



OAKLAND ATHLETICS (73-60) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (62-72)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three of four after a season-high tying six-game losing streak...are now 5-11 over the last 16 games after going 12-3 over the previous 15 contests...are in third place in the American League Wild Card, two games behind the second place team (Boston) and four behind the first place team (New York)...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are in second place in the AL West and trail Houston by five games...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 but have spent each of the 69 days since then in second...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 69 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 18-8 (.692) against American League Central teams...are batting .251 (214-for-854) with an average of 5.42 runs per game (141 runs in 26 games) against teams from the Central compared to .233 with a .702 OPS and an average of 4.2 runs per game against all other teams...have a 3.41 ERA (86 er in 227.0 ip) against the Central, 3.83 against everyone else...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 83-28 (.748) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

A'S IN AUGUST: The A's went 14-12 (.538) in August, which was the fourth best record in the American League...have now finished with a winning record in 11 of the last 12 months (min. 10 games) with the exception being this July when they went 11-13 (.458)...went 33-for-35 (94.1%) in stolen base attempts...the 33 steals were the most in the majors, the most by the A's in August since 1983 (42) and their most in any month since September of 2010 (36)...led the AL in hit by pitches (19), had the second fewest strikeouts (202) and ranked third in on-base percentage (.332)...the pitching staff had the second fewest strikeouts (196), tied for the second fewest walks (73) and had the fifth lowest opponents batting average (.239).

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in each of their last 20 stolen base attempts, which is tied for the second longest streak in Oakland history...are now 35-for-37 (94.6%) in the 30 games since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29 and are second to Kansas City for the most steals in the majors over that span...Marte has accounted for 20 of the 35 steals...are now 78-for-91 (85.7%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 86.5%)...the 78 steals rank third in the American League, tied for fifth in the majors and are the most by an A's team since 2015 (78).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 58 errors, which is second fewest in the American League to Houston (53)...are on pace for 71 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...have 11 outfield assists, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for second fewest in the majors (Padres, 10)...have the fifth fewest double plays in the AL (99).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.79 ERA (83 er in 156.0 ip) and allowed 31 home runs over the last 18 games after logging a 2.19 ERA and four home runs over the previous 12 contests...overall, rank fourth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.386) and on-base percentage (.301), fifth in ERA (3.75) and OPS (.687)...have the fewest walks (359) and pitches per inning (15.9) and are second fewest home runs (148)...are tied for second in shutouts (11).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in 12 of the last 18 games and are 3-7 with a 5.22 ERA (51 er in 88.0 ip) and .281 (98-for-349) opponents batting average over that span...however, have 748.2 innings pitched for the season, which is the most in the majors...the fewest innings pitched by a Major League leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 New York Mets...are 48-44 with a 3.80 ERA (316 er in 748.2 ip)...rank third in the American League in wins and fourth in opponents OPS (.698) and fifth in ERA...are tied for second in the AL in complete games (3).

BULLPEN: Last night, the A's bullpen allowed four earned runs against Detroit...is now 2-2 with two saves, two blown saves, a 3.72 ERA (12 er in 29.0 ip) and .230 (26-for-113) opponents batting average over the last seven games after blowing a save and taking the loss in three consecutive games from Aug. 21-23...has just 16 losses for the season, which is the fewest in the majors, but has 22 blown saves, which is third most in the American

League...ranks third in the AL in opponents OPS (.667) and fourth in the AL in ERA (3.65).

OFFENSE: The A's had 10 hits last night, which was their second consecutive game in double figures after a not accruing double digit hits since August 15...are now batting .258 (200-for-776) with 115 runs scored over the last 23 games (5.00 runs per game)...are hitting .236 overall, which is third lowest in the American League...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 79 times, which is the most in the AL, fourth most in the majors and third most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019)...ranks fourth in the AL in sacrifice flies (38), tied for fourth in fewest grounded into double plays (84) and fifth in walks (448), sacrifice hits (15) and fewest strikeouts (1127)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (26), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (124), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in RBI (17) and tied for third in extra base hits (6).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 19-23 (.452) in one-run games, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...lead the AL in one-run losses and rank second in one-run decisions (42)...are 28-34 (.452) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 45-26 (.634) in games decided by three runs or more...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is the second best record in the AL (Seattle, 12-5/.706)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 16-10 in games decided in the last at bat.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this six-game road trip to Detroit (1-1) and Toronto (three games)...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (1-2) and Chicago-AL (1-3) and are 36-29 (.554) on the road, which is the second best road record in the American League and fifth best in the majors...have a 3.74 ERA (234 er in 562.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...have the third best road OPS in the AL (.747) and fourth best batting average (.247), but the second lowest home batting average (.225) and third lowest home OPS (.696)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against San Francisco (1-2), Seattle (0-2) and New York-AL (2-2) and are 37-31 (.544) at home.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 31-19 (.620) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 42-41 (.506) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to the Dodgers (25-14/.641)...have used a different lineup in each of the last 70 games and have 130 different lineups over the first 133 contests.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's lead the season series, 5-1...lost the second game in Detroit last night after winning the first game of the series and sweeping a four-game series in Oakland in April...have now won four consecutive season series...snapped a seven-game winning streak last night, which was tied for second longest in Oakland history against Detroit...the longest is a 16-game streak from May 6, 2017-May 19, 2019...have won 23 of the last 25 games and are 29-7 (.806) dating back to June 2, 2015...had a 12-game winning streak at Comerica Park, which matched the longest winning streak at a road ballpark in Athletics history (Kauffman Stadium, 2003-06)...had not lost here since April 28, 2016...have won six straight and 11 of the last 12 in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 275-249 against the Tigers...that includes 151-112 in Oakland, 122-135 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 46-29 (.613) at Comerica Park, which is the best winning percentage by any team...all-time, the A's are 943-1002 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS
Matt Chapman leads Major League third basemen with a .987 fielding percentage... Starling Marte batted .363 in August and his 41 hits were the most by an A's player in any month since Mark Ellis had 43 in September of 2010... Matt Olson ranks third in the American League in slugging percentage (.550), fourth in OPS (.924), tied for fifth in home runs (32), tied for fourth in extra base hits (62), seventh in walks (68) and on-base percentage (.374), tied for third in sacrifice flies (8), tied for seventh in doubles (30), tied for eighth in RBI (84) and ninth in runs (84).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY
In 1932 Al Simmons has two home runs and seven RBI in the second game of a doubleheader against Boston, a 15-0 A's win...in 1989 Jose Canseco's two-run homer in the first inning of the A's 7-2 win at Milwaukee is the 8000th in the history of the Athletics franchise...in 2003 the A's score two times in the 12 th inning to defeat Baltimore 2-0 and extend their winning streak to 10 games.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (10-9, 3.66 ERA)

LAST TWO STARTS: Has tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed two hits in each of his last two starts...joins Bobby Witt (June 23-28, 1994) and Daniel Mengden (May 20-26, 2018) as the only pitchers in Athletics history with back-to-back starts of at least seven scoreless innings and two hits or fewer... it is the first time in his career he has back-to-back scoreless starts and his 14.0-inning scoreless streak is one short of his career high of 15.0 from June 1-8, 2018.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Is 2-2 with a 2.16 ERA (12 er in 50.0 ip) and .203 (35-for-172) opponents batting average in eight starts since the All-Star Break...has struck out 62 and walked just 14 while yielding two home runs in 50.0 innings...has the lowest opponents OPS (.538) and slugging percentage (.273) in the American League since the break, ranks fourth in ERA and on-base percentage (.265), and fifth in strikeouts and batting average...was 8-7 with a 4.41 ERA, .258 opponents average, .737 OPS and 14 home runs in 18 starts before the break.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks sixth in the American League with 167 strikeouts, which are the most by an A's pitcher since Sonny Gray had 169 in 2015... also ranks sixth in the AL in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.96), tied for eighth in wins (10), eighth in opponents OPS (.677) and innings pitched (150.0), ninth in ERA (3.66) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.98), sixth in opponents slugging percentage (.379), tied for fifth in starts (26) and 12th in on-base percentage (.297) and batting average (.241).

IN AUGUST: Went 1-1 in five starts in August, the fourth time in five months he had a .500 record (2-2 in April, 3-3 in May, 2-2 in June)...however, had a 2.03 ERA and .212 opponents batting average...did not allow a home run in 31.0 innings, walked nine and struck out 35...the ERA was his lowest in a month with more than one game and ranked fifth in the American League in August...also ranked second in opponents slugging percentage (.240) and third in OPS (.512)

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed two home runs over his last 10 starts after surrendering 14 over his first 16...has a .203 (42-for-207) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .262 (95-for-363) with 11 of his 16 home runs after that...has held the opponents three hitter to a .182 (12-for-66) average and the four hitter to a mark of .174 (12-for-69).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 7-4 with a 2.93 ERA (32 er in 98.1 ip) and .214 (77-for-360) opponents batting average in 16 starts on five days rest or more compared to 3-4 with a 4.04 ERA (22 er in 49.0 ip) and .273 (54-for-198) opponents average in nine starts on four days rest.

THIS AND THAT: Picked up his 10th win of the season in his last start, which is a new career-high, surpassing his nine in 2019...has career highs in all counting categories...has received two runs of support or fewer in 15 of his 26 starts, including 13 of his last 18...has four games of 10 or more strikeouts this year, which is tied for the fourth most 10-strikeout games in a season in Oakland history...has seven in his career, which is tied for fifth in Oakland history...has tossed seven innings or fewer in all 26 of his starts, including six innings or fewer 20 times...has six no decisions this year, four of which have come in extra inning games...the A's have won three of his no decisions and are 13-13 (.500) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start on April 5 against Los Angeles (NL)...allowed seven runs in a season-low 2.2 innings and walked a season-high three batters...it was his first of seven three-walk games...tossed 90 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...the loss extended his losing streak to a career-high three games dating back to Sept. 13, 2020... then picked up the win in each of his next two starts and allowed just one run on eight hits in 12.0 innings...won 7-3 at Houston on April 10 and then combined with Romo, Diekmann and Wendelken on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 victory over Detroit on April 16...allowed six runs on a season-high nine hits in 4.0 innings against Minnesota on April 21 but had a no decision in the A's 13-12, 10-inning win...allowed three home runs in a start for the second time in his career (Sept. 22, 2020 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...finished April 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts...then went 3-3 with a 3.18 ERA in six starts in May...the three wins matched his most ever in a month and he had 38 strikeouts, which tied for eighth in the American League...won each of his first three starts in May and posted a 3.12 ERA over that stretch from May 3-14...then went 0-3 with a 3.24 ERA over his next three starts from May 19-29...the losing streak matched his career high...struck out 11 batters in 6.0 innings in a 4-2 loss to Seattle on May 24...it was one of four games with 10 or more strikeouts (10, July 8 at Houston; 10, July 23 at Seattle; 10, July 29 at Los Angeles-AL) and the second highest single-game total of his career to his 13 against the Mariners in the final game of the 2020 season...now has seven career 10-strikeout games...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings June 15 against Los Angeles (AL) and allowed just two runs for the win...it was his first of four starts of 7.0 innings...then surrendered a season-high eight runs on a season-high tying nine hits in 5.2 innings at Texas on June 21 for the loss...is 3-2 with a 2.27 ERA (17 er in 67.1

ip) in 11 starts since then...started consecutive games that went extra innings on June 26 at San Francisco and July 2 against Boston...struck out 10 batters in back-to-back starts on July 23 at Seattle and July 29 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the first A's pitcher with consecutive games of 10 or more strikeouts since Brandon McCarthy (Aug. 29-Sept. 3, 2011)...combined with Romo and Trivino on a three-hit shutout in the latter contest against the Angels, a 4-0 win...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...struck out 10 and logged a season-high 109 pitches...finished July with a 2-1 record, a 2.30 ERA and .204 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 40 in 31.1 innings and walked just nine while surrendering two home runs...his strikeouts ranked fifth in the AL and fifth in Oakland history in the month of July...also ranked seventh in the AL in ERA and opponents batting average, ninth in slugging percentage (.310) and 10th in OPS (.588)...struck out eight batters on Aug. 4th against San Diego, giving him 45 strikeouts over a five-start stretch from July 8-Aug. 4...those were the second most strikeouts by an A's pitcher over a five-game span over the last 35 years...only Todd Stottlemyre, with 46 from June 16-July 6, 1995, had more.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-2 victory over New York last Saturday in Oakland...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and yielded just two hits and a walk...allowed a two-out double to Judge in the first and then retired each of the next 15 batters before walking LeMahieu in the sixth...also allowed a single to Judge in the seventh and was relieved by Chafin to start the eighth with the A's leading 3-0.

LHP Sean Manaea (8-8, 3.77 ERA): Went 0-3 with a 9.90 ERA and .344 opponents batting average in five starts in August...the ERA was the highest by an Athletics pitcher in a month with 20 or more innings pitched since Carl Scheib posted a 9.99 ERA in July of 1947...is now 2-7 with a 5.28 ERA over his last 12 starts dating back to June 20 after going 6-2 with a 2.99 ERA over his first 14 starts...is tied for fifth in the American League in games started (26), ranks seventh in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.33) and eighth in strikeouts (156)...the 156 strikeouts are a career-high...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 8-2 A's loss to New York last Friday in Oakland (4.1 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 5 so)...is 2-0 with a 3.72 ERA (29.0 ip, 24 h, 12 r, 12 er, 8 bb, 25 so, 4 hr) in five career appearances, four starts, against Toronto...has not faced the Blue Jays since Aug. 1, 2018 when he was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-3 victory in Oakland (6.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so).
