OAKLAND ATHLETICS (73-59) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (62-71)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight after a season-high tying six-game losing streak...are now 5-10 over the last 15 games after going 12-3 over the previous 15 contests...are in third place in the American League Wild Card, one game behind the second place team (Boston) and three behind the first place team (New York)...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are in second place in the AL West and trail Houston by five games...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 but have spent each of the 68 days since then in second...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 68 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 18-7 (.720) against American League Central teams, which is the best record in the majors...are batting .249 (204-for-818) with an .806 OPS and an average of 5.4 runs per game (135 runs in 25 games) against teams from the Central compared to .233 with a .702 OPS and an average of 4.2 runs per game against all other teams...have a 3.21 ERA (78 er in 219.0 ip) against the Central, 3.83 against everyone else...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 83-27 (.755) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

A'S IN AUGUST: The A's went 14-12 (.538) in August, which was the fourth best record in the American League...have now finished with a winning record in 11 of the last 12 months (min. 10 games) with the exception being this July when they went 11-13 (.458)...went 33-for-35 (94.1%) in stolen base attempts...the 33 steals were the most in the majors, the most by the A's in August since 1983 (42) and their most in any month since September of 2010 (36)...led the AL in hit by pitches (19), had the second fewest strikeouts (202) and ranked third in on-base percentage (.332)...the pitching staff had the second fewest strikeouts (196), tied for the second fewest walks (73) and had the fifth lowest opponents batting average (.239).

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in each of their last 20 stolen base attempts, which is tied for the second longest streak in Oakland history...are now 35-for-37 (94.6%) in the 29 games since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29 and are tied with Cleveland for the most steals in the majors over that span...Marte has accounted for 20 of the 35 steals...are now 78-for-91 (85.7%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 86.5%)...the 78 steals rank third in the American League, fifth in the majors and are the most by an A's team since 2015 (78).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 57 errors, which is second fewest in the American League to Houston (53)...are on pace for 70 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...have 11 outfield assists, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for second fewest in the majors (Padres, 10)...have the fifth fewest double plays in the AL (98).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.56 ERA (75 er in 148.0 ip) and allowed 28 home runs over the last 17 games after logging a 2.19 ERA and four home runs over the previous 12 contests...overall, rank third in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.384), fourth in ERA (3.71) and on-base percentage (.301) and fifth in OPS (.685)...have the fewest walks (355) and pitches per inning (15.9) and are tied for the fewest home runs (145)...are tied for second in shutouts (11).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in 11 of the last 17 games and are 3-7 with a 5.04 ERA (47 er in 84.0 ip) and .282 (94-for-333) opponents batting average over that span...however, have 744.2 innings pitched for the season, which is the most in the majors...the fewest innings pitched by a Major League leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 New York Mets...are 48-44 with a 3.77 ERA (312 er in 744.2 ip)...rank third in the American League in wins and fourth in opponents OPS (.696) and ERA...are tied for second in complete games (3).

BULLPEN: Last night, the A's bullpen did not allow a run for the first time since Aug. 20...is now 2-1 with two saves, a blown save, a 2.88 ERA (8 er in 25.0 ip) and .211 (20-for-95) opponents batting average over the last six games after blowing a save and taking the loss in three consecutive games from Aug. 21-23...has just 15 losses for the season, which is the fewest in the majors, but has 21 blown saves, which is tied for third most in the American League...ranks third in the AL in opponents OPS (.665) and ERA (3.60)...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced (.420) and the fourth highest batting average (.242).

OFFENSE: The A's had 12 hits last night, which was their first game in double figures since August 15...are now batting .254 (190-for-740) with 109 runs scored over the last 22 games (4.95 runs per game)...are hitting .236 overall, which is third lowest in the American League...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 79 times, which is the most in the AL, fourth most in the majors and third most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019)...ranks fourth in the AL in sacrifice flies (37), tied for fourth in fewest grounded into double plays (84) and fifth in walks (447), sacrifice hits (15) and fewest strikeouts (1121)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (26), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (123), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in RBI (17) and tied for third in extra base hits (6).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 19-23 (.452) in one-run games, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...lead the AL in one-run losses and rank second in one-run decisions (42)...are 28-33 (.459) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 45-26 (.634) in games decided by three runs or more...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is the second best record in the AL (Seattle, 12-5/.706)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 16-10 in games decided in the last at bat.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this six-game road trip to Detroit (1-0) and Toronto (three games)...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (1-2) and Chicago-AL (1-3) and are 36-28 (.563) on the road, which is the second best road record in the American League and fifth best in the majors...have a 3.67 ERA (226 er in 554.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...have the third best road OPS in the AL (.747) and fourth best batting average (.247), but the second lowest home batting average (.225) and third lowest home OPS (.696)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against San Francisco (1-2), Seattle (0-2) and New York-AL (2-2) and are 37-31 (.544) at home.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 31-19 (.620) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 42-40 (.512) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to the Dodgers (25-14/.641)...have used a different lineup in each of the last 69 games and have 129 different lineups over the first 132 contests.

A'S vs. TIGERS: The A's lead the season series, 5-0...won the first game in Detroit last night after sweeping a four-game series in Oakland in April...have now won four consecutive season series...have a seven-game winning streak, which is tied for second longest in Oakland history against Detroit...the longest is a 16-game streak from May 6, 2017-May 19, 2019...have won 23 of the last 24 games and are 29-6 (.829) dating back to June 2, 2015...have a 12-game winning streak at Comerica Park, which matches the longest winning streak at a road ballpark in Athletics history (Kauffman Stadium, 2003-06)...have not lost here since April 28, 2016...have won six straight and 11 of the last 12 in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 275-248 against the Tigers...that includes 151-112 in Oakland, 122-134 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 46-28 (.622) at Comerica Park, which is the best winning percentage by any team...all-time, the A's are 943-1001 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman leads Major League third basemen with a .987 fielding percentage...**Starling Marte** batted .363 in August and his 41 hits were the most by an A's player in any month since Mark Ellis had 43 in September of 2010...**Matt Olson** ranks fourth in the American League in OPS (.921) and slugging (.548), tied for fourth in home runs (32), fifth in on-base percentage (.373), tied for sixth in extra base hits (61), tied for seventh in walks (67), tied for ninth in doubles (29) and runs (82) and tied for 10th in RBI (84).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1906** Jack Coombs and Boston's Joe Harris go the distance in a 24 inning, 4-1 A's victory that lasts four hours and 47 minutes...Coombs strikes out 18 and allows 14 hits...in **1974** Sal Bando hits a two-run homer in the A's 5-3 win at Detroit...it is his 1,000th hit in an Oakland uniform...in **2002** Miguel Tejada hits a three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth inning as the A's defeat Minnesota 7-5 to set a franchise record with their 18th consecutive win...the streak would reach an AL record 20 before coming to an end.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (7-4, 3.65 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the injured list on Aug. 8 and is 2-0 with a 5.06 ERA (12 er in 21.1 ip) in four starts since his return...was 5-4 with a 3.24 ERA in 13 starts when he was placed on the 10-day IL July 31 retroactive to July 28 with a right shoulder impingement...missed just one start and did not have a rehab assignment...began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and was recalled by the A's on May 12.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Is tied for fifth among American League rookies in wins (7), ranks seventh in innings pitched (93.2) and eighth in strikeouts (95) and games started (16)...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, his 3.65 ERA is fifth lowest in the AL among rookies...also ranks fourth in opponents OPS (.704), batting average (.221) and on-base percentage (.293) and fifth in slugging percentage (.411).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average breaks down to .179 (32-for-179) with a .555 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .266 (45-for-169) with an .856 OPS against left-handers...has issued 24 of his 34 walks to lefties...has allowed a .200 (13-for-65) batting average with runners in scoring position...11 of the 15 home runs he has surrendered have been solo shots...has a .169 (24-for-142) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .288 (38-for-132) the second time and .203 (15-for-74) after that...has allowed five of his 15 home runs to the opponents clean-up hitter but has held the five hitter to a .075 (3-for-40) batting average.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-2 with a 4.93 ERA (25 er in 45.2 ip) and .259 (45-for-174) opponents average in nine starts on the road compared to 5-2 with a 2.44 ERA (13 er in 48.0 ip) and .184 (32-for-174) opponents batting average in eight starts at home.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-2 with a 5.06 ERA (27 er in 48.0 ip) and .249 (46-for-185) opponents batting average in nine starts at night compared to 4-2 with a 2.17 ERA (11 er in 45.2 ip) and .190 (31-for-163) opponents batting average in eight starts during the day...has yielded 12 of his 15 home runs at night.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 4-3 with a 2.90 ERA and .200 opponents batting average in 11 starts before the All-Star Break...has gone 3-1 since then but has a 5.12 ERA (18 er in 31.2 ip) and .260 (32-for-123) opponents average in six starts since then.

THIS AND THAT: Has a 1.85 ERA (7 er in 34.0 ip) and .172 (21-for-122) opponents batting average over the first two innings of a game, a 4.68 ERA (31 er in 59.2 ip) and .248 (56-for-226) opponents average from the third inning on...has allowed two runs or fewer in 11 of his 17 starts and five hits or fewer 13 times...has left with the lead in four of his five no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the A's are 10-7 (.588) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and went 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA in one start...was the Aviators Opening Day starter on May 6 at Las Vegas and was the losing pitcher in an 8-1 loss to Sacramento (4.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 0 hr, 76 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and made his first Major League start that day at Boston...allowed a run on four hits in 5.0 innings to earn his first ML win in the A's 4-1 victory over the Red Sox...would go 4-1 with a 2.84 ERA and .182 opponents batting average over his first seven starts through June 18...struck out nine batters in 5.2 innings in his second start on May 21 at Los Angeles (AL) but had a no decision in an 8-4 A's win...left with a 3-2 lead and two outs in the bottom of the sixth but Petit allowed a run for the blown save...it was the first of four starts in which he left with the lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (June 23 at Texas, July 10 at Texas, Aug. 14 at Cleveland)...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings May 26 against Seattle for his second win...that matched his longest outing as a professional...also tossed 7.0 innings for Single-A Tampa at Charlotte on April 16, 2016, his second professional appearance...logged a season-low 3.2 innings May 31 at Seattle but had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss...was charged with the first loss of his career when he allowed two runs in 5.0 innings on June 6 at Colorado, a 3-1 A's loss...pitched 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits on June 12 to defeat Kansas City 11-2...walked a career-high four...tossed 105 pitches, which were his most as a professional, in a 5-4 loss to Texas on June 29...took the loss that day and went 0-2 despite a 3.00 ERA over his final three starts before the All-Star Break...struck out a career-high 10 batters in a career-high tying 7.0 innings on July 4 against Boston but was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss...it was the first 10-strikeout game by an A's rookie since Chris Bassitt on Aug. 9, 2015 against Houston (also 10)...issued a career-high tying four walks in 5.0 innings in a no decision at Texas on July 10...combined with Romo, Moll and Guerra on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Los Angeles (AL) on July 20 as part of a career-high 12.0-inning scoreless streak from July 10 to 27...allowed a career-high six runs in 4.1 innings in a 7-4 loss at San Diego on July 27...it snapped a career-opening 14-game streak of 1.2 innings or more and six hits or fewer, which was the longest such streak in Athletics history...singled off Chris Paddock in the third inning for his first Major League hit...was placed

on the 10-day injured list July 31 retroactive to July 28 with a right shoulder impingement...missed just one start, did not have a rehab assignment, and was reinstated from the IL on Aug. 8...allowed a career-high eight hits in 5.1 innings in a no decision in an 8-3 A's win at Texas on Aug. 14...did not walk or strikeout a batter to mark the 19th time in Oakland history a starting pitcher went at least five innings without a walk or strikeout (last: Dallas Braden, Aug. 25, 2008 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...issued a career-high tying four walks in 5.0 innings but picked up the win on Aug. 20 against San Francisco.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to New York (AL) last Thursday in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying six runs in 5.0 innings...struck out the first four batters before Stanton homered with one out in the second...also allowed a solo home run to Gardner...then allowed four runs in the third inning on a Rizzo RBI double and a Gallo three-run home run...the A's came back to tie the game and he was relieved by Petit to start the sixth with the score tied 6-6.

2020 RECAP: Made his Major League debut and had two relief appearances over five stints with Oakland...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average...allowed two home runs in 3.2 innings, walked two and struck out four...did not pitch during his first stint...joined the club a second time Aug. 16 and made his ML debut that day at San Francisco (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...was recalled as the 29th man for doubleheaders on Sept. 8 and Sept. 14 but did not pitch...recalled for his fifth stint on Sept. 24 and made one appearance in the second game of the Sept. 26 doubleheader against Seattle (1.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...was on the Taxi Squad for the postseason...was rated as the A's number 10 prospect by *Baseball America* following the season.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Sean Manaea (8-8, 3.77 ERA): Went 0-3 with a 9.90 ERA and .344 opponents batting average in five starts in August...the ERA was the highest by an Athletics pitcher in a month with 20 or more innings pitched since Carl Scheib posted a 9.99 ERA in July of 1947...tossed five innings or fewer in all five starts...is now 2-7 with a 5.28 ERA over his last 12 starts dating back to June 20 after going 6-2 with a 2.99 ERA over his first 14 starts...is tied for fourth in the American League in games started (26), ranks sixth in in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.33) and eighth in strikeouts (156)...the 156 strikeouts are a career-high...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 8-2 A's loss to New York last Friday in Oakland (4.1 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 5 so)...is 3-1 with a 2.88 ERA (25.0 ip, 21 h, 8 r, 8 er, 5 bb, 23 so, 4 hr) in four career starts against Detroit...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, an 8-4 A's win on April 15 in Oakland (6.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 7 so).

- Has not allowed a run in 15 of his 16 games since he was acquired from Chicago (NL) on July 26 for a 1.08 ERA (2 er in 16.2 ip) and .179 (10-for-56) opponents batting average...however, has allowed 3-of-4 inherited runners to score.
- Has not allowed a run in 41 of his last 43 appearances (5 er in 41.0 ip, 1.10 ERA) and 54 of 59 overall.
- Ranks second among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.470), fourth in slugging percentage (.245), fifth in ERA (1.77), sixth in batting average (.161) and on-base percentage (.225) and tied for eighth in games pitched (59).
- Is tied for fifth in the majors in opponents on-base percentage against first batters faced (.203) and ranks 10th in slugging percentage (.200).
- Has a 1.15 ERA (4 er in 31.1 ip) in 33 appearances on one day of rest or fewer, a 2.63 ERA (7 er in 24.0 ip) in 25 games on two days rest or more.
