OAKLAND ATHLETICS (68-53) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (71-50)

THURSDAY, AUGUST 19, 2021 — GUARANTEED RATE FIELD — 1:10 CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four straight and five of the last six games after winning seven in a row...are 9-6 in August, 12-7 over the last 19 games and 16-13 since the All-Star Break...are 68-53 (.571) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 55th consecutive day (dating back to June 21) and trail first place Houston by 2½ games for the sixth consecutive day...are in a virtual tie for the second AL Wild Card spot with the Red Sox...have held at least a share of a playoff spot every day dating back to April 17...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 55 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

AGAINST THE BEST: The A's will play seven games this week, all against teams currently leading their division...after this four-game series with the White Sox, the A's return home to host a three-game series with the Giants...have a 16-26 (.381) record against teams currently leading their divisions or holding at least a share of a wild card spot compared to 52-27 (.658) against all other teams.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 16-7 (.696) against American League Central teams, which is the best record in the majors...are batting .247 (185-for-748) and are averaging 5.26 runs per game (121 runs in 23 games) against teams from the Central compared to .234 with an average of 4.3 runs per game against all other teams...have a 3.22 ERA (72 er in 201.0 ip) against the Central, 3.81 against everyone else...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 81-27 (.750) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 35 runs and 59 hits over the last six games after yielding just 17 runs and 41 hits during their seven-game winning streak...have a 3.70 ERA overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have the third lowest opponents OPS (.680) and slugging percentage (.380) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.301)...have issued the fewest walks (324), allowed the fewest home runs (125), averaged the fewest pitches per inning (15.8) and are tied for the most shutouts (11).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than six innings in a season high six consecutive games...are 0-5 with an 7.42 ERA (22 er in 26.2 ip) over that span and 45-42 with a 3.76 ERA (287 er in 687.1 ip) overall...rank fourth in the American League in ERA and fourth in opponents OPS (.688)...lead the majors in innings pitched (687.1) and are tied for third in complete games (3)...have used just nine starting pitchers, which is tied for fourth fewest.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has a 2.27 ERA (28 er in 110.2 ip) and .190 (75-for-393) opponents batting average over the last 34 contests dating back to July 7...has a 3.60 ERA overall, which is third lowest in the American League... also has the third lowest opponents OPS (.665) in the AL...is now 29-for-46 (63.0%) in save opportunities...has just 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .264 (137-for-518) in August, which is third best in the American League to the Red Sox (.276) and Rays (.266)...lead the AL in on-base percentage (.356) and fewest strikeouts (110) this month, rank second in OPS (.812), third in stolen bases (16) and fourth in slugging (.456), and home runs (23)...grounded into a season-high four double plays Tuesday night and have hit into at least one double play in each of the last 13 games (19 GIDP total), which ties the Oakland Athletics record of 13 from May 30-June 14, 1969...have been hit by a pitch an AL leading 76 times, which is 24 more than the next closest teams, the White Sox and Mariners (52)...the hit by pitches are tied for third most in Oakland A's history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019, 76 in 2018)...rank third in the American League in stolen base percentage (82.9%), tied for thir din sacrifice flies (36), fifth in sacrifice hits (15) and fewest strikeouts (1029) and tied for fifth in walks (414)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (25), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (117), are tied for the lead in home runs (3) and rank second in RBI (17) and extra base hits (6).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have made eight errors in the last 10 games but have just 53 for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the majors to the Astros (48)...are on pace for 71 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...are tied for the third fewest outfield assists in the American League (11) and tied for the fifth fewest double plays (91).

CLOSE CALLS AND NOT SO CLOSE: The A's have 16 wins since the All-Star Break, 12 of which have been by three runs or more...are 43-24 (.642) in games de-

cided by three runs or more compared to 25-29 (.462) in games decided by two runs or fewer...are 17-20 (.459) in one-run games, which includes 11-7 at home and 6-13 on the road...lead the American League in one-run losses (20) and are third in games (37)...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with the Red Sox for the second best record in the AL (Mariners, 10-4/.714)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 15-7 in games decided in the last at bat... are tied with the Mariners for the second most walk-off wins in the majors (10) to the Rockies (11)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-5 on this 10-game road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (1-2) and Chicago-AL (0-3)...this is the A's second consecutive 10-game road trip as they went 5-5 on the last trip to Seattle (1-3), San Diego (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-1)...this trip concludes a stretch that began on July 6 where the A's are scheduled to play 26 of 36 games away from home... after this trip, the A's have 22 home games and 18 road games remaining in the regular season...are 34-28 (.548) on the road and 34-25 (.576) at home... the road record is third best in the American League...return home following the game today for a nine-game homestand against San Francisco (three games), Seattle (two games) and New York-AL (four games)...went 4-1 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (3-0) and have won six of their last seven home games.

HOME AND AWAY SPLITS: The A's have a 3.69 ERA (217 er in 528.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...are batting .246 (528-for-2147) with a .740 OPS on the road compared to .226 with a .707 OPS at home...have the fifth best road batting average and fourth best road OPS in the AL but the second lowest home batting average and fourth lowest home OPS.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 27-18 (.600) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 41-35 (.539) against righties...the mark against lefties is second best in the AL to the White Sox (21-12/.636)...are 4-5 in this stretch of 15 games in 15 days from Aug. 10-24...have used a different lineup in each of the last 58 games and have 118 different lineups over the first 121 contests.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's have lost the first three meetings of 2021...the two clubs squared off in the American League Wild Card Series last year, with the A's winning two of three in Oakland...the A's won the season series in 2019, 5-1...went 3-0 in Oakland and 2-1 in Chicago...it was their third consecutive season series win over the White Sox and Oakland is 15-7 against Chicago dating back to 2017...have an eight-game winning streak in Oakland, which is the second longest Coliseum winning streak against Chicago in Oakland history (10, May 18, 2001-May 6, 2003)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 317-293 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 167-138 in Oakland and 150-155 in Chicago...including 68-67 at Guaranteed Rate Field...all-time, the A's are 994-1048 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin is fourth among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.454) and slugging percentage (.223), seventh in ERA (1.66) and ninth in on-base percentage (.231) and tied for eighth in batting average (.163)... Starling Marte has started each of his 18 games with the A's in center field and is 28-for-78 (.359) with 12 runs, 12 stolen bases and eight multiple hit games...Matt Olson ranks third in the American League in OPS (.939) and slugging percentage (.563), is tied for third in home runs (30), tied for fourth in extra base hits (58), tied for fifth in sacrifice flies (7), tied for seventh in doubles (28) and RBI (79), seventh in on-base percentage (.376), tied for eighth in runs (76) and is sixth in walks (61)...Lou Trivino has converted each of his last 12 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 0.90 ERA (3 er in 30.0 ip) and .184 (19-for-103) opponents batting average in 29 games over that span

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1931** Lefty Grove wins his 16th consecutive game, tying the American League record set by Walter Johnson and Joe Wood in 1912...in **1989**, in the midst of a 19-game hitting streak, Carney Lansford records his 1000th hit in an A's uniform...in **1991** Jose Canseco hits his 200th career home run in the A's 8-7 win at Minnesota...he becomes the second Oakland Athletic and fifth Athletic all-time to reach the 200 plateau...in **2010** Trevor Cahill allows seven hits, ending a modern major league record tying stretch of 20 consecutive starts with six hits or fewer and five innings or more.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (8-11, 3.52 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Has compiled a 2.98 ERA (18 er in 54.1 ip), .229 (47-for-205) opponents batting average and allowed just two home runs over his last nine starts dating back to June 22...however, is just 4-4 over that span...ranks fifth in the American League in opponents OPS (.665), sixth in slugging percentage (.364) and eighth in ERA (3.52), but is tied for fifth in most losses (11)...is the first A's pitcher to lose 11 games since 2017 when Daniel Gossett also lost 11.

DON'T WALK: Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 23 starts, which is the second longest such streak by a starting pitcher in Oakland history... the longest is 26 by Gil Heredia from April 10-Aug. 28, 1999...has issued just 25 free passes in 135.1 innings, an average of 1.66 walks per nine innings...that is the third lowest mark in the majors...ranks seventh in the AL in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.84) but is averaging the fourth fewest strikeouts per nine innings (6.38)...is averaging 14.6 pitches per inning, which are the fewest in the majors (Wainwright, STL 14.8)...has walked just 39 batters in 180.2 career innings (1.94 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed 11 home runs in 135.1 innings and his average of 0.73 home runs per nine innings is third lowest in the American League...eight of the 11 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots... eight have come at home...has hit nine batters, which is tied for fourth most in the AL...opponents are hitting .317 (32-for-101) with runners in scoring position, which is second highest in the AL.

SUPPORT: Left his last start with a 4-3 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was the fourth time this year he left with the lead only to have the bullpen blow the save...has received two runs of support or fewer in five of his last 12 starts...is 8-2 in 12 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-9 in 11 starts with support of two runs or fewer.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 7-4 with a 2.45 ERA (23 er in 84.1 ip) in 14 starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-6 with a 5.01 ERA (26 er in 46.2 ip) in eight starts on four days rest...eight of the 11 home runs he has allowed have come on four days rest.

THIS AND THAT: Is 1-0 with a 0.96 ERA (2 er in 18.2 ip) in three starts against American League Central teams...the A's are 3-1 in his no decisions and are 11-12 in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and lost each of his first two starts, allowing four runs in each contest for a 7.45 ERA...went 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA over his first two starts on April 3 and 8, both against Houston...did not pitch again until April 17 against Detroit when he combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in a 7-0 win... it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...that began a four-start stretch where he went 3-1 with a 1.42 ERA and .232 opponents batting average through May 4...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his start against the Tigers and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...lost on April 28 at Tampa Bay but then picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102) against the Blue Jays...then went 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA and .284 opponents batting average over his next five starts from May 9 to 30...the losing streak matched his career high (also May 22, 2019-April 8, 2021)...left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of four times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (June 11 vs. Kansas City, July 9 at Texas, Aug. 13 at Texas)...allowed a season-high five runs in an 8-4 loss to Houston on May 20...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings of work in a 4-3 loss to Seattle on May 25...went 1-4 with a 4.46 ERA in six starts in May...tied for second in the American League in losses in May...then compiled a 3-0 record and a 2.64 ERA in five starts in the month of June...the ERA was fourth lowest in the American League and the three-game winning streak was the longest of his career...allowed a run in the first inning on June 5 at Colorado and did not allow another run until the seventh inning of his next start on June 11 against Kansas City for a career-high tying 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and did not allow a run in a 6-2 win at San Francisco on June 27...did not allow a run over the first three innings of his next start on July 3 against Boston for another 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters (13th time, last: Bassitt, April 29, 2021 at Tampa Bay) in a 3-2 loss at Texas on July 9...tossed 4.0 innings in a 4-3 loss at Seattle on July 25...it was the shortest start of his career...finished July with a 1-3 record despite a 3.07 ERA and .227 opponents batting average.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-6 loss at Texas last Friday... allowed a season-high tying five runs on eight hits in 5.0 innings...surrendered three runs in the first inning on an error, a RBI ground out and a Peters sacrifice fly...blanked the Rangers on four hits and a walk over the next four innings and had a 4-3 lead when the first two batters in the sixth inning

2020 RECAP: Had two stints with Philadelphia and was 0-1 with a 17.18 ERA in three relief appearances...opponents went 11-for-21 (.524) but he walked just one and struck out four in 3.2 innings...allowed a .438 (7-for-16) average against right-handed hitters compared to .800 (4-for-5) against left-handers...was 2-0 with a 4.50 ERA in four spring training appearances... was optioned to Lehigh Valley March 26 but was recalled on July 23 and was on the Phillies Opening Day roster...was optioned to Philadelphia's alternate site on Aug. 9, recalled for a second time Aug. 20, pitched the next day and was optioned again on Aug. 22...did not pitch the remainder of the season.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP James Kaprielian (6-4, 3.33 ERA): Was reinstated from the injured list on Aug. 8 and is 1-0 with a 3.97 ERA in two starts since his return...was 5-4 with a 3.24 ERA in 13 starts when he was placed on the 10-day IL July 31 retroactive to July 28 with a right shoulder impingement...missed just one start and did not have a rehab assignment...based on a minimum of 70 innings pitched, he ranks second among American League rookies in ERA (3.33), opponents OPS (.675) and on-base percentage (.289), and third in slugging percentage (.387) and batting average (.219)...has allowed a .183 batting average with runners in scoring position...had a no decision in his last start, an 8-3 A's win at Cleveland last Saturday (5.1 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 0 so)...has faced San Francisco once in his career and it came in relief last year on Aug. 16 at Oracle Park in his Major League debut...his line was 2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 so.

- Was acquired from the Cubs on July 26 and has not allowed a run in nine games with the A's (9.1 ip, 6 h, 1 bb, 9 so)...however, has allowed 3-of-4 inherited runners to score and has a win, save and blown save.
- Has not allowed a run in 35 of his last 36 appearances (3 er in 33.2 ip, 0.80 ERA) and 48 of 52 overall.
- Ranks fourth among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.454) and slugging percentage (.223), seventh in ERA (1.66) and ninth in on-base per-
- centage (.231) and tied for eighth batting average (.163). Has not allowed a home run in his last 42 games (39.2 innings) and has yielded just one home run in 48.2 innings overall...his average of 0.18 home runs per nine innings is sixth lowest among ML relievers.
- Has a 0.72 ERA (2 er in 25.0 ip) in 27 appearances on one day of rest or fewer, a 2.74 ERA (7 er in 23.0 ip) in 24 games on two days rest or more. Has not allowed a run in the eighth inning (24.2 ip).
- Has not allowed a run in four career appearances against Chicago (3.1 ip, 3 h, 6 so), including two last year with the Cubs
