OAKLAND ATHLETICS (74-62) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (72-62)

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost last night by a score of 10-8...trailed 10-3 going into the ninth and scored five runs to bring the game to within two...have won four of the last seven games after a season-high tying six-game losing streak...are 6-13 over the last 19 games after going 12-3 over the previous 15 contests...are tied with Seattle for third place in the American League Wild Card, four games behind the second place team (Boston) and 4½ behind the first place team (New York)...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are tied with Seattle for second place in the AL West and trail Houston by 5½ games...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 but had spent each of the last 71 days since then in sole possession of second...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 71 days in second, two days tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

ON THE BASES: Tony Kemp was caught stealing yesterday, snapping a streak of 21 successful A's stolen base attempts...were one short of the Oakland record of 22...are 36-for-39 (92.3%) in the 33 games since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29 and have the third most stolen bases in the majors over that span (Kansas City, 38; Cleveland, 37)...Marte has accounted for 20 of the 36 steals...are 79-for-93 (84.9%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 86.9%)...the 79 steals rank third in the American League, fifth in the majors and are the most by an A's team since 2014 (83).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 58 errors, which is second fewest in the American League to Houston (53)...are on pace for 69 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...have 11 outfield assists, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for second fewest in the majors (Padres, 10)...have the fifth fewest double plays in the AL (99).

PITCHING: The A's have a 5.47 ERA (110 er in 181.0 ip) over the last 21 games after logging a 2.19 ERA over the previous 12 contests...overall, rank fifth in the American League in ERA (3.87), opponents OPS (.697), on-base percentage (.304) and slugging (.393)...have the fewest walks (368), second fewest pitches per inning (16.0), and are tied for second in shutouts (11).

THE LONG BALL: The A's yielded four home runs yesterday and have now allowed three or more home runs in each of the last five games, which is longest streak of consecutive games with three or more home runs allowed in franchise history (the previous Oakland record was three homers in three consecutive games nine times, last: Sept. 20-23, 2020)...the franchise record was four by the Kansas City A's (June 6-8, 1964)...have surrendered 24 home runs in the last eight games but have allowed 158 for the season, which is fourth fewest in the American League.

STARTING PITCHING: Paul Blackburn surrendered nine hits and four earned runs in 3.2 innings of work yesterday...A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in 13 of the last 21 games and are 4-8 with a 5.13 ERA (60 er in 105.1 ip) and .279 (117-for-420) opponents batting average over that span...however, have 766.0 innings pitched for the season, which is the most in the majors...the fewest innings pitched by a Major League leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 New York Mets...are 49-45 with a 3.82 ERA (325 er in 766.0 ip)...rank third in the American League in wins, and fourth in opponents OPS (.703), and fourth in ERA (3.82)...are tied for second in complete games (3)...have used just nine starting pitchers, which is tied for fourth fewest in the majors...are the only team with four pitchers with 25 or more starts.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 2-6 with three saves, seven blown saves and a 7.85 ERA (39 er in 46.1 ip) over the last 13 games...has just 17 losses for the season, which is the fewest in the majors, but has 23 blown saves, which is second most in the American League...ranks fourth in the AL in opponents OPS (.684) and sixth in ERA (3.96).

OFFENSE: The A's have hit .296 (55-for-186) with 41 runs scored and 11 home runs during this current road trip after batting .210 with 37 runs scored and 12 home runs over the previous 13 games...are now hitting .261 (233-for-894) with 141 runs scored over the last 26 games (5.42 runs per game)...are batting .238 overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 82 times, which is the most in the AL, tied for third most in the majors and third most in Oakland history (88 in

2001, 87 in 2019)...ranks fourth in the AL in sacrifice flies (38) and doubles (234), tied for fourth in fewest grounded into double plays (85) and fifth in walks (456), sacrifice hits (15) and fewest strikeouts (1147).**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters lead the American League in hits (27), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (125), are tied for the lead in home runs (3), rank second in RBI (18) and are third in extra base hits (7) and fourth in doubles (4).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters lead the American League in hits (28), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (128), are tied for second in home runs (3), rank second in RBI (18) and are tied for third in extra base hits (7) and fourth in doubles (4).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 19-24 (.442) in one-run games, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...lead the AL in one-run losses and rank second in one-run decisions (43)...are 29-36 (.446) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 45-26 (.634) in games decided by three runs or more...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is the second best record in the AL (Seattle, 12-5/.706)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 16-11 in games decided in the last at bat.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-3 on this six-game road trip to Detroit (2-1) and Toronto (0-2)...went 5-5 on the last road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Texas (1-2) and Chicago-AL (1-3) and are 37-31 (.544) on the road...have a 4.00 ERA (261 er in 587.2 ip) on the road, which is the fourth lowest in the AL and ninth lowest in the majors...the hitters have the second best road OPS in the AL (.755) and fourth best batting average (.249), but the second lowest home batting average (.225) and third lowest home OPS (.696)...return home following the game Sunday for a six-game homestand against Chicago-AL (three games) and Texas (three games) that starts on Tuesday...went 3-6 on the last homestand against San Francisco (1-2), Seattle (0-2) and New York-AL (2-2) and are 37-31 (.544) at home.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Four of the A's last five wins have come in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 31-19 (.620) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 43-42 (.506) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to the Dodgers (26-14/.650).

A'S IN AUGUST: The A's went 14-12 (.538) in August, which was the fourth best record in the American League...have now finished with a winning record in 11 of the last 12 months (min. 10 games) with the exception being this July when they went 11-13 (.458)...went 33-for-35 (94.1%) in stolen base attempts...the 33 steals were the most in the majors, the most by the A's in August since 1983 (42) and their most in any month since September of 2010 (36)...led the AL in hit by pitches (19), had the second fewest strikeouts (202) and ranked third in on-base percentage (.332)...the pitching staff had the second fewest strikeouts (196), tied for the second fewest walks (73) and had the fifth lowest opponents batting average (.239).

A'S vs. BLUE JAYS: Toronto leads the series 3-2...the A's are making their first visit to Toronto since April 28, 2019, a span of 859 days...have lost nine of the last 11 games...have won just one season series against the Blue Jays dating back to 2015 (7-0 in 2018) and are 15-22 over that span...are 226-204 all-time against the Blue Jays, including 114-102 in Oakland, 112-10 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 71-68 (.511) in Rogers Centre.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks second among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.468), third in on-base percentage (.224), fifth in ERA (1.73) and slugging (.244), sixth in batting average (.162) and tied for 11th in games pitched (60)...**Starling Marte** leads the majors in stolen bases (42), ranks third in batting (.320) and fourth in on-base percentage (.398)...**Matt Olson** ranks fourth in the AL in OPS (.921) and slugging (.548), tied for fourth in extra base hits (64), fifth in on-base percentage (.373), tied for seventh in home runs (32), tied for sixth in walks (69) and doubles (32), tied for ninth in RBI (89) and tied for eighth in runs (88).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1931** George Earnshaw tosses a one-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win the first game of a doubleheader at Boston...in **1951** Ferris Fain goes 5 for 5 in the second game of a doubleheader against Washington...in **1973** Catfish Hunter improves his record to 18-3 as the A's defeat the California Angels 11-6...it is Hunter's club record 13th consecutive win...he finishes the season 21-5, an .808 winning percentage.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (9-12, 3.74 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 2-4 with a 4.75 ERA (19 er in 36.0 ip) and .289 (43-for-149) opponents batting average over his last seven starts...has walked 13 and struck out just 18 in 36.0 innings over that span and has pitched fewer than five innings three times...was 4-1 with a 2.54 ERA over his previous eight starts...ranks ninth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.391), and 13th in OPS (.705) and ERA (3.74), but is tied for third in most losses (12)...the 12 losses are the most by an A's pitcher since Jesse Chavez had 15 in 2015.

DON'T WALK: Has walked 33 batters in 149.0 innings for an average of 1.99 per nine innings...that is the sixth lowest mark in the American League...is averaging 14.8 pitches per inning, which are second fewest in the majors (Wainwright, STL 14.7)...has walked two batters or fewer in 25 of his 26 starts...began the season with a streak of 23 consecutive starts with two walks or fewer, which was the second longest streak by a starting pitcher in Oakland history to Gil Heredia, who had a 26-start streak from April 10-Aug. 28, 1999...the streak ended Aug. 19 at Chicago (AL) when he walked a career-high four batters...has walked just 47 batters in 194.1 career innings (2.18 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed three home runs in a game for the first time in his career in his last start on Tuesday at Detroit...has yielded just 15 home runs in 149.0 innings this season and his average of 0.91 home runs per nine innings is fourth lowest in the American League...11 of the 15 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has a .253 (110-for-434) opponents average against right-handed hitters compared to .303 (46-for-152) against left-handers...has hit nine batters, which is tied for eighth most in the AL...opponents are hitting .325 (37-for-114) with runners in scoring position, which is second highest (Minor, KC .388).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-7 with a 5.26 ERA (29 er in 49.2 ip) in nine starts on four days rest compared to 8-4 with a 2.75 ERA (29 er in 95.0 ip) in 16 starts on five days rest or more ...is tied for second in the American League in wins on five days rest or more and ranks fourth in ERA...is tied for second in most losses on four days rest and has the fifth highest ERA.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 3-10 with a 5.40 ERA (44 er in 73.1 ip) and .300 (91-for-303) opponents batting average in 14 starts against American League West competition, 6-2 with a 2.14 ERA (18 er in 75.2 ip) and .230 (65-for-283) opponents average in 12 starts against everyone else...his 10 intradivision losses are the most in the majors and one short of the Athletics record of 11 held by Brian Kingman (1980) and Rick Langford (1977 and 1979)...his 5.40 intradivision ERA is sixth highest in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 4-1 in his no decisions and are 13-13 (.500) in his starting assignments...is 9-2 in 14 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-10 in 12 starts with support of two runs or fewer...has a 3.23 ERA (37 er in 103.0 ip) over innings one through four, a 5.45 ERA (23 er in 38.0 ip) in innings five and six and a 2.25 ERA (2 er in 8.0 ip) from the seventh inning on.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and lost each of his first two starts, allowing four runs in each contest for a 7.45 ERA...went 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA over his first two starts on April 3 and 8, both against Houston...did not pitch again until April 17 against Detroit when he combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in a 7-0 win...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...that began a four-start stretch where he went 3-1 with a 1.42 ERA and .232 opponents batting average through May 4...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his start against the Tigers and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...lost on April 28 at Tampa Bay but then picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102) against the Blue Jays...then went 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA and .284 opponents batting average over his next five starts from May 9 to 30...the losing streak matched his career high (also May 22, 2019-April 8, 2021)...left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of four times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (June 11 vs. Kansas City, July 9 at Texas, Aug. 13 at Texas)...allowed a season-high five runs in an 8-4 loss to Houston on May 20...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings of work in a 4-3 loss to Seattle on May 25...went 1-4 with a 4.46 ERA in six starts in May...tied for second in the American League in losses in May...then compiled a 3-0 record and a 2.64 ERA in five starts in the month of June...the ERA was fourth lowest in the American League and the three-game winning streak was the longest of his career...allowed a run in the first inning on June 5 at Colorado and did not allow another run until the seventh inning of his next start on June 11 against Kansas City for a career-high tying 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and did not allow a run in a 6-2 win at San Francisco on June 27...did not allow a run over the first three innings of his next start on July 3 against Boston for

another 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters (13th time, last: Bassitt, April 29, 2021 at Tampa Bay) in a 3-2 loss at Texas on July 9...finished July with a 1-3 record despite a 3.07 ERA and .227 opponents batting average...allowed a season-high tying five runs on eight hits in an 8-6 loss at Texas on Aug 13...walked a career-high four batters but picked up the win in a 5-4 victory at Chicago (AL) on Aug. 19...tossed just 3.0 innings in a 5-1 loss to Seattle on Aug. 24, which was the shortest start of his career...finished August 2-2 in five starts but had a 4.91 ERA, which was his highest single-month ERA in 2021.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 9-3 win at Detroit on Tuesday...allowed three home runs in a game for the first time in his career...tossed just 4.2 innings and did not qualify for the win...yielded a solo home run to Grossman in the first inning but the A's scored three times in the third and three times in the fifth to give him a 6-1 lead...then allowed two more solo home runs to Garneau and Hill in the fifth and was relieved by Guerra with two outs in the fifth inning and runners on first and second.

IRVIN vs. TORONTO: Was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance, a start in the A's 4-1 win in Oakland earlier this year on May 4...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102)...faced the minimum over the first five innings as his only base runner, a Biggio single to lead off the third, was erased on a double play...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the sixth inning on a Semien RBI double...then retired seven of the final eight batters he faced.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP James Kaprielian (7-4, 3.87 ERA): Was reinstated from the injured list on Aug. 8 and is 2-0 despite a 5.68 ERA in five starts since his return...was 5-4 with a 3.24 ERA in 13 starts when he was placed on the 10-day IL July 31 retroactive to July 28 with a right shoulder impingement...missed just one start and did not have a rehab assignment...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, his 3.87 ERA is fifth lowest in the AL among rookies...also ranks fourth in opponents OPS (.719), batting average (.223) and on-base percentage (.296) and fifth in slugging percentage (.423)...his opponents batting average breaks down to .176 with a .558 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .271 with an .883 OPS against left-handers...is 5-2 with a 2.44 ERA at home, 2-2 with a 5.26 ERA on the road...had a no decision in his last start, an 8-6 A's loss at Detroit on Wednesday (4.0 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 4 so)...has never faced the White Sox in his career.

- Has not allowed a run in 42 of his last 44 appearances (5 er in 42.1 ip, 1.06 ERA) and 55 of 60 overall.
