OAKLAND ATHLETICS (71-59) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (76-53)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their losing streak at a season-high tying six games yesterday...are now 3-10 over the last 13 games after going 12-3 over the previous 15 contests...started the year 0-6, went a Major League best 44-21 (.677) from April 7-June 18 (first game at New York-AL), and are 27-32 (.458) since then...are in third place in the American League Wild Card, 3½ games behind the second place team (Boston) and 5½ behind the first place team (New York)...the 3½ games out of the playoffs matches the A's season-high (April 6 and Aug. 27)...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are in second place in the AL West and trail Houston by a season-high 6½ games for the second consecutive day...it is the first time the A's have been more than six games out of first place in the West since finishing the 2019 season 10 games back...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 but have spent each of the 65 days since then in second...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 65 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

A's IN AUGUST: The A's are 12-12 (.500) in August with two games remaining... went 11-13 (.458) in July, which was the A's first losing record in a month of 10 or more games since they went 11-15 in April of 2019...have not had back-toback months with a losing record since they had 10 straight from May 2016-Aug. 2017...are 32-for-34 (94.1%) in stolen base attempts in August and are tied with Kansas City for the most steals in the majors this month...the 32 steals are the A's most in August since 1983 (42) and their most in any month since September of 2010 (36)...lead the AL in hit by pitches (19) and rank fourth on-base percentage (.332), walks (87) and fewest strikeouts (190)...the pitching staff ranks fifth in opponents OPS (.693) and eighth in ERA (4.10).

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in each of their last 19 stolen base attempts and are now 34-for-36 (94.4%) in the 27 games since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29...rank second in the majors in steals over that span (Kansas City, 35)...Marte has accounted for 20 of the 34 steals...are now 77-for-90 (85.6%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 86.2%)...the 77 steals rank third in the American League, fifth in the majors and are the most by an A's team since 2015 (78).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just three errors in the last 14 games and have 55 for the season, which is second fewest in the American League to Houston (49)...are on pace for 69 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...have the second fewest outfield assists in the AL (11) and are tied for the fourth fewest double plays (95)

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.98 ERA (72 er in 130.0 ip) and allowed $25\ home\ runs\ over\ the\ last\ 15\ games\ after\ logging\ a\ 2.19\ ERA\ and\ four\ home$ runs over the previous 12 contests...overall, rank third in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.384), fourth in ERA (3.74) and fifth in OPS (.685) and on-base percentage (.301)...have the fewest walks (349) and the second fewest home runs (142) and pitches per inning (15.9)...are tied for second in shutouts (11).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in nine of the last 15 games and are 3-7 with a 5.33 ERA (44 er in 74.1 ip) and .277 (82-for-296) opponents batting average over that span...however, have 735.0 innings pitched for the season, which is the most in the majors...are on pace for 916.0 innings, which would be the fewest by a Major League leader in a season of 154 games or more...the current low is 941.1 by the Mets in 2019...are 48-44 with a 3.78 ERA (309 er in 735.0 ip)...rank third in the American League in wins and fourth in opponents OPS (.693) and ERA...are tied for second in complete games (3)...have used just nine starting pitchers, which is tied for fourth fewest in the majors...are the only team with four pitchers with 25 or more starts.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has allowed at least one run in each of the last seven games and is 0-4 with a save, three blown saves and a 5.81 ERA (17 er in 26.1 ip) over that span...has just 15 losses for the season, which is the fewest in the majors, but has 20 blown saves, which is tied with the Yankees for third most in the American League...ranks third in the AL in opponents OPS (.675) and fourth in ERA (3.68)...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced (.426) and the fourth highest batting average (.244).

OFFENSE: The A's have been held to eight hits or fewer in each of the last 12 games, which matches the second longest such streak in a single season in Oakland history...the longest is a 14-game streak from July 3-20, 2007...are hitting .206 (80-for-388) with 34 runs scored over the last 12 games (2.8 runs per game) and are 14-for-88 (.159) with runners in scoring position...batted .308 with 63 runs over the previous eight games (7.9 per game), including .346 with RISP...are hitting .235 overall, which is third lowest in the American League, but have a .254 average with RISP, which is eighth highest...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 79 times, which is the most in the AL, fourth most in the majors and third most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019)...are tied for fourth in the AL in sacrifice flies (36) and rank fifth in walks (442) and sacrifice hits (15)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (25), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (122), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in RBI (17) and tied for third in extra base hits (6).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 19-23 (.452) in one-run games, which is the fifth worst record in the American League...lead the AL and are tied for third in the majors in one-run losses and one-run decisions (42)...are 27-33 (.450) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 44-26 (.629) in games decided by three runs or more...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is the second best record in the AL (Seattle, 12-5/.706)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years... are 15-10 in games decided in the last at bat... are tied with Seattle for the most walk-off wins in the AL (10)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...have six losses when leading after seven innings, which is tied for third most in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's snapped their season-high six-game home losing streak last night...are 2-6 on this nine-game homestand against San Francisco (1-2), Seattle (0-2) and New York-AL (1-2)...need a win today to avoid their worst record on a homestand of nine or more games since going 1-8 on the first homestand of the 2001 season...went 4-1 on the last homestand against San Diego (1-1) and Texas (3-0) and are 36-31 (.537) at home compared to 35-28 (.556) on the road...begin a six-game road trip to Detroit (three games) and Toronto (three games) on Tuesday...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (1-2) and Chicago-AL (1-3)...are batting .224 (477-for-2128) with a .697 OPS at home compared to .245 with a .742 OPS on the road... have the second lowest home batting average and third lowest home OPS in the American League but the third highest road OPS and fourth highest road batting average.

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's have lost the season series for the first time since 2016 as they are 2-4 entering the final game today...went 1-2 in New York and are 1-2 in Oakland...are 17-15 against the Yankees dating back to 2016... have won 10 of the last 13 games and 22 of the last 31 in Oakland but have dropped eight of the last 11 games in New York...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 256-287 against the Yankees...that includes 142-130 in Oakland and 114-157 in New York...are 17-26 at Yankee Stadium...all-time, the A's are 797-1153 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks fifth among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.484), sixth in ERA (1.83), tied for eighth in batting average (.167) and ninth in slugging percentage (.253)... Matt Chapman leads ML third basemen in fielding percentage (.989), total chances (371) and putouts (144), ranks second in double plays (35), tied for third in assists (223) and fifth in defensive runs saved (8)...**Starling Marte** has 19 stolen bases in 24 games in August...the steals are the most in the American League in the month of August since Alex Cole had 19 for Cleveland in 1990...they are the most by an Athletic in any month since Rickey Henderson had 27 in August of 1983... Matt Olson ranks third in the AL in slugging percentage (.551), fourth in OPS (.925), tied for fourth in home runs (32) and extra base hits (60), fifth in on-base percentage (.374), tied for sixth in sacrifice flies (7), tied for seventh in walks (66), tied for ninth in doubles (28) and RBI (83) and tied for 10th in runs (80).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1937 the A's score 12 runs in the first inning of the first game of a doubleheader against Chicago...Bob Johnson drives in six runs in the first inning...in **1989** the A's score 10 times in the fifth inning of a 19-5 win at New York...Jose Canseco has two hits in the inning, including a three run homer, and is 4 for 5 with four runs, a pair of homers and five RBI in the game...in 2020 the A's bullpen allows a run in the second game of a doubleheader at Houston to snap an Oakland-record 30.0-inning scoreless streak by the

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (0-1, 4.09 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas Aug. 18 and is 0-1 with a 4.09 ERA (5 er in 11.0 ip) and .233 (10-for-43) opponents batting average in two starts...is scheduled to make the 24th appearance and 21st start of his career...began his career with 17 starts, pitched in relief in his final three outings of 2019 and his last three outings have been starts...was a non-roster invitee with Oakland this spring after being outrighted on Feb. 27 following the Mitch Moreland signing.

FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-5 with a 9.53 ERA (30 er in 28.1 ip) and .333 (41-for-123) opponents batting average over his last eight games, including five starts, dating back to July 6, 2018...the five-game losing streak is a career high...his last win came on June 29, 2018 against Cleveland.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss at Chicago (AL) on Aug. 18...allowed a RBI double to Jimenez in the first but then retired nine straight and Oakland tied the game with a run in the fourth...then allowed a RBI single to Robert in the fourth and was relieved by Romo with runners on first and second and one out in the sixth...Romo allowed one of those runs to score.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-3 loss to Seattle on Monday in Oakland...struck out a career-high tying five batters in 5.2 innings (also June 29, 2018 vs. Cleveland)...shut out the Mariners on three hits over the first five innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Haniger in the sixth...was relieved by Chafin with two outs in the sixth inning, the bases empty and the scored tied 2-2.

WITH LAS VEGAS: Was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA and .311 opponents batting average in 17 games, including 16 starts, with Las Vegas...the seven losses are his most as a minor leaguer and his opponents batting average is a career high... surrendered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings, an average of 0.81 per nine innings...ranked second in the Triple-A West in innings pitched (88.2), tied for second in games started (16) and fifth in ERA and strikeouts (80) at the time of his Aug. 18 promotion to Oakland.

LAS VEGAS OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .300 (61-for-203) against left-handed hitters and .323 (53-for-164) against right-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs and issued 18 of his 27 walks to lefties...opponents hit .311 with the bases empty, .311 with runners on...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots...had a .296 opponents average and allowed one home run the first time through the order, .307 with three home runs the second time and .337 with four home runs after that.

LAS VEGAS THIS AND THAT: Went 2-3 with a 4.24 ERA, .287 opponents batting average and .737 OPS in nine starts at home, 2-4 with a 5.79 ERA, .333 opponent average and .867 OPS on the road...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his 17 appearances...the Aviators were 5-11 (.313) in his starting assignments

LAS VEGAS HIGHLIGHTS: Issued a season-high three walks in his first start on May 9 against Sacramento, his first of four games with three walks...tossed a season-high 6.0 innings May 15 at Reno, his first of five outings of 6.0 innings...picked up his first win of the season May 27 against Sacramento in his only relief appearance of the season...relieved a rehabbing Jesús Luzardo in the second inning and allowed two runs on six hits in 4.2 innings...finished May with a 1-1 record and a 3.74 ERA in four games, three starts... logged a season-high 106 pitches on June 1 against Sacramento...picked up his second win June 7 against Albuquerque for his only winning streak of the season...allowed six runs in a season-low 4.0 innings but had a no decision in a 10-9 loss at Salt Lake on June 25...had a season-high three-game losing streak from July 12-31...posted a 7.08 ERA and .360 opponents batting average during that four-start streak...including July 18 against El Paso when he tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 12 hits in a 10-1 loss to Tacoma on July 31 and finished July 1-4 with a 6.23 ERA in six starts...struck out a season-high nine in 5.0 innings in his final Triple-A start on Aug. 13 against Tacoma but allowed four runs in and was the losing pitcher in a 4-3 loss.

2020 RECAP: Was on the A's Taxi Squad for every road trip except the first and had two stints with Oakland...was recalled for the first time Aug. 19 but was optioned back to the alternate camp Aug. 24 without pitching...was added as the 29th man for the Sept. 26 doubleheader against Seattle and started game two...allowed seven runs on five hits and two walks in 2.1 innings and was the losing pitcher in the A's 12-3 loss...was also on the Taxi Squad for the ALWCS and ALDS...was 0-0 with a 9.39 ERA in three games, including two starts, during the spring before he was optioned to Triple-A Las Vegas March 7...was added to the A's 60-man player pool June 29.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Cole Irvin (9-12, 3.68 ERA): Is 2-4 with a 4.60 ERA and .279 opponents batting average over his last six starts...has walked 11 and struck out just 16 in 31.1 innings over that span...was 4-1 with a 2.54 ERA over his previous eight starts...ranks fifth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.375), eighth in OPS (.685) and ninth in ERA (3.68), but is tied for third in most losses (12)...the 12 losses are the most by an A's pitcher since Jesse Chavez had 15 in 2015...has walked 31 batters in 144.1 innings for an average of 1.93 per nine innings...that is the fifth lowest mark in the AL...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-1 A's loss to Seattle on Tuesday here in Oakland (3.0 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb)...combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in his lone career appearance against Detroit, a start and win in the A's 7-0 victory in Oakland earlier this year on April 17 (6.0 ip, 4 h, 6 so).

- On Aug. 21, allowed his first runs since being acquired from the Cubs on July 26...has now allowed two runs in 13 games with the A's (13.2 ip, 9 h, 2 er, 2 bb, 12 so)...however, has allowed 3-of-4 inherited runners to score and has a win, save and blown save.
- Surrendered back-to-back home runs to the Giants on Aug. 21...marked just the second time in his career he's allowed more than one home run in an outing (2, July 25, 2017, also back-to-back).
- Has not allowed a run in 39 of his last 41 appearances (5 er in 39.0 ip, 1.15 ERA) and 52 of 57 overall.
- Ranks fifth among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.484), ninth in slugging percentage (.253), 12th in on-base percentage (.232), and is tied for eighth in batting average (.167).
- Snapped a 43-game homerless streak Aug. 21 (40.2 innings) but has yielded just three home runs in 54.0 innings overall...his average of 0.50 home runs per nine innings is 17th lowest among ML relievers.
- Has a 1.23 ERA (4 er in 29.1 ip) in 31 appearances on one day of rest or fewer, a 2.74 ERA (7 er in 23.0 ip) in 24 games on two days rest or more.
- Has not allowed a run in the eighth inning (26.2 ip).
- Was 0-2 with a 2.06 ERA in 43 relief appearances for Chicago (NL) when he was traded to Oakland along with cash considerations for Greg Deichmann and minor leaguer Daniel Palencia.

Last Year: Combined for a 1-2 record, one save and a 6.52 ERA in 15 relief appearances with the Diamondbacks and Cubs...missed a month of the season from Aug. 19 to Sept. 18 with a sprained left finger.
