ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost five of the last seven games but are 10-6 over the last 16 contests and 14-8 over the last 22...are 70-54 (.565) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 58th consecutive day (dating back to June 21) and lost ground on Houston yesterday for the first time since Aug. 13...trail the Astros by 3½ games...currently have the second AL Wild Card...are two games behind the first Wild Card (Yankees) and ½-game ahead of the third place team (Red Sox)...have held at least a share of a playoff spot every day dating back to April 17...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 58 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

AGAINST THE BEST: The A's will play seven games this week, all against teams currently leading their division...lost three of four at Chicago (AL) to start the week and have split the first two games of this three-game series with San Francisco...are 15-24 (.385) against teams currently leading their divisions or holding at least a share of a wild card spot compared to 55-30 (.647) against all other teams.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's have clinched a winning record in interleague play for the 15th time in 25 seasons as they are 11-8 (.579) entering the final game today...are tied for the 10th best interleague record in the majors...A's pitchers rank 15th in the majors in ERA (4.17) and 16th in opponents OPS (.722)...A's hitters rank 20th in batting average (.238) and OPS (.685)...have 20 stolen bases, which is the most in the majors and an Oakland interleague record (previous: 16 in 2011)...are 249-214 (.538) all-time in interleague games, which is fourth best in Major League history.

PITCHING: The A's have a 5.09 ERA (43 er in 76.0 ip) and have allowed 14 home runs over the last nine games after logging a 2.19 ERA and four home runs over the previous 12 starts...have a 3.69 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage (.381) and fourth lowest OPS (.682) and on-base percentage (.301)...have the fewest walks (337) and fewest pitches per inning (15.9), are tied for the fewest home runs (131) and tied for second in shut-outs (11).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than six innings in eight of the last nine games and are 2-5 with a 5.95 ERA (28 er in 42.1 ip) and .305 (53-for-174) opponents batting average over that span...are 47-42 with a 3.75 ERA (293 er in 703.0 ip) overall...are tied for second in the American League in wins and ranks fourth in ERA and opponents OPS (.691)...lead the majors in innings pitched (703.0) and are tied for third in complete games (3)...have used just nine starting pitchers, which is tied for fourth fewest in the majors...are the only team with four pitchers with 24 or more starts.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen was charged with its 12th loss of the season yesterday, which is four fewer than any other bullpen in the majors...has a 2.38 ERA (32 er in 121.0 ip) and .193 (84-for-436) opponents batting average over the last 37 games dating back to July 7...has a 3.58 ERA overall, which is third lowest in the American League...also has the third lowest opponents OPS (.665)...is 31-for-49 (63.3%) in save opportunities...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.421) and the third highest batting average (.243) but the fifth lowest on-base percentage (.307)...has the fifth highest percentage of inherited runners scored (36.1%).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 26-for-28 (92.9%) in stolen base attempts in the 21 games since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29...are tied with Cleveland for the second most stolen bases in the majors over that span (Kansas City, 29)...are 69-for-82 (84.1%) for the season...have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and rank fourth in steals...the 69 steals are the most by an A's team since 2015 (78).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .194 (37-for-191), including .156 (7-for-45) with runners in scoring position, over the last six games and have scored 18 runs...batted .308, including .346 with RISP, over the previous eight games and scored 63 runs...are batting .236 overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...lead the AL in on-base percentage (.348) and hit by pitches (18) in August, are tied for second in stolen bases (24) and walks (71) and rank third in runs (99)...overall, have been hit by a pitch 78 times, which is the most in the AL, third most in the majors and third most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019)...are tied for fourth in the AL in sacrifice flies (36) and rank fifth in walks (426), sacrifice hits (15) and fewest strikeouts (1057)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (25), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (119), are tied for the lead in home runs (3) and rank second in RBI (17) and extra base hits (6).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have made nine errors in the last 13 games but have just 54 for the season, which is second fewest in the American League to the Astros (48)...are on pace for 71 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...are tied for the second fewest outfield assists in the AL (11).

CLOSE CALLS: The loss yesterday was the A's first when leading after eight innings since Sept. 27, 2019 at Seattle, snapping a 79-game winning streak when leading after eight innings...dropped to 18-21 (.462) in one-run games with the loss...have the most one-run losses in the American League and are tied for the second most games (39)...are 11-8 at home, 7-13 on the road...are 44-24 (.647) in games decided by three runs or more compared to 26-30 (.464) in games decided by two runs or fewer...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with the Red Sox for the second best record in the AL (Mariners, 11-4/.733)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 15-8 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Mariners for the second most walk-off wins in the majors (10) to the Rockies (12)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this nine-game homestand against San Francisco (1-1), Seattle (two games) and New York-AL (four games)...went 4-1 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (3-0) and have won seven of their last nine home games...are 35-26 (.574) at home compared to 35-28 (.556) on the road...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (1-2) and Chicago-AL (1-3) to concluded a stretch that began on July 6 where the A's played 26 of 36 games on the road...have 20 home games and 18 road games remaining...are batting .225 (435-for-1931) with a .704 OPS at home compared to .245 with a .741 OPS on the road...have the second lowest home batting average and third lowest home OPS in the American League but the fourth highest road batting average and OPS.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 28-18 (.609) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 42-36 (.538) against righties...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to the White Sox (21-13/.618)...are 6-6 in this stretch of 15 games in 15 days from Aug. 10-24...have used the injured list 21 times this year...used it eight times last year and 17 times in 2019...have used a different lineup in each of the last 61 games and have 121 different lineups over the first 124 contests.

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's are 2-3 against the Giants...won the first game in Oakland last night after losing two of three at San Francisco from June 25-27...won the season series last year, 5-1...it matched their best record against the Giants (2007)...won two of three in Oakland and swept a three-game series in San Francisco...in the previous 24 seasons of interleague play, the A's have won nine season series, lost five and split 10...are 71-64 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 39-28 in Oakland and 32-36 in San Francisco...are 28-33 at Oracle Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks fifth among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.494), eighth in ERA (1.95) and ninth in slugging percentage (.259) and batting average (.167)...**Matt Chapman** leads Major League third basemen in fielding percentage (.989), total chances (353) and putouts (134)...**Starling Marte** is batting .379 (50-for-132) with 20 stolen bases and 20 RBI in 32 games since the All-Star Break...leads the majors in batting and steals since the break and ranks fifth in on-base percentage (.424)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.934) and slugging percentage (.560), fourth in home runs (31), tied for fourth in extra base hits (59), sixth in on-base percentage (.374), tied for sixth in walks (62) and sacrifice flies (7), eighth in RBI (81), tied for eighth in doubles (28) and tied for ninth in runs (78)...**Sergio Romo** has not allowed a run in 19 of his last 20 games and has a 0.42 ERA (1 er in 21.1 ip) and .103 (7-for-68) opponents batting average over that span...**Lou Trivino** was charged with his first blown save since May 25 yesterday...is 21-for-24 (87.5%) in save opportunities, which is the fourth best percentage in the AL.

In **1928** Mule Haas leads off the bottom of the 17th inning with a home run as the A's defeat Cleveland, 6-5...Eddie Rommel tosses nine innings of scoreless relief for the win...in **1971** the A's and the Red Sox are tied at 1-1 entering the bottom of the ninth of the first game of a doubleheader when Reggie Jackson hits an inside the park home run with two outs to give the A's the win...in **1990** Rickey Henderson scores his 744th run in an A's uniform, breaking Reggie Jackson's Oakland record...Rickey finished his A's career with 1270 runs scored.

Inherited Runners/Scored: 24/8 **First Hitters:** 7-50 (3 bb, sf)

- Allowed his first runs since being acquired from the Cubs on July 26 yesterday...has now allowed two runs in 11 games with the A's (11.1 ip, 8 h, 2 er, 2 bb, 10 so)...however, has allowed 3-of-4 inherited runners to score and has a win, save and blown save.
- Surrendered back-to-back home runs to the Giants yesterday...marked just the second time in his career he's allowed more than one home run in an outing (2, July 25, 2017, also back-to-back).
- Has not allowed a run in 36 of his last 38 appearances (5 er in 35.2 ip, 1.26 ERA) and 49 of 54 overall.
- Ranks seventh among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.494), 15th in slugging percentage (.259) and is 14th in on-base percentage (.236) and batting average (.167).
- Snapped a 43-game homerless streak yesterday (40.2 innings) but has yielded just three home runs in 50.2 innings overall...his average of 0.53 home runs per nine innings is 19th lowest among ML relievers.
- Has a 1.33 ERA (4 er in 27.0 ip) in 29 appearances on one day of rest or fewer, a 2.74 ERA (7 er in 23.0 ip) in 24 games on two days rest or more.
- Has not allowed a run in the eighth inning (25.2 ip).
- Threw 1.0 scoreless inning against the Giants while with the Cubs on June 6...overall is 0-2 with a 2.77 ERA (12 er in 39.0 ip) in 41 career outings against San Francisco, including 1 start.
- Was 0-2 with a 2.06 ERA in 43 relief appearances for Chicago (NL) when he was traded to Oakland along with cash considerations for Greg Deichmann and minor leaguer Daniel Palencia.

Last Year: Combined for a 1-2 record, one save and a 6.52 ERA in 15 relief appearances with the Diamondbacks and Cubs...missed a month of the season from Aug. 19 to Sept. 18 with a sprained left finger.

- Has a 2.63 ERA (7 er in 24.0 ip) and .195 (16-for-82) opponents batting average over his last 27 games dating back to June 4.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .178 (19-for-107) average but they have hit five of the career-high six home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 4.23 ERA (10 er in 21.2 ip) and .253 (21-for-83) opponents batting average in 24 outings on one day rest or fewer, a 1.44 ERA (4 er in 25.0 ip) and .133 (11-for-83) opponents average in 27 appearances on two days of rest or more.
- Has a 3.94 (7 er in 16.0 ip) career mark against the Giants.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

Inherited Runners/Scored: 7/2 **First Hitters:** 6-32, 2 bb, hbp

- Has allowed five runs in his last six games (6.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 9 so, 7.50 ERA) after an eight-game, 7.2-inning scoreless streak.
- Has a .143 (10-for-70) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .247 (21-for-85) against right-handers...has issued 10 of his 12 walks and yielded three of his four home runs to righties for a .718 OPS...has a .418 OPS against lefties.
- Opponents are batting .172 (5-for-29) with runners in scoring position.
- Pitched twice against the Giants earlier this season, including 1.2 scoreless innings on June 25...allowed two runs in 0.2 innings in his second outing.
- Has a career high in strikeouts (41) and has matched his high in walks (12).

Last Year: Was claimed off waivers from Milwaukee by Philadelphia on Feb. 5 and made the Phillies Opening Day roster...went 1-3 with an 8.59 ERA in nine relief appearances before he was designated for assignment on Aug. 22.

- Has allowed at least one run in three of his last eight games (7.2 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 2 hr, 4.70 ERA).
- Leads the majors in games pitched (62)...is tied for the lead among American League relievers in wins (8) and innings pitched (63.1), is fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (1.42) and tied for fifth in most inherited runners (34)...is averaging the fewest strikeouts per nine innings in the majors among relievers (4.26).
- Has 499 games pitched in his career and needs one more game to become one of 24 active players with 500 games pitched.
- Opponents are hitting .172 (11-for-64) with runners in scoring position.
- Has allowed eight home runs, four of which have come to his first batter faced in an outing, which is tied for the most in the majors.
- Pitched 1.0 scoreless inning against the Giants earlier this year...spent four seasons with the Giants from 2012-15...is 3-4 with a 6.49 ERA (25 er in 34.2 ip) in 19 career outings (three starts) against his former team.

Last Year: Compiled a career-low 1.66 ERA in a team-leading 26 relief appearances...opponents hit .232 and he walked just five batters for a .273 on-base percentage...yielded four runs, three of which scored on solo home runs.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas Aug. 10 for his second stint with the A's this year and has pitched four times since his return (4.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 4 so).
- Has not allowed a run in five games overall and now has a career-high 8.1-inning scoreless streak dating back to Sept. 27, 2019.
- Did not record an out but was tagged with a run in his sole career appearance against the Giants.
- Was first recalled for the first time on April 5, pitched in relief that day against the Dodgers, and was placed on the 10-day injured list April 8 retroactive to April 6 with a strained left biceps...had a five-game rehab assignment before he was reinstated and optioned to Las Vegas May 28.
- Had a 1.64 ERA over his final 13 games at Triple-A dating back to June 26...allowed a .308 opponents batting average overall, including .231 against left-handed hitters and .374 against right-handers...surrendered seven of his 10 home runs to righties...his complete 2021 starts with Las Vegas:

- Had his 17.2 inning scoreless streak snapped last Friday at Texas when he allowed a first batter three-run home run to Pozo...opponents were 3-for-53 (.057) during the scoreless streak.
- Now has a 0.87 ERA (3 er in 31.0 ip) and .142 (15-for-106) opponents batting average over his last 32 games dating back to May 25 after compiling a 7.63 ERA and .290 opponents average over his first 18 contests.
- Ranks sixth among American League relievers in opponents OPS (.557), eighth in slugging percentage (.292) and is 15th in on-base percentage (.265)...tied for the seventh highest percentage of inherited runners scored (50.0%).
- First batters faced are 3-for-23 (.130) with nine strikeouts over his last 23 games after going 12-for-24 (.500) with a walk and two hit by pitches over his first 27 contests.
- Has a 1.75 ERA (5 er in 25.2 ip) in 26 games on zero or one day of rest, a 5.03 ERA (11 er in 19.2 ip) in 23 outings on two days rest or more.

- Allowed five runs Tuesday night, which matched his most ever as a reliever (third time, last: July 23, 2019 vs. Cincinnati)...now has a 6.23 ERA (15 er in 21.2 ip) over his last 13 games after posting a 3.63 ERA over his first 13.
- Allowed all three of his inherited runners to score Tuesday night, snapping a streak of 14 consecutive inherited runners stranded dating back to Sept. 11, 2019.
- Has pitched at least two innings in 10 of his 26 outings.

Last Year: Made the A's Opening Day roster and was 2-0 with a save, a 2.25 ERA and .163 opponents batting average in six relief appearances before his season was cut short in mid-August with a forearm injury.

- Prior to yesterday's blown save, had converted 14 consecutive save opportunities dating back to June 5...had a 0.84 ERA (3 er in 32.0 ip) and .188 (21-for-112) opponents batting average in 31 games over that span.
- Is 21-for-24 (87.5%) in save opportunities...ranks eighth in the American League in save percentage and ranks fourth in saves.
- Has a 1.09 ERA (5 er in 41.1 ip) over his last 40 games and now has a 1.99 ERA for the season, which ranks seventh among AL relievers.
- Ranks ninth among AL relievers in opponents OPS (.571), seventh in slugging (.280), is fifth in innings pitched (58.2), tied for eighth in games (56) and is 12th in opponents batting average (.193).
- Has a .151 (18-for-119) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .250 (22-for-88) against left-handers.
- Opponents are hitting .133 (8-for-60) with runners in scoring position.

- Prior to yesterday, had not allowed a run to the Giants this season...has a 5.54 ERA (8 er in 13.0 ip) in 13 career outings against San Francisco.

Last Year: Compiled a 3.86 ERA in 20 relief appearances and held the opposition to a career-low .193 batting average...issued 10 walks in 23.1 innings for a career-low .280 on-base percentage...struck out 26 for a career-best 10.03 strikeouts per nine innings.

- Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas yesterday for his third stint with the A's this year and went 1-for-4 with two RBI in a start in right field.
- Hit .199 with 12 home runs and 30 RBI in 79 games during his first stint from April 6 to July 31...went 4-for-14 (.286) with a double, triple and RBI in three games with the Aviators following his Aug. 1 option...returned for a second time Aug. 6 and batted .242 with four home runs and seven RBI in 12 games before he was optioned to Las Vegas Friday.
- Is tied for fourth among American League rookies in home runs (16).
- Has made 57 of his 58 starts this year and 74 of 76 in his career in games in which the opponent starts a right-handed pitcher.
- Is 4-for-19 (.211) with a double, home run, four RBI, a walk and a sacrifice fly as a pinch hitter...is tied for the lead among AL pinch hitters in plate appearances (21) and tied for fourth in RBI.
- More than half of his hits are for extra bases (26-of-47, 55.4%)...36 of his 69 (52.2%) career hits are extra base hits.
- Is batting .155 (9-for-58) with runners in scoring position.
- Is 4-for-27 (.148) in interleague play
- Has started games at four different positions (44 in right field, nine in left field, three at designated hitter, two at first base).
