OAKLAND ATHLETICS (70-53) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (78-44)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight after losing four in a row...are 11-6 in August, 14-7 over the last 21 games and 18-13 since the All-Star Break...are 70-53 (.569) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 57th consecutive day (dating back to June 21) and trail first place Houston by 2½ games for the eighth consecutive day...currently have the second AL Wild Card...are one game behind the first Wild Card (Yankees) and ½-game ahead of the third place team (Red Sox)...have held at least a share of a playoff spot every day dating back to April 17...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 57 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

AGAINST THE BEST: The A's will play seven games this week, all against teams currently leading their division...lost three of four at Chicago (AL) to start the week and won the first game of this three-game series with San Francisco last night...are 15-23 (.395) against teams currently leading their divisions or holding a wild card spot compared to 55-30 (.647) against all other teams.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's have clinched a winning record in interleague play for the 15th time in 25 seasons as they are 11-7 (.611) with two games remaining...are tied for the sixth best interleague record in the majors...A's pitchers rank 12th in the majors in opponents OPS (.705) and 13th in ERA (4.07)...A's hitters rank 19th in batting average (.238) and 20th in OPS (.688)...have 17 stolen bases, which is tied for second in the majors and is an Oakland interleague record (previous: 16 in 2011)...are 249-213 (.539) all-time in interleague games, which is fourth best in Major League history.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.24 ERA (64 er in 178. ip) over the last 20 games and now have a 3.67 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.378, third lowest OPS (.679) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.301)...have issued the fewest walks (333), allowed the fewest home runs (127) and averaged the fewest pitches per inning (15.8)...are tied for the most shutouts (11).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-5 with a 6.21 ERA (26 er in 37.2 ip) and .314 (49-for-156) opponents batting average over the last eight games but are 47-42 with a 3.75 ERA (291 er in 695.1 ip) overall...are tied for second in the American League in wins and ranks fourth in ERA and opponents OPS (.690)...lead the majors in innings pitched (698.1) and are tied for third in complete games (3)...have used just nine starting pitchers, which is tied for fourth fewest in the majors...are the only team with four pitchers with 24 or more starts...no other team has more than two.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has a 2.14 ERA (28 er in 117.2 ip) and .187 (78-for-418) opponents batting average over the last 36 games dating back to July 7...has a 3.53 ERA overall, which is second lowest in the American League...also has the second lowest opponents OPS (.659)...is 31-for-48 (64.6%) in save opportunities, which is the fifth best save percentage in the AL...has just 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.423) and the fourth highest batting average (.243)...has the fourth highest percentage of inherited runners scored (36.9%).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 23-for-25 (92.0%) in stolen base attempts in the 20 games since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29...are tied with Cleveland for the second most stolen bases in the majors over that span (Kansas City, 25)...are 66-for-79 (83.5%) for the season...are tied for the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and tied for fifth in steals...the 66 steals are the most by an A's team since 2015 (78).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .186 (29-for-156), including .122 (4-for-33) with runners in scoring position, over the last five games and have scored just 13 runs...batted .308, including .346 with RISP, over the previous eight games and scored 63 runs...are batting .236 overall, which is fifth lowest in the American League...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...lead the AL in on-base percentage (.351) and hit by pitches (16) in August, rank second in fewest strikeouts (129), tied for second in stolen bases (21) and walks (70) and third in OPS (.797) and runs (94)...overall, have been hit by a pitch 76 times, which is the most in the AL, third most in the majors and tied for third most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019, 76 in 2018)...are tied for fourth in the AL in sacrifice flies (36) and rank fifth in walks (425), sacrifice hits (15) and fewest strikeouts (1048)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (25), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (117), are tied for the lead in home runs (3) and rank second in RBI (17) and extra base hits (6).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have made nine errors in the last 12 games but have just 54 for the season, which is second fewest in the American League to the Astros (48)...are on pace for 71 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...are tied for the third fewest outfield assists in the AL (11).

CLOSE CALLS AND NOT SO CLOSE: The A's are 44-24 (.647) in games decided by three runs or more compared to 26-29 (.473) in games decided by two runs or fewer...are 18-20 (.474) in one-run games, which includes 11-7 at home and 7-13 on the road...lead the American League in one-run losses (20) and are third in games (38)...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with the Red Sox for the second best record in the AL (Mariners, 11-4/.733)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 15-7 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Mariners for the second most walk-off wins in the majors (10) to the Rockies (11)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this nine-game homestand against San Francisco (1-0), Seattle (two games) and New York-AL (four games)...went 4-1 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (3-0) and have won seven of their last eight home games...are 35-25 (.583) at home compared to 35-28 (.556) on the road...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (1-2) and Chicago-AL (1-3) to concluded a stretch that began on July 6 where the A's played 26 of 36 games on the road...have 21 home games and 18 road games remaining...are batting .225 (427-for-1896) with a .705 OPS at home compared to .245 with a .741 OPS on the road...have the second lowest home batting average and third lowest home OPS in the American League but the fourth highest road batting average and OPS.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 28-18 (.609) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 42-35 (.545) against righties...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to the White Sox (21-13/.618)...are 6-5 in this stretch of 15 games in 15 days from Aug. 10-24...have used a different lineup in each of the last 60 games and have 120 different lineups over the first 132 contests.

A's vs. GIANTS: The season series is even at two games each...the A's won the first game in Oakland last night after losing two of three at San Francisco from June 25-27...won the season series last year, 5-1...it matched their best record against the Giants (2007)...won two of three in Oakland and swept a three-game series in San Francisco...in the previous 24 seasons of interleague play, the A's have won nine season series, lost five and split 10...are 71-63 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 39-27 in Oakland and 32-36 in San Francisco...are 28-33 at Oracle Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks fourth among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.450) and slugging percentage (.219), fifth in ERA (1.63), seventh in batting average (.160) and 10th in on-base percentage (.231)...**Starling Marte** is batting .378 (48-for-127) with 19 stolen bases and 20 RBI in 31 games since the All-Star Break...lead the majors in batting and steals since the break and ranks seventh in on-base percentage (.424)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.935) and slugging percentage (.561), fourth in home runs (31), tied for fourth in extra base hits (59), tied for fifth in sacrifice flies (7), sixth in walks (62), seventh in on-base percentage (.373) and RBI (81), tied for eighth in doubles (28) and tied for 10th in runs (77)...**Lou Trivino** has converted each of his last 14 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 0.84 ERA (3 er in 32.0 ip) and .188 (21-for-112) opponents batting average in 30 games over that span...ranks fourth in the AL in save percentage (91.3%) and fifth in saves (21).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1983** Rickey Henderson steals the 399th base of his career, breaking Bert Campaneris' Oakland record of 398...in **1997** Jason Giambi, Ernie Young, Jason McDonald and Jose Canseco all homer in the third inning of the A's 13-6 win over Boston...the four home runs in an inning sets an Oakland record...in **2002** Cory Lidle tosses his second complete game one-hitter of the season in the A's 6-0 win at Cleveland, extending his scoreless streak to 31 innings...the streak would end at 32 innings in his next start on August 26...in **2006** the A's tie what was then an Oakland record by overcoming an eight-run deficit to defeat Toronto, 12-10...Dan Haren allows eight runs in the first two innings and nine runs total, setting an Oakland record for runs allowed in a win.

39 LHP ANDREW CHAFIN

Last Outing: 8/19 at Chicago-AL (ND, 1.0 ip, bb, so)

Saves/Opportunities: 1-3

Inherited Runners/Scored: 24/8 **First Hitters:** 7-49 (3 bb, sf)

- Was acquired from the Cubs on July 26 and has not allowed a run in 10 games with the A's (10.1 ip, 6 h, 2 bb, 10 so)...however, has allowed 3-of-4 inherited runners to score and has a win, save and blown save.
- Has not allowed a run in 36 of his last 37 appearances (3 er in 34.2 ip, 0.78 ERA) and 49 of 53 overall.
- Ranks fourth among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.450) and slugging percentage (.219), fifth in ERA (1.63) and 10th in on-base percentage (.231) and seventh in batting average (.160).
- Has not allowed a home run in his last 43 games (40.2 innings) and has yielded just one home run in 49.2 innings overall...his average of 0.18 home runs per nine innings is sixth lowest among ML relievers.
- Has a 0.69 ERA (2 er in 26.0 ip) in 28 appearances on one day of rest or fewer, a 2.74 ERA (7 er in 23.0 ip) in 24 games on two days rest or more.
- Has not allowed a run in the eighth inning (25.2 ip).
- Threw 1.0 scoreless inning against the Giants while with the Cubs on June 6...overall is 0-2 with a 2.37 ERA (10 er in 38.0 ip) in 40 career outings against San Francisco, including 1 start.
- Was 0-2 with a 2.06 ERA in 43 relief appearances for Chicago (NL) when he was traded to Oakland along with cash considerations for Greg Deichmann and minor leaguer Daniel Palencia.

Last Year: Combined for a 1-2 record, one save and a 6.52 ERA in 15 relief appearances with the Diamondbacks and Cubs...missed a month of the season from Aug. 19 to Sept. 18 with a sprained left finger.

35 LHP JAKE DIEKMAN

Last Outing: 8/20 vs. San Francisco (ND, 1.1 ip, so)

Saves/Opportunities: 7-12

Inherited Runners/Scored: 9/4 **First Hitters:** 8-41, 6 bb, 3 hbp

- Has a 2.74 ERA (7 er in 23.0 ip) and .179 (14-for-78) opponents batting average over his last 26 games dating back to June 4.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .181 (19-for-105) average but they have hit five of the career-high six home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 4.35 ERA (10 er in 20.2 ip) and .241 (19-for-79) opponents batting average in 23 outings on one day rest or fewer, a 1.44 ERA (4 er in 25.0 ip) and .133 (11-for-83) opponents average in 27 appearances on two days of rest or more.
- Has a 4.20 (7 er in 15.0 ip) career mark against the Giants.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

65 RHP DEOLIS GUERRA

Last Outing: 8/17 at Chicago-AL (ND, 1.0 ip, h, 3 so)

Saves/Opportunities: 0-0

Inherited Runners/Scored: 7/2 **First Hitters:** 6-32, 2 bb, hbp

- Has allowed five runs in his last six games (6.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 9 so, 7.50 ERA) after an eight-game, 7.2-inning scoreless streak.
- Has a .143 (10-for-70) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .247 (21-for-85) against right-handers...has issued 10 of his 12 walks and yielded three of his four home runs to righties for a .718 OPS...has a .418 OPS against lefties.
- Opponents are batting .172 (5-for-29) with runners in scoring position.
- Pitched twice against the Giants earlier this season, including 1.2 scoreless innings on June 25...allowed two runs in 0.2 innings in his second outing.
- Has a career high in strikeouts (41) and has matched his high in walks (12).

Last Year: Was claimed off waivers from Milwaukee by Philadelphia on Feb. 5 and made the Phillies Opening Day roster...went 1-3 with an 8.59 ERA in nine relief appearances before he was designated for assignment on Aug. 22.

36 RHP YUSMEIRO PETIT

Last Outing: 8/20 vs. San Francisco (0.2 ip)

Saves/Opportunities: 2-6

Inherited Runners/Scored: 31/11 **First Hitters:** 16-56, 4 bb, sf

- Has allowed at least one run in three of his last seven games (6.1 ip, 3 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 1 so, 2 hr, 5.68 ERA).
- Leads the majors in games pitched (61)...is tied for the lead among American League relievers in wins (8), ranks second in innings pitched (62.0), is fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (1.45) and seventh in most inherited runners (31)...is averaging the fewest strikeouts per nine innings in the majors among relievers (4.21).
- Opponents are hitting .175 (11-for-63) with runners in scoring position.
- Has allowed eight home runs, four of which have come to his first batter faced in an outing, which is tied for the most in the majors.
- Pitched 1.0 scoreless inning against the Giants earlier this year...spent four seasons with the Giants from 2012-15...is 3-4 with a 6.75 ERA (25 er in 33.1 ip) in 18 career outings (three starts) against his former team.

Last Year: Compiled a career-low 1.66 ERA in a team-leading 26 relief appearances...opponents hit .232 and he walked just five batters for a .273 on-base percentage...yielded four runs, three of which scored on solo home runs.

Last Outing: 8/16 at Chicago-AL (ND, 1.0 ip, 2 so, wp)

Saves/Opportunities: 0-0

Inherited Runners/Scored: 2/0 **First Hitters:** 0-5

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas Aug. 10 for his second stint with the A's this year and has pitched four times since his return (4.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 4 so).
- Has not allowed a run in five games overall and now has a career-high 8.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 27, 2019.
- Did not record an out but was tagged with a run in his sole career appearance against the Giants.
- Was first recalled for the first time on April 5, pitched in relief that day against the Dodgers, and was placed on the 10-day injured list April 8 retroactive to April 6 with a strained left biceps...had a five-game rehab assignment before he was reinstated and optioned to Las Vegas May 28.
- Had a 1.64 ERA over his final 13 games at Triple-A dating back to June 26...allowed a .308 opponents batting average overall, including .231 against left-handed hitters and .374 against right-handers...surrendered seven of his 10 home runs to righties...his complete 2021 stats with Las Vegas:

Last Year: Made two starts during the spring and did not allow a run before he was shut down with a shoulder injury...began the season on the IL and eventually underwent surgery on the left shoulder on Sept. 16.

54 RHP SERGIO ROMO

Last Outing: 8/20 vs. San Francisco (ND, 1.0 ip, h)

Saves/Opportunities: 0-2

Inherited Runners/Scored: 22/11 **First Hitters:** 15-47, bb, 2 hbp

- Had his 17.2 inning scoreless streak snapped last Friday at Texas when he allowed a first batter three-run home run to Pozo...opponents were 3-for-53 (.057) during the scoreless streak.
- Now has a 0.87 ERA (3 er in 31.0 ip) and .142 (15-for-106) opponents batting average over his last 32 games dating back to May 25 after compiling a 7.63 ERA and .290 opponents average over his first 18 contests.
- Ranks eighth among American League relievers in opponents OPS (.557), 11th in slugging percentage (.292) and is 14th in on-base percentage (.265)...tied for the eighth highest percentage of inherited runners scored (50.0%).
- First batters faced are 3-for-23 (.130) with nine strikeouts over his last 23 games after going 12-for-24 (.500) with a walk and two hit by pitches over his first 27 contests.
- Has a 1.75 ERA (5 er in 25.2 ip) in 26 games on zero or one day of rest, a 5.03 ERA (11 er in 19.2 ip) in 23 outings on two days rest or more.
- Has allowed one run in 1.2 innings against the Giants this year...overall has a save and a 6.43 ERA (5 er in 7.0 ip) in eight career games against them...pitched for San Francisco for the first nine years of his career, recording 84 saves and going 32-26 with a 2.58 ERA (126 er in 439.2 ip) in 515 games.

Last Year: Was 1-2 with five saves, a 4.05 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in 24 relief appearances with Minnesota...had 10 holds, which tied for third most in the majors...was the only reliever in the majors with at least 10 holds and at least five saves.

46 RHP BURCH SMITH

Saves/Opportunities: 0-1

Inherited Runners/Scored: 11/3 **First Hitters:** 8-25, bb

- Allowed five runs Tuesday night, which matched his most ever as a reliever (third time, last: July 23, 2019 vs. Cincinnati)...now has a 6.23 ERA (15 er in 21.2 ip) over his last 13 games after posting a 3.63 ERA over his first 13.
- Allowed all three of his inherited runners to score Tuesday night, snapping a streak of 14 consecutive inherited runners stranded dating back to Sept. 11, 2019.
- Has pitched at least two innings in 10 of his 26 outings.

Last Year: Made the A's Opening Day roster and was 2-0 with a save, a 2.25 ERA and .163 opponents batting average in six relief appearances before his season was cut short in mid-August with a forearm injury.

62 RHP LOU TRIVINO

Last Outing: 8/20 vs. San Francisco (S, 1.0 ip, h)

Saves/Opportunities: 21-23

Inherited Runners/Scored: 14/2 **First Hitters:** 11-50, 5 bb

- Has converted each of his last 14 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 0.84 ERA (3 er in 32.0 ip) and .188 (21-for-112) opponents batting average in 31 games over that span.
- Is 21-for-23 (91.3%) in save opportunities...is tied for sixth in the American League in save percentage and ranks fourth in saves.
- Has a 0.67 ERA (3 er in 40.1 ip) over his last 39 games and now has a 1.72 ERA for the season, which ranks fourth among AL relievers.
- Ranks seventh among AL relievers in opponents OPS (.555) and slugging (.266), is tied for fifth in innings pitched (57.2), tied for ninth in games (55) and 12th in opponents batting average (.192).
- Has a .155 (18-for-116) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .241 (21-for-87) against left-handers.
- Opponents are hitting .133 (8-for-60) with runners in scoring position.
- Has a 0.34 ERA (1 er in 26.2 ip) on the road, a 0.73 ERA (2 er in 24.2 ip) during the day and a 0.69 ERA (3 er in 39.0 ip) in the ninth inning.
- Allowed both of his inherited runners to score in his second game on April 3 but has stranded all 12 of his inherited runners since then.
- Has allowed just one home run over his last 44 games (44.2 innings).
- Has not allowed a run to the Giants this season (3.0 ip) and has a 4.50 ERA (6 er in 12.0 ip) in 12 career outings against San Francisco.

Last Year: Compiled a 3.86 ERA in 20 relief appearances and held the opposition to a career-low .193 batting average...issued 10 walks in 23.1 innings for a career-low .280 on-base percentage...struck out 26 for a career-best 10.03 strikeouts per nine innings.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas today for his third stint with the A's this year...hit .199 with 12 home runs and 30 RBI in 79 games during his first stint from April 6 to July 31...went 4-for-14 (.286) with a double, triple and RBI in three games with the Aviators following his Aug. 1 option...returned for a second time Aug. 6 and batted .242 with four home runs and seven RBI in 12 games before he was optioned to Las Vegas yesterday.
- Is tied for fourth among American League rookies in home runs (16).
- Has made 56 of his 57 starts this year and 73 of 75 in his career in games in which the opponent starts a right-handed pitcher.
- Is 4-for-19 (.211) with a double, home run, four RBI, a walk and a sacrifice fly as a pinch hitter...is tied for the lead among AL pinch hitters in plate appearances (21) and tied for fourth in RBI.
- More than half of his hits are for extra bases (26-of-46, 56.5%)...36 of his 68 (52.9%) career hits are extra base hits.
- Is batting .143 (8-for-56) with runners in scoring position.
- Is 3-for-23 (.115) in interleague play
- Has started games at four different positions (43 in right field, nine in left field, three at designated hitter, two at first base).

Last Year: Went 0-for-5 with two strikeouts in seven games over three stints with Oakland...all five of his plate appearances came against right-handed pitchers...made just one start and went 0-for-2 as the A's designated hitter.
