ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the last five games after a season-high tying six-game losing streak...are 6-11 over the last 17 games after going 12-3 over the previous 15 contests...are in third place in the American League Wild Card, two games behind the second place team (Boston) and 3½ behind the first place team (New York)...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are in second place in the AL West and trail Houston by 4½ games...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 but have spent each of the 70 days since then in second...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 70 days in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in each of their last 21 stolen base attempts, which is one short of the Oakland record of 22...are 36-for-38 (94.7%) in the 31 games since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29 and have the second most stolen bases in the majors over that span (Kansas City, 37)...Marte has accounted for 20 of the 36 steals...are 79-for-92 (85.9%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 86.5%)...the 79 steals rank third in the American League, fifth in the majors and are the most by an A's team since 2014 (83).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 58 errors, which is second fewest in the American League to Houston (53)...are on pace for 70 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...have 11 outfield assists, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for second fewest in the majors (Padres, 10)...have the fifth fewest double plays in the AL (99).

PITCHING: The A's have a 4.85 ERA (89 er in 165.0 ip) over the last 19 games after logging a 2.19 ERA over the previous 12 contests...overall, rank fifth in the American League in ERA (3.76), opponents OPS (.689), on-base percentage (.302) and slugging (.387)...have the fewest walks (363) and pitches per inning (16.0) and are tied for second in shutouts (11).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have allowed three home runs in each of the last three games, which matches the longest streak of consecutive games with three or more home runs allowed in Oakland history (nine times, last: Sept. 20-23, 2020)...the franchise record is four by the Kansas City A's (June 6-8, 1964)...have surrendered 17 home runs in the last seven games but have allowed 151 for the season, which is fourth fewest in the American League.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in 12 of the last 19 games and are 4-7 with a 5.13 ERA (54 er in 94.2 ip) and .275 (103-for-374) opponents batting average over that span...however, have 755.1 innings pitched for the season, which is the most in the majors...the fewest innings pitched by a Major League leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 New York Mets...are 49-44 with a 3.80 ERA (319 er in 755.1 ip)...rank third in the American League in wins, fourth in opponents OPS (.699) and fifth in ERA (3.80)...are tied for second in complete games (3)...have used just nine starting pitchers, which is tied for fourth fewest in the majors...are the only team with four pitchers with 25 or more starts.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 2-5 with three saves, five blown saves and a 5.27 ERA (24 er in 41.0 ip) over the last 11 games...has just 16 losses for the season, which is the fewest in the majors, but has 22 blown saves, which is tied for second most in the American League...ranks third in the AL in opponents OPS (.671) and fourth in ERA (3.70)...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced (.423) and the fourth highest batting average (.245).

OFFENSE: The A's hit .304 (34-for-112) with 23 runs scored and six home runs in the three-game series at Detroit after batting .210 with 37 runs scored and 12 home runs over the previous 13 games...are now hitting .257 (212-for-824) with 123 runs scored over the last 24 games (5.13 runs per game)...are batting .237 overall, which is third lowest in the American League...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 79 times, which is the most in the AL, fourth most in the majors and third most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019)...ranks fourth in the AL in sacrifice flies (38), tied for fourth in fewest grounded into double plays (84) and fifth in doubles (229), walks (453), sacrifice hits (15) and fewest strikeouts (1132).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters lead the American League in hits (27), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (125), are tied for the lead in home runs

(3), rank second in RBI (18) and tied for second in extra base hits (7) and doubles (4).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 19-23 (.452) in one-run games, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...lead the AL in one-run losses and rank second in one-run decisions (42)...are 29-34 (.460) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 45-26 (.634) in games decided by three runs or more...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is the second best record in the AL (Seattle, 12-5/.706)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 16-10 in games decided in the last at bat.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on this six-game road trip to Detroit (2-1) and Toronto (three games)...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (1-2) and Chicago-AL (1-3) and are 37-29 (.561) on the road, which is the second best road record in the American League (Tampa Bay, 41-25/.621)...have a 3.78 ERA (240 er in 571.2 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the AL and fifth lowest in the majors...have the second best road OPS in the AL (.750) and fourth best batting average (.248), but the second lowest home batting average (.225) and third lowest home OPS (.696)...return home following the game Sunday for a six-game homestand against Chicago-AL (three games) and Texas (three games) that starts on Tuesday...went 3-6 on the last homestand against San Francisco (1-2), Seattle (0-2) and New York-AL (2-2) and are 37-31 (.544) at home.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Four of the A's last five wins have come in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 31-19 (.620) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 43-41 (.512) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to the Dodgers (26-14/.650).

A'S IN AUGUST: The A's went 14-12 (.538) in August, which was the fourth best record in the American League...have now finished with a winning record in 11 of the last 12 months (min. 10 games) with the exception being this July when they went 11-13 (.458)...went 33-for-35 (94.1%) in stolen base attempts...the 33 steals were the most in the majors, the most by the A's in August since 1983 (42) and their most in any month since September of 2010 (36)...led the AL in hit by pitches (19), had the second fewest strikeouts (202) and ranked third in on-base percentage (.332)...the pitching staff had the second fewest strikeouts (196), tied for the second fewest walks (73) and had the fifth lowest opponents batting average (.239).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have used a different lineup in each of the last 71 games and have 131 different lineups over the first 134 contests...have used the injured list 23 times this year...used it eight times last year and 17 times in 2019.

A'S vs. BLUE JAYS: The season series is even at two games each as the two clubs split a four-game series in Oakland, May 3-6...the A's are making their first visit to Toronto since April 28, 2019, a span of 859 days...have lost eight of the last 10 games...have won just one season series against the Blue Jays dating back to 2015 (7-0 in 2018) and are 15-21 over that span...are 226-203 all-time against the Blue Jays, including 114-102 in Oakland, 112-99 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 71-67 (.514) in Rogers Centre.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks second among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.468), fourth in slugging percentage (.244) and on-base percentage (.224), fifth in ERA (1.73), seventh in batting average (.162) and tied for eighth in games pitched (60)...**Matt Chapman** leads ML third basemen with a .987 fielding percentage...has 148 putouts, which are the most by an American League third baseman since Carney Lansford had 150 for California in 1980...**Starling Marte** leads the majors in stolen bases (42), ranks third in batting (.319) and fourth in on-base percentage (.396)...**Matt Olson** ranks fourth in the AL in OPS (.919) and slugging (.546), tied for fourth in extra base hits (62), fifth in on-base percentage (.372), tied for fifth in home runs (32), seventh in walks (68), tied for seventh in doubles (30), tied for eighth in RBI (87) and ninth in runs (85).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1932** Jimmie Foxx hits his 50th and 51st home runs of the season to become the third player to reach 50 in one season, joining Babe Ruth and Hack Wilson...in **1947** Bill McCahan no hits the Washington Senators, 3-0...in **1988** Dennis Eckersley sets an Oakland record with his 37th save of the season...he would go on to save 45, becoming the first Athletic to reach the 40 plateau...in **1997** Ben Grieve makes his major league debut and ties an Oakland record with three doubles in the A's 12-3 win over San Francisco.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (8-9, 3.97 ERA)

AUGUST AND SEPTEMBER: Went 0-3 with a 9.90 ERA and .344 opponents batting average in five starts in August...the ERA was the highest by an Athletics pitcher in a month with 20 or more innings pitched since Carl Scheib posted a 9.99 ERA in July of 1947...tossed five innings or fewer in all five starts...it is the second time in his career he has five straight starts of five innings or fewer (July 25-Aug. 15, 2020)...is now 8-12 with a 6.01 ERA in 26 career starts in August...the losses are his most in any month and the ERA is his highest...is 10-3 with a 2.17 ERA (24 er in 99.1 ip) in 17 career starts in September...the ERA is his lowest for any month of the season and the wins are second only to his 11 in June

THREE GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-3 with a 9.90 ERA (22 er in 20.0 ip), .344 (31-for-90) opponents batting average and eight home runs allowed over his last five starts...the losing streak is one short of his career high of four, which he established earlier this year from June 20 to July 7...is now 2-7 with a 5.28 ERA (36 er in 61.1 ip) over his last 12 starts dating back to June 20 after going 6-2 with a 2.99 ERA over his first 14 starts...has allowed 14 home runs over his last 12 starts after yielding eight of his first 14.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks sixth in the American League in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.33), tied for seventh in games started (26) and tied for eighth in strikeouts (156)...the 156 strikeouts are a career-high...is the only AL pitcher and one of four in the majors with two shutouts...is one of two AL pitchers with two complete games (Cole, NYY).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .171 (24-for-140) batting average and .534 OPS against left-handed hitters compared to .282 (118-for-419) with a .785 OPS against right-handers...his batting average and OPS against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Kikuchi, SEA .123/.410)...has issued 29 of his 36 walks to righties.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on six days rest...is 5-6 with a 5.09 ERA (42 er in 74.1 ip) in 15 starts on five days rest or more compared to 3-2 with a 2.26 ERA (16 er in 63.2 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest...over the last three years, he is 10-7 with a 4.13 ERA (55 er in 120.0 ip) in 23 starts on five days rest or more compared to 9-3 with a 2.72 ERA (35 er in 115.2 ip) in 20 starts on four days rest.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed three home runs in two of his last three starts...never allowed more than two home runs in his first 119 starts...now has 22 home runs for the season, which is a career high (previous: 21 in 2018)...the A's are 7-2 in his no decisions and are 15-11 (.577) in his starting assignments...are 26-16 (.619) when he starts over the last three years...has allowed one run or fewer in 12 of his 26 starts but has received one run of support or fewer in 11 of his starts...is 0-7 with one run of support or fewer, 8-2 with two runs of support or more...has walked two batters or fewer 20 times, including eight starts with one walk and seven with no walks...has three games of 10 or more strikeouts this year and six in his career...the six 10-strikeout games are tied for seventh most in Oakland history.

CAREER NOTES: Is scheduled to make the 123rd start of his career today, which are the most by an A's pitcher over the last 18 years...has 47 wins, which match Trevor Cahill and Joe Blanton for the most by an A's pitcher over that span, and 603 strikeouts, which are second most to Sonny Gray (607)...in the Wild Card era (1995-present), the only A's pitchers with more starts and wins are Barry Zito (224 starts, 102 wins), Tim Hudson (183, 92) and Mark Mulder (150, 81).

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start but then went 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA over his next four starts...tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the doubleheader April 20...it was the 11th complete game shutout of fewer than eight innings in Oakland history and his second career complete game and shutout...had 10 strikeouts on May 7 against Tampa Bay, but had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win...retired each of the first 18 batters he faced before walking Arozarena to start the seventh...allowed one run or fewer in five consecutive starts from May 23 to June 14 and went 3-0 with a 0.84 ERA over that span...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on May 23...left with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was the first of two times the pen blew the save in a game in which he was the pitcher of record (July 16 vs. Cleveland)...fanned Taylor Ward to end the fourth inning for his 500th career strikeout...tossed a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Seattle on June 2...it was his third career complete game and shutout, his second this year...then combined with Petit, Trivino and Diekman on a two-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win on June 9 against Arizona...it was the second time in his career he did not allow a run in back-to-back starts (Sept. 14-20, 2016)...had a career-high 16.0-inning scoreless streak from June 2 to 14...struck out 11 batters in 5.1 innings June 20 at New York (AL) but was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss...the 11 strikeouts match the most in Athletics history by a pitcher with fewer than six innings pitched...went 2-for-2 with a double June 25 at San Francisco...it was the first extra base hit by an A's pitcher since Joe Kennedy

doubled on June 12, 2007 at Houston...was named American League Pitcher of the Month for June after going 3-2 with a 1.13 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 34 batters in 32.0 innings and allowed just one home run...it was the second time he was named Pitcher of the Month (April, 2018)...struck out a career-high 13 batters in 7.0 innings in a 4-1 win at Seattle on July 22...matched the most strikeouts in Athletics history by a pitcher with seven innings or fewer and equaled the seventh highest single-game total in Oakland history...went 2-2 with a 3.30 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in five starts in July...struck out 41 and walked just five in 30.0 innings...the strikeouts tied for third in the American League in July and tied Mike Moore (1989) for the third highest total in July in Oakland history behind Vida Blue (55 in 1971, 42 in 1976).

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-2 loss to New York (AL) a week ago today in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying three home runs for the second time in his last three starts...blanked the Yankees on two hits and a hit batter over the first three innings but then allowed solo home runs to Stanton and Voit in the fourth inning and a two-run home run to Judge in the fifth...left after 4.2 innings trailing 5-0.

RHP Paul Blackburn (0-1, 2.81 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas Aug. 18 and is 0-2 with a 2.81 ERA and .250 opponents batting average in three starts...is 0-5 with a 8.10 ERA and .329 opponents batting average over his last nine games, including six starts, dating back to July 6, 2018...the five-game losing streak is a career high...had a no decision in his last start, a 3-1 A's win over New York (AL) last Sunday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 5 h, 1 bb, 1 so)...had a no decision in his only career appearance against the Blue Jays, a start in the A's 3-2 loss at Toronto on July 26, 2017 (7.0 ip, 2 h, 0 r, 0 er, 3 bb, 3 so)...was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA and .311 opponents batting average in 17 games, including 16 starts, with Las Vegas...surrendered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings, an average of 0.81 per nine innings...ranked second in the Triple-A West in innings pitched (88.2), tied for second in games started (16) and fifth in ERA and strikeouts (80) at the time of his Aug. 18 promotion to Oakland.

- Has not allowed a run in 16 of his 17 games since he was acquired from Chicago (NL) on July 26...has a 1.00 ERA (2 er in 18.0 ip) and .180 (11-for-61) opponents batting average...however, has allowed 3-of-5 (60.0%) inherited runners to score.
- Has not allowed a run in 42 of his last 44 appearances (5 er in 42.1 ip, 1.06 ERA) and 55 of 60 overall.
