# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (70-57) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (74-52)

THURSDAY, AUGUST 26, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost four straight and eight of the last 10 games after going 12-3 over the previous 15 contests...the four-game losing streak matches the A's second longest of the season...the longest is the season-opening six-game losing streak (April 1-6)...have lost 2½ games to Houston in the American League West race during the losing streak and now trail the Astros by five games, which is one short of the season high of six (twice, last: July 28)...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 but have spent each of the 62 days since then in second...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 62 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...are in third place in the AWild Card, 1½ games behind the second place team (Boston) and 4½ behind the first place team (Yankees)...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22

**DAYS OFF:** The A's had yesterday off after going 6-9 during a stretch of 15 consecutive days without a day off...are 13-4 (.765) following a day off, which is the second best record in the majors (San Francisco, 16-4/.800)...will have the next three Mondays off before finishing the season with 19 games in 20 days.

**ON THE BASES:** The A's are 30-for-32 (93.8%) in stolen base attempts in the 24 games since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29 and rank second in the majors in steals over that span (Kansas City, 33)...Marte has accounted for 17 of the 30 steals...are now 73-for-86 (84.9%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 85.2%)...the 73 steals rank third in the American League, fifth in the majors and are the most by an A's team since 2015 (78).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have a five-game errorless streak and have committed just two errors in the last 11 games...have 54 for the season, which is second fewest in the American League to Houston (49)...are on pace for 69 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...are tied for the second fewest outfield assists in the AL (11) and have the fifth fewest double plays (94).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 4.81 ERA (55 er in 103.0 ip) and allowed 17 home runs over the last 12 games after logging a 2.19 ERA and four home runs over the previous 12 contests...overall, rank third in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.380), fourth in OPS (.681) and fifth in ERA (3.70) and on-base percentage (.301)...have the fewest walks (344), home runs (134) and pitches per inning (15.9)...are tied for second in shutouts (11).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in seven of the last 12 games and are 2-6 with a 5.12 ERA (33 er in 58.0 ip) and .288 (67-for-233) opponents batting average over that span...however, have 718.2 innings pitched for the season, which is the most in the majors...are on pace for 916.2 innings, which would be the fewest by a Major League leader in a season of 154 games or more...the current low is 941.1 by the Mets in 2019...are 47-43 with a 3.73 ERA (298 er in 718.2 ip)...rank third in the American League in wins and fourth in ERA and opponents OPS (689)...are tied for second in complete games (3)...have used just nine starting pitchers, which is tied for fourth fewest in the majors...are the only team with four pitchers with 25 or more starts...no other team has more than two.

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen is 1-3 with two saves, five blown saves and a 4.40 ERA (22 er in 45.0 ip) over the last 12 games...has a 3.64 ERA overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League...has the third lowest opponents OPS (.667)...has 20 blown saves, which is tied with the Yankees for third most in the league...has just 14 losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.424) and the fourth highest batting average (.242).

*OFFENSE:* The A's are hitting .207 (60-for-290) with 23 runs scored over the last nine games (2.5 runs per game) and are 11-for-66 (.167) with runners in scoring position...batted .308 with 63 runs over the previous eight games (7.9 per game), including .346 with RISP...are hitting .236 overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League, but have a .257 average with RISP, which is eighth highest...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 79 times, which is the most in the AL, third most in the majors and third most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019)...are tied for fourth in the AL in sacrifice flies (36) and rank fifth in walks (429) and sacrifice hits (15)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (25), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (121), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in RBI (17) and tied for second in extra base hits (6).

**A's IN AUGUST:** The A's are 11-10 (.524) in August...went 11-13 (.458) in July, which was the A's first losing record in a month of 10 or more games since they went 11-15 in April of 2019...have not had back-to-back months with a losing record since they had 10 straight from May 2016-Aug. 2017...are 28-for-30 (93.3%) in stolen base attempts in August and are second in the American League in steals this month (Kansas City, 30)...the 28 steals are the most by an A's team in any month since they stole 36 bases in September of 2010...lead the AL in hit by pitches (19) and fewest strikeouts (158), rank third on-base percentage (.337) and fifth in OPS (.772)...the pitching staff ranks fifth in opponents OPS (.670) and ninth in ERA (3.88).

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 18-22 (.450) in onerun games...the losses are the most in the American League and tied for fourth most in the majors...the 40 one-run games are tied with Seattle for the most in the AL...are 11-9 in one-run games at home, 7-13 on the road... are 26-32 (.448) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 44-25 (.638) in games decided by three runs or more...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is the second best record in the AL (Seattle, 12-4/.750)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 15-9 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Seattle for the second most walk-off wins in the majors (10) to Colorado (12)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...lost three consecutive games on Saturday, Sunday and Monday despite leading after seven innings...it was the first three-game stretch in Oakland history where the A's led each game entering the eighth inning but gone on to lose the game...have six losses when leading after seven innings this year, which is tied for second most in the AL (Houston, 7).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-4 on this nine-game homestand against San Francisco (1-2), Seattle (0-2) and New York-AL (four games)...went 4-1 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (3-0)...are 35-29 (.547) at home compared to 35-28 (.556) on the road...begin a six-game road trip to Detroit (three games) and Toronto (three games) on Tuesday...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (1-2) and Chicago-AL (1-3)...are batting .225 (457-for-2030) with a .699 OPS at home compared to .245 with a .742 OPS on the road...have the second lowest home batting average and third lowest home OPS in the American League but the fourth highest road OPS and fifth highest batting average.

*A's vs. YANKEE5:* The A's trail in the season series after losing two of three in New York, June 18-20...this will be the Yankees first visit to the Coliseum in over two years as they were last here Aug. 20-22, 2019...the A's won the season series in 2019, 4-2...went 3-0 in Oakland and 1-2 in New York...it was their fifth season series win in seven seasons...are 29-19 (.604) dating back to 2013, which is the best record by an American League team against the Yankees over that stretch...have won nine of the last 10 games and 21 of the last 28 in Oakland but have dropped eight of the last 11 games in New York... since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 255-285 against the Yankees... that includes 141-128 in Oakland and 114-157 in New York...are 17-26 at Yankee Stadium...all-time, the A's are 796-1151 against the Yankees/Orioles.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks sixth among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.492), tied for seventh in ERA (1.90), ninth in batting average (.168) and 10th in slugging percentage (.257)...*Matt Chapman* leads ML third basemen in fielding percentage (.989) and putouts (136), ranks second in total chances (355) and double plays (34) and fourth in assists (215)... *Starling Marte* is 10 plate appearances short of qualifying for the league leaders...based on a minimum of 350 plate appearances, he leads the majors in batting (.323) and ranks fourth in on-base percentage (.405)....*Matt Olson* ranks third in the American League in OPS (.934) and slugging percentage (.560), fourth in home runs (32), extra base hits (60) and on-base percentage (.373), tied for sixth in sacrifice flies (7), tied for eighth in RBI (82), walks (62) and doubles (28) and tied for ninth in runs (79).

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1916** Joe Bush no-hits Cleveland 5-0 in Philadelphia after lasting just three innings against Cleveland a day earlier...in **1926** the A's have walk-off wins in both games of a doubleheader against St. Louis, winning 8-6 in 11 innings in the first game and 4-3 in 12 innings in the second game...Al Simmons combines for five hits and four RBI, including a walk-off home run in game one...in **1973** Ken Holtzman tosses a four-hit shutout to improve to 19-11 in the A's 1-0 win over New York...Vic Davalillo's pinch hit RBI single in the eighth inning drives in the only run of the game.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (7-4, 3.25 ERA)

*FOR STARTERS:* Was reinstated from the injured list on Aug. 8 and is 2-0 with a 3.31 ERA (6 er in 16.1 ip) in three starts since his return...was 5-4 with a 3.24 ERA in 13 starts when he was placed on the 10-day IL July 31 retroactive to July 28 with a right shoulder impingement...missed just one start and did not have a rehab assignment...began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and was recalled by the A's on May 12.

**ROOKIE LEADERS:** Is tied for fifth among American League rookies in wins (7) and ranks eighth in innings pitched (88.2), strikeouts (87) and games started (15)...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, his 3.25 ERA is third lowest in the AL...also ranks third in opponents on-base percentage (.291) and fourth in OPS (.677), slugging percentage (.385) and batting average (.217).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has a .217 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .179 (30-for-168) with a .545 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .258 (41-for-159) with an .810 OPS against left-handers...has issued 24 of his 33 walks to lefties...has allowed a .177 (11-for-62) batting average with runners in scoring position...nine of the 12 home runs he has surrendered have been solo shots...has a .158 (21-for-133) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .282 (35-for-124) the second time and .214 (15-for-70) after that...has allowed four of his 12 home runs to the opponents clean-up hitter but has held the five hitter to a .053 (2-for-38) batting average.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 5-2 with a 1.47 ERA (7 er in 43.0 ip) and .170 (26-for-153) opponents batting average in seven starts at home compared to 2-2 with a 4.93 ERA (25 er in 45.2 ip) and .259 (45-for-174) opponents average in nine starts on the road...has yielded nine of his 12 home runs on the road for an .805 OPS...has a .530 opponents OPS in Oakland.

*BY INNING:* Has not allowed a run in the second inning (16.0 ip) and has a 1.41 ERA (5 er in 32.0 ip) and .167 (19-for-114) opponents batting average over the first two innings of a game...has a 4.29 ERA (27 er in 56.2 ip) and .244 (52-for-213) opponents average from the third inning on.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 3-2 with a 4.40 ERA (21 er in 43.0 ip) and .244 (40-for-164) opponents batting average in eight starts at night compared to 4-2 with a 2.17 ERA (11 er in 45.2 ip) and .190 (31-for-163) opponents batting average in eight starts during the day...has yielded nine of his 12 home runs at night.

*THIS AND THAT:* Has allowed two runs or fewer in 11 of his 16 starts and five hits or fewer 13 times...has left with the lead in four of his five no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the A's are 10-6 (.625) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and went 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA in one start...was the Aviators Opening Day starter on May 6 at Las Vegas and was the losing pitcher in an 8-1 loss to Sacramento (4.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 0 hr, 76 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and made his first Major League start that day at Boston...allowed a run on four hits in 5.0 innings to earn his first ML win in the A's 4-1 victory over the Red Sox...would go 4-1 with a 2.84 ERA and .182 opponents batting average over his first seven starts through June 18...struck out nine batters in 5.2 innings in his second start on May 21 at Los Angeles (AL) but had a no decision in an 8-4 A's win...left with a 3-2 lead and two outs in the bottom of the sixth but Petit allowed a run for the blown save...it was the first of four starts in which he left with the lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (June 23 at Texas, July 10 at Texas, Aug. 14 at Cleveland)...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings May 26 against Seattle for his second win...that matched his longest outing as a professional…also tossed 7.0 innings for Single-A Tampa at Charlotte on April 16, 2016, his second professional appearance...logged a season-low 3.2 innings May 31 at Seattle but had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss...was charged with the first loss of his career when he allowed two runs in 5.0 innings on June 6 at Colorado, a 3-1 A's loss...pitched 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits on June 12 to defeat Kansas City 11-2... walked a career-high four...tossed 105 pitches, which were his most as a professional, in a 5-4 loss to Texas on June 29...took the loss that day and went 0-2 despite a 3.00 ERA over his final three starts before the All-Star Break... struck out a career-high 10 batters in a career-high tying 7.0 innings on July 4 against Boston but was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss...it was the first 10-strikeout game by an A's rookie since Chris Bassitt on Aug. 9, 2015 against Houston (also 10)...issued a career-high tying four walks in 5.0 innings in a no decision at Texas on July 10...combined with Romo, Moll and Guerra on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Los Angeles (AL) on July 20 as part of a career-high 12.0-inning scoreless streak from July 10 to 27...allowed a career-high six runs in 4.1 innings in a 7-4 loss at San Diego on July 27...it snapped a career-opening 14-game streak of 1.2 innings or more and six hits or fewer, which was the longest such streak in Athletics history...singled off Chris Paddack in the third inning for his first Major League hit...was placed on the 10-day injured list July 31 retroactive to July 28 with a right shoulder

impingement...missed just one start, did not have a rehab assignment, and was reinstated from the IL on Aug. 8...allowed a career-high eight hits in 5.1 innings in a no decision in an 8-3 A's win at Texas on Aug. 14...did not walk or strikeout a batter to mark the 19th time in Oakland history a starting pitcher went at least five innings without a walk or strikeout (last: Dallas Braden, Aug. 25, 2008 vs. Los Angeles-AL).

*LAST START:* He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 victory over San Francisco last Friday in Oakland...issued a career-high tying four walks in 5.0 innings but yielded just three hits...blanked the Giants on two hits and four walks over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a lead-off home run to Yastrzemski in the fifth...retired the next three batters and was relieved by Diekman to start the sixth with the A's leading 2-1.

**2020 RECAP:** Made his Major League debut and had two relief appearances over five stints with Oakland...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average...allowed two home runs in 3.2 innings, walked two and struck out four...did not pitch during his first stint...joined the club a second time Aug. 16 and made his ML debut that day at San Francisco (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...was recalled as the 29th man for doubleheaders on Sept. 8 and Sept. 14 but did not pitch...recalled for his fifth stint on Sept. 24 and made one appearance in the second game of the Sept. 26 doubleheader against Seattle (1.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...was on the Taxi Squad for the postseason...was rated as the A's number 10 prospect by *Baseball America* following the season.

# TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (8-8, 3.77 ERA): Has tossed five innings or fewer in all four of his starts in August and is 0-2 with a 9.77 ERA and .343 opponents batting average...is now 8-11 with a 5.84 ERA in 25 career starts in August...the losses are his most in any month and the ERA is his highest...is tied for fifth in the American League in games started (25), ranks sixth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.19) and tied for eighth in strikeouts (151)...has allowed a .178 batting average and .554 OPS against left-handed hitters compared to .275 with a .756 OPS against right-handers...has allowed a .178 batting average and .554 OPS against left-handed hitters...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-5 A's loss to San Francisco last Saturday here in Oakland (4.2 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 3 so)...is 1-2 with a 3.60 ERA (30.0 ip, 22 h, 12 r, 12 er, 10 bb, 35 so, 2 hr) in five career starts against the Yankees...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 2-1 A's loss at New York on June 20 (5.1 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 11 so).

# 39 LHP ANDREW CHAFIN

### Last Outing: 8/23 vs. Seattle (ND, 1.1 ip, h, 2 so) Saves/Opportunities: 1-3

Inherited Runners/Scored: 24/8 First Hitters: 8-51 (3 bb, sf)

- Allowed his first runs since being acquired from the Cubs on July 26 Saturday...has now allowed two runs in 12 games with the A's (12.2 ip, 9 h, 2 er, 2 bb, 12 so)...however, has allowed 3-of-4 inherited runners to score and has a win, save and blown save.
- Surrendered back-to-back home runs to the Giants Saturday...marked just the second time in his career he's allowed more than one home run in an outing (2, July 25, 2017, also back-to-back).
- Has not allowed a run in 37 of his last 39 appearances (5 er in 37.0 ip, 1.22 ERA) and 50 of 55 overall.
- Ranks sixth among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.492), 10th in slugging percentage (.257), 14th in on-base percentage (.235), and is ninth in batting average (.168).
- Snapped a 43-game homerless streak Saturday (40.2 innings) but has yielded just three home runs in 52.0 innings overall...his average of 0.52 home runs per nine innings is 20th lowest among ML relievers.
