OAKLAND ATHLETICS (70-53) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (78-44)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight after losing four in a row...are 11-6 in August, 14-7 over the last 21 games and 18-13 since the All-Star Break...are 70-53 (.569) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League... are in second place in the AL West for the 57th consecutive day (dating back to June 21) and trail first place Houston by 2½ games for the eighth consecutive day...currently have the second AL Wild Card...are one game behind the first Wild Card (Yankees) and ½-game ahead of the third place team (Red Sox)...have held at least a share of a playoff spot every day dating back to April 17...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 57 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

AGAINST THE BEST: The A's will play seven games this week, all against teams currently leading their division...lost three of four at Chicago (AL) to start the week and won the first game of this three-game series with San Francisco last night...are 15-23 (.395) against teams currently leading their divisions or holding a wild card spot compared to 55-30 (.647) against all other teams.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's have clinched a winning record in interleague play for the 15th time in 25 seasons as they are 11-7 (.611) with two games remaining...are tied for the sixth best interleague record in the majors...A's pitchers rank 12th in the majors in opponents OPS (.705) and 13th in ERA (4.07)...A's hitters rank 19th in batting average (.238) and 20th in OPS (.688)... have 17 stolen bases, which is tied for second in the majors and is an Oakland interleague record (previous: 16 in 2011)...are 249-213 (.539) all-time in interleague games, which is fourth best in Major League history.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.24 ERA (64 er in 178. ip) over the last 20 games and now have a 3.67 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.378, third lowest OPS (.679) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.301)... have issued the fewest walks (333), allowed the fewest home runs (127) and averaged the fewest pitches per inning (15.8)...are tied for the most shutouts (11).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-5 with a 6.21 ERA (26 er in 37.2 ip) and .314 (49-for-156) opponents batting average over the last eight games but are 47-42 with a 3.75 ERA (291 er in 695.1 ip) overall...are tied for second in the American League in wins and ranks fourth in ERA and opponents OPS (.690)...lead the majors in innings pitched (698.1) and are tied for third in complete games (3)...have used just nine starting pitchers, which is tied for fourth fewest in the majors...are the only team with four pitchers with 24 or more starts...no other team has more than two.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has a 2.14 ERA (28 er in 117.2 ip) and .187 (78-for-418) opponents batting average over the last 36 games dating back to July 7...has a 3.53 ERA overall, which is second lowest in the American League... also has the second lowest opponents OPS (.659)...is 31-for-48 (64.6%) in save opportunities, which is the fifth best save percentage in the AL...has just 11 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.423) and the fourth highest batting average (.243)...has the fourth highest percentage of inherited runners scored (36.9%).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 23-for-25 (92.0%) in stolen base attempts in the 20 games since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29...are tied with Cleveland for the second most stolen bases in the majors over that span (Kansas City, 25)...are 66-for-79 (83.5%) for the season...are tied for the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and tied for fifth in steals... the 66 steals are the most by an A's team since 2015 (78).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .186 (29-for-156), including .122 (4-for-33) with runners in scoring position, over the last five games and have scored just 13 runs...batted .308, including .346 with RISP, over the previous eight games and scored 63 runs...are batting .236 overall, which is fifth lowest in the American League...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...lead the AL in on-base percentage (.351) and hit by pitches (16) in August, rank second in fewest strikeouts (129), tied for second in stolen bases (21) and walks (70) and third in OPS (.797) and runs (94)...overall, have been hit by a pitch 76 times, which is the most in the AL, third most in the majors and tied for third most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019, 76 in 2018)...are tied for fourth in the AL in sacrifice flies (36) and rank fifth in walks (425), sacrifice hits (15) and fewest strikeouts (1048)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (25), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (117), are tied for the lead in home runs (3) and rank second in RBI (17) and extra base hits (6).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have made nine errors in the last 12 games but have just 54 for the season, which is second fewest in the American League to the Astros (48)...are on pace for 71 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...are tied for the third fewest outfield assists in the AL (11).

CLOSE CALLS AND NOT SO CLOSE: The A's are 44-24 (.647) in games decided by three runs or more compared to 26-29 (.473) in games decided by two runs or fewer...are 18-20 (.474) in one-run games, which includes 11-7 at home and 7-13 on the road...lead the American League in one-run losses (20) and are third in games (38)...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with the Red Sox for the second best record in the AL (Mariners, 11-4/.733)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 15-7 in games decided in the last at bat... are tied with the Mariners for the second most walk-off wins in the majors (10) to the Rockies (11)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this nine-game homestand against San Francisco (1-0), Seattle (two games) and New York-AL (four games)...went 4-1 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (3-0) and have won seven of their last eight home games...are 35-25 (.583) at home compared to 35-28 (.556) on the road...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (1-2) and Chicago-AL (1-3) to concluded a stretch that began on July 6 where the A's played 26 of 36 games on the road...have 21 home games and 18 road games remaining...are batting .225 (427-for-1896) with a .705 OPS at home compared to .245 with a .741 OPS on the road...have the second lowest home batting average and third lowest home OPS in the American League but the fourth highest road batting average and OPS.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 28-18 (.609) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 42-35 (.545) against righties...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to the White Sox (21-13/.618)... are 6-5 in this stretch of 15 games in 15 days from Aug. 10-24...have used a different lineup in each of the last 60 games and have 120 different lineups over the first 132 contests.

A's vs. GIANTS: The season series is even at two games each...the A's won the first game in Oakland last night after losing two of three at San Francisco from June 25-27...won the season series last year, 5-1...it matched their best record against the Giants (2007)...won two of three in Oakland and swept a three-game series in San Francisco...in the previous 24 seasons of interleague play, the A's have won nine season series, lost five and split 10...are 71-63 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 39-27 in Oakland and 32-36 in San Francisco...are 28-33 at Oracle Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks fourth among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.450) and slugging percentage (.219), fifth in ERA (1.63), seventh in batting average (.160) and 10th in on-base percentage (.231)...Starling Marte is batting .378 (48-for-127) with 19 stolen bases and 20 RBI in 31 games since the All-Star Break...lead the majors in batting and steals since the break and ranks seventh in on-base percentage (.424)...Matt Olson ranks third in the American League in OPS (.935) and slugging percentage (.561), fourth in home runs (31), tied for fourth in extra base hits (59), tied for fifth in sacrifice flies (7), sixth in walks (62), seventh in on-base percentage (.373) and RBI (81), tied for eighth in doubles (28) and tied for 10th in runs (77)...Lou Trivino has converted each of his last 14 save opportunities dating back to June 5 and has a 0.84 ERA (3 er in 32.0 ip) and .188 (21-for-112) opponents batting average in 30 games over that span...ranks fourth in the AL in save percentage (91.3%) and fifth in saves (21).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1983 Rickey Henderson steals the 399th base of his career, breaking Bert Campaneris' Oakland record of 398...in 1997 Jason Giambi, Ernie Young, Jason McDonald and Jose Canseco all homer in the third inning of the A's 13-6 win over Boston...the four home runs in an inning sets an Oakland record...in 2002 Cory Lidle tosses his second complete game one-hitter of the season in the A's 6-0 win at Cleveland, extending his scoreless streak to 31 innings...the streak would end at 32 innings in his next start on August 26...in 2006 the A's tie what was then an Oakland record by overcoming an eight-run deficit to defeat Toronto, 12-10...Dan Haren allows eight runs in the first two innings and nine runs total, setting an Oakland record for runs allowed in a win.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (8-8, 3.77 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make the 121st start of his career today, which matches Brett Anderson for the most starts by an A's pitcher over the last 18 years...his 47 wins match Trevor Cahill and Joe Blanton for the most by an A's pitcher over that span and his 595 strikeouts are second most to Sonny Gray (607)...in the Wild Card era (1995-present), the only A's pitchers with more starts and wins are Barry Zito (224 starts, 102 wins), Hudson (183, 92) and Mulder (150, 81).

BY MONTH: Went 6-4 with a 2.92 ERA and .655 OPS in 16 starts over the first three months of the season and allowed just eight home runs in 92.2 innings...is 2-4 with a 5.71 ERA (26 er in 41.0 ip) and .799 OPS in eight starts in July and August and has allowed 10 home runs in 41.0 innings...is 0-2 with a 12.27 ERA (15 er in 11.0 ip) and .385 (20-for-52) opponents batting average in three starts in August and is now 8-11 with a 5.93 ERA (72 er in 109.1 ip) in 24 career starts in August...the losses are his most in any month and the ERA is his highest (has nine losses and a 5.51 ERA in May).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks eighth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.401) and tied for eighth in games started (24)...is one of three pitchers in the majors with two shutouts (DeSclafani, SF and Wheeler, PHI) and one of six with two or more complete games.

STRIKEOUTS AND WALKS: Has 52 strikeouts and just nine walks over his last eight starts and 41.0 innings...now has a career-high 148 strikeouts for the season, which ranks eighth in the American League...has walked just 33 for an average of 2.22 per nine innings, which is ninth lowest in the AL... his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.48 is fifth best...has three games of 10 or more strikeout this year and six in his career...the six 10-strikeout games are tied for seventh most in Oakland history...has more strikeouts than innings pitched in 12 of his 24 starts...has walked two batters or fewer 19 times, including eight starts with one walk and six with no walks.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .176 (23-for-131) batting average and .542 OPS against left-handed hitters compared to .277 (108-for-390) with a .754 OPS against right-handers...his batting average against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Kikuchi, SEA .127) and his OPS ranks third...has issued 26 of his 33 walks to righties.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 2-2 with a 2.42 ERA (22.1 ip, 14 h, 6 r, 6 er, 6 bb, 23 so) and .171 (14-for-82) opponents batting in four interleague starts...is now 7-10 with a 3.74 ERA (52 er in 125.0 ip) in 23 career starts against the National League compared to 40-29 with a 3.85 ERA (238 er in 556.1 ip) in 98 games against the American League.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest...is 3-2 with a 2.26 ERA (16 er in 63.2 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest compared to 5-5 with a 4.82 ERA (35 er in 65.1 ip) in 13 starts on five days rest or more...over the last three years, he is 9-3 with a 2.72 ERA (35 er in 115.2 ip) in 20 starts on four days rest, 10-6 with a 3.89 ERA (48 er in 111.0 ip) in 21 starts on five days rest or more.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 7-1 in his no decisions and are 15-9 (.625) in his starting assignments...are 26-14 (.650) when he starts over the last three years...has allowed one run or fewer in 12 of his 24 starts but has received one run of support or fewer in 10 of his starts...is 0-6 with one run of support or fewer, 8-2 with two runs of support or more...has a 4.91 ERA (26 er in 47.2 ip) over the first two innings of his starts, a 2.99 ERA (26 er in 78.1 ip) in innings three through six and a 4.15 ERA (4 er in 8.2 ip) from the seventh inning on.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start but then went 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA over his next four starts...picked up his first win of the season in the 100th game of his career, an 8-4 victory over Detroit on April 15...tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the doubleheader April 20...it was the 11th complete game shutout of fewer than eight innings in Oakland history and his second career complete game and shutout...the start was the 100th of his career and he became the 25th pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...had 10 strikeouts on May 7 against Tampa Bay, but had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win...retired each of the first 18 batters he faced before walking Arozarena to start the seventh...allowed one run or fewer in five consecutive starts from May 23 to June 14 and went 3-0 with a 0.84 ERA over that span...became the first A's pitcher with five consecutive games of one run or fewer and five innings pitched or more since Trevor Cahill (April 17-May 9, 2011)...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on May 23...left with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was the first of two times the pen blew the save in one of his starts (July 16 vs. Cleveland)...struck out Justin Upton to lead off the game for the 50,000 strikeout in Oakland history...fanned Taylor Ward to end the fourth inning for his 500th career strikeout...tossed a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Seattle on June 2...it was his third career complete game and shutout, his second this year...then combined with Petit, Trivino and Diekman on a two-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win on June 9 against Arizona...it was the second time in his career he did not allow a run in

back-to-back starts (Sept. 14-20, 2016)...had a career-high 16.0-inning score less streak from June 2 to 14...struck out 11 batters in 5.1 innings June 20 at New York (AL) but was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss...the 11 strikeouts match the most in Athletics history by a pitcher with fewer than six innings pitched...went 2-for-2 with a double June 25 at San Francisco...it was the first extra base hit by an A's pitcher since Joe Kennedy doubled on June 12, 2007 at Houston...was named American League Pitcher of the Month for June after going 3-2 with a 1.13 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 34 batters in 32.0 innings and allowed just one home run... it was the second time he was named Pitcher of the Month (April, 2018)... struck out a career-high 13 batters in 7.0 innings in a 4-1 win at Seattle on July 22...matched the most strikeouts in Athletics history by a pitcher with seven innings or fewer and equaled the seventh highest single-game total in Oakland history...went 2-2 with a 3.30 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in five starts in July...struck out 41 and walked just five in 30.0 innings... the strikeouts tied for third in the American League in July and tied Mike Moore (1989) for the third highest total in July in Oakland history behind Vida Blue (55 in 1971, 42 in 1976).

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-4 loss at Texas last Sunday... yielded three home runs in a game for the first time in his career and allowed a season-high tying seven runs in 5.0 innings...surrendered a two-run home run to Peters in the Rangers three-run first, a RBI double to Hernandez in the second, a leadoff home run to Garcia in the third and a two-run home run to Peters in the fifth.

MANAEA vs. SAN FRANCISCO: Is 2-2 with a 2.51 ERA (32.1 ip, 30 h, 14 r, 9 er, 7 bb, 23 so, 2 hr) in six career starts... is 1-1 with a 2.35 ERA (4 er in 15.1 ip) in three starts in Oakland and 1-1 with a 2.65 ERA (5 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts in San Francisco...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 2-0 A's loss in San Francisco on June 25...al-
