each of his last 14 dating back to Sept. 11, 2019...last allowed an inherited runner to score on Sept. 5, 2019.
- Has faced the Rangers three times (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 1 so) and has a 0.96 ERA (1 er in 9.1 ip) in five career outings against Texas.

Last Year: Made the A's Opening Day roster and was 2-0 with a save, a 2.25 ERA and .163 opponents batting average in six relief appearances before his season was cut short in mid-August with a forearm injury.

- Has converted each of his last 12 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 0.93 ERA (3 er in 29.0 ip) and .188 (19-for-101) opponents batting average in 28 games over that span.
- Is 19-for-21 (90.5%) in save opportunities...ranks fourth in the American League in save percentage and tied for fifth in saves.
- Has a 0.72 ERA (3 er in 37.1 ip) over his last 36 games and now has a 1.81 ERA for the season, which ranks sixth among AL relievers.
- Is tied for fifth among AL relievers in innings pitched (54.2), tied for eighthth in games (52) and ranks 10th in opponents OPS (.562) and eighth in slugging (.275).
- Has a .164 (18-for-110) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .232 (19-for-82) against left-handers.
- Opponents are hitting .136 (8-for-59) with runners in scoring position.
- Has a 0.36 ERA (1 er in 24.2 ip) on the road, a 0.76 ERA (2 er in 23.2 ip) during the day and a 0.73 ERA (3 er in 37.0 ip) in the ninth inning.
- Allowed both of his inherited runners to score in his second game on April 3 but has stranded all 12 of his inherited runners since then.
- Has allowed just one home run over his last 41 games (41.2 innings).
- Last night was his first outing against Cleveland since May 22, 2019 (1.0 ip, 1 so).
- Tossed a scoreless ninth inning on Sunday against Texas for the save in his 200th career appearance.

Last Year: Compiled a 3.86 ERA in 20 relief appearances and held the opposition to a career-low .193 batting average...issued 10 walks in 23.1 innings for a career-low .280 on-base percentage...struck out 26 for a career-best 10.03 strikeouts per nine innings.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas Friday for his second stint with the A's this year...hit .199 with 12 home runs and 30 RBI in 79 games during his first stint from April 6 to July 31.
- Went 4-for-14 (.286) with a double, triple and RBI in three games with the Aviators following his Aug. 1 option...appeared in one game in left field, one at designated hitter and one at right field.
- Is fifth among American League rookies in home runs (14).
- Is batting .212 (41-for-193) against right-handed pitchers, .176 (3-for-17) against left-handers...has made 53 of his 54 starts this year and 70 of 72 in his career in games in which the opponent starts a right-handed pitcher.
- Is batting .252 (26-for-103) at home, .168 (18-for-107) on the road.
- More than half of his hits are for extra bases (24-of-44, 54.5%)...34 of his 66 (51.5%) career hits are extra base hits.
- Is 4-for-17 (.235) with a double, home run, four RBI, a walk and a sacrifice fly as a pinch hitter...is second among AL pinch hitters in plate appearances (19), and is tied for fourth in RBI and fifth in hits.
- Has started games at four different positions (40 in right field, nine in left field, three at designated hitter, two at first base).

Last Year: Went 0-for-5 with two strikeouts in seven games over three stints with Oakland...all five of his plate appearances came against right-handed pitchers...made just one start and went 0-for-2 as the A's designated hitter.

20 MARK CANHA

- Was reinstated from the injured list July 17 and had reached base safely in 21 of his 22 games since his return...is 18-for-81 (.222) and has 14 walks and eight hit by pitches.
- Was hit by a pitch for the 21st time Wednesday night, which set a new Athletics single-season record for hit by pitches and is the most in the majors this year.
- Ranks fifth in the American League in on-base percentage (.379) and has a .388 on-base percentage over the last three years, which is eighth best in the majors (min. 900 PA).
- Leads the majors in pitches per plate appearance (4.30)...is tied for sixth in the AL in triples (4) and is 14th in walks (54).
- Has made 93 of his 94 starts batting leadoff...the A's are 57-36 (.613) when he hits leadoff, 10-13 (.435) when he doesn't.
- Is batting .303 (23-for-76) with runners in scoring position.
- Has not homered since June 4 and his 39-game homerless streak is a career high.
