## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (74-64) VS. CHICAGO WHITE SOX (80-58)

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 8, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost four straight, five of the last six and 11 of the last 15 games...are in third place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by a season-high seven games...it is their largest deficit in the West since finishing the 2019 season 10 games back...are in fifth place in the American League Wild Card, 3½ games behind the second place team (Boston)...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...held at least a share of first in the West for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 and spent 71 consecutive days in sole possession of second place from June 21 to Sept. 3...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 71 days in second, two days tied for second, six days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

**AGAINST THE CENTRAL:** The A's are 19-9 (.679) against American League Central teams, which is the second best record in the majors (New York, 20-8/.714)...are batting .251 (232-for-923) with an .800 OPS and an average of 5.4 runs per game (152 runs in 28 games) against teams from the Central compared to .232 with a .703 OPS and an average of 4.3 runs per game against all other teams...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 84-29 (.743) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** Four of the A's last five wins have come in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 31-20 (.608) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 43-44 (.494) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to the White Sox (23-14/.622).

**OFFENSE:** The A's have scored three runs on eight hits over the last two games but are hitting .252 (241-for-957) with 144 runs scored over the last 28 contests (5.14 runs per game)...are batting .236 overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 82 times, which is the most in the AL, fifth most in the majors and third most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019)...rank fourth in the AL in sacrifice flies (39), tied for fourth in fewest grounded into double plays (87) and fifth in doubles (236) and fewest strikeouts (1167)...A's pinch hitters lead the American League in hits (28) and plate appearances (132), rank second in RBI (18) and tied for second in home runs (3).

**ON THE BASES:** The A's are 37-for-40 (92.3%) in stolen base attempts since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29...rank third in the majors in steals over that span...Marte has accounted for 21 of the 37 steals...are 80-for-94 (85.1%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 87.4%)...were successful in 89.7% of their stolen base attempts last year but the highest percentage in a full season in Athletics history is 80.7% in 2008...the 80 steals rank fourth in the American League and are the most by an A's team since 2014 (83)...had their streak of 21 consecutive stolen bases without a caught stealing snapped on Saturday, which fell one short of the Oakland record of 22.

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed at least six runs in each of their last six games, which is their longest such streak since a six-game streak from Sept. 6-12, 2006...have an 8.82 ERA (49 er in 50.0 ip), .330 (73-for-221) opponents batting average and have allowed 15 home runs over that span...have a 5.64 ERA (124 er in 198.0 ip) and 43 home runs in the last 23 games...overall, rank fifth in the American League in opponents OPS (.701) and slugging percentage (.395)...have the fewest walks (374), the second fewest pitches per inning (16.0), are tied for second in shutouts (11) and rank third in fewest home runs (160).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in 15 of the last 23 games and are 4-9 with a 5.48 ERA (68 er in 111.2 ip) and .288 (130-for-452) opponents batting average over that span...however, have 772.1 innings pitched for the season, which is the most in the majors...the fewest innings pitched by a Major League leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 Mets...are 49-46 with a 3.88 ERA (333 er in 772.1 ip)...are tied for third in the American League in wins and rank fifth in opponents OPS (.709) and ERA...are tied for second in complete games (3).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen is 2-7 with three saves, seven blown saves and a 7.11 ERA (45 er in 57.0 ip) over the last 15 games...had just 11 losses over the first 123 games and now have 18 for the season, which is the fewest in the American League...have 24 blown saves, which is second most in the AL...ranks fourth in the AL in opponents OPS (.687) and fifth in ERA (3.99)...has the second highest slugging percentage (.429) and batting average (.251)

against first batters faced...has the fourth highest percentage of inherited runners scored (37.3%).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have not committed an error in the last five games and have just 58 for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to Houston (53)...are on pace for 68 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...have 11 outfield assists, which is the fewest in the American League and tied for second fewest in the majors (Padres, 10)...are tied for the third fewest double plays in the AL (100).

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 19-24 (.442) in one-run games, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...lead the AL in one-run losses and rank second in one-run decisions (43)...are 29-36 (.446) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 45-28 (.616) in games decided by three runs or more...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with Seattle for the best record in the AL (Seattle, 14-6/.700)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are tied with Seattle for the most walk-off wins in the AL (10)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...are 16-11 in games decided in the last at bat.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-1 on the penultimate homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Chicago-AL (0-1) and Texas (three games)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against San Francisco (1-2), Seattle (0-2) and New York-AL (2-2) and are 37-32 (.536) at home...went 2-4 on the last road trip to Detroit (2-1) and Toronto (0-3) and are 37-32 (.536) on the road...have the second lowest home batting average (.224) and OPS (.693) in the American League but the fourth best road OPS (.749) and batting average (.247).

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's lineup last night was the same as Friday, snapping a streak of 74 consecutive games with a different lineup...have used 134 different lineups in 138 games...have used the injured list 23 times this year and currently have six players on the IL...used it eight times last year and 17 times in 2019...the 23 players have combined to miss 652 games, an average of 28.3 games per stint.

**A's vs. WHITE SOX:** The A's have lost the season series for the first time since 2016 as they are 1-4 with two games remaining...had gone 15-4 over the previous three season series...lost the first game in Oakland last night to snap an eight-game regular season winning streak against the White Sox in the Coliseum...lost three of four in Chicago from Aug. 16-19...squared off in the American League Wild Card Series last year, with the A's winning two of three in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 318-294 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 167-139 in Oakland and 151-155 in Chicago...including 69-67 at Guaranteed Rate Field...all-time, the A's are 995-1049 against Chicago.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Andrew Chafin** ranks second among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.468), fourth in on-base percentage (.224), fifth in slugging percentage (.244), tied for fifth in ERA (1.73) and sixth in batting average (.162)...**Matt Chapman** leads ML third basemen in fielding percentage (.987), total chances (395) and putouts (150)...**Starling Marte** leads the majors in stolen bases (43), ranks fourth in batting average (.316), fifth in on-base percentage (.393) and eighth in batting with runners in scoring position (.351)...**Matt Olson** ranks fourth in the American League in OPS (.911), tied for fourth in extra base hits (64), tied for sixth in walks (70), seventh in on-base percentage (.370), tied for seventh in doubles (32), eighth in slugging percentage (.541), tied for eighth in home runs (32), ninth in runs (88) and tied for ninth in RBI (90)

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1916** switch hitter Wally Schang becomes the first American Leaguer to homer from both sides of the plate in the same game...in **1965** Bert Campaneris plays all nine positions in a game against the Angels...the A's lose in 13 innings, 5-3...in **1978** Mike Edwards sets an Oakland record by scoring five runs in the A's 11-4 win at Texas...in **1984** Carney Lansford collects four hits in the A's 9-5 win at Cleveland, including the 1000th hit of his career off Steve Farr...in **1992** Carney Lansford is 5 for 6 with five RBI in the A's 14-2 win at California...in **2002** Barry Zito wins his 20<sup>th</sup> game as he combines with Jim Mecir and Ricardo Rincon on a three-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Minnesota...Zito would go on to win 23 games and the AL Cy Young.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (11-9, 3.68 ERA)

**SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK:** Is 3-2 with a 2.38 ERA (15 er in 56.2 ip) and .203 (40-for-197) opponents batting average in nine starts since the All-Star Break...has struck out 69 and walked just 17 while yielding four home runs in 56.2 innings...has the second lowest opponents OPS in the American League since the break (.572), third lowest batting average, fourth lowest ERA, slugging percentage (.305) and on-base percentage (.267) and fifth most strikeouts (69)...was 8-7 with a 4.41 ERA, .258 opponents average, .737 OPS and 14 home runs in 18 starts before the break.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Ranks fifth in the American League with 174 strikeouts, which are the most by an A's pitcher since Sonny Gray had 183 in 2014...is tied for second in starts (27), tied for fourth in wins (11), tied for sixth in innings pitched (156.2), ranks seventh in opponents OPS (.682), strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.87), slugging percentage (.385) and fewest home runs per nine innings (1.03), eighth in ERA (3.68), ninth in on-base percentage (.297) and 10th in batting average (.240).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Allowed two home runs in his last start after yielding two home runs over his previous 10 starts...has a .200 (43-for-215) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .262 (100-for-382) with 13 of his 18 home runs after that...has held the opponents three hitter to a .174 (12-for-69) average and the four hitter to a mark of .181 (13-for-72)...the mark against the four hitter is the lowest in the American League and his average against the three hitter is tied for the lowest.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 7-4 with a 2.93 ERA (32 er in 98.1 ip) and .214 (77-for-360) opponents batting average in 16 starts on five days rest or more compared to 4-4 with a 4.04 ERA (25 er in 55.2 ip) and .265 (59-for-223) opponents average in 10 starts on four days rest.

**SEVEN INNINGS OR FEWER:** Has tossed seven innings or fewer in each of his 27 starts this year and now has a streak of 39 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to Sept. 25, 2019...that is the second longest such streak in Oakland history to a 40-start streak by Chris Bassitt from May 21, 2019-May 16, 2021...last tossed more than seven innings on June 20, 2019 against Tampa Bay (8.0 ip).

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 5-2 with a 2.69 ERA (18 er in 60.1 ip) in 10 starts during the day compared to 6-7 with a 4.30 ERA (46 er in 96.1 ip) in 17 starts at night...ranks third in the American League in day ERA and tied for fourth in day wins.

**IN AUGUST:** Went 1-1 in five starts in August, the fourth time in five months he had a .500 record (2-2 in April, 3-3 in May, 2-2 in June)...however, had a 2.03 ERA and .212 opponents batting average...did not allow a home run in 31.0 innings, walked nine and struck out 35...the ERA was his lowest in a month with more than one game and ranked fifth in the American League in August...also ranked second in opponents slugging percentage (.240) and third in OPS (.512)

**THIS AND THAT:** Has career highs in all categories including wins (11), starts (27) and strikeouts (174)...has four games of 10 or more strikeouts this year, which is tied for the fourth most 10-strikeout games in a season in Oakland history...has seven in his career, which is tied for fifth in Oakland history...has received two runs of support or fewer in 15 of his 27 starts, including 13 of his last 19...has six no decisions this year, four of which have come in extra inning games...the A's have won three of his no decisions and are 14-13 (.519) in his starting assignments.

**2021 HIGHLIGHTS:** Took the loss in his first start on April 5 against Los Angeles (NL)...the loss extended his losing streak to a career-high three games dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...then picked up the win in each of his next two starts and allowed just one run on eight hits in 12.0 innings...won 7-3 at Houston on April 10 and then combined with Romo, Diekmann and Wendelken on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 victory over Detroit on April 16...finished April 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts...then went 3-3 with a 3.18 ERA in six starts in May...the three wins matched his most ever in a month and he had 38 strikeouts, which tied for eighth in the American League...won each of his first three starts in May and posted a 3.12 ERA over that stretch from May 3-14...then went 0-3 with a 3.24 ERA over his next three starts from May 19-29...the losing streak matched his career high...struck out 11 batters in 6.0 innings in a 4-2 loss to Seattle on May 24...it was one of four games with 10 or more strikeouts (10, July 8 at Houston; 10, July 23 at Seattle; 10, July 29 at Los Angeles-AL) and the second highest single-game total of his career to his 13 against the Mariners in the final game of the 2020 season...now has seven career 10-strikeout games...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings June 15 against Los Angeles (AL) and allowed just two runs for the win...it was his first of four starts of 7.0 innings...then surrendered a season-high eight runs on a season-high tying nine hits in 5.2 innings at Texas on June 21 for the loss...is 4-2 with a 2.43 ERA (20 er in 74.0 ip) in 12 starts since then...struck out 10 batters in back-to-back starts on July 23 at Seattle and July 29 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the first A's pitcher with consecutive games of 10 or more strikeouts since Brandon McCarthy (Aug. 29-Sept. 3, 2011)...combined with Romo and Trivino on a three-hit shutout in the latter contest against the Angels, a 4-0 win...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...struck out 10 and logged a season-high 109 pitches...fin-

ished July with a 2-1 record, a 2.30 ERA and .204 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 40 in 31.1 innings and walked just nine while surrendering two home runs...his strikeouts ranked fifth in the AL and fifth in Oakland history in the month of July...also ranked seventh in the AL in ERA and opponents batting average, ninth in slugging percentage (.310) and 10th in OPS (.588)...struck out eight batters on Aug. 4th against San Diego, giving him 45 strikeouts over a five-start stretch from July 8-Aug. 4...those were the second most strikeouts by an A's pitcher over a five-game span over the last 35 years...only Todd Stottlemyre, with 46 from June 16-July 6, 1995, had more...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed two hits in back-to-back starts on Aug. 22 against San Francisco (ND) and Aug. 28 against New York-AL (W)...joins Bobby Witt (June 23-28, 1994) and Daniel Mengden (May 20-26, 2018) as the only pitchers in Athletics history with back-to-back starts of at least seven scoreless innings and two hits or fewer.

**LAST START:** He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-6 win at Detroit last Thursday...blanked the Tigers on a walk and a triple over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 18.0 innings...had an 8-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Castro in the fifth...yielded a two-run home run to Baddoo in the seventh and was relieved by Guerra with two outs in the sixth innings and the A's leading 8-3.

**MONTAS vs. CHICAGO:** Was the losing pitcher in his only career regular season appearance, a start and loss in a 5-2 decision at Chicago earlier this year on Aug. 16...the A's scored twice in the second and he blanked the White Sox on two walks over the first two innings...then allowed one run in the third, fourth and fifth innings on a Hernandez sacrifice fly, a Zavala RBI single and a Jimenez RBI single...also faced the White Sox in the 2020 American League Wild Card Series and was the winning pitcher in relief in Game 3 on Oct. 1 in Oakland, a 6-4 A's win...entered the game to start the fourth inning with the A's trailing 3-0...retired the side in order in the fourth and Oakland scored four times in the bottom of the fourth to take a 4-3 lead...he allowed the game-tying RBI single to Mazara in the fifth but the A's scored twice in the bottom of the fifth to take the lead for good...was relieved by Wendelken to start the sixth.

**TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER**  
**LHP Sean Manaea (8-9, 3.91 ERA):** Is 0-3 with an 8.00 ERA, .310 opponents batting average and nine home runs allowed over his last six starts...the losing streak is one short of his career high of four, which he established earlier this year from June 20 to July 7...is now 2-7 with a 5.00 ERA over his last 13 starts...is tied for second in the AL in games started (27), ranks fourth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.58), eighth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.16) and eighth in strikeouts (165)...has allowed a .171 batting average and .534 OPS against left-handed hitters compared to .276 with a .774 OPS against right-handers...had a no decision in his last start, an 11-10 A's loss at Toronto last Friday (7.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 9 so)...has faced the White Sox once in his career and it came in a start on June 22, 2018 in the first game of a doubleheader at Chicago...was the winning pitcher in the A's 11-2 victory (7.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 7 so).
