OAKLAND ATHLETICS (74-63) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (79-58)

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept in a three-games at Toronto over the week-end and have now lost four of the last five games after winning three in a row...are 4-10 over the last 14 games and 14-15 over the last 29...are in fifth place in the American League Wild Card, 3½ games behind the second place team (Boston)...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are in third place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by six games...that is one-half game short of the season high of 6½ (twice, last: Aug. 28)...held at least a share of first for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 and spent 71 consecutive days in sole possession of second place from June 21 to Sept. 3...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 71 days in second, two days tied for second, five days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 19-8 (.704) against American League Central teams, which is the second best record in the majors (New York, 20-8/.714)...are batting .253 (226-for-893) with an .810 OPS and an average of 5.5 runs per game (149 runs in 27 games) against teams from the Central compared to .232 with a .703 OPS and an average of 4.3 runs per game against all other teams...have a 3.51 ERA (92 er in 236.0 ip) against the Central, 4.00 against everyone else...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 84-28 (.750) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

OFFENSE: The A's were shut out on two hits on Sunday...it was the seventh time they have been shutout this year...hit .296 and scored 41 runs over the first five games of the road trip...are now hitting .254 (235-for-927) with 141 runs scored over the last 27 games (5.22 runs per game)...are batting .237 overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 82 times, which is the most in the AL, tied for third most in the majors and third most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019)...rank fourth in the AL in sacrifice flies (38) and fewest grounded into double plays (85) and fifth in doubles (235) and fewest strikeouts (1162)...A's pinch hitters lead the American League in hits (28), sacrifice flies (3) and plate appearances (129), rank second in RBI (18), tied for second in home runs (3) and tied for third in extra base hits (7).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 36-for-39 (92.3%) in stolen base attempts since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29...rank third in the majors in steals over that span...Marte has accounted for 20 of the 36 steals...are 79-for-93 (84.9%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 87.3%)...the 79 steals rank fourth in the American League, sixth in the majors and are the most by an A's team since 2014 (83)...had their streak of 21 consecutive stolen bases without a caught stealing snapped on Saturday, which fell one short of the Oakland record of 22.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 43 runs over the first five games of September (43 er in 41.0 ip, 9.44 ERA) and opponents are hitting .322 (58-for-180) with 15 home runs...now have a 5.62 ERA (118 er in 189.0 ip) over the last 22 games...overall, rank fifth in the American League in opponents OPS (.699), on-base percentage (.305) and slugging percentage (.395)...have the fewest walks (371) and pitches per inning (16.0) and are tied for second in shutouts (11).

THE LONG BALL: The A's allowed two home runs on Sunday, snapping their Major League record tying streak of five consecutive games with three or more home runs allowed (fourth time last: New York-AL, July 22-26, 2019)...the streak of six consecutive games with two or more home runs is one short of the Athletics record of seven (twice, last: April 6-14, 2018)...surrendered 18 home runs in six games on the road trip and have yielded 26 over the last 10 games...have 160 for the season, which is tied for fourth fewest in the American League.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in 14 of the last 22 games and are 4-9 with a 5.60 ERA (67 er in 107.2 ip) and .287 (125-for-435) opponents batting average over that span...however, have 768.1 innings pitched for the season, which is the most in the majors...the fewest innings pitched by a Major League leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 Mets...are 49-46 with a 3.89 ERA (332 er in 768.1 ip)...rank third in the American League in wins, fourth in opponents OPS (.708) and fifth in ERA...are tied for second in complete games (3).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 2-6 with three saves, seven blown saves and a 6.92 ERA (40 er in 52.0 ip) over the last 14 games...has just 17 losses for the season, which is tied with the Brewers for the fewest in the majors, but has 24 blown saves, which is second most in the American League...ranks fourth in the AL in opponents OPS (.684) and fifth in ERA (3.93)...has the second highest slugging percentage against first batters faced (.429) and the third

highest batting average (.249)...has the fifth highest percentage of inherited runners scored (36.9%).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 58 errors, which is second fewest in the American League to Houston (53)...are on pace for 69 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...have 11 outfield assists, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for second fewest in the majors (Padres, 10)...are tied for the third fewest double plays in the AL (99).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 19-24 (.442) in one-run games, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...lead the AL in one-run losses and rank second in one-run decisions (43)...are 29-36 (.446) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 45-27 (.625) in games decided by three runs or more...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is the second best record in the AL (Seattle, 14-5/.737)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are tied with Seattle for the most walk-off wins in the AL (10)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...are 16-11 in games decided in the last at bat.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin the penultimate homestand of the season tonight, a six-game stand against Chicago-AL (three games) and Texas (three games)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against San Francisco (1-2), Seattle (0-2) and New York-AL (2-2) and are 37-31 (.544) at home...went 2-4 on the last road trip to Detroit (2-1) and Toronto (0-3) and are 37-32 (.536) on the road...have the second lowest home batting average in the American League (.225) and third lowest home OPS (.696) but the third best road OPS (.749) and fourth best batting average (.247).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Four of the A's last five wins have come in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 31-20 (.608) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 43-43 (.500) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to the White Sox (23-14/.622).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 14-5 (.737) following a day off, which is the second best record in the majors (San Francisco, 16-4/.800)...will have next Monday off before finishing the season with 19 games in 20 days...have used a different lineup in each of the last 74 games and have 134 different lineups over the first 137 contests...have used the injured list 23 times this year...used it eight times last year and 17 times in 2019.

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's lost three of four in Chicago from Aug. 16-19 to open the season series...have an eight-game regular season winning streak in Oakland, which is the second longest Coliseum winning streak against Chicago in Oakland history (10, May 18, 2001-May 6, 2003)...squared off in the American League Wild Card Series last year, with the A's winning two of three in Oakland...the A's won the season series in 2019, 5-1...went 3-0 in Oakland and 2-1 in Chicago...it was their third consecutive season series win over the White Sox and Oakland is 16-7 against Chicago dating back to 2017...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 318-293 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 167-138 in Oakland and 151-155 in Chicago...including 69-67 at Guaranteed Rate Field...all-time, the A's are 995-1048 against Chicago.

Andrew Chafin ranks second among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.468), third in on-base percentage (.224), fourth in slugging percentage (.244), fifth in ERA (1.73) and sixth in batting average (.162)...**Matt Chapman** leads ML third basemen in fielding percentage (.987), total chances (392) and putouts (149)...**Starling Marte** leads the majors in stolen bases (42), ranks fourth in batting average (.316) and on-base percentage (.394) and ninth in batting with runners in scoring position (.347)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the AL in OPS (.917), fourth in on-base percentage (.373), tied for fourth in extra base hits (74), fifth in slugging percentage (.544), tied for sixth in walks (70), tied for seventh in doubles (32), tied for eighth in home runs (32), ninth in runs (88) and tied for 10th in RBI (89)

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1984** the A's tie a then club record by using 22 players in a game but lose 13-2 at Cleveland...only Mike Davis, who started the game in right and moved to center, played the entire game...in **2005** the A's scored five times in the bottom of the ninth to defeat Seattle 8-7, marking the first time in Oakland history the A's have come back from a four-run deficit entering the final bat and won...Nick Swisher walks with the bases loaded to force in the winning run...in **2019**, A's pitchers strike out 19 batters in a 10-2 win over Detroit to set a franchise record for strikeouts in a nine-inning game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (7-4, 3.87 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the injured list on Aug. 8 and is 2-0 despite a 5.68 ERA (16 er in 25.1 ip) in five starts since his return...was 5-4 with a 3.24 ERA in 13 starts when he was placed on the 10-day IL July 31 retroactive to July 28 with a right shoulder impingement...missed just one start and did not have a rehab assignment...began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and was recalled by the A's on May 12.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Is tied for fifth among American League rookies in wins (7), ranks seventh in strikeouts (99) and innings pitched (97.2) and eighth in games started (18)...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, his 3.87 ERA is sixth lowest in the AL among rookies...also ranks fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.296) and fifth in batting average (.223).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average breaks down to .176 (33-for-187) with a .558 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .271 (48-for-177) with an .883 OPS against left-handers...has issued 27 of his 37 walks and allowed 23 of his 37 extra base hits to lefties...has allowed a .206 (14-for-68) batting average with runners in scoring position...12 of the 17 home runs he has surrendered have been solo shots...has a .173 (26-for-150) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .281 (39-for-139) the second time and .213 (16-for-75) after that...has allowed six of his 17 home runs to the opponents clean-up hitter but has held the five hitter to a .098 (4-for-41) batting average.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-2 with a 2.44 ERA (13 er in 48.0 ip) and .184 (32-for-174) opponents batting average in eight starts at home compared to 2-2 with a 5.26 ERA (29 er in 49.2 ip) and .258 (49-for-190) opponents average in 10 starts on the road...has allowed 11 of his 17 home runs on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-2 with a 5.37 ERA (31 er in 52.0 ip) and .249 (50-for-201) opponents batting average in 10 starts at night compared to 4-2 with a 2.17 ERA (11 er in 45.2 ip) and .190 (31-for-163) opponents batting average in eight starts during the day...has yielded 14 of his 17 home runs at night.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 4-3 with a 2.90 ERA and .200 opponents batting average in 11 starts before the All-Star Break...has gone 3-1 since then but has a 5.55 ERA (22 er in 35.2 ip) and .259 (36-for-139) opponents average in seven starts since then.

THIS AND THAT: Has a 2.00 ERA (8 er in 36.0 ip) and .178 (23-for-129) opponents batting average over the first two innings of a game, a 4.96 ERA (34 er in 61.2 ip) and .247 (58-for-235) opponents average from the third inning on...has allowed two runs or fewer in 11 of his 18 starts and five hits or fewer 14 times...has left with the lead and was the pitcher of record in four of his five no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the A's are 10-8 (.556) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and went 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA in one start...was the Aviators Opening Day starter on May 6 at Las Vegas and was the losing pitcher in an 8-1 loss to Sacramento (4.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 0 hr, 76 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and made his first Major League start that day at Boston...allowed a run on four hits in 5.0 innings to earn his first ML win in the A's 4-1 victory over the Red Sox...would go 4-1 with a 2.84 ERA and .182 opponents batting average over his first seven starts through June 18...struck out nine batters in 5.2 innings in his second start on May 21 at Los Angeles (AL) but had a no decision in an 8-4 A's win...left with a 3-2 lead and two outs in the bottom of the sixth but Petit allowed a run for the blown save...it was the first of four starts in which he left with the lead and was the pitcher of record only to have the bullpen blow the save (June 23 at Texas, July 10 at Texas, Aug. 14 at Cleveland)...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings May 26 against Seattle for his second win...that matched his longest outing as a professional...also tossed 7.0 innings for Single-A Tampa at Charlotte on April 16, 2016, his second professional appearance...logged a season-low 3.2 innings May 31 at Seattle but had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss...was charged with the first loss of his career when he allowed two runs in 5.0 innings on June 6 at Colorado, a 3-1 A's loss...pitched 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits on June 12 to defeat Kansas City 11-2...walked a career-high four...tossed 105 pitches, which were his most as a professional, in a 5-4 loss to Texas on June 29...took the loss that day and went 0-2 despite a 3.00 ERA over his final three starts before the All-Star Break...struck out a career-high 10 batters in a career-high tying 7.0 innings on July 4 against Boston but was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss...it was the first 10-strikeout game by an A's rookie since Chris Bassitt on Aug. 9, 2015 against Houston (also 10)...issued a career-high tying four walks in 5.0 innings in a no decision at Texas on July 10...combined with Romo, Moll and Guerra on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Los Angeles (AL) on July 20 as part of a career-high 12.0-inning scoreless streak from July 10 to 27...allowed a career-high six runs in 4.1 innings in a 7-4 loss at San Diego on July 27...it snapped a career-opening 14-game streak of 1.2 innings or more and six hits or fewer, which was the longest such streak in Athletics history...singled off Chris Paddock in the third inning for his first

Major League hit...was placed on the 10-day injured list July 31 retroactive to July 28 with a right shoulder impingement...missed just one start, did not have a rehab assignment, and was reinstated from the IL on Aug. 8...allowed a career-high eight hits in 5.1 innings in a no decision in an 8-3 A's win at Texas on Aug. 14...did not walk or strikeout a batter to mark the 19th time in Oakland history a starting pitcher went at least five innings without a walk or strikeout (last: Dallas Braden, Aug. 25, 2008 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...issued a career-high tying four walks in 5.0 innings but picked up the win on Aug. 20 against San Francisco...allowed a career-high tying six runs in 5.0 innings on Aug. 26 against New York (AL) but had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-6 loss at Detroit last Wednesday...Oakland scored a run in the first and he allowed a RBI single to Castro in the second...the A's scored twice in the fourth but he allowed a two-run home run to Cabrera in the bottom of the fourth...Oakland scored three times in the fifth to give him a 6-3 lead but he allowed a leadoff home run to Baddoo in the bottom of the fifth and was relieved by Petit with no outs in the fifth and the A's leading 6-4

2020 RECAP: Made his Major League debut and had two relief appearances over five stints with Oakland...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average...allowed two home runs in 3.2 innings, walked two and struck out four...did not pitch during his first stint...joined the club a second time Aug. 16 and made his ML debut that day at San Francisco (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...was recalled as the 29th man for doubleheaders on Sept. 8 and Sept. 14 but did not pitch...recalled for his fifth stint on Sept. 24 and made one appearance in the second game of the Sept. 26 doubleheader against Seattle (1.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...was on the Taxi Squad for the postseason...was rated as the A's number 10 prospect by *Baseball America* following the season.

RHP Frankie Montas (11-9, 3.68 ERA):	Is 3-2 with a 2.38 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in nine starts since the All-Star Break...has struck out 69 and walked just 17 while yielding four home runs in 56.2 innings...has the second lowest opponents OPS in the American League since the break (.572), ranks third in ERA (2.38) and fourth in strikeouts (69), batting average (.203), on-base percentage (.267) and slugging percentage (.305)...was 8-7 with a 4.41 ERA, .258 opponents average, .737 OPS and 14 home runs in 18 starts before the break...overall, ranks fifth in the AL with 174 strikeouts, which are the most by an A's pitcher since Sonny Gray had 183 in 2014...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 8-6 A's win at Detroit last Thursday (6.2 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 7 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career regular season appearance against the White Sox, a start and loss in a 5-2 decision at Chicago earlier this year on Aug. 16 (5.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 6 so).

- Has not allowed a run in 16 of his 17 games since he was acquired from Chicago (NL) on July 26...has a 1.00 ERA (2 er in 18.0 ip) and .180 (11-for-61) opponents batting average...however, has allowed 3-of-5 (60.0%) inherited runners to score.
- Has not allowed a run in 42 of his last 44 appearances (5 er in 42.1 ip, 1.06 ERA) and 55 of 60 overall.
- Ranks second among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.468), third in on-base percentage (.224), fourth in slugging (.244), fifth in ERA (1.73), sixth in batting average (.162).
- Ranks seventh in the majors in opponents on-base percentage against first batters faced (.200) and 10th in slugging percentage (.196).
