# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (70-59) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (76-52)

ABOUT THE A'S: Extended their losing streak to six games last night, which matches their longest losing streak over the last four years (fourth time, last: April 1-6, 2021)...have not lost more than six straight since an eightgame losing streak from Aug. 28-Sept 5. 2017...have also lost 10 of the last 12 games after going 12-3 over the previous 15 contests...started the year 0-6, went a Major League best 44-21 (.677) from April 7-June 18 (first game at New York-AL), and are 26-32 (.448) since then...are in third place in the American League Wild Card, 3½ games behind the second place team (Boston) and 6½ behind the first place team (New York)...the 3½ games out of the playoffs matches the A's season-high (April 6)...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are in second place in the AL West and trail Houston by a season-high 6½ games...it is the first time the A's have been more than six games out of first place in the West since finishing the 2019 season 10 games back...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 but have spent each of the 64 days since then in second...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 64 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

A's IN AUGUST: The A's are 11-12 (.478) in August with three games remaining...went 11-13 (.458) in July, which was the A's first losing record in a month of 10 or more games since they went 11-15 in April of 2019...have not had back-to-back months with a losing record since they had 10 straight from May 2016-Aug. 2017...are 30-for-32 (93.8%) in stolen base attempts in August and are tied with Cleveland for second in the majors in steals this month (Kansas City, 32)...the 30 steals match the most by an A's team in August over the last 38 years (had 42 in 1983) and are the most by an A's team in any month since they stole 36 bases in September of 2010...lead the AL in hit by pitches (19), rank third on-base percentage (.336) and fourth in walks (83) and fewest strikeouts (184)...the pitching staff ranks sixth in opponents OPS (.701) and ninth in ERA (4.19).

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in each of their last 17 stolen base attempts and are now 32-for-34 (94.1%) in the 26 games since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29...are tied with Cleveland for second in the majors in steals over that span (Kansas City, 35)...Marte has accounted for 18 of the 32 steals...are now 75-for-88 (85.2%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 86.2%)...the 75 steals rank third in the American League, fifth in the majors and are the most by an A's team since 2015 (78).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed just three errors in the last 13 games and have 55 for the season, which is second fewest in the American League to Houston (49)...are on pace for 69 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...have the second fewest outfield assists in the AL (11) and are tied for the fourth fewest double plays (94).

*PITCHING*: The A's have compiled a 5.21 ERA (70 er in 121.0 ip) and allowed 24 home runs over the last 14 games after logging a 2.19 ERA and four home runs over the previous 12 contests...overall, rank third in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.385) and fifth in OPS (.687), onbase percentage (.302) and ERA (3.76)...have the fewest walks (348) and the second fewest home runs (141) and pitches per inning (15.9)...are tied for second in shutouts (11).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in nine of the last 14 games and are 2-7 with a 5.88 ERA (44 er in 67.1 ip) and .292 (80-for-274) opponents batting average over that span...however, have 728.0 innings pitched for the season, which is the most in the majors...are on pace for 914.1 innings, which would be the fewest by a Major League leader in a season of 154 games or more...the current low is 941.1 by the Mets in 2019...are 47-44 with a 3.82 ERA (309 er in 728.0 ip)...rank third in the American League in wins, fourth in opponents OPS (692) and fifth in ERA...are tied for second in complete games (3)...have used just nine starting pitchers, which is tied for fourth fewest in the majors...are the only team with four pitchers with 25 or more starts.

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has allowed at least one run in each of the last six games and is 0-4 with three blown saves and a 5.55 ERA (15 er in 24.1 ip) over that span...has just 15 losses for the season, which is the fewest in the majors, but has 20 blown saves, which is tied with the Yankees for third most in the American League...ranks third in the AL in opponents OPS (.670) and fourth in ERA (3.65)...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced (.425) and the fourth highest batting average (.242).

*OFFENSE:* The A's have been held to eight hits or fewer in each of the last 11 games, which is their longest streak in one season since a 14-game streak from July 3-20, 2007...are hitting .209 (75-for-358) with 31 runs scored over

that span (2.8 runs per game) and are 13-for-79 (.165) with runners in scoring position...batted .308 with 63 runs over the previous eight games (7.9 per game), including .346 with RISP...are hitting .235 overall, which is third lowest in the American League, but have a .256 average with RISP, which is eighth highest...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 79 times, which is the most in the AL, fourth most in the majors and third most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019)...are tied for fourth in the AL in sacrifice flies (36) and rank fifth in walks (438) and sacrifice hits (15)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (25), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (122), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in RBI (17) and third in extra base hits (6).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 18-23 (.439) in one-run games, which is the fifth worst record in the American League...lead the AL in one-run losses and are tied with Seattle for the most one-run decisions (41)...are 26-33 (.441) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 44-26 (.629) in games decided by three runs or more...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is the second best record in the AL (Seattle, 12-5/.706)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 15-10 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with Seattle for the second most walk-off wins in the majors (10) to Colorado (12)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...have six losses when leading after seven innings this year, which is tied for third most in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have lost each of their last six home games, which matches their longest home losing streak over the last four years (third time, last: April 1-6, 2021)...have not lost more than six straight home games since an eight-game losing streak from June 19-July 3, 2017...are 1-6 on this ninegame homestand against San Francisco (1-2), Seattle (0-2) and New York-AL (0-2)...went 4-1 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (3-0)...are 35-31 (.530) at home compared to 35-28 (.556) on the road...leave for a six-game road trip to Detroit (three games) and Toronto (three games) on Monday...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (1-2) and Chicago-AL (1-3)...are batting .225 (472-for-2098) with a .698 OPS at home compared to .245 with a .742 OPS on the road...have the second lowest home batting average and third lowest home OPS in the American League but the third highest road OPS and fourth highest road batting average.

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's have lost the season series for the first time since 2016 as they are 1-4 with two games remaining...are 1-2 in New York and 0-2 in Oakland...won the first game but have lost four straight since then, which matches the A's longest losing streak against the Yankees over the last 10 years...have not lost more than five straight since an 11-game losing streak from July 5, 2010-July 22, 2011...are 16-15 against the Yankees dating back to 2016...have won nine of the last 12 games and 21 of the last 30 in Oakland but have dropped eight of the last 11 games in New York...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 255-287 against the Yankees...that includes 141-130 in Oakland and 114-157 in New York...are 17-26 at Yankee Stadium... all-time, the A's are 796-1153 against the Yankees/Orioles.

# TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks fifth among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.484), sixth in ERA (1.87), seventh in batting average (.165) and eighth in slugging percentage (.253)...Matt Chapman leads ML third basemen in fielding percentage (.989), total chances (362) and putouts (139), ranks second in double plays (34), fourth in assists (219) and tied for fourth in defensive runs saved (8)...Starling Marte has hit safely in 23 of his 26 games with the A's...is batting .357 with 18 stolen bases and 12 multiple hit games with Oakland...has 40 hits, which are the most by a player over his first 25 games with the A's since Paul Lehner had 43 in 1950...Matt Olson ranks third in the American League in OPS (.926) and slugging percentage (.554), tied for fourth in home runs (32) and extra base hits (60), sixth in on-base percentage (.373), tied for sixth in sacrifice flies (7), eighth in walks (64), tied for ninth in doubles (28) and RBI (83) and tied for 10th in runs (80)

## THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1938 the A's sweep a doubleheader from Chicago on Connie Mack Day at Shibe Park, their seventh consecutive twin bill in eight days...in 1974 the A's win at Milwaukee 3-1 as Catfish Hunter wins his 20th game of the season, his fourth consecutive 20-win season...he would go on to win 25 games, an Oakland record which stood until 1990 when Bob Welch won 27...in 2002 the A's defeat Kansas City 7-1 to extend their winning streak to an Oakland record 15, breaking the mark of 14 set in 1988...the streak would reach a then-AL record 20 before coming to an end.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (9-9, 3.84 ERA)

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Has a 1-2 record since the All-Star Break but has a 2.51 ERA (12 er in 43.0 ip) and .220 (33-for-150) opponents batting average in seven starts...has struck out 56 and walked just 13 while yielding two home runs in 43.0 in-nings...ranks third in the American League in opponents OPS (.576) and slugging percentage (.293) since the All-Star Break, fourth in strikeouts, sixth in ERA and 10th in batting average...was 8-7 with a 4.41 ERA, .258 opponents average, .737 OPS and 14 home runs in 18 starts before the break

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks sixth in the American League with 161 strikeouts, which are the most by an A's pitcher since Sonny Gray had 169 in 2015... also ranks sixth in the AL in fewest home runs per nine innings (1.01), eighth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.93) and opponents slugging percentage (.389) and tied for eighth in starts (25).

## **OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed two home runs

over his last nine starts after surrendering 14 over his first 16...has a .207 (41for-198) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .270 (95-for-352) with 11 of his 16 home runs after that...has held the opponents three hitter to a .159 (10-for-63) average and the four hitter to a mark of .182 (12-for-66)...the mark against the three hitter is the lowest in the American League and his average against the four hitter is third lowest.

CAREER BESTS: Picked up his ninth win of the season July 29, which matches his career high established in 2019...already has career highs in nearly every other category including games (25), games started (25), innings pitched (143.0), strikeouts (161), losses (9), hits (136), runs (67), earned runs (61), walks (41) and home runs (16).

THIS AND THAT: Is 0-1 despite a 2.63 ERA (7 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts in August...has received two runs of support or fewer in 15 of his 25 starts, including 13 of his last 17...has four games of 10 or more strikeouts this year and seven in his career...has tossed seven innings or fewer in all 25 of his starts, including six innings or fewer 20 times...has six no decisions this year, four of which have come in extra inning games...the A's have won three of his no decisions and are 12-13 (.480) in his starting assignments

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start on April 5 against Los Angeles (NL)...allowed seven runs in a season-low 2.2 innings and walked a season-high three batters...it was his first of seven three-walk games...tossed 90 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...the loss extended his losing streak to a career-high three games dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...then picked up the win in each of his next two starts and allowed just one run on eight hits in 12.0 innings...won 7-3 at Houston on April 10 and then combined with Romo, Diekman and Wendelken on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 victory over Detroit on April 16...allowed six runs on a season-high nine hits in 4.0 innings against Minnesota on April 21 but had a no decision in the A's 13-12, 10-inning win...allowed three home runs in a start for the second time in his career (Sept. 22, 2020 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...finished April 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts...then went 3-3 with a 3.18 ERA in six starts in May...the three wins matched his most ever in a month and he had 38 strikeouts, which tied for eighth in the American League...won each of his first three starts in May and posted a 3.12 ERA over that stretch from May 3-14...then went 0-3 with a 3.24 ERA over his next three starts from May 19-29...the losing streak matched his career high...struck out 11 batters in 6.0 innings in a 4-2 loss to Seattle on May 24...it was one of four games with 10 or more strikeouts (10, July 8 at Houston; 10, July 23 at Seattle; 10, July 29 at Los Angeles-AL) and the second highest single-game total of his career to his 13 against the Mariners in the final game of the 2020 season... now has seven career 10-strikeout games...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings June 15 against Los Angles (AL) and allowed just two runs for the win...then surrendered a season-high eight runs on a season-high tying nine hits in 5.2 innings at Texas on June 21 for the loss...is 2-2 with a 2.54 ERA (17 er in 60.1 ip) in 10 starts since then...started consecutive games that went extra innings on June 26 at San Francisco and July 2 against Boston...struck out 10 batters in back-to-back starts on July 23 at Seattle and July 29 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the first A's pitcher with consecutive games of 10 or more strikeouts since Brandon McCarthy (Aug. 29-Sept. 3, 2011)...combined with Romo and Trivino on a three-hit shutout in the latter contest against the Angels, a 4-0 win...tossed a season-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...struck out 10 and logged a season-high 109 pitches...finished July with a 2-1 record, a 2.30 ERA and .204 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 40 in 31.1 innings and walked just nine while surrendering two home runs...his strikeouts ranked fifth in the American League and

fifth in Oakland history in the month of July...also ranked seventh in the AL in ERA and opponents batting average, ninth in slugging percentage (.310) and 10th in OPS (.588)...struck out eight batters on Aug. 4th against San Diego, giving him 45 strikeouts over a five-start stretch from July 8-Aug. 4...those were the second most strikeouts by an A's pitcher over a five-game span over the last 35 years...only Todd Stottlemyre, with 46 from June 16-July 6, 1995,

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-1 loss to San Francisco last Sunday in Oakland...tossed a season-high tying 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits and two walks...allowed just one base runner to advance past second...had a 1-0 lead when he was relieved by Puk to start the eighth...Puk allowed a two-run home run to Solano for the blown save.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER RHP Paul Blackburn (0-1, 4.09 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas

Aug. 18 and is 0-1 with a 4.09 ERA and .233 opponents batting average in two starts...is 0-5 with a 11.12 ERA and .356 opponents batting average over his last seven games, including four starts, dating back to July 6, 2018...the five-game losing streak is a career high...his last win came on June 29, 2018 against Cleveland...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-3 A's loss to Seattle last Monday here in Oakland (5.2 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 5 so)...has never faced the Yankees in his career...was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA and .311 opponents batting average in 17 games, including 16 starts, with Las Vegas...surrendered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings, an average of 0.81 per nine innings...ranked fifth in the Triple-A West in ERA and strikeouts (80) at the time of his Aug. 18 promotion...his opponents batting average broke down to .300 against lefthanded hitters and .323 against right-handers.

Last Outing: 8/26 vs. New York-AL (ND, 1.0 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 1-3

Inherited Runners/Scored: 24/8 First Hitters: 8-52 (3 bb, sf)

- Allowed his first runs since being acquired from the Cubs on July 26 Saturday...has now allowed two runs in 13 games with the A's (13.2 ip, 9 h, 2 er, 2 bb, 12 so)...however, has allowed 3-of-4 inherited runners to score and has a win, save and blown save.
- Surrendered back-to-back home runs to the Giants last Saturday...marked
  just the second time in his career he's allowed more than one home run in
  an outing (2, July 25, 2017, also back-to-back).
- Has not allowed a run in 38 of his last 40 appearances (5 er in 38.0 ip, 1.18 ERA) and 51 of 56 overall.
- Ranks fifth among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.484), eighth in slugging percentage (.253), 12th in on-base percentage (.231), and is seventh in batting average (.165).
- Snapped a 43-game homerless streak last Saturday (40.2 innings) but has yielded just three home runs in 53.0 innings overall...his average of 0.51 home runs per nine innings is 20th lowest among ML relievers.
- Has a 1.27 ERA (4 er in 28.1 ip) in 30 appearances on one day of rest or fewer, a 2.74 ERA (7 er in 23.0 ip) in 24 games on two days rest or more.
