OAKLAND ATHLETICS (70-58) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (75-52)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost five straight and nine of the last 11 games after going 12-3 over the previous 15 contests...the five-game losing streak is one short of the season high of six (April 1-6)...started the year 0-6, went a Major League best 44-21 (.677) from April 7-June 18 (first game at New York-AL), and are 26-31 (.456) since then...are in third place in the American League Wild Card, 2½ games behind the second place team (Boston) and 5½ behind the first place team (New York)...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are in second place in the AL West and trail Houston by 5½ games...that is ½ game short of the season high of six (twice, last: July 28)...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 but have spent each of the 63 days since then in second...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 63 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's erased a six-run deficit last night but lost, 7-6...are now 18-23 (.439) in one-run games, which is the fifth worst record in the American League...lead the AL and are tied for third in the majors in one-run losses and one-run decisions (41)...are 26-33 (.441) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 44-25 (.638) in games decided by three runs or more...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is the second best record in the AL (Seattle, 12-4/.750)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 15-10 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Seattle for the second most walk-off wins in the majors (10) to Colorado (12)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...lost three consecutive games last Saturday, Sunday and Monday despite leading after seven innings...it was the first three-game stretch in Oakland history where the A's led each game entering the eighth inning but gone on to lose the game...have six losses when leading after seven innings this year, which is tied for second most in the AL (Houston, 7).

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in each of their last 17 stolen base attempts and are now 32-for-34 (94.1%) in the 25 games since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29...rank second in the majors in steals over that span (Kansas City, 34)...Marte has accounted for 18 of the 32 steals...are now 75-for-88 (85.2%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 86.0%)...the 75 steals rank third in the American League, fifth in the majors and are the most by an A's team since 2015 (78).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just three errors in the last 12 games and have 55 for the season, which is second fewest in the American League to Houston (49)...are on pace for 70 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...have the second fewest outfield assists in the AL (11) and the fifth fewest double plays (94).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.98 ERA (62 er in 112.0 ip) and allowed 20 home runs over the last 13 games after logging a 2.19 ERA and four home runs over the previous 12 contests...overall, rank fourth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.382) and fifth in OPS (.683), on-base percentage (.301) and ERA (3.72)...have the fewest walks (348), home runs (137) and pitches per inning (15.9)...are tied for second in shutouts (11).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in eight of the last 13 games and are 2-6 with a 5.57 ERA (39 er in 63.0 ip) and .287 (73-for-254) opponents batting average over that span...however, have 723.2 innings pitched for the season, which is the most in the majors...are on pace for 916.0 innings, which would be the fewest by a Major League leader in a season of 154 games or more...the current low is 941.1 by the Mets in 2019...are 47-43 with a 3.78 ERA (304 er in 723.2 ip)...rank third in the American League in wins and fourth in ERA and opponents OPS (.692)...are tied for second in complete games (3)...have used just nine starting pitchers, which is tied for fourth fewest in the majors...are the only team with four pitchers with 25 or more starts...no other team has more than two.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen was charged with its fourth loss in the last five games last night but has just 15 losses for the season, which is the fewest in the majors...has two saves and five blown saves over the last 13 games...has 20 blown saves overall, which is tied with the Yankees for third most in the American League...ranks third in the AL in opponents OPS (.666) and fourth in ERA (3.63)...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced (.425) and the fourth highest batting average (.242).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .207 (67-for-324) with 29 runs scored over the last 10 games (2.9 runs per game) and are 12-for-70 (.171) with runners in scoring position...batted .308 with 63 runs over the previous eight games (7.9 per game), including .346 with RISP...are hitting .235 overall, which is third lowest in the American League, but have a .257 average with RISP,

which is eighth highest...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 79 times, which is the most in the AL, tied for third most in the majors and third most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019)...are tied for fourth in the AL in sacrifice flies (36) and rank fifth in walks (434) and sacrifice hits (15)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (25), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (121), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in RBI (17) and tied for second in extra base hits (6).

A'S IN AUGUST: The A's are 11-11 (.500) in August with four games remaining...went 11-13 (.458) in July, which was the A's first losing record in a month of 10 or more games since they went 11-15 in April of 2019...have not had back-to-back months with a losing record since they had 10 straight from May 2016-Aug. 2017...are 30-for-32 (93.8%) in stolen base attempts in August and are second in the majors in steals this month (Kansas City, 31)...the 30 steals match the most by an A's team in August over the last 38 years (had 42 in 1983) and are the most by an A's team in any month since they stole 36 bases in September of 2010...lead the AL in hit by pitches (19), are tied for second in fewest strikeouts (170) and rank third on-base percentage (.336)...the pitching staff ranks fifth in opponents OPS (.682) and ninth in ERA (4.02).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-5 on this nine-game homestand against San Francisco (1-2), Seattle (0-2) and New York-AL (0-1)...went 4-1 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (3-0)...are 35-30 (.538) at home compared to 35-28 (.556) on the road...leave for a six-game road trip to Detroit (three games) and Toronto (three games) on Monday...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (1-2) and Chicago-AL (1-3)...are batting .225 (464-for-2064) with a .700 OPS at home compared to .245 with a .742 OPS on the road...have the second lowest home batting average and third lowest home OPS in the American League but the fourth highest road batting average and OPS.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 28-19 (.596) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 42-39 (.519) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to the White Sox (22-14/.611)...are 13-5 (.722) following a day off, which is the second best record in the majors (San Francisco, 16-4/.800)...will have the next three Mondays off before finishing the season with 19 games in 20 days...have used the injured list 22 times this year...used it eight times last year and 17 times in 2019...have used a different lineup in each of the last 65 games and have 125 different lineups over the first 128 contests.

A'S vs. YANKEES: The A's are 1-3 against the Yankees...lost the first game in Oakland last night after losing two of three in New York in mid-June...have not lost the season series to the Yankees since 2016 (3-4) and have won five of the previous seven season series...are 29-20 (.592) dating back to 2013, which is the best record by an American League team against the Yankees over that stretch...have won nine of the last 11 games and 21 of the last 29 in Oakland but have dropped eight of the last 11 games in New York...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 255-286 against the Yankees...that includes 141-129 in Oakland and 114-157 in New York...are 17-26 at Yankee Stadium...all-time, the A's are 796-1152 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks sixth among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.484), seventh in ERA (1.87) and batting average (.165) and ninth in slugging percentage (.253)...**Matt Chapman** leads ML third basemen in fielding percentage (.989), total chances (360) and putouts (139), ranks second in double plays (34) and fourth in assists (217)...**Starling Marte** stole his ML leading 40th base of the season last night, his third 40-steal season (47 in 2016, 41 in 2013)...ranks third in the National League in steals (22) and tied for seventh in the American League (18)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.927) and slugging percentage (.555), fourth in extra base hits (60), tied for fourth in home runs (32), tied for sixth in sacrifice flies (7), seventh in on-base percentage (.372), eighth in walks (63), tied for ninth in doubles (28) and runs (80) and 10th in RBI (82).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1948** Hank Majeski has six doubles in a doubleheader against St. Louis as the A's win 6-0 and 9-1...in **1982** Rickey Henderson steals four bases against the Milwaukee Brewers, breaking Lou Brock's major league single season record of 118...he would finish the season with 130 steals...in **2010** Brett Anderson allowed four runs in 2.0 innings, ending an Athletics record tying streak of 18 games with six or more innings and three earned runs or fewer by A's starting pitchers.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (8-8, 3.77 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make the 122nd start of his career today, which surpasses Brett Anderson (121) for the most starts by an A's pitcher over the last 18 years...his 47 wins match Trevor Cahill and Joe Blanton for the most by an A's pitcher over that span and his 598 strikeouts are second most to Sonny Gray (607)...in the Wild Card era (1995-present), the only A's pitchers with more starts and wins are Barry Zito (224 starts, 102 wins), Tim Hudson (183, 92) and Mark Mulder (150, 81).

IN AUGUST: Has tossed five innings or fewer in all four of his starts in August and is 0-2 with a 9.77 ERA (17 er in 15.2 ip) and .343 (24-for-70) opponents batting average...is now 8-11 with a 5.84 ERA (74 er in 114.0 ip) in 25 career starts in August...the losses are his most in any month and the ERA is his highest (has nine losses and a 5.51 ERA in May)...went 6-4 with a 2.92 ERA and .655 OPS in 16 starts over the first three months of the season and allowed just eight home runs in 92.2 innings...is 2-4 with a 5.52 ERA (28 er in 45.2 ip) and .804 OPS in nine starts in July and August and has allowed 11 home runs in 45.2 innings.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks sixth in the American League in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.19), tied for sixth in games started (25) and tied for eighth in strikeouts (151)...the 151 strikeouts are a career-high...is one of three pitchers in the majors with two shutouts (DeSclafani, SF and Wheeler, PHI) and one of six with two or more complete games.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .178 (24-for-135) batting average and .554 OPS against left-handed hitters compared to .275 (111-for-404) with a .756 OPS against right-handers...his batting average against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Kikuchi, SEA .129) and his OPS ranks third...has issued 29 of his 36 walks to righties.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest...is 5-5 with a 4.76 ERA (37 er in 70.0 ip) in 14 starts on five days rest or more compared to 3-2 with a 2.26 ERA (16 er in 63.2 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest...over the last three years, he is 10-6 with a 3.89 ERA (50 er in 115.2 ip) in 22 starts on five days rest or more compared to 9-3 with a 2.72 ERA (35 er in 115.2 ip) in 20 starts on four days rest.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 7-2 in his no decisions and are 15-10 (.600) in his starting assignments...are 26-15 (.634) when he starts over the last three years...has allowed one run or fewer in 12 of his 25 starts but has received one run of support or fewer in 10 of his starts...is 0-6 with one run of support or fewer, 8-2 with two runs of support or more...has walked two batters or fewer 19 times, including eight starts with one walk and six with no walks...has three games of 10 or more strikeouts this year and six in his career...the six 10-strikeout games are tied for seventh most in Oakland history...has a 5.07 ERA (28 er in 49.2 ip) over the first two innings of his starts, a 2.89 ERA (26 er in 81.0 ip) in innings three through six and a 4.15 ERA (4 er in 8.2 ip) from the seventh inning on.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start but then went 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA over his next four starts...picked up his first win of the season in the 100th game of his career, an 8-4 victory over Detroit on April 15...tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the doubleheader April 20...it was the 11th complete game shutout of fewer than eight innings in Oakland history and his second career complete game and shutout...the start was the 100th of his career and he became the 25th pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...had 10 strikeouts on May 7 against Tampa Bay, but had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win...retired each of the first 18 batters he faced before walking Arozarena to start the seventh...allowed one run or fewer in five consecutive starts from May 23 to June 14 and went 3-0 with a 0.84 ERA over that span...became the first A's pitcher with five consecutive games of one run or fewer and five innings pitched or more since Trevor Cahill (April 17-May 9, 2011)...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on May 23...left with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was the first of two times the pen blew the save in a game in which he was the pitcher of record (July 16 vs. Cleveland)...struck out Justin Upton to lead off the game for the 50,000th strikeout in Oakland history...fanned Taylor Ward to end the fourth inning for his 500th career strikeout...tossed a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Seattle on June 2...it was his third career complete game and shutout, his second this year...then combined with Petit, Trivino and Diekmann on a two-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win on June 9 against Arizona...it was the second time in his career he did not allow a run in back-to-back starts (Sept. 14-20, 2016)...had a career-high 16.0-inning scoreless streak from June 2 to 14...struck out 11 batters in 5.1 innings June 20 at New York (AL) but was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss...the 11 strikeouts match the most in Athletics history by a pitcher with fewer than six innings pitched...went 2-for-2 with a double June 25 at San Francisco...it was the first extra base hit by an A's pitcher since Joe Kennedy doubled on June 12, 2007 at Houston...was named American League Pitcher of the Month for June after going 3-2 with a 1.13 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 34 batters in 32.0 innings and al-

lowed just one home run...it was the second time he was named Pitcher of the Month (April, 2018)...struck out a career-high 13 batters in 7.0 innings in a 4-1 win at Seattle on July 22...matched the most strikeouts in Athletics history by a pitcher with seven innings or fewer and equaled the seventh highest single-game total in Oakland history...went 2-2 with a 3.30 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in five starts in July...struck out 41 and walked just five in 30.0 innings...the strikeouts tied for third in the American League in July and tied Mike Moore (1989) for the third highest total in July in Oakland history behind Vida Blue (55 in 1971, 42 in 1976).

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss to San Francisco last Saturday in Oakland...walked a season-high tying three batters in 4.2 innings...the A's scored three times in the first but he allowed a two-run home run to Bryant in the second...had a 5-2 when he hit Belt with two outs in the fifth...then walked Ruf and Bryant and was relieved by Petit, who got the final out.
