OAKLAND ATHLETICS (69-53) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (78-43)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their four-game losing streak yesterday and are now 2-5 over the last seven games after winning seven in a row...are 10-6 in August, 13-7 over the last 20 games and 17-13 since the All-Star Break...are 69-53 (.566) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 56th consecutive day (dating back to June 21) and trail first place Houston by 2½ games for the seventh consecutive day...currently have the second AL Wild Card...are one game behind the first Wild Card (Yankees) and ½-game ahead of the third place team (Red Sox)...have held at least a share of a playoff spot every day dating back to April 17...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 56 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

AGAINST THE BEST: The A's will play seven games this week, all against teams currently leading their division...lost three of four at Chicago (AL) to start the week and open a three-game series with San Francisco tonight...are 14-23 (.378) against teams currently leading their divisions or holding a wild card spot compared to 55-30 (.647) against all other teams.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's conclude interleague play with this three-game series against San Francisco...are 10-7 (.588) against the National League West, which is tied for the ninth best interleague record in the majors...have clinched at least a .500 record in interleague play for the fourth consecutive season and need one more win to finishing with a winning record against the NL for the 15th time in 25 years of interleague games...A's pitchers rank 14th in the majors in opponents OPS (.715) and 16th in ERA (4.25)...A's hitters have the 10th lowest batting average (.240) and OPS (.695)...have 16 stolen bases, which ranks third in the majors and ties the Oakland interleague record set in 2011...are 248-213 (.538) all-time in interleague games, which is fourth best in Major League history.

PITCHING: The A's have a 5.59 ERA (36 er in 58.0 ip) and .288 (67-for-233) opponents batting average over the last seven games but have a 3.69 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.379) and the fourth lowest OPS (.680) and on-base percentage...have issued the fewest walks (329), allowed the fewest home runs (126) and averaged the fewest pitches per inning (15.8)...are tied for the most shutouts (11).

STARTING PITCHING: Cole Irvin tossed 6.0 innings yesterday to snap a season-high streak of six consecutive games of fewer than six innings from the starting pitchers...A's starters are now 1-5 with a 6.89 ERA (25 er in 32.2 ip) and .331 (46-for-139) opponents batting average over the last seven games...are 46-42 with a 3.76 ERA (290 er in 693.1 ip) overall...rank third in the American League in wins and fourth in ERA and opponents OPS (.690)...lead the majors in innings pitched (693.0) and are tied for third in complete games (3)...the A's have used just nine starting pitchers, which is tied for fourth fewest in the majors...are the only team with four pitchers with 24 or more starts...no other team has more than two.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has a 2.22 ERA (28 er in 113.2 ip) and .188 (76-for-404) opponents batting average over the last 35 games dating back to July 7...has a 3.57 ERA overall, which is third lowest in the American League...has the second lowest opponents OPS (.662)...is 30-for-47 (63.8%) in save opportunities...has just 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.429) and the third highest batting average (.246)...has the fourth highest percentage of inherited runners scored (36.9%).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 22-for-24 (91.7%) in stolen base attempts in the 19 games since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29...are tied with Cleveland for the second most stolen bases in the majors over that span (Kansas City, 24)...are 65-for-78 (83.3%) for the season...are tied for the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and tied for fifth in steals...the 65 steals are the most by an A's team since 2015 (78).

OFFENSE: The A's hit .183 (23-for-126), including .115 (3-for-26) with runners in scoring position, in the four-game series at Chicago and scored just nine runs...batted .308, including .346 with RISP, over the previous eight games and scored 63 runs...did not ground into a double play yesterday, snapping an Oakland record tying streak of 13 consecutive games with at least one GIDP (May 30-June 14, 1969)...lead the American League in on-base percentage (.354) and hit by pitches (16) in August, are tied for the fewest strikeouts (118), rank second in OPS (.810) and tied for second in stolen bases (20)...overall, have been hit by a pitch 76 times, which is the most in the AL, third most in the majors and tied for third most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019, 76 in 2018)...are tied for fourth in the AL in sacrifice flies (36) and rank fifth in walks (421), sacrifice hits (15) and fewest strikeouts (1037)...A's

pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (25), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (117), are tied for the lead in home runs (3) and rank second in RBI (17) and extra base hits (6).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have made nine errors in the last 11 games but have just 54 for the season, which is second fewest in the American League to the Astros (48)...are on pace for 72 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...are tied for the third fewest outfield assists in the AL (11).

CLOSE CALLS AND NOT SO CLOSE: Each of the A's last two games have been decided by one run...the A's are 18-20 (.474) in one-run games, which includes 11-7 at home and 7-13 on the road...lead the American League in one-run losses (20) and are third in games (38)...are 26-29 (.473) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 43-24 (.642) in games decided by three runs...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with the Red Sox for the second best record in the AL (Mariners, 11-4/.733)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 15-7 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Mariners for the second most walk-off wins in the majors (10) to the Rockies (11)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a nine-game homestand against San Francisco (three games), Seattle (two games) and New York-AL (four games) tonight...went 4-1 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (3-0) and have won six of their last seven home games...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (1-2) and Chicago-AL (1-3) to concluded a stretch that began on July 6 where the A's played 26 of 36 games on the road...have 22 home games and 18 road games remaining...are 34-25 (.576) at home compared to 35-28 (.556) on the road...are batting .226 (421-for-1866) with a .707 OPS at home compared to .245 with a .741 OPS on the road...have the second lowest home batting average and third lowest home OPS in the American League but the fourth highest road OPS and fifth highest road batting average.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 27-18 (.600) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 42-35 (.545) against righties...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to the White Sox (21-13/.618)...are 5-5 in this stretch of 15 games in 15 days from Aug. 10-24...have used a different lineup in each of the last 59 games and have 119 different lineups over the first 122 contests.

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's lost two of three at San Francisco from June 25-27 to open the season series...won the season series last year, 5-1...it matched their best record against the Giants (2007)...won two of three in Oakland and swept a three-game series in San Francisco...in the previous 24 seasons of interleague play, the A's have won nine season series, lost five and split 10...are 70-63 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 38-27 in Oakland and 32-36 in San Francisco...are 28-33 at Oracle Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks fourth among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.450) and slugging percentage (.219), sixth in ERA (1.63), eighth in batting average (.160) and 10th in on-base percentage (.231)...**Matt Chapman** homered in the same game as Matt Olson for the 21st time yesterday...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last pair of A's teammates to homer that many times in the same game were Miguel Tejada and Jason Giambi, who went long in the same game 22 times from 1998 to 2001...**Starling Marte** is batting .382 (47-for-123) with 18 stolen bases in 30 games since the All-Star Break...lead the majors in steals since the break and ranks second in batting...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.943) and slugging percentage (.567), fourth in home runs (31) and extra base hits (59), tied for fifth in sacrifice flies (7), sixth in on-base percentage (.376) and walks (62), seventh in RBI (81), tied for seventh in doubles (28) and tied for eighth in runs (77)...**Lou Trivino** has converted each of his last 13 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 0.87 ERA (3 er in 31.0 ip) and .185 (20-for-108) opponents batting average in 30 games over that span.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1959** Bob Cerv hits three home runs in Kansas City's 11-10 loss to Boston...in **1963** the A's sweep a doubleheader from Washington...Moe Drabowsky tosses a one-hit shutout in a 9-0 win in Game 1 and Jerry Lumpe hits a two-run home run in the bottom of the 14th inning of Game 2, a 7-5 victory...in **1987** Jose Canseco ties an Oakland record with three doubles, but the A's lose 7-6 to Toronto.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (6-4, 3.33 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the injured list on Aug. 8 and is 1-0 with a 3.97 ERA (5 er in 11.1 ip) in two starts since his return...was 5-4 with a 3.24 ERA in 13 starts when he was placed on the 10-day IL July 31 retroactive to July 28 with a right shoulder impingement...missed just one start and did not have a rehab assignment...began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and was recalled by the A's on May 12.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Is tied for sixth among American League Rookies in wins (6) and ranks eighth in innings pitched (83.2), strikeouts (83) and games started (14)...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, his 3.33 ERA is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors...also ranks third in the AL in opponents OPS (.675) and on-base percentage (.289) and fourth in slugging percentage (.387) and batting average (.219).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .219 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .185 (30-for-162) with a .560 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .257 (38-for-148) with a .797 OPS against left-handers...has issued 21 of his 29 walks to lefties...has allowed a .183 (11-for-60) batting average with runners in scoring position...eight of the 11 home runs he has surrendered have been solo shots...has a .153 (19-for-124) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .286 (34-for-119) the second time and .224 (15-for-67) after that...has allowed four of his 11 home runs to the opponents clean-up hitter but has held the five hitter to a .056 (2-for-36) batting average.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-2 with a 1.42 ERA (6 er in 38.0 ip) and .169 (23-for-136) opponents batting average in six starts at home compared to 2-2 with a 4.93 ERA (25 er in 45.2 ip) and .259 (45-for-174) opponents average in nine starts on the road...has yielded nine of his 11 home runs on the road for an .805 OPS...has a .509 opponents OPS in Oakland.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 0-2 with a 7.71 ERA (9.1 ip, 12 h, 8 r, 8 er, 4 bb, 12 so, 1 hr) in two interleague starts this year...had one appearance in relief last year is 0-2 with a 7.15 ERA (9 er in 11.1 ip) in three career interleague appearances.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-2 with a 4.74 ERA (20 er in 38.0 ip) and .252 (37-for-147) opponents batting average in seven starts at night compared to 4-2 with a 2.17 ERA (11 er in 45.2 ip) and .190 (31-for-163) opponents batting average in eight starts during the day...has yielded eight of his 11 home runs at night.

BY INNING: Has not allowed a run in the second inning (15.0 ip) and has a 1.50 ERA (5 er in 30.0 ip) and .160 (17-for-106) opponents batting average over the first two innings of a game...has a 4.36 ERA (26 er in 53.2 ip) and .250 (51-for-204) opponents average from the third inning on.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed two runs or fewer in 10 of his 15 starts and five hits or fewer 12 times...has left with the lead in four of his five no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the A's are 9-6 (.600) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and went 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA in one start...was the Aviators Opening Day starter on May 6 at Las Vegas and was the losing pitcher in an 8-1 loss to Sacramento (4.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 0 hr, 76 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and made his first Major League start that day at Boston...allowed a run on four hits in 5.0 innings to earn his first ML win in the A's 4-1 victory over the Red Sox...would go 4-1 with a 2.84 ERA and .182 opponents batting average over his first seven starts through June 18...struck out nine batters in 5.2 innings in his second start on May 21 at Los Angeles (AL) but had a no decision in an 8-4 A's win...left with a 3-2 lead and two outs in the bottom of the sixth but Petit allowed a run for the blown save...it was the first of four starts in which he left with the lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (June 23 at Texas, July 10 at Texas, Aug. 14 at Cleveland)...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings May 26 against Seattle for his second win...that matched his longest outing as a professional...also tossed 7.0 innings for Single-A Tampa at Charlotte on April 16, 2016, his second professional appearance...logged a season-low 3.2 innings May 31 at Seattle but had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss...was charged with the first loss of his career when he allowed two runs in 5.0 innings on June 6 at Colorado, a 3-1 A's loss...pitched 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits on June 12 to defeat Kansas City 11-2...walked a career-high four...tossed 105 pitches, which were his most as a professional, in a 5-4 loss to Texas on June 29...took the loss that day and went 0-2 despite a 3.00 ERA over his final three starts before the All-Star Break...struck out a career-high 10 batters in a career-high tying 7.0 innings on July 4 against Boston but was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss...it was the first 10-strikeout game by an A's rookie since Chris Bassitt on Aug. 9, 2015 against Houston (also 10)...issued a career-high tying four walks in 5.0 innings in a no decision at Texas on July 10...combined with Romo, Moll and Guerra on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Los Angeles (AL) on July 20 as part of a career-high 12.0-inning scoreless streak from July 10 to 27...allowed a career-high six runs in 4.1 innings in a 7-4 loss at San Diego on July 27...it

snapped a career-opening 14-game streak of 1.2 innings or more and six hits or fewer, which was the longest such streak in Athletics history...singled off Chris Paddock in the third inning for his first Major League hit...was placed on the 10-day injured list July 31 retroactive to July 28 with a right shoulder impingement...missed just one start, did not have a rehab assignment, and was reinstated from the IL on Aug. 8.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-3 win at Texas last Saturday...allowed a career-high eight hits in 5.1 innings...did not walk or strikeout a batter to mark the 19th time in Oakland history a starting pitcher went at least five innings without a walk or strikeout (last: Dallas Braden, Aug. 25, 2008 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...allowed a Lowe RBI double in the bottom of the first but then retired 12 of the next 15 batters...had a 3-1 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Lowe in the sixth...was relieved by Chafin with runners on first and third and one out in the sixth and Chafin allowed a run to score for the blown save.

KAPRIELIAN vs. SAN FRANCISCO: Has faced the Giants once in his career and it came in relief last year on Aug. 16 at San Francisco in his Major League debut (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...relieved Fiers to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 13-2 and allowed a home run to the first batter he faced (Crawford)...walked the next batter (Dubon) before retiring each of the final six batters he faced...struck out Solano to end the seventh inning for his first strikeout.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (8-8, 3.77 ERA): Is scheduled to make the 121st start of his career tomorrow, which will match Brett Anderson for the most starts by an A's pitcher over the last 18 years...went 6-4 with a 2.92 ERA and .655 OPS in 16 starts over the first three months of the season and allowed just eight home runs in 92.2 innings...is 2-4 with a 5.71 ERA and .799 OPS in eight starts in July and August and has allowed 10 home runs in 41.0 innings...is tied for sixth in the American League in games started (24), ranks seventh in opponents slugging percentage (.401) and eighth in strikeouts (148)...has allowed a .176 batting average against left-handed hitters...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-4 A's loss at Texas on Sunday (5.0 ip, 7 h, 7 r, 7 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...is 2-2 with a 2.51 ERA (32.1 ip, 30 h, 14 r, 9 er, 7 bb, 23 so, 2 hr) in six career starts against San Francisco...including a loss in his only start this year on June 25, a 2-0 A's loss (6.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 7 so).

- Was acquired from the Cubs on July 26 and has not allowed a run in 10 games with the A's (10.1 ip, 6 h, 2 bb, 10 so)...however, has allowed 3-of-4 inherited runners to score and has a win, save and blown save.
- Has not allowed a run in 36 of his last 37 appearances (3 er in 34.2 ip, 0.78 ERA) and 49 of 53 overall.
- Ranks fourth among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.450) and slugging percentage (.219), sixth in ERA (1.63) and 10th in on-base percentage (.231) and eighth batting average (.160).
- Has not allowed a home run in his last 43 games (40.2 innings) and has yielded just one home run in 49.2 innings overall...his average of 0.18 home runs per nine innings is fifth lowest among ML relievers.
- Has a 0.69 ERA (2 er in 26.0 ip) in 28 appearances on one day of rest or fewer, a 2.74 ERA (7 er in 23.0 ip) in 24 games on two days rest or more.
- Has not allowed a run in the eighth inning (25.2 ip).
- Threw 1.0 scoreless inning against the Giants while with the Cubs on June 6...overall is 0-2 with a 2.37 ERA (10 er in 38.0 ip) in 40 career outings against San Francisco, including 1 start.
