ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight after a season-high tying six-game losing streak...are now 4-10 over the last 14 games after going 12-3 over the previous 15 contests...are in third place in the American League Wild Card, two games behind the second place team (Boston) and four behind the first place team (New York)...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are in second place in the AL West and trail Houston by five games...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 but have spent each of the 67 days since then in second...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 67 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 17-7 (.708) against American League Central teams, which is the second best record in the majors (New York, 20-8/.714)...are batting .246 (192-for-781) with a .795 OPS and an average of 5.3 runs per game (126 runs in 24 games) against teams from the Central compared to .233 with a .702 OPS and an average of 4.2 runs per game against all other teams...have a 3.21 ERA (75 er in 210.0 ip) against the Central, 3.83 against everyone else...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 82-27 (.752) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

A'S IN AUGUST: The A's are 13-12 (.520) in August entering the final game today...have finished with a winning record in 10 of the previous 11 months (min. 10 games), with the exception being this July when they went 11-13 (.458)...are 32-for-34 (94.1%) in stolen base attempts in August and are tied with Cleveland and Kansas City for the most steals in the majors this month...the 32 steals are the A's most in August since 1983 (42) and their most in any month since September of 2010 (36)...lead the AL in hit by pitches this month (19) and are tied for the fewest strikeouts (194)...the pitching staff ranks third in opponents on-base percentage (.301) and fourth in slugging percentage (.383), OPS (.684) and fewest walks (71)...has the third fewest strikeouts (191).

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in each of their last 19 stolen base attempts and are now 34-for-36 (94.4%) in the 28 games since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29...are tied with Cleveland for second in the majors in steals over that span (Kansas City, 35)...Marte has accounted for 20 of the 34 steals...are now 77-for-90 (85.6%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 86.5%)...the 77 steals rank third in the American League, fifth in the majors and are the most by an A's team since 2015 (78).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed two errors on Sunday after making two over the previous 11 games...have 57 errors for the season, which is second fewest in the American League to Houston (53)...are on pace for 70 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...have 11 outfield assists, which is tied with Detroit for the fewest in the AL...in the majors, only the Padres (10) have fewer.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.66 ERA (72 er in 139.0 ip) and allowed 25 home runs over the last 16 games after logging a 2.19 ERA and four home runs over the previous 12 contests...overall, rank third in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.383), fourth in ERA (3.72) and on-base percentage (.301) and fifth in OPS (.684)...have the fewest walks (353), home runs (142) and pitches per inning (15.9)...are tied for second in shutouts (11).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in 10 of the last 16 games and are 3-7 with a 4.99 ERA (44 er in 79.1 ip) and .278 (87-for-313) opponents batting average over that span...however, have 740.0 innings pitched for the season, which is the most in the majors...the fewest innings pitched by a Major League leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 New York Mets...are 48-44 with a 3.76 ERA (309 er in 740.0 ip)...rank third in the American League in wins, fourth in opponents OPS (.692) and fifth in ERA...are tied for second in complete games (3).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has allowed at least one run in each of the last eight games and is 1-4 with two saves, four blown saves and a 5.04 ERA (17 er in 30.1 ip) over that span...has just 15 losses for the season, which is the fewest in the majors, but has 21 blown saves, which is tied for third most in the American League...ranks third in the AL in opponents OPS (.667) and ERA (3.64)...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced (.422) and the fourth highest batting average (.242).

OFFENSE: The A's have been held to fewer than 10 hits in each of the last 13 games and are batting .210 (89-for-423) with 37 runs scored (2.85 per game)...are 15-for-96 (.156) with runners in scoring position over that span...are hitting .235 overall, which is third lowest in the American League...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 79 times, which is the most in the AL, fourth most in the majors and third most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019)...are tied for fourth in the AL in sacrifice flies (36) and fewest grounded into double plays (84) and rank fifth in walks (443), sacrifice hits (15) and fewest strikeouts (1113)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (26), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (123), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in RBI (17) and tied for third in extra base hits (6).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 19-23 (.452) in one-run games, which is the fifth worst record in the American League...lead the AL in one-run losses and rank second in one-run decisions (42)...are 28-33 (.459) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 44-26 (.629) in games decided by three runs or more...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is the second best record in the AL (Seattle, 12-5/.706)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 16-10 in games decided in the last at bat.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game road trip to Detroit (three games) and Toronto (three games) tonight...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (1-2) and Chicago-AL (1-3) and are 35-28 (.556) on the road, which is the third best road record in the American League...have a 3.68 ERA (223 er in 545.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...have the fourth best road batting average (.245) and OPS (.742), but the second lowest home batting average (.225) and third lowest home OPS (.696)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against San Francisco (1-2), Seattle (0-2) and New York-AL (2-2) and are 37-31 (.544) at home.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 13-5 (.722) following a day off, which is the second best record in the majors (San Francisco, 16-4/.800)...will have the next two Mondays off before finishing the season with 19 games in 20 days...are 30-19 (.612) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 42-40 (.512) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to the Dodgers (25-14/.641)...have used a different lineup in each of the last 68 games and have 128 different lineups over the first 131 contests.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's swept a four-game series from Detroit in Oakland in April and have now won four consecutive season series...it was their first ever four-game sweep of the Tigers in the Coliseum...have now won six straight and 22 of the last 23 games and are 28-6 (.824) dating back to June 2, 2015...will play their first game in Comerica Park since May 19, 2019, a span of 835 days...have an 11-game winning streak at Comerica Park, which is the second longest winning streak at a road ballpark in Athletics history...have not lost here since April 28, 2016...have won six straight and 11 of the last 12 in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 274-248 against the Tigers...that includes 151-112 in Oakland, 121-134 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 45-28 (.616) at Comerica Park, which is the best winning percentage by any team...all-time, the A's are 942-1001 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League third basemen with a .987 fielding percentage...**Starling Marte** has 19 stolen bases in 25 games in August...the steals are the most in the American League in the month of August since Alex Cole had 19 for Cleveland in 1990...they are the most by an Athletic in any month since Rickey Henderson had 27 in August of 1983...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the AL in OPS (.920), tied for fourth in home runs (32), fifth in on-base percentage (.373) and slugging percentage (.548), tied for sixth in extra base hits (60) and walks (67) and tied for ninth in doubles (28).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1996 Willie Adams tosses the A's third consecutive shutout, a 8-0 white-washing of the Red Sox...it follows a combined shutout by Dave Telgheder and Buddy Groom against Boston and a Don Wengert blanking of the Orioles...in 1998 Rickey Henderson scores on a Jason Giambi fifth inning sacrifice fly in a game at Cleveland to become the sixth player in major league history to score 2000 runs in his career.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (9-12, 3.68 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 2-4 with a 4.60 ERA (16 er in 31.1 ip) and .279 (36-for-129) opponents batting average over his last six starts...has walked 11 and struck out just 16 in 31.1 innings over that span...was 4-1 with a 2.54 ERA over his previous eight starts...ranks fifth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.375), eighth in OPS (.685) and 10th in ERA (3.68), but is tied for third in most losses (12)...the 12 losses are the most by an A's pitcher since Jesse Chavez had 15 in 2015.

DON'T WALK: Has walked 31 batters in 144.1 innings for an average of 1.93 per nine innings...that is the fifth lowest mark in the American League...is averaging 14.7 pitches per inning, which are second fewest in the majors (Wainwright, STL 14.6)...has walked two batters or fewer in 24 of his 25 starts...began the season with a streak of 23 consecutive starts with two walks or fewer, which was the second longest streak by a starting pitcher in Oakland history to Gil Heredia, who had a 26-start streak from April 10-Aug. 28, 1999...the streak ended Aug. 19 at Chicago (AL) when he walked a career-high four batters...has walked just 45 batters in 189.2 career innings (2.14 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed 12 home runs in 144.1 innings and his average of 0.75 home runs per nine innings is second lowest in the American League...eight of the 12 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...eight have come at home...has a .249 (103-for-414) opponents average against right-handed hitters compared to .303 (46-for-152) against left-handers...has hit nine batters, which is tied for sixth most in the AL...opponents are hitting .324 (36-for-111) with runners in scoring position, which is second highest in the AL (Minor, KC .382)...has held the opponents number three hitter to a .194 (13-for-67) average.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on six days rest today...is 8-4 with a 2.59 ERA (26 er in 90.1 ip) in 15 starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-7 with a 5.26 ERA (29 er in 49.2 ip) in nine starts on four days rest...eight of the 12 home runs he has allowed have come on four days rest...is tied for second in the American League in wins on five days rest or more and ranks fourth in ERA...is tied for second in most losses on four days rest and has the fifth highest ERA.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 3-10 with a 5.40 ERA (44 er in 73.1 ip) and .300 (91-for-303) opponents batting average in 14 starts against American League West competition, 6-2 with a 1.90 ERA (15 er in 71.0 ip) and .221 (58-for-263) opponents average in 11 starts against everyone else...his 10 intradivision losses are the most in the majors and one short of the Athletics record of 11 held by Brian Kingman (1980) and Rick Langford (1977 and 1979)...his 5.40 intradivision ERA is sixth highest in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 3-1 in his no decisions and are 12-13 (.480) in his starting assignments...is 9-2 in 13 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-10 in 12 starts with support of two runs or fewer

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and lost each of his first two starts, allowing four runs in each contest for a 7.45 ERA...went 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA over his first two starts on April 3 and 8, both against Houston...did not pitch again until April 17 against Detroit when he combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in a 7-0 win...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...that began a four-start stretch where he went 3-1 with a 1.42 ERA and .232 opponents batting average through May 4...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his start against the Tigers and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...lost on April 28 at Tampa Bay but then picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102) against the Blue Jays...then went 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA and .284 opponents batting average over his next five starts from May 9 to 30...the losing streak matched his career high (also May 22, 2019-April 8, 2021)...left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of four times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (June 11 vs. Kansas City, July 9 at Texas, Aug. 13 at Texas)...allowed a season-high five runs in an 8-4 loss to Houston on May 20...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings of work in a 4-3 loss to Seattle on May 25...went 1-4 with a 4.46 ERA in six starts in May...tied for second in the American League in losses in May...then compiled a 3-0 record and a 2.64 ERA in five starts in the month of June...the ERA was fourth lowest in the American League and the three-game winning streak was the longest of his career...allowed a run in the first inning on June 5 at Colorado and did not allow another run until the seventh inning of his next start on June 11 against Kansas City for a career-high tying 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and did not allow a run in a 6-2 win at San Francisco on June 27...did not allow a run over the first three innings of his next start on July 3 against Boston for another 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters (13th time, last: Bassitt, April 29, 2021 at Tampa Bay) in a 3-2 loss at Texas on July 9...finished July

with a 1-3 record despite a 3.07 ERA and .227 opponents batting average...allowed a season-high tying five runs on eight hits in an 8-6 loss at Texas on Aug 13...walked a career-high four batters but picked up the win in a 5-4 victory at Chicago (AL) on Aug. 19.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Seattle a week ago today in Oakland...tossed just 3.0 innings, which was the shortest start of his career...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed a RBI single to Kelenic in the second...then allowed a two-run single to Torrens in the third and left after allowing three runs on seven hits and two walks in 3.0 innings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP James Kaprielian (7-4, 3.65 ERA): Was reinstated from the injured list on Aug. 8 and is 2-0 with a 5.06 ERA (12 er in 21.1 ip) in four starts since his return...was 5-4 with a 3.24 ERA in 13 starts when he was placed on the 10-day IL July 31 retroactive to July 28 with a right shoulder impingement...missed just one start and did not have a rehab assignment...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, his 3.65 ERA is fifth lowest in the American League among rookies...also ranks fourth in opponents OPS (.704), batting average (.221) and on-base percentage (.293) and fifth in slugging percentage (.411)...his opponents batting average breaks down to .179 with a .555 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .266 with an .856 OPS against left-handers...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-6 A's loss to New York (AL) last Thursday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 6 h, 6 er, 1 bb, 8 so)...has never faced Detroit in his career.

- Picked up his second save of the season Sunday against New York, both of which have come with the A's...now has five career saves.
- Has not allowed a run in 14 of his 15 games since he was acquired from Chicago (NL) on July 26 for a 1.15 ERA (2 er in 15.2 ip) and .189 (10-for-53) opponents batting average...however, has allowed 3-of-4 inherited runners to score.
- Has not allowed a run in 40 of his last 42 appearances (5 er in 40.0 ip, 1.13 ERA) and 53 of 58 overall.
- Ranks fourth among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.477), sixth in ERA (1.80) and slugging percentage (.249), seventh in batting average (.164), eighth in on-base percentage (.228) and tied for 14th in games pitched (58).
- Is tied for fifth in the majors in opponents on-base percentage against first batters faced (.207) and tied for 10th in slugging percentage (.204).
- Has a 1.19 ERA (4 er in 30.1 ip) in 32 appearances on one day of rest or fewer, a 2.63 ERA (7 er in 24.0 ip) in 25 games on two days rest or more.
- Has not allowed a run in the eighth inning (26.2 ip).
