OAKLAND ATHLETICS (70-54) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (79-44)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost five of the last seven games but are 10-6 over the last 16 contests and 14-8 over the last 22...are 70-54 (.565) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in second place in the AL West for the 58th consecutive day (dating back to June 21) and lost ground on Houston yesterday for the first time since Aug. 13...trail the Astros by 3½ games...currently have the second AL Wild Card...are two games behind the first Wild Card (Yankees) and ½-game ahead of the third place team (Red Sox)...have held at least a share of a playoff spot every day dating back to April 17...have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 58 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

AGAINST THE BEST: The A's will play seven games this week, all against teams currently leading their division...lost three of four at Chicago (AL) to start the week and have split the first two games of this three-game series with San Francisco...are 15-24 (.385) against teams currently leading their divisions or holding at least a share of a wild card spot compared to 55-30 (.647) against all other teams.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's have clinched a winning record in interleague play for the 15th time in 25 seasons as they are 11-8 (.579) entering the final game today...are tied for the 10th best interleague record in the majors...A's pitchers rank 15th in the majors in ERA (4.17) and 16th in opponents OPS (.722)...A's hitters rank 20th in batting average (.238) and OPS (.685)...have 20 stolen bases, which is the most in the majors and an Oakland interleague record (previous: 16 in 2011)...are 249-214 (.538) all-time in interleague games, which is fourth best in Major League history.

PITCHING: The A's have a 5.09 ERA (43 er in 76.0 ip) and have allowed 14 home runs over the last nine games after logging a 2.19 ERA and four home runs over the previous 12 starts...have a 3.69 ERA for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage (.381) and fourth lowest OPS (.682) and on-base percentage (.301)...have the fewest walks (337) and fewest pitches per inning (15.9), are tied for the fewest home runs (131) and tied for second in shutouts (11).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than six innings in eight of the last nine games and are 2-5 with a 5.95 ERA (28 er in 42.1 ip) and .305 (53-for-174) opponents batting average over that span... are 47-42 with a 3.75 ERA (293 er in 703.0 ip) overall...are tied for second in the American League in wins and ranks fourth in ERA and opponents OPS (.691)...lead the majors in innings pitched (703.0) and are tied for third in complete games (3)...have used just nine starting pitchers, which is tied for fourth fewest in the majors...are the only team with four pitchers with 24 or more starts.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen was charged with its 12th loss of the season yesterday, which is four fewer than any other bullpen in the majors...has a 2.38 ERA (32 er in 121.0 ip) and .193 (84-for-436) opponents batting average over the last 37 games dating back to July 7...has a 3.58 ERA overall, which is third lowest in the American League...also has the third lowest opponents OPS (.665)...is 31-for-49 (63.3%) in save opportunities...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.421) and the third highest batting average (.243) but the fifth lowest on-base percentage (.307)...has the fifth highest percentage of inherited runners scored (36.1%).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 26-for-28 (92.9%) in stolen base attempts in the 21 games since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29...are tied with Cleveland for the second most stolen bases in the majors over that span (Kansas City, 29)...are 69-for-82 (84.1%) for the season...have the second best stolen base percentage in the American League and rank fourth in steals...the 69 steals are the most by an A's team since 2015 (78).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .194 (37-for-191), including .156 (7-for-45) with runners in scoring position, over the last six games and have scored 18 runs... batted .308, including .346 with RISP, over the previous eight games and scored 63 runs...are batting .236 overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...lead the AL in on-base percentage (.348) and hit by pitches (18) in August, are tied for second in stolen bases (24) and walks (71) and rank third in runs (99)...overall, have been hit by a pitch 78 times, which is the most in the AL, third most in the majors and third most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019)...are tied for fourth in the AL in sacrifice flies (36) and rank fifth in walks (426), sacrifice hits (15) and fewest strikeouts (1057)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (25), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (119), are tied for the lead in home runs (3) and rank second in RBI (17) and extra base hits (6).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have made nine errors in the last 13 games but have just 54 for the season, which is second fewest in the American League to the Astros (48)...are on pace for 71 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...are tied for the second fewest outfield assists in the AL (11).

CLOSE CALLS: The loss yesterday was the A's first when leading after eight innings since Sept. 27, 2019 at Seattle, snapping a 79-game winning streak when leading after eight innings...dropped to 18-21 (.462) in one-run games with the loss...have the most one-run losses in the American League and are tied for the second most games (39)...are 11-8 at home, 7-13 on the road... are 44-24 (.647) in games decided by three runs or more compared to 26-30 (.464) in games decided by two runs or fewer...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with the Red Sox for the second best record in the AL (Mariners, 11-4/.733)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 15-8 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Mariners for the second most walk-off wins in the majors (10) to the Rockies (12)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this nine-game homestand against San Francisco (1-1), Seattle (two games) and New York-AL (four games)...went 4-1 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (3-0) and have won seven of their last nine home games...are 35-26 (.574) at home compared to 35-28 (.556) on the road...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (1-2) and Chicago-AL (1-3) to concluded a stretch that began on July 6 where the A's played 26 of 36 games on the road...have 20 home games and 18 road games remaining...are batting .225 (435-for-1931) with a .704 OPS at home compared to .245 with a .741 OPS on the road...have the second lowest home batting average and third lowest home OPS in the American League but the fourth highest road batting average and OPS.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 28-18 (.609) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 42-36 (.538) against righties...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to the White Sox (21-13/.618)... are 6-6 in this stretch of 15 games in 15 days from Aug. 10-24...have used the injured list 21 times this year...used it eight times last year and 17 times in 2019...have used a different lineup in each of the last 61 games and have 121 different lineups over the first 124 contests.

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's are 2-3 against the Giants...won the first game in Oakland last night after losing two of three at San Francisco from June 25-27... won the season series last year, 5-1...it matched their best record against the Giants (2007)...won two of three in Oakland and swept a three-game series in San Francisco...in the previous 24 seasons of interleague play, the A's have won nine season series, lost five and split 10...are 71-64 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 39-28 in Oakland and 32-36 in San Francisco...are 28-33 at Oracle Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks fifth among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.494), eighth in ERA (1.95) and ninth in slugging percentage (.259) and batting average (.167)...Matt Chapman leads Major League third basemen in fielding percentage (.989), total chances (353) and putouts (134)...Starling Marte is batting .379 (50-for-132) with 20 stolen bases and 20 RBI in 32 games since the All-Star Break...leads the majors in batting and steals since the break and ranks fifth in on-base percentage (.424)...Matt Olson ranks third in the American League in OPS (.934) and slugging percentage (.560), fourth in home runs (31), tied for fourth in extra base hits (59), sixth in on-base percentage (.374), tied for sixth in walks (62) and sacrifice flies (7), eighth in RBI (81), tied for eighth in doubles (28) and tied for ninth in runs (78)...Sergio Romo has not allowed a run in 19 of his last 20 games and has a 0.42 ERA (1 er in 21.1 ip) and .103 (7-for-68) opponents batting average over that span...Lou Trivino was charged with his first blown save since May 25 yesterday...is 21-for-24 (87.5%) in save opportunities, which is the fourth best percentage in the AL.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1928 Mule Haas leads off the bottom of the 17th inning with a home run as the A's defeat Cleveland, 6-5...Eddie Rommel tosses nine innings of scoreless relief for the win...in 1971 the A's and the Red Sox are tied at 1-1 entering the bottom of the ninth of the first game of a doubleheader when Reggie Jackson hits an inside the park home run with two outs to give the A's the win...in 1990 Rickey Henderson scores his 744th run in an A's uniform, breaking Reggie Jackson's Oakland record...Rickey finished his A's career with 1270 runs scored.

FOR STARTERS: Is 2-2 with a 2.79 ERA (15 er in 48.1 ip), .237 (41-for-173) opponents batting average and two home runs allowed over his last eight starts dating back to July 2 after going 7-7 with a 4.72 ERA, .262 opponents average and 14 home runs over his first 16 starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks seventh in the American League in strikeouts (152) and fewest home runs per nine innings (1.06), eigth in strikeout-towalk ratio (3.90) and opponents slugging percentage (.402) and tied for 10th in starts (24)

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .211 (40-for-190) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .278 (94-for-338) with 11 of his 16 home runs after that...has held the opponents three hitter to a .164 (10-for-61) average and the four hitter to a mark of .190 (12-for-63)...the mark against the three hitter is the lowest in the American League and his average against the four hitter is third low-

BY MONTH: Has had a roller coaster season with his ERA as he posted a mark of 6.20 in April, 3.18 in May, 5.28 in June and 2.30 in July...currently has a 3.71 ERA (7 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts in August...went 2-2 in April, 3-3 in May and 2-2 in June before posting a winning mark of 2-1 in July...is currently 0-1

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 1-1 with a 7.23 ERA (18.2 ip, 23 h, 15 r, 15 er, 7 bb, 19 so, 2 hr) in four interleague starts...snapped a five-game interleague losing streak on June 4 at Colorado and is now 3-5 with a 7.24 ERA (44 er in 54.2 ip) in 14 career games (11 starts) in interleague play...is 24-18 with a 3.65 ERA in 80 games (53 starts) against American League competition.

THAT'S ODD: Has a 5.08 ERA (41 er in 72.2 ip) and .276 (81-for-294) opponents batting average in odd numbered innings compared to a 2.84 ERA (20 er in 63.1 ip) and .226 (53-for-234) opponents average in even numbered

CAREER BESTS: Picked up his ninth win of the season July 29, which matches his career high established in 2019...already has career highs in nearly every other category including games (24), games started (24), innings pitched (136.0), strikeouts (152), losses (9), hits (134), runs (67), earned runs (61), walks (39) and home runs (16).

THIS AND THAT: Has six no decisions this year, four of which have come in extra inning games...the A's have won three of his no decisions and are 12-12 (.500) in his starting assignments...has tossed seven innings or fewer in all 24 of his starts, including six innings or fewer 20 times...has received two runs of support or fewer in 14 of his 24 starts, including 12 of his last 16...has four games of 10 or more strikeouts this year and seven in his career.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start on April 5 against Los Angeles (NL)...allowed seven runs in a season-low 2.2 innings and walked a season-high three batters...it was his first of seven three-walk games...tossed 90 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...the loss extended his losing streak to a career-high three games dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...then picked up the win in each of his next two starts and allowed just one run on eight hits in 12.0 innings...won 7-3 at Houston on April 10 and then combined with Romo, Diekman and Wendelken on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 victory over Detroit on April 16...allowed six runs on a season-high nine hits in 4.0 innings against Minnesota on April 21 but had a no decision in the A's 13-12, 10-inning win...allowed three home runs in a start for the second time in his career (Sept. 22, 2020 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...finished April 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts...then went 3-3 with a 3.18 ERA in six starts in May...the three wins matched his most ever in a month and he had 38 strikeouts, which tied for eighth in the American League...won each of his first three starts in May and posted a 3.12 ERA over that stretch from May 3-14...then went 0-3 with a 3.24 ERA over his next three starts from May 19-29...the losing streak matched his career high...struck out 11 batters in 6.0 innings in a 4-2 loss to Seattle on May 24...it was one of four games with 10 or more strikeouts (10, July 8 at Houston; 10, July 23 at Seattle; 10, July 29 at Los Angeles-AL) and the second highest single-game total of his career to his 13 against the Mariners in the final game of the 2020 season... now has seven career 10-strikeout games...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings June 15 against Los Angles (AL) and allowed just two runs for the win...then surrendered a season-high eight runs on a season-high tving nine hits in 5.2 innings at Texas on June 21 for the loss...is 2-2 with a 2.87 ERA (17 er in 53.1 ip) in nine starts since then...started consecutive games that went extra innings on June 26 at San Francisco and July 2 against Boston...struck out 10

batters in back-to-back starts on July 23 at Seattle and July 29 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the first A's pitcher with consecutive games of 10 or more strikeouts since Brandon McCarthy (Aug. 29-Sept. 3, 2011)...combined with Romo and Trivino on a three-hit shutout in the latter contest against the Angels, a 4-0 win...tossed a season-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...struck out 10 and logged a season-high 109 pitches...finished July with a 2-1 record, a 2.30 ERA and .204 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 40 in 31.1 innings and walked just nine while surrendering two home runs...his strikeouts ranked fifth in the American League and fifth in Oakland history in the month of July...also ranked seventh in the AL in ERA and opponents batting average, ninth in slugging percentage (.310) and 10th in OPS (.588)...struck out eight batters on Aug. 4th against San Diego, giving him 45 strikeouts over a five-start stretch from July 8-Aug. 4...those were the second most strikeouts by an A's pitcher over a five-game span over the last 35 years...only Todd Stottlemyre, with 46 from June 16-July 6, 1995,

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss at Chicago last Monday...walked a season-high tying three batters...the A's scored twice in the second and he blanked the White Sox on two walks over the first two innings...then allowed one run in the third, fourth and fifth innings on a Hernandez sacrifice fly, a Zavala RBI single and a Jimenez RBI single.

2020 RECAP: Was off to a strong start as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA, .175 opponents batting average and no home runs over his first four starts...was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA, .321 opponents average and 10 home runs over his final seven starts...went 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA in 11 starts overall...his ERA was eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched...led the A's in strikeouts (60), losses (5), runs (35), home runs (10) and walks (23)...his opponents batting average broke down to .198 against right-handed hitters compared to .350 against left-handers.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Paul Blackburn (0-1, 5.06 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas last Wednesday and made his 2021 debut with a start that day at Chicago (AL)... was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss (5.1 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 3 so)...is 0-5 with a 11.12 ERA and .356 opponents batting average over his last seven games, including four starts, dating back to July 6, 2018...the five-game losing streak is a career high...his last win came on June 29, 2018 against Cleveland...is 1-1 with a 7.20 ERA (10.0 ip, 13 h, 8 r, 8 er, 3 bb, 2 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, both starts, against Seattle...the loss came in his only start last year, a 12-3 A's loss in the second game of a Sept. 26, 2020 doubleheader against Seattle in Oakland where the A's were the visiting team (2.1 ip, 5 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA and .311 opponents batting average in 17 games, including 16 starts, with Las Vegas...ranked fifth in the Triple-A West in ERA and strikeouts (80) at the time of his Aug. 18 promotion.
