OAKLAND ATHLETICS (68-51) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (69-50)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three of the last four games after winning seven in a row...are 9-4 (.692) in August, which is the second best record in the American League, and have won 12 of the last 17 games...are 68-51 (.571) overall, which is the fifth best record in the AL...are in second place in the AL West for the 53rd consecutive day (dating back to June 21) and trail first place Houston by 2½ games for the fourth consecutive day...with the loss last night, dropped back into second place in the AL Wild Card for the first time since Aug. 7...trail Boston by ½ game and have a 1½ game lead over the third place team, New York...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 53 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

AGAINST THE BEST: The A's will play seven games this week, all against teams currently leading their division...after this four-game series with the White Sox, the A's return home to host a three-game series with the Giants...have a 15-22 (.405) record against teams currently leading their divisions or holding a wild card spot compared to 53-29 (.646) against all other teams.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 16-5 (.762) against American League Central teams, which is the best record in the majors...are batting .253 (174-for-687) and are averaging 5.7 runs per game (119 runs in 21 games) against teams from the Central compared to .234 with an average of 4.3 runs per game against all other teams...have a 2.92 ERA (60 er in 185.0 ip) against the Central, 3.81 against everyone else...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 81-25 (.764) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 23 runs and 39 hits over the last four games after yielding just 17 runs and 41 hits during their seven-game winning streak...have a 3.65 ERA overall, which is third lowest in the American League...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.379), the third lowest OPS (.678) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.299)...have issued the fewest walks (317), allowed the fewest home runs (123), averaged the fewest pitches per inning (15.8) and are tied for the most shutouts (11).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than six innings in four consecutive games, which is their second longest such streak this year...began the season by doing it in five straight games...are 0-3 with a 7.08 ERA (16 er in 20.1 ip) over the last four games and 4-4 with a 4.67 ERA (36 er in 69.1 ip) in the month of August...are 45-40 with a 3.71 ERA (281 er in 681.0 ip) overall...rank third in the American League in ERA and wins and fourth in opponents OPS (.688)...lead the majors in innings pitched (681.0) and are tied for third in complete games (3)...have used just eight starting pitchers, which is tied with the Reds and Astros for second fewest in the majors (Red Sox, 7).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has a 1.96 ERA (22 er in 101.0 ip) and .178 (63-for-354) opponents batting average over the last 32 games dating back to July 7...has a 3.55 ERA overall, which is second lowest in the American League...also has the second lowest opponents OPS (.659)...had two blown saves in the three games at Texas and is now 29-for-46 (63.0%) in save opportunities for the season...has just 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.430) and the fourth highest batting average (.243) but has the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.306).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .276 (126-for-457) in August, which is second best in the American League to the Red Sox (.288)...lead the AL in on-base percentage (.366), OPS (.846) and fewest strikeouts (95), rank second in runs (83) and third in slugging (.479), home runs (22) and stolen bases (16)...have homered in all 13 games this month, which is their second longest streak of consecutive games with a home run this year (14, June 10-24)...overall, the A's have been hit by a pitch an American League leading 75 times, which is 23 more than the next closest team, the White Sox (52)...the hit by pitches are fourth most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019, 76 in 2018)...rank second in the AL in stolen base percentage (82.4%) and fifth in walks (406), sacrifice hits (15), sacrifice flies (35), fewest strikeouts (1014) and fewest grounded into double plays (74)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (24), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (113), are tied for the lead in home runs (3) and rank second in RBI (17) and extra base hits (6).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have made eight errors in the last eight games but have just 53 for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the majors to the Astros (48)...are on pace for 72 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...are tied for the third fewest outfield assists in the American League (11) and have the fifth fewest double plays (89).

CLOSE CALLS AND NOT SO CLOSE: The A's have 16 wins since the All-Star Break, 12 of which have been by three runs or more...are 43-23 (.652) in games decided by three runs or more compared to 25-28 (.472) in games decided by two runs or fewer...are 17-19 (.472) in one-run games, which includes 11-7 at home and 6-12 on the road...lead the American League in one-run losses (19) and rank third in games (36)...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with the Red Sox for the second best record in the AL (Mariners, 10-4/.714)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 15-7 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Mariners for the second most walk-off wins in the majors (10) to the Rockies (11)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-3 on this 10-game road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (1-2) and Chicago-AL (0-1)...this is the A's second consecutive 10-game road trip as they went 5-5 on the last trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-1)...this trip concludes a stretch that began on July 6 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games on the road...after this trip, the A's have 22 home games and 18 road games remaining...are 34-26 (.567) on the road and 34-25 (.576) at home...the road record is third best in the American League...return home following the game Thursday for a nine-game homestand against San Francisco (three games), Seattle (two games) and New York-AL (four games)...went 4-1 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (3-0) and have won six of their last seven home games.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's have a 3.60 ERA (208 er in 520.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...are batting .248 (517-for-2086) with a .746 OPS on the road compared to .226 with a .707 OPS at home...have the third best road batting average and fourth best road OPS in the AL but the second lowest home batting average and third lowest home OPS.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 27-18 (.600) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 41-33 (.554) against righties...the mark against lefties is second best in the AL to the White Sox (21-12/.636)...are 4-3 in this stretch of 15 games in 15 days from Aug. 10-24...have used a different lineup in each of the last 56 games and have 116 different lineups over the first 119 contests.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's lost the first meeting of 2021 last night...the two clubs squared off in the American League Wild Card Series last year, with the A's winning two of three in Oakland...the A's won the season series in 2019, 5-1...went 3-0 in Oakland and 2-1 in Chicago...it was their third consecutive season series win over the White Sox and Oakland is 15-5 against Chicago dating back to 2017...have won seven of the last 11 games in Chicago...have an eight-game winning streak in Oakland, which is the second longest Coliseum winning streak against Chicago in Oakland history (10, May 18, 2001-May 6, 2003)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 317-291 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 167-138 in Oakland and 150-153 in Chicago...including 68-65 at Guaranteed Rate Field...all-time, the A's are 994-1046 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks third among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.441) and slugging percentage (.216) and seventh in on-base percentage (.225), batting average (.154) and ERA (1.70)...**Starling Marte** is batting a ML leading .398 (45-for-113) since the All-Star Break...also leads the majors in steals since the break (16) and ranks fourth in on-base percentage (.443)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.946) and slugging percentage (.570), tied for third in home runs (30), tied for fourth in extra base hits (58), sixth in on-base percentage (.377), tied for sixth in RBI (79), tied for seventh in doubles (28) and runs (76) and eighth in walks (59)...**Lou Trivino** has converted each of his last 12 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 0.93 ERA (3 er in 29.0 ip) and .188 (19-for-101) opponents batting average in 28 games over that span.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1934** Ed Coleman hits three consecutive home runs in the first game of a doubleheader against Chicago, a 9-8, 10 inning A's win...in **1980** Brian Kingman tosses the A's Oakland record ninth consecutive complete game in the A's 4-3 loss at Seattle...in **1987** Reggie Jackson hits the 563rd and final home run of his career against his teammates from the previous season, the California Angels...he homers off Mike Witt, but the A's would go on to lose, 6-4...in **1990** Bob Welch wins his 20th game of the season en route to a club record 27 wins and the AL Cy Young...the 27 wins are the most by an American League pitcher since Denny McClain's 31 in 1968.

39 LHP ANDREW CHAFIN

Last Outing: 8/14 at Texas (W/BS, 1.2 ip, h, bb)
Saves/Opportunities: 1-3

Inherited Runners/Scored: 24/8 **First Hitters:** 7-48 (2 bb, sf)

- Was acquired from the Cubs on July 26 and has not allowed a run in eight games with the A's (8.1 ip, 4 h, 1 bb, 8 so)...however, has allowed 3-of-4 inherited runners to score and has a win, save and blown save.
- Has not allowed a run in 34 of his last 35 appearances (3 er in 32.2 ip, 0.83 ERA) and 47 of 51 overall.
- Ranks third among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.441) and slugging percentage (.216) and seventh in on-base percentage (.225), batting average (.154) and ERA (1.70).
- Has not allowed a home run in his last 41 games (38.2 innings) and has yielded just one home run in 47.2 innings overall...his average of 0.19 home runs per nine innings is tied for sixth lowest among ML relievers.
- Has a 0.72 ERA (2 er in 25.0 ip) in 27 appearances on one day of rest or fewer, a 2.86 ERA (7 er in 22.0 ip) in 23 games on two days rest or more.
- Has not allowed a run in the eighth inning (23.2 ip).
- Has not allowed a run in three career appearances against Chicago (2.1 ip, 1 h, 5 so), including two last year with the Cubs
- Retired the side in order in the 10th inning a week ago tonight at Cleveland for his fourth career save, his first since Sept. 27, 2020 against the White Sox.
- Was 0-2 with a 2.06 ERA in 43 relief appearances for Chicago (NL) when he was traded to Oakland along with cash considerations for Greg Deichmann and minor leaguer Daniel Palencia.

Last Year: Combined for a 1-2 record, one save and a 6.52 ERA in 15 relief appearances with the Diamondbacks and Cubs...missed a month of the season from Aug. 19 to Sept. 18 with a sprained left finger.

35 LHP JAKE DIEKMAN

Last Outing: 8/15 at Texas (ND, 1.0 ip, so)
Saves/Opportunities: 7-12

Inherited Runners/Scored: 9/4 **First Hitters:** 8-40, 5 bb, 3 hbp

- Has a 2.61 ERA (6 er in 20.2 ip) and .186 (13-for-70) opponents batting average over his last 24 games dating back to June 4.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .180 (18-for-100) average but they have hit five of the career-high six home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 4.12 ERA (9 er in 19.2 ip) and .240 (18-for-75) opponents batting average in 22 outings on one day rest or fewer, a 1.52 ERA (4 er in 23.2 ip) and .139 (11-for-79) opponents average in 25 appearances on two days of rest or more.
- Pitched in all three games of the ALWCS against Chicago last year (1.2 ip, 2 bb, 1 so), earning the save in Game 2.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

65 RHP DEOLIS GUERRA

Last Outing: 8/16 at Chicago-AL (ND, 1.0 ip, h, r, er, so, hr, hb)
Saves/Opportunities: 0-0

Inherited Runners/Scored: 7/2 **First Hitters:** 6-31, 2 bb, hbp

- Has allowed five runs in his last five games (5.0 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 6 so) after an eight-game, 7.2-inning scoreless streak.
- Has a .149 (10-for-67) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .238 (20-for-84) against right-handers...has issued 10 of his 12 walks and yielded three of his four home runs to righties for a .704 OPS...has a .425 OPS against lefties.
- Opponents are batting .172 (5-for-29) with runners in scoring position.
- Last night was his first appearance against the White Sox since 2017.
- Has a career high in strikeouts (38) and has matched his high in walks (12).

Last Year: Was claimed off waivers from Milwaukee by Philadelphia on Feb. 5 and made the Phillies Opening Day roster...went 1-3 with an 8.59 ERA in nine relief appearances before he was designated for assignment on Aug. 22.

Inherited Runners/Scored: 31/11 **First Hitters:** 16-54, 4 bb, sf

- Has allowed at least one run in three of his last five games (4.2 ip, 3 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 1 so, 2 hr, 7.71 ERA).
- Leads the majors in games pitched (59)...is tied for the lead among American League relievers in wins (8), ranks second in innings pitched (60.1), third in fewest walks per nine innings (1.49) and ninth in most inherited runners (31)...is averaging the fewest strikeouts per nine innings in the majors among relievers (4.33).
- Opponents are hitting .175 (11-for-63) with runners in scoring position.
- Has allowed eight home runs, four of which have come to his first batter faced in an outing, which is tied for the most in the majors.
- Faced the White Sox twice in the ALWCS last year (2.1 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 so).

Last Year: Compiled a career-low 1.66 ERA in a team-leading 26 relief appearances...opponents hit .232 and he walked just five batters for a .273 on-base percentage...yielded four runs, three of which scored on solo home runs.

Inherited Runners/Scored: 2/0 **First Hitters:** 0-5

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas a week ago today for his second stint with the A's this year and has pitched four times since his return (4.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 4 so).
- Has not allowed a run in five games overall and now has a career-high 8.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 27, 2019.
- Last night was his first career outing against the White Sox.
- Was first recalled for the first time on April 5, pitched in relief that day against the Dodgers, and was placed on the 10-day injured list April 8 retroactive to April 6 with a strained left biceps...had a five-game rehab assignment before he was reinstated and optioned to Las Vegas May 28.
- Had a 1.64 ERA over his final 13 games at Triple-A dating back to June 26...allowed a .308 opponents batting average overall, including .231 against left-handed hitters and .374 against right-handers...surrendered seven of his 10 home runs to righties...his complete 2021 stats with Las Vegas:

Last Year: Made two starts during the spring and did not allow a run before he was shut down with a shoulder injury...began the season on the IL and eventually underwent surgery on the left shoulder on Sept. 16.

54 RHP SERGIO ROMO

Last Outing: 8/13 at Texas (BS, 1.0 ip, h, r, er, bb, hr)
Saves/Opportunities: 0-2

Inherited Runners/Scored: 22/11 **First Hitters:** 14-45, bb, 2 hbp

- Had his 17.2 inning scoreless streak snapped last Friday at Texas when he allowed a first batter three-run home run to Pozo...opponents were 3-for-53 (.057) during the scoreless streak.
- Now has a 0.93 ERA (3 er in 29.0 ip) and .126 (12-for-95) opponents batting average over his last 30 games dating back to May 25 after compiling a 7.63 ERA and .290 opponents average over his first 18 contests.
- Ranks fifth among American League relievers in opponents OPS (.557) and 10th in slugging percentage (.293) and on-base percentage (.264)...has the third highest percentage of inherited runners scored (50.0%).
- Has a 1.82 ERA (5 er in 24.2 ip) in 25 games on zero or one day of rest, a 5.30 ERA (11 er in 18.2 ip) in 22 outings on two days rest or more.
- First batters faced are 2-for-21 (.095) with nine strikeouts over his last 21 games after going 12-for-24 (.500) with a walk and two hit by pitches over his first 27 contests.
- Faced the White Sox three times last year while pitching for Minnesota (2.1 ip, 2 h)...has a 1.50 ERA (2 er in 12.0 ip) in 13 career appearances against Chicago.

- Has not allowed a run in five of his last six outings (12.1 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 5 so, 1.46 ERA).
- Has stranded all eight of his inherited runners this year and each of his last 14 dating back to Sept. 11, 2019...last allowed an inherited runner to score on Sept. 5, 2019.
- Has pitched at least two innings in nine of his 25 outings.
- Has faced the White Sox five times in his career, all in 2018 while pitching for Kansas City (8.1 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 8 so, 3 hr, 6.48 ERA).

Last Year: Made the A's Opening Day roster and was 2-0 with a save, a 2.25 ERA and .163 opponents batting average in six relief appearances before his season was cut short in mid-August with a forearm injury.

62 RHP LOU TRIVINO

Saves/Opportunities: 19-21

Inherited Runners/Scored: 14/2 **First Hitters:** 10-47, 5 bb

- Has converted each of his last 12 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 0.93 ERA (3 er in 29.0 ip) and .188 (19-for-101) opponents batting average in 28 games over that span.
- Is 19-for-21 (90.5%) in save opportunities...ranks fourth in the American League in save percentage and tied for fifth in saves.
- Has a 0.72 ERA (3 er in 37.1 ip) over his last 36 games and now has a 1.81 ERA for the season, which ranks fifth among AL relievers.
- Ranks sixth among AL relievers in opponents OPS (.562), tied for seventh in innings pitched (54.2), eighth in slugging (.271) and 10th in games (52).
- Has a .164 (18-for-110) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .232 (19-for-82) against left-handers.
- Opponents are hitting .136 (8-for-59) with runners in scoring position.
- Has a 0.36 ERA (1 er in 24.2 ip) on the road, a 0.76 ERA (2 er in 23.2 ip) during the day and a 0.73 ERA (3 er in 37.0 ip) in the ninth inning.
- Allowed both of his inherited runners to score in his second game on April 3 but has stranded all 12 of his inherited runners since then.
- Has allowed just one home run over his last 41 games (41.2 innings).
- Faced the White Sox once last year in the ALWCS in Game 3 (0.2 ip, hb)...has not allowed a run in four regular season appearances against Chicago (6.2 ip, 5 h, 1 bb, 11 so).

Last Year: Compiled a 3.86 ERA in 20 relief appearances and held the opposition to a career-low .193 batting average...issued 10 walks in 23.1 innings for a career-low .280 on-base percentage...struck out 26 for a career-best 10.03 strikeouts per nine innings.

- Is hitting .255 (67-for-264) with all three of his home runs against right-handed pitchers, .185 (24-for-130) against left-handers.
- For his career, is hitting .226 (62-for-274) with a .602 OPS in 70 career games against the White Sox.

Last Year: Was hampered by a back injury for much of the season and batted .194 with three home runs and seven RBI in 29 games with Texas...had two stints on the 10-day injured list with the back injury (Aug. 20-30 and Sept. 12-end of season).

Road Trip: 6-23, 5 r, 2 2b, 2 hr, 5 rbi, bb, 8 so

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas on Aug. 6 for his second stint with the A's this year...hit .199 with 12 home runs and 30 RBI in 79 games during his first stint from April 6 to July 31.
- Went 4-for-14 (.286) with a double, triple and RBI in three games with the Aviators following his Aug. 1 option...appeared in one game in left field, one at designated hitter and one at right field.
- Is fifth among American League rookies in home runs (15).
- Is batting .211 (42-for-199) against right-handed pitchers, .167 (3-for-18) against left-handers...has made 54 of his 55 starts this year and 71 of 73 in his career in games in which the opponent starts a right-handed pitcher.
- Is batting .252 (26-for-103) at home, .167 (19-for-114) on the road.
- More than half of his hits are for extra bases (25-of-45, 55.6%)...35 of his 67 (52.2%) career hits are extra base hits.
- Is 4-for-19 (.211) with a double, home run, four RBI, a walk and a sacrifice fly as a pinch hitter...is first among AL pinch hitters in plate appearances (21), and is tied for fourth in RBI and tied for fifth in hits.
- Has started games at four different positions (41 in right field, nine in left field, three at designated hitter, two at first base).

Last Year: Went 0-for-5 with two strikeouts in seven games over three stints with Oakland...all five of his plate appearances came against right-handed pitchers...made just one start and went 0-for-2 as the A's designated hitter.

20 MARK CANHA

Current Streak: 2 games (3 for 3)

Chicago-AL Series: 2-5, rbi, so

Road Trip: 4-28, 3 r, 2b, hr, 5 rbi, 2 bb, 5 so, hbp

- Was reinstated from the injured list July 17 and had reached base safely in 23 of his 25 games since his return...is 21-for-95 (.221) and has 15 walks and eight hit by pitches.
- Was hit by a pitch for the 21st time Wednesday night, which set a new Athletics single-season record for hit by pitches and is the most in the majors this year.
- Ranks seventh in the American League in on-base percentage (.377) and has a .386 on-base percentage over the last three years, which is eighth best in the majors (min. 900 PA).
