## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (68-49) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (41-76)

SUNDAY, AUGUST 15, 2021 — GLOBE LIFE FIELD — 1:35 CDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's hit a season-high five home runs to beat the Rangers 8-3 last night and have won 12 of the last 15 games...are 19 games over .500 which matches their season high from two days ago...are tied for the third best record in the American League and tied for sixth best in the majors...are 9-2 (.800) in August, which is the best record in the majors...are in second place in the AL West for the 51st consecutive day (dating back to June 21) and trail first place Houston by 2½ games...were ½-game back on June 30... are in first place in the AL Wild Card, one game ahead of the second Wild Card (Red Sox) and 3 ½ games ahead of the third place team (Yankees)...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 51 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 27-16 (.628) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 41-33 (.554) when they start a right-hander...are 3-1 in this stretch of 15 games in 15 days from Aug. 10-24...are scheduled to play 22 of their next 30 games against non-division foes before concluding the season with 16 straight games against the West... have used a different lineup in each of the last 54 games and have 114 different lineups over the first 117 contests.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** This three-game series with Texas concludes a stretch that began on July 19 where the A's were scheduled to play 13 of 17 games against American League West teams...are 9-5 against the West during the stretch...are now 28-25 (.528) against AL West competition overall compared to 36-24 (.600) against all other teams...beginning Tuesday, the A's are scheduled to play 26 of their next 34 games against non-division foes before concluding the season with 16 straight games against the American League West.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .283 (110-for-389) in August, which is tied for second best in the majors...have the highest on-base percentage (.376) and OPS (.870), and fewest strikeouts (80) in the majors this month...are second in stolen bases (15)...they are now batting .237 overall, which is sixth lowest in the American League but one point shy of the season high of .238 (last on June 25)...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 23 times in the last 24 games and 73 times overall for the season, which is the most in the AL, third most in the majors and fourth most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019, 76 in 2018)...rank third in the AL in stolen base percentage (82.2%), tied for fourth in fewest grounded into double plays (72), and fifth in sacrifice flies (35), walks (401), and sacrifice hits (15)...Oakland pinch hitters lead the American League in hits (24), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (108), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in RBI (17) and extra base hits (6) and are tied for second in doubles (3).

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed four or fewer runs in eight of their last nine games...had their third shutoff in the previous 12 games on Thursday and their 11th of the season, which is tied with the Blue Jays for the most in the American League...have a 2.53 ERA (36 er in 128.0 ip) over the last 14 games and now have a 3.61 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...also have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.376), the third lowest OPS (.675) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.299)...have issued the fewest walks (313), allowed the fewest home runs (119) and averaged the fewest pitches per inning (15.8).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 7-3 with a 2.87 ERA (27 er in 85.2 ip) and .226 (72-for-318) opponents batting average over the last 15 contests...are 45-38 with a 3.63 ERA (271 er in 671.0 ip) overall...are tied for second in the American League in wins, rank third in ERA and opponents OPS (.682)...lead the majors in innings pitched (671.0) and are tied for third in complete games (3)...have used just eight starting pitchers, which is tied with Cincinnati and Houston for second fewest starters used in the majors (Red Sox, 6).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has a 1.89 ERA (20 er in 95.0 ip) and .180 (60-for-333) opponents batting average over the last 30 games dating back to July 7...has a 3.55 ERA overall, which is second lowest in the American League... also has the second lowest opponents OPS (.662)...has converted six of its eight save opportunities dating back to July 19 and is 29-for-46 (63.0%) for the season...is tied for sixth in saves...has 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's went errorless last night, snapping a streak of five straight games with an error...have just 52 for the season, which is tied

for second fewest in the majors to the Astros (48)...are on pace for 72 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...are tied for the second fewest outfield assists in the American League (10) and have the sixth fewest double plays (88).

**CLOSE CALLS AND NOT SO CLOSE:** The A's won my five runs last night...six of the A's last eight wins have been by three or more runs...are 43-21 (.672) in games decided by three runs or more compared to 25-28 (.472) in games decided by two runs or fewer... are 17-19 (.472) in one-run games, which includes 11-7 at home and 6-12 on the road...lead the American League in one-run losses (19)...have played three extra inning games in the last seven games and have a five-game winning streak in extra inning contests...are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with the Red Sox for the second best record in the American League (Mariners, 10-4/.714)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 15-7 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Rockies for the most walk-off wins in the majors (10) and have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 4-1 on this 10-game road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (1-1) and Chicago-AL (four games)...are 5-1 over their last five road games and are now 34-24 (.5886) in away games...this is the A's second consecutive 10-game road trip as they went 5-5 on the last trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-1)...this trip concludes a stretch that began on July 6 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games away from home...after this trip, the A's have 22 home games and 18 road games remaining...went 4-1 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (3-0) and have won six of their last seven home games...are 34-25 (.576) at home.

**HOME AND AWAY SPLITS:** The A's have a 3.50 ERA (196 er in 504.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...are batting .248 (501-for-2018) with a .747 OPS on the road compared to .226 with a .707 OPS at home...have the third best road batting average and second best road OPS in the AL but the second lowest home batting average and third lowest home OPS.

**A's vs. RANGERS:** The A's lead the season series, 9-6...are 4-2 in Oakland and 5-4 in Texas...are 6-1 over the last seven games...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their fourth consecutive season series victory over the Rangers, which is just the second time the A's have won four consecutive season series against Texas (2002-05)...are 53-29 (.646) against the Rangers over the last five years...are 23-10 (.697) dating back to July 27, 2019, including 11-3 (.786) in Oakland...are 394-382 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 207-178 in Oakland and 187-204 in Texas...are 9-7 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 491-466 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Matt Chapman** is batting a .318 (7-for-22) with a 1.152 OPS, two home runs, eight runs, six RBI, along with nine walks and just seven strikeouts over his last seven games...**Mitch Moreland** has started each of the A's last four games and is hitting .353 with three home runs, five RBI, and a 1.507 OPS...prior to this stretch, had appeared in just one game in August...**Starling Marte** is batting a ML leading .423 (44-for-104) since the All-Star Break...also leads the majors in steals since the break (15) and ranks third in on-base percentage (.469)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.957), slugging percentage (.578) and home runs (29), fourth in extra base hits (58), sixth in on-base percentage (.379), tied for seventh in doubles (28), sixth in RBI (79), tied for eighth in walks (58) and tied for seventh in runs (75)...**Lou Trivino** has converted each of his last 12 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 0.93 ERA (3 er in 29.0 ip) and .188 (19-for-101) opponents batting average in 28 games over that span.

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1907** Chief Bender wins his 11<sup>th</sup> consecutive decision in the A's 4-2 win over Cleveland...in **1976** Joe Rudi collects his 1000<sup>th</sup> hit as an Oakland Athletic in the A's 8-7 win against Boston...in **1980** Rick Langford pitches a six-hitter as the A's defeat Seattle 11-3...it is his club record ninth consecutive complete game victory...the win comes in the midst of a club record 22 consecutive complete games...in **2009** Adam Kennedy is a perfect 5 for 5 in the A's 8-1 loss to Chicago...it is Kennedy's second of two five-hit games in 2009.

# ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

## 39 LHP ANDREW CHAFIN

**Last Outing:** 8/14 at Texas(BS/W, 1.2 ip, h, bb)

**Saves/Opportunities:** 1-3

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 24/8     **First Hitters:** 7-49, 2 bb, sf

- Retired the side in order in the 10th inning Tuesday night at Cleveland for his fourth career save, his first since Sept. 27, 2020 against the White Sox.
- Was acquired from the Cubs on July 26 and has not allowed a run in eight games with the A's (8.1 ip, 4 h, 1 bb, 8 so).
- Has not allowed a run in 34 of his last 35 appearances (3 er in 32.2 ip, 0.83 ERA) and 47 of 51 overall.
- Ranks third among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.441), sixth in on-base percentage (.225), seventh in batting average (.154), fourth in slugging percentage (.216), and seventh in ERA (1.70).
- Has not allowed a home run in his last 41 games (38.2 innings) and has yielded just one home run in 47.2 innings overall...his average of 0.19 home runs per nine innings is tied for sixth lowest among ML relievers.
- Has a 0.72 ERA (2 er in 25.0 ip) in 27 appearances on one day of rest or fewer, a 2.86 ERA (7 er in 22.0 ip) in 23 games on two days rest or more.
- Has not allowed a run in the eighth inning (23.2 ip).
- Has not allowed a run in three outings against the Rangers this year (3.2 ip, h, bb, 4 so), but has a 9.00 ERA (11 er in 11.0 ip) in 12 career outings against Texas.
- Was 0-2 with a 2.06 ERA in 43 relief appearances for Chicago (NL) when he was traded to Oakland along with cash considerations for Greg Deichmann and minor leaguer Daniel Palencia.

**Last Year:** Combined for a 1-2 record, one save and a 6.52 ERA in 15 relief appearances with the Diamondbacks and Cubs...missed a month of the season from Aug. 19 to Sept. 18 with a sprained left finger.

## 35 LHP JAKE DIEKMAN

**Last Outing:** 8/12 at Cleveland (ND, 1.0 ip)

**Saves/Opportunities:** 7-12

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 9/4     **First Hitters:** 8-39, 5 bb, 3 hbp

- Has a 2.75 ERA (6 er in 19.2 ip) and .194 (13-for-67) opponents batting average over his last 23 games dating back to June 4.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .184 (18-for-98) average but they have hit five of the career-high six home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 4.12 ERA (9 er in 19.2 ip) and .240 (18-for-75) opponents batting average in 22 outings on one day rest or fewer, a 1.59 ERA (4 er in 22.2 ip) and .145 (11-for-76) opponents average in 24 appearances on two days of rest or more.
- Has a blown save in four appearances against Texas (2.1 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 6 so) and now has a 8.31 ERA (8 er in 8.2 ip) in 11 career appearances against the Rangers.

**Last Year:** Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

## 65 RHP DEOLIS GUERRA

**Last Outing:** 8/13 at Texas (ND, 1.0 ip, h, 2 so)

**Saves/Opportunities:** 0-0

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 7/2     **First Hitters:** 6-30, 2 bb, hbp

- Has allowed four runs in his last three games (3.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 5 so) after an eight-game, 7.2-inning scoreless streak.
- Ranks 11th among American League relievers in opponents OPS (.565).
- Has a .149 (10-for-67) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .238 (19-for-80) against right-handers...has issued 10 of his 12 walks and yielded two of his three homers to righties for a .676 OPS...has a .425 OPS against lefties.
- Opponents are batting .179 (5-for-28) with runners in scoring position.
- Has 37 strikeouts which is a career high.
- Has a 2.25 ERA (5 er in 20.0 ip) in 16 games at night, a 5.06 ERA (12 er in 21.1 ip) in 17 day games.
- Has faced the Rangers six times (6.0 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 4 so, 1 hr).

**Last Year:** Was on the Opening Day roster and appeared in nine games for Philadelphia in 2020 and went 1-3 with an 8.59 ERA (7 er in 7.1 ip)...struck out eight batters and walked two.

**Saves/Opportunities:** 2-6

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 31/11     **First Hitters:** 15-53, 4 bb, sf

- Has not allowed a run in six of his last eight games (7.1 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 4 so, hr).
- Leads the majors in games pitched (58)...is tied for the lead among American League relievers in wins (8), ranks second in innings pitched (59.1) and fewest walks per nine innings (1.52) and eighth in most inherited runners (31)...is averaging the fewest strikeouts per nine innings in the majors among relievers (4.40).
- Opponents are hitting .177 (11-for-62) with runners in scoring position.
- Has allowed seven home runs, four of which have come to his first batter faced in an outing, which is tied for the most in the majors.
- Has a win, a loss and a blown save in eight games against Texas (7.2 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 2 so)

**Last Year:** Compiled a career-low 1.66 ERA in a team-leading 26 relief appearances...opponents hit .232 and he walked just five batters for a .273 on-base percentage...yielded four runs, three of which scored on solo home runs.

**Last Outing:** 8/14 at Texas (ND, 1.0 ip, h)

**Saves/Opportunities:** 0-0

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 2/0     **First Hitters:** 0-4

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas Tuesday for his second stint with the A's this year and has pitched three times since his return (3.0 ip, 1 bb, 1 h, 2 so).
- Has faced the Rangers three times in his career (4.0 ip 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 so).
- Was first recalled from the A's alternate site on April 5, pitched in relief that day against the Dodgers (3.1 ip, 1 h, 3 bb, 4 so), and was placed on the 10-day injured list April 8 retroactive to April 6 with a strained left biceps...had a five-game rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the IL and optioned to Las Vegas May 28.
- Had a 1.64 ERA (4 er in 22.0 ip) over his final 13 games at Triple-A dating back to June 26...allowed a .308 opponents batting average with the Aviators overall, including .231 (18-for-78) against left-handed hitters and .374 (34-for-91) against right-handers...surrendered seven of his 10 home runs to righties...his complete 2021 stats with Las Vegas:

**Last Year:** Made two starts during the spring and did not allow a run before he was shut down with a shoulder injury...began the season on the IL and eventually underwent surgery on the left shoulder on Sept. 16.

## 54 RHP SERGIO ROMO

**Last Outing:** 8/13 at Texas (BS, 1.0 ip, h, r, er, bb, hr)

**Saves/Opportunities:** 0-2

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 22/11     **First Hitters:** 14-45, bb, 2 hbp

- Gave up a home run Friday night...had not allowed a run in his previous 17 games dating back to June 29 (17.2 ip, 3 h, 4 bb, 19 so)...opponents were 3-for-53 (.057) over that span...the scoreless streak is his longest since his career-high 21.2-inning streak from June 30-Sept. 23, 2011.
- Has a 0.93 ERA (3 er in 29.0 ip) and .126 (12-for-95) opponents batting average over his last 30 games dating back to May 25 after compiling a 7.63 ERA and .290 opponents average over his first 18 contests.
- Ranks eighth among American League relievers in opponents OPS (.557) and 11th in slugging percentage (.293) and on-base percentage (.264).
- Has a 1.82 ERA (5 er in 24.2 ip) in 25 games on zero or one day of rest, a 5.30 ERA (11 er in 18.2 ip) in 22 outings on two days rest or more.
- Has a 2.10 ERA (6 er in 25.2 ip) and .151 (13-for-86) opponents batting average at night, 4.82 (10 er in 18.2 ip) and .239 (17-for-71) during the day.
- First batters faced are 2-for-21 (.095) with nine strikeouts over his last 21 games after going 12-for-24 (.500) with a walk and two hit by pitches over his first 27 contests.
- Has a blown two saves in five appearances against Texas (5.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so, hr)...has a 1.50 ERA (2 er in 11.0 ip) in 12 career regular season appearances against the Rangers.

**Last Year:** Was 1-2 with five saves, a 4.05 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in 24 relief appearances with Minnesota...had 10 holds, which tied for third most in the majors...was the only reliever in the majors with at least 10 holds and at least five saves.

## 46 RHP BURCH SMITH

**Saves/Opportunities:** 0-1

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 8/0     **First Hitters:** 7-23, bb

- Tossed 3.1 scoreless innings Tuesday night and has pitched at least two innings in eight of his 24 outings.
- Has not allowed a run in four his last five outings (10.1 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 4 so, 1.74 ERA).
- Has stranded all eight of his inherited runners this year and each of his last 14 dating back to Sept. 11, 2019...last allowed an inherited runner to score on Sept. 5, 2019.
- Has faced the Rangers three times (4.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 1 so) and has a 0.96 ERA (1 er in 9.1 ip) in five career outings against Texas.

**Last Year:** Made the A's Opening Day roster and was 2-0 with a save, a 2.25 ERA and .163 opponents batting average in six relief appearances before his season was cut short in mid-August with a forearm injury.

## 62 RHP LOU TRIVINO

**Last Outing:** 8/11 at Cleveland (S, 1.0 ip, h)

**Saves/Opportunities:** 19-21

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 14/2     **First Hitters:** 10-47, 5 bb

- Has converted each of his last 12 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 0.93 ERA (3 er in 29.0 ip) and .188 (19-for-101) opponents batting average in 28 games over that span.
- Is 19-for-21 (90.5%) in save opportunities...ranks fourth in the American League in save percentage and tied for fifth in saves.
- Has a 0.72 ERA (3 er in 37.1 ip) over his last 36 games and now has a 1.81 ERA for the season, which ranks sixth among AL relievers.
- Is sixth among AL relievers in innings pitched (54.2), tied for eighth in games (52) and ranks 10th in opponents OPS (.562) and eighth in slugging (.275).
- Has a .164 (18-for-110) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .232 (19-for-82) against left-handers.
- Opponents are hitting .136 (8-for-59) with runners in scoring position.
- Has a 0.36 ERA (1 er in 24.2 ip) on the road, a 0.76 ERA (2 er in 23.2 ip) during the day and a 0.73 ERA (3 er in 37.0 ip) in the ninth inning.
- Allowed both of his inherited runners to score in his second game on April 3 but has stranded all 12 of his inherited runners since then.
- Has allowed just one home run over his last 41 games (41.2 innings).
- Last night was his first outing against Cleveland since May 22, 2019 (1.0 ip, 1 so).
- Tossed a scoreless ninth inning on Sunday against Texas for the save in his 200th career appearance.

**Last Year:** Compiled a 3.86 ERA in 20 relief appearances and held the opposition to a career-low .193 batting average...issued 10 walks in 23.1 innings for a career-low .280 on-base percentage...struck out 26 for a career-best 10.03 strikeouts per nine innings.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas on Aug. 6 for his second stint with the A's this year...hit .199 with 12 home runs and 30 RBI in 79 games during his first stint from April 6 to July 31.
- Went 4-for-14 (.286) with a double, triple and RBI in three games with the Aviators following his Aug. 1 option...appeared in one game in left field, one at designated hitter and one at right field.
- Is fifth among American League rookies in home runs (15).
- Is batting .214 (42-for-196) against right-handed pitchers, .167 (3-for-18) against left-handers...has made 54 of his 55 starts this year and 71 of 73 in his career in games in which the opponent starts a right-handed pitcher.
- Is batting .252 (26-for-103) at home, .171 (19-for-111) on the road.
- More than half of his hits are for extra bases (25-of-45, 55.6%)...35 of his 67 (52.2%) career hits are extra base hits.
- Is 4-for-17 (.235) with a double, home run, four RBI, a walk and a sacrifice fly as a pinch hitter...is second among AL pinch hitters in plate appearances (19), and is tied for fourth in RBI and fifth in hits.
- Has started games at four different positions (41 in right field, nine in left field, three at designated hitter, two at first base).

**Last Year:** Went 0-for-5 with two strikeouts in seven games over three stints with Oakland...all five of his plate appearances came against right-handed pitchers...made just one start and went 0-for-2 as the A's designated hitter.

## 20 MARK CANHA

**Current Streak:** 0 for 5  
**Texas Series:** 0-5, 2 so  
**Road Trip:** 1-19, 2 r, 2b, 3 rbi, bb, 4 so, hbp

- Was reinstated from the injured list July 17 and had reached base safely in 21 of his 23 games since his return...is 18-for-86 (.209) and has 14 walks and eight hit by pitches.
- Was hit by a pitch for the 21st time Wednesday night, which set a new Athletics single-season record for hit by pitches and is the most in the majors this year.
