OAKLAND ATHLETICS (70-55) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (67-58)

MONDAY, AUGUST 23, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight and six of the last eight games after going 12-3 over the previous 15 contests...are 70-55 (.565) overall, which is tied for the fifth best record in the American League...are tied with Boston for the second AL Wild Card spot and trail first place New York by 2½ games... have held at least a share of a playoff spot every day dating back to April 17... are in second place in the AL West and trail Houston by 3½ games for the second consecutive day...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 but have spent each of the 59 days since then in second... overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 59 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost each of the final two games against San Francisco by one-run and are now 18-22 (.450) in one-run games...have the most one-run losses in the American League and are tied for second most in the majors (Arizona and Miami, 23)...are tied with Seattle for the most one-run games in the AL...are 11-9 in one-run games and home, 7-13 on the road...led after seven innings in each of the two losses to San Francisco on Saturday and Sunday, marking just the second time over the last 15 years the A's lost back-to-back games when leading after seven innings (Aug. 31-Sept. 1, 2019 at New York-AL)...are 26-31 (.456) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 44-24 (.647) in games decided by three runs or more...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with the Boston for the second best record in the AL (Seattle, 12-4/.750)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 15-8 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Seattle for the second most walk-off wins in the majors (10) to the Colorado (12)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

A'S IN AUGUST: The A's are 11-8 (.579) in August, which is the third best record in the American League...are 26-for-28 (92.9%) in stolen base attempts and rank second in the majors in steals this month (Kansas City, 28)...the 26 steals are the most by an A's team in any month since they stole 36 bases in September of 2010...lead the league in hit by pitches (18), rank third in runs (100), walks (72) and on-base percentage (.344) and fourth in OPS (.779) and fewest strikeouts (148).

ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen a base in five consecutive games (10 stolen bases total) for the first time since July 18-25, 2012 when they did it in seven straight games...are 28-for-30 (93.3%) in stolen base attempts in the 22 games since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29 and rank second in the majors in steals over that span (Kansas City, 31)...Marte has accounted for 17 of the 28 steals...are now 71-for-84 (84.5%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 85.2%)...the 71 steals rank third in the American League, fifth in the majors and are the most by an A's team since 2015 (78).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.29 ERA (244 er in 667.2 ip) over the last 75 games dating back to May 26, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...have a 3.68 ERA overall, which ranks third in the AL...also rank third in opponents slugging percentage (.380) and fourth in OPS (.680) and on-base percentage (.301)...have the fewest walks (341) and pitches per inning (15.9) and the second fewest home runs (132)...are tied for second in shutouts (11).

STARTING PITCHING: Frankie Montas tossed 7.0 scoreless innings yesterday but had a no decision...A's starting pitchers are 2-5 with a 5.11 ERA (28 er in 49.1 innings) over the last 10 games and have tossed five innings or fewer six times over that stretch...starters have a Major League leading 710.0 innings pitched for the season...are on pace for 920 innings, which would be the fewest by a ML leader in a season of 154 games or more...the current low is 941.1 by the Mets in 2019...are 47-42 with a 3.71 ERA (293 er in 710.0 ip) ...are tied for second in the American League in wins and complete games (3) and rank fourth in ERA and opponents OPS (.687)...have used just nine starting pitchers, which is tied for fourth fewest in the majors...are the only team with four pitchers with 24 or more starts.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has been charged with the loss in back-to-back games for the second time this year (July 23-24 at Seattle)...has just 13 losses for the season, which is three fewer than any other team (Boston, Milwaukee and Pittsburgh, 16)...has back-to-back games with a blown save for the fourth time...has 19 blown saves for the season, which is fourth most in the American League...has a 2.47 ERA (34 er in 124.0 ip) and .194 (86-for-444) opponents batting average over the last 37 games dating back to July 7... has a 3.61 ERA overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League...has the third lowest opponents OPS (.667)...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.419) and the fourth highest

batting average (.242) but the fifth lowest on-base percentage (.306)...has the fifth highest percentage of inherited runners scored (36.1%).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .201 (45-for-224), including .164 (9-for-55) with runners in scoring position, over the last seven games and have scored 19 runs (2.7 per game)...batted .308, including .346 with RISP, over the previous eight games and scored 63 runs (7.9 per game)...are hitting .236 overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League, but have a .258 average with RISP, which is seventh highest...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 78 times, which is the most in the AL, third most in the majors and third most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019)...are tied for fourth in the AL in sacrifice flies (36) and rank fifth in walks (427) and sacrifice hits (15)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (25), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (120), are tied for the lead in home runs (3) and rank second in RBI (17) and extra base hits (6).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed two errors in the last nine games and have 54 for the season, which is second fewest in the American League to Houston (48)...are on pace for 70 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...are tied for the second fewest outfield assists in the AL (11).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this nine-game homestand against San Francisco (1-2), Seattle (two games) and New York-AL (four games)...went 4-1 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (3-0)...are 35-27 (.565) at home compared to 35-28 (.556) on the road...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (1-2) and Chicago-AL (1-3) to conclude a stretch that began on July 6 where the A's played 26 of 36 games on the road...have 19 home games and 18 road games remaining...are batting .226 (443-for-1964) with a .702 OPS at home compared to .245 with a .741 OPS on the road...have the second lowest home batting average and third lowest home OPS in the American League but the fourth highest road batting average and OPS.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 28-18 (.609) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 42-37 (.532) against righties...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to the White Sox (21-13/.618)... are 6-7 in this stretch of 15 games in 15 days that concludes tomorrow...have used the injured list 21 times this year...used it eight times last year and 17 times in 2019...have used a different lineup in each of the last 62 games and have 122 different lineups over the first 125 contests.

A'S vs. MARINERS: The A's are 4-6 against the Mariners...are 3-4 in Seattle and 1-2 in Oakland...won the season series last year 6-4 after going 10-9 in 2019 and have won back-to-back season series against the Mariners for the first time since winning three straight from 2004-06...are 20-19 against Seattle over the last three years...however, are 66-87 (.431) dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the A's worst mark against any American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 370-311 against the Mariners...that includes 198-138 in Oakland, 171-170 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 95-106 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks fourth among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.494), eighth in ERA (1.95) and batting average (.167) and ninth in slugging percentage (.259)...**Matt Chapman** leads ML third basemen in fielding percentage (.989), total chances (354) and putouts (135), is tied with Seager (SEA) for the lead in double plays (34) and ranks fourth in assists (215) and defensive runs saved (8)...**Starling Marte** has a ML leading 39 stolen bases...ranks third in the National League in steals (22) and tied for eighth in the AL (17)...has swiped 40 bags twice in his career (47 in 2016, 41 in 2013)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.930) and slugging percentage (.557), fourth in home runs (31), tied for fourth in extra base hits (59), fifth in on-base percentage (.373), tied for sixth in walks (62) and sacrifice flies (7), tied for eighth in doubles (28), ninth in RBI (81) and tied for ninth in runs (78)...**Lou Trivino** ranks fourth among AL relievers in save percentage (87.5%), fifth in saves (21) and seventh in ERA (1.99).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1946** Jesse Flores tosses a three-hit shutout and Gene Desautels has a RBI single in the bottom of the ninth in a 1-0 win over Cleveland...in **1975** Billy Williams homers twice in the second game of a doubleheader at Milwaukee and combines for six hits in the A's sweep of the Brewers...in **1983** Rickey Henderson has three hits and steals four bases in the A's 9-3 win at New York.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (0-1, 5.06 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas last Wednesday and made his 2021 debut with a start that day at Chicago (AL)...is scheduled to make the 23rd appearance and 20th start of his career...began his career with 17 starts, pitched in relief in his final three outings of 2019 and his last two outings have been starts...was a non-roster invitee with Oakland this spring after being outrighted on Feb. 27 following the Mitch Moreland signing.

FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-5 with a 11.12 ERA (28 er in 22.2 ip) and .356 (36-for-101) opponents batting average over his last seven games, including four starts, dating back to July 6, 2018...the five-game losing streak is a career high...his last win came on June 29, 2018 against Cleveland.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss at Chicago (AL) last Wednesday...allowed a RBI double to Jimenez in the first but then retired nine straight and Oakland tied the game with a run in the fourth...then allowed a RBI single to Robert in the fourth and was relieved by Romo with runners on first and second and one out in the sixth...Romo allowed one of those runs to score.

BLACKBURN vs. SEATTLE: Is 1-1 with a 7.20 ERA (10.0 ip, 13 h, 8 r, 8 er, 3 bb, 2 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, both starts...the loss came in his only start last year, a 12-3 A's loss in the second game of a Sept. 26, 2020 doubleheader against Seattle in Oakland where the A's were the visiting team...retired each of the first seven batters he faced before allowing seven of the Mariners eighth runs in the third inning...the win was his first Major League victory, a 7-4 A's win at Seattle on July 6, 2017...Oakland scored three times in the first inning and he allowed a hit in each of the first four innings...did not allow a run as he was aided by three double plays and a pickoff...allowed his only run in 7.2 innings of work in the fifth inning on a two-out solo home run by Haniger.

WITH LAS VEGAS: Was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA and .311 opponents batting average in 17 games, including 16 starts, with Las Vegas...the seven losses are his most as a minor leaguer and his opponents batting average is a career high...surrendered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings, an average of 0.81 per nine innings...ranked second in the Triple-A West in innings pitched (88.2), tied for second in games started (16) and fifth in ERA and strikeouts (80) at the time of his Aug. 18 promotion to Oakland.

LAS VEGAS OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .300 (61-for-203) against left-handed hitters and .323 (53-for-164) against right-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs and issued 18 of his 27 walks to lefties...opponents hit .311 with the bases empty, .311 with runners on...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots...had a .296 opponents average and allowed one home run the first time through the order, .307 with three home runs the second time and .337 with four home runs after that.

LAS VEGAS THIS AND THAT: Went 2-3 with a 4.24 ERA, .287 opponents batting average and .737 OPS in nine starts at home, 2-4 with a 5.79 ERA, .333 opponent average and .867 OPS on the road...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his 17 appearances...the Aviators were 5-11 (.313) in his starting assignments.

LAS VEGAS HIGHLIGHTS: Issued a season-high three walks in his first start on May 9 against Sacramento, his first of four games with three walks...tossed a season-high 6.0 innings May 15 at Reno, his first of five outings of 6.0 innings...picked up his first win of the season May 27 against Sacramento in his only relief appearance of the season...relieved a rehabbing Jesús Luzardo in the second inning and allowed two runs on six hits in 4.2 innings...finished May with a 1-1 record and a 3.74 ERA in four games, three starts...logged a season-high 106 pitches on June 1 against Sacramento...picked up his second win June 7 against Albuquerque for his only winning streak of the season...allowed six runs in a season-low 4.0 innings but had a no decision

in a 10-9 loss at Salt Lake on June 25...had a season-high three-game losing streak from July 12-31...posted a 7.08 ERA and .360 opponents batting average during that four-start streak...including July 18 against El Paso when he tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 12 hits in a 10-1 loss to Tacoma on July 31 and finished July 1-4 with a 6.23 ERA in six starts...struck out a season-high nine in 5.0 innings in his final Triple-A start on Aug. 13 against Tacoma but allowed four runs in and was the losing pitcher in a 4-3 loss.

2020 RECAP: Was on the A's Taxi Squad for every road trip except the first and had two stints with Oakland...was recalled for the first time Aug. 19 but was optioned back to the alternate camp Aug. 24 without pitching...was added as the 29th man for the Sept. 26 doubleheader against Seattle and started game two...allowed seven runs on five hits and two walks in 2.1 innings and was the losing pitcher in the A's 12-3 loss...was also on the Taxi Squad for the ALWCS and ALDS...was 0-0 with a 9.39 ERA in three games, including two starts, during the spring before he was optioned to Triple-A Las Vegas March 7...was added to the A's 60-man player pool June 29.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Cole Irvin (8-11, 3.52 ERA): Is 5-4 with a 3.13 ERA and .236 opponents batting average over his last 10 starts dating back to June 22 and has allowed just three home runs over that span...went 4-7 with a 3.89 ERA, .273 opponents average and nine home runs allowed over his first 14 stats...ranks fourth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.368), fifth in OPS (.673) and seventh in ERA (3.57), but is tied for fifth in most losses (11)...walked a career-high four batters in his last start but has issued just 29 free passes in 141.1 innings, an average of 1.85 walks per nine innings...that is the fourth lowest mark in the American League...is averaging 14.6 pitches per inning, which are the fewest in the majors...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 5-4 A's win at Chicago (AL) last Thursday (60 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er 4 bb, 1 so)...is 0-2 with an 8.31 ERA (8.2 ip, 15 h, 8 r, 8 er, 2 bb, 5 so) in two career starts against Seattle, both this year.

- Allowed his first runs since being acquired from the Cubs on July 26 yesterday...has now allowed two runs in 11 games with the A's (11.1 ip, 8 h, 2 er, 2 bb, 10 so)...however, has allowed 3-of-4 inherited runners to score and has a win, save and blown save.
- Surrendered back-to-back home runs to the Giants yesterday...marked just the second time in his career he's allowed more than one home run in an outing (2, July 25, 2017, also back-to-back).
- Has not allowed a run in 36 of his last 38 appearances (5 er in 35.2 ip, 1.26 ERA) and 49 of 54 overall.
- Ranks fourth among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.494), ninth in slugging percentage (.259), 13th in on-base percentage (.236), and is eighth in batting average (.167).
- Snapped a 43-game homerless streak Saturday (40.2 innings) but has yielded just three home runs in 50.2 innings overall...his average of 0.53 home runs per nine innings is 20th lowest among ML relievers.
- Has a 1.33 ERA (4 er in 27.0 ip) in 29 appearances on one day of rest or fewer, a 2.74 ERA (7 er in 23.0 ip) in 24 games on two days rest or more.
- Has not allowed a run in the eighth inning (25.2 ip).
- Was 0-2 with a 2.06 ERA in 43 relief appearances for Chicago (NL) when he was traded to Oakland along with cash considerations for Greg Deichmann and minor leaguer Daniel Palencia.

Last Year: Combined for a 1-2 record, one save and a 6.52 ERA in 15 relief appearances with the Diamondbacks and Cubs...missed a month of the season from Aug. 19 to Sept. 18 with a sprained left finger.

- Has a 2.63 ERA (7 er in 24.0 ip) and .195 (16-for-82) opponents batting average over his last 27 games dating back to June 4.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .178 (19-for-107) average but they have hit five of the career-high six home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 4.23 ERA (10 er in 21.2 ip) and .253 (21-for-83) opponents batting average in 24 outings on one day rest or fewer, a 1.44 ERA (4 er in 25.0 ip) and .133 (11-for-83) opponents average in 27 appearances on two days of rest or more.

- Has allowed five runs in his last six games (6.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 9 so, 7.50 ERA) after an eight-game, 7.2-inning scoreless streak.
- Has a .143 (10-for-70) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .247 (21-for-85) against right-handers...has issued 10 of his 12 walks and yielded three of his four home runs to righties for a .718 OPS...has a .418 OPS against lefties.
- Opponents are batting .172 (5-for-29) with runners in scoring position.
