OAKLAND ATHLETICS (68-50) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (68-50)

MONDAY, AUGUST 16, 2021 — GUARANTEED RATE FIELD — 7:10 CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's lost two of three at Texas over the weekend...are 9-3 (.750) in August, which is the best record in the American League and tied for third best in the majors...have won 12 of the last 16 games...are 68-50 (.576) overall, which is tied with the White Sox for the third best record in the AL and tied for sixth best in the majors...the 18 games over .500 are one short of the season high of 19 (twice, last: 68-49 on Aug. 14)...are in second place in the AL West for the 52nd consecutive day (dating back to June 21) and trail first place Houston by 2½ games...are in a virtual tie with the Red Sox for the first AL Wild Card and are 2½ games ahead of the third place team (Yankees)...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 52 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...had their seven-game winning streak snapped on Friday...it was the third winning streak of seven or more games this year, the sixth time in Oakland history they have had at least three such streaks in a season (1971, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2005).

AGAINST THE BEST: The A's will play seven games this week, all against teams currently leading their division...after this four-game series with the White Sox, the A's return home to host a three-game series with the Giants...have a 15-21 (.417) record against teams currently leading their divisions or holding a wild card spot compared to 53-29 (.646) against all other teams.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 16-4 (.800) against American League Central teams, which is the best record in the majors...are batting .256 (168-for-655) and are averaging 5.9 runs per game (117 runs in 20 games) against teams from the Central compared to .234 with an average of 4.3 runs per game against all other teams...have a 2.80 ERA (55 er in 177.0 ip) against the Central, 3.81 against everyone else...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 81-24 (.771) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher from the second consecutive day after nine consecutive games against right-handers...are 27-17 (.614) when the opponent starts a lefty compared to 41-33 (.554) against righties...the mark against lefties is second best in the AL to the White Sox (21-12/.636)

PITCHING: The A's allowed 18 runs and 29 hits in the three games series at Texas but have a 2.85 ERA (43 er in 136.0 ip) and .211 (104-for-494) opponents batting average over the last 15 games...have a 3.64 ERA overall, which is second lowest in the American League...have the lowest opponents OPS in the AL (.677), the second lowest slugging percentage (.378) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.299)...have issued the fewest walks (314), allowed the fewest home runs (122), averaged the fewest pitches per inning (15.8) and are tied for the most shutouts (11).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-3 with a 4.62 ERA (33 er in 64.1 ip) in the month of August...are 45-39 with a 3.70 ERA (278 er in 676.0 ip) overall...are tied with the White Sox for second in the American League in wins, rank third in ERA and fourth in opponents OPS (.687)...lead the majors in innings pitched (676.0) and are tied for third in complete games (3)...have used just eight starting pitchers, which is tied with the Reds and Astros for second fewest in the majors (Red Sox, 7).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has a 1.84 ERA (20 er in 98.0 ip) and .178 (61-for-343) opponents batting average over the last 31 games dating back to July 7...has a 3.53 ERA overall, which is second lowest in the American League...also has the second lowest opponents OPS (.659)...had two blown saves in the three games at Texas and is now 29-for-46 (63.0%) in save opportunities for the season, which is tied for the fifth best save percentage in the majors...has 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.431) and the fourth highest batting average (.242) but has the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.306).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .282 (120-for-425) in August, which is second best in the majors to the Red Sox (.288)...lead the majors in on-base percentage (.372), OPS (.863) and fewest strikeouts (84) this month, are tied for the lead in stolen bases (16), rank second in slugging percentage (.492) and tied for second in runs (81)...overall, the A's have been hit by a pitch an American League leading 73 times, which is 22 more than the next closest team, the White Sox (51)...the hit by pitches are fourth most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019, 76 in 2018)...rank third in the AL in stolen base percentage (82.4%) and fifth in walks (403), sacrifice hits (15), sacrifice flies (35), fewest strikeouts (1003) and fewest grounded into double plays (73)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (24), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (111), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in RBI (17) and extra base hits (6) and tied for second in doubles (3).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have not committed an error in the last two games after making seven over the previous five contests...have 52 errors for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to the Astros (48)...are on pace for 71 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...are tied for the second fewest outfield assists in the American League (10) and have the fifth fewest double plays (88).

CLOSE CALLS AND NOT SO CLOSE: The A's have 16 wins since the All-Star Break, 12 of which have been by three runs or more...are 43-22 (.662) in games decided by three runs or more compared to 25-28 (.472) in games decided by two runs or fewer...are 17-19 (.472) in one-run games, which includes 11-7 at home and 6-12 on the road...lead the American League in one-run losses (19) and are third in games (36)...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with the Red Sox for the second best record in the AL (Mariners, 10-4/.714)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 15-7 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Mariners and Rockies for the most walk-off wins in the majors (10) and have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-2 on this 10-game road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (1-2) and Chicago-AL (four games) and have won eight of their last 11 road games...this is the A's second consecutive 10-game road trip as they went 5-5 on the last trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-1)...this trip concludes a stretch that began on July 6 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...after this trip, the A's have 22 home games and 18 road games remaining...are 34-25 (.576) on the road and 34-25 (.576) at home...the road record is third best in the American League...return home following the game Thursday for a nine-game homestand against San Francisco (three games), Seattle (two games) and New York-AL (four games)...went 4-1 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (3-0) and have won six of their last seven home games.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's have a 3.56 ERA (203 er in 512.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...are batting .249 (511-for-2054) with a .748 OPS on the road compared to .226 with a .707 OPS at home...have the second best road OPS and third best road batting average in the AL but the second lowest home batting average and third lowest home OPS.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's and White Sox meet for the first time in the regular season since Aug. 11, 2019, a span of 736 days...the two clubs squared off in the American League Wild Card Series last year, with the A's winning two of three in Oakland...the A's won the season series in 2019, 5-1...went 3-0 in Oakland and 2-1 in Chicago...it was the A's third consecutive season series win over the White Sox and Oakland is 15-4 over that span...have won seven of the last 10 games in Chicago...have an eight-game winning streak in Oakland, which is the second longest Coliseum winning streak against Chicago in Oakland history (10, May 18, 2001-May 6, 2003)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 317-290 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 167-138 in Oakland and 150-152 in Chicago...including 68-64 at Guaranteed Rate Field...all-time, the A's are 994-1045 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks fourth among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.441) and slugging percentage (.216), sixth in on-base percentage (.225) and seventh in batting average (.154) and ERA (1.70)...**Starling Marte** is batting a ML leading .413 (45-for-109) since the All-Star Break...also leads the majors in steals since the break (16) and ranks third in on-base percentage (.458)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.952) and slugging percentage (.574), tied for third in home runs (30), tied for fourth in extra base hits (58), fifth in on-base percentage (.378), tied for sixth in RBI (79), tied for seventh in doubles (28) and runs (76) and eighth in walks (59)...**Lou Trivino** has converted each of his last 12 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 0.93 ERA (3 er in 29.0 ip) and .188 (19-for-101) opponents batting average in 28 games over that span.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1930 Lefty Grove wins his 20th game of the season, defeating St. Louis in Philadelphia, 4-2...in 1983 Chris Codiroli and Dave Beard combine on a 4-0 shutout against California, the A's third consecutive shutout...the shutout comes as part of an Oakland record 37 consecutive scoreless innings...in 1991 Dennis Eckersley strikes out Chili Davis at Minnesota for his 2000th career strikeout...in 1996 Geronimo Berroa hits two home runs in the first game of a doubleheader against Boston, the A's 199th and 200th of the season...that broke the A's franchise record of 199.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (9-8, 3.98 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 2-1 with a 2.61 ERA (14 er in 48.1 ip), .206 (35-for-170) opponents batting average and three home runs allowed over his last eight starts dating back to June 26 after going 7-7 with a 4.79 ERA, .269 opponents average and 13 home runs over his first 15 starts...is tied for 10th in the American League in wins (9).

STRIKEOUTS: Has 51 strikeouts and nine walks in 37.2 innings over his last six starts...the strikeouts are the most by an A's pitcher over a six-game span since Todd Stottlemyre had 56 from June 16-July 12, 1995...ranks eighth in the American League in strikeouts (146)...has four games of 10 or more strikeouts this year and seven in his career

CAREER BESTS: Picked up his ninth win of the season July 29, which matches his career high established in 2019...already has career highs in nearly every other category including games started (23), innings pitched (131.0), strikeouts (146), losses (8), hits (126), runs (64), earned runs (58), walks (36) and home runs (16).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-2 with a 3.49 ERA (23 er in 59.1 ip) and .217 (48-for-221) opponents batting average in 10 starts on the road compared to 4-6 with a 4.40 ERA (35 er in 71.2 ip) and .272 (78-for-287) opponents average in 13 starts at home.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed two home runs over his last seven starts and five over his last 13...surrendered 11 long balls over his first 10 starts...has a .213 (39-for-183) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .268 (87-for-325) with 11 of his 16 home runs after that...has held the opponents three hitter to a .172 (10-for-58) average and the four hitter to a mark of .183 (11-for-60)...the mark against the three hitter is the lowest in the American League and his average against the four hitter is third lowest.

THAT'S ODD: Has a 5.04 ERA (39 er in 69.2 ip) and .270 (76-for-281) opponents batting average in odd numbered innings compared to a 2.79 ERA (19 er in 61.1 ip) and .220 (50-for-227) opponents average in even numbered innings.

BY MONTH: Went 2-1 with a 2.30 ERA and .204 opponents batting average in five starts in July...struck out 40 in 31.1 innings and walked just nine while surrendering two home runs...his strikeouts ranked fifth in the American League and fifth in Oakland history in the month of July...also ranked seventh in the AL in ERA and opponents batting average, ninth in slugging percentage (.310) and 10th in OPS (.588)...has had a roller coaster season with his ERA as he posted a mark of 6.20 in April, 3.18 in May, 5.28 in June and 2.30 in July...his 2-1 record in July was his first month this year that was not .500 as he went 2-2 in April, 3-3 in May and 2-2 in June.

THIS AND THAT: Has six no decisions this year, four of which have come in extra inning games...the A's have won three of his no decisions and are 12-11 (.522) in his starting assignments...has tossed seven innings or fewer in all 23 of his starts, including six innings or fewer 19 times...has received two runs of support or fewer in 13 of his 23 starts, including 11 of his last 15.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start on April 5 against Los Angeles (NL)...allowed seven runs in a season-low 2.2 innings and walked a season-high three batters...tossed 90 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...the loss extended his losing streak to a career-high three games dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...then picked up the win in each of his next two starts and allowed just one run on eight hits in 12.0 innings...won 7-3 at Houston on April 10 and then combined with Romo, Diekman and Wendelken on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 victory over Detroit on April 16...allowed six runs on a season-high nine hits in 4.0 innings against Minnesota on April 21 but had a no decision in the A's 13-12, 10-inning win...allowed three home runs in a start for the second time in his career (Sept. 22, 2020 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...finished April 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts...then went 3-3 with a 3.18 ERA in six starts in May...the three wins matched his most ever in a month and he had 38 strikeouts, which tied for eighth in the American League...won each of his first three starts in May and posted a 3.12 ERA over that stretch from May 3-14...then went 0-3 with a 3.24 ERA over his next three starts from May 19-29...the losing streak matched his career high...struck out 11 batters in 6.0 innings in a 4-2 loss to Seattle on May 24...it was one of four games with 10 or more strikeouts (10, July 8 at Houston; 10, July 23 at Seattle; 10, July 29 at Los Angeles-AL) and the second highest single-game total of his career to his 13 against the Mariners in the final game of the 2020 season...now has seven career 10-strikeout games...walked a season-high tying three...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings June 15 against Los Angeles (AL) and allowed just two runs for the win...

then surrendered a season-high eight runs on a season-high tying nine hits in 5.2 innings at Texas on June 21 for the loss...is 2-1 with a 2.61 ERA (14 er in 48.1 ip) in eight starts since then...started consecutive games that went extra innings on June 26 at San Francisco and July 2 against Boston...issued a season-high tying three walks in each contests...struck out 10 batters in back-to-back starts on July 23 at Seattle and July 29 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the first A's pitcher with consecutive games of 10 or more strikeouts since Brandon McCarthy (Aug. 29-Sept. 3, 2011)...combined with Romo and Trivino on a three-hit shutout in the latter contest against the Angels, a 4-0 win...tossed a season-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...struck out 10, issued a season-high tying three walks and logged a season-high 109 pitches.

LAST START: He had his second straight no decision in the A's 6-3 win at Cleveland last Wednesday...issued a season-high tying three walks...allowed two runs in the first inning on an error and a Ramirez RBI single...faced the minimum over his final five innings as his two base runners, both walks, were erased on double plays...the A's tied the game with two runs in the seventh and he was relieved by Diekman to start the bottom of the seventh.

MONTAS vs. CHICAGO: The White Sox are the only American League team he has never faced during the regular season...did face Chicago in the 2020 American League Wild Card Series and was the winning pitcher in relief in Game 3 on Oct. 1 in Oakland, a 6-4 A's win...entered the game to start the fourth inning with the A's trailing 3-0...retired the side in order in the fourth and Oakland scored four times in the bottom of the fourth to take a 4-3 lead...he allowed the game-tying RBI single to Mazara in the fifth but the A's scored twice in the bottom of the fifth to take the lead for good...was relieved by Wendelken to start the sixth.

2020 RECAP: Was off to a strong start as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA, .175 opponents batting average and no home runs over his first four starts...was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA, .321 opponents average and 10 home runs over his final seven starts...went 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA in 11 starts overall...his ERA was eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched...had career highs in losses (5) and earned runs (33) and matched his high in home runs (10), runs (35) and walks (23)...led the A's in strikeouts (60), losses, runs, home runs and walks...his opponents batting average broke down to .198 (22-for-111) against right-handed hitters compared to .350 (35-for-100) against left-handers...surrendered six of his 10 home runs and issued 15 of his 23 walks to lefties for a 1.061 OPS (.572 against right-handers).
