ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their four-game losing streak last night but have lost five of the seven games and 11 of the last 16...are in third place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by a six games...that is one short of the season high of seven (Sept. 7)...are in fifth place in the AL Wild Card, three games behind the second place team (New York)...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...held at least a share of first in the West for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 and spent 71 consecutive days in sole possession of second place from June 21 to Sept. 3...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 71 days in second, two days tied for second, seven days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 20-9 (.690) against American League Central teams, which is the second best record in the majors (New York, 20-8/.714)...are batting .253 (242-for-956) with an .802 OPS and an average of 5.4 runs per game (157 runs in 29 games) against teams from the Central compared to .232 with a .703 OPS and an average of 4.3 runs per game against all other teams...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 85-29 (.746) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .254 (251-for-990) with 149 runs scored over the last 29 contests (5.14 runs per game)...are batting .237 overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 83 times, which is the most in the AL, tied for fourth most in the majors and third most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019)...rank fourth in the AL in sacrifice flies (39) and fewest strikeouts (1171) and tied for fourth in doubles (238) and fewest grounded into double plays (87)...A's pinch hitters lead the American League in hits (28) and plate appearances (132), rank second in RBI (18) and tied for second in home runs (3).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 37-for-40 (92.3%) in stolen base attempts since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29...rank third in the majors in steals over that span...Marte has accounted for 21 of the 37 steals...are 80-for-94 (85.1%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 87.4%)...were successful in 89.7% of their stolen base attempts last year but the highest percentage in a full season in Athletics history is 80.7% in 2008...the 80 steals rank fourth in the American League and are the most by an A's team since 2014 (83)...had their streak of 21 consecutive stolen bases without a caught stealing snapped on Saturday, which fell one short of the Oakland record of 22.

PITCHING: The A's allowed one run last night after yielding at least six runs in each of the previous six games...have a 5.43 ERA (125 er in 207.0 ip) and have allowed 43 home runs in the last 24 games...overall, rank fifth in the American League in opponents OPS (.700) and slugging percentage (.395)...have the fewest walks (376), the second fewest pitches per inning (16.0), are tied for second in shutouts (11) and rank third in fewest home runs (160).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in 15 of the last 24 games and are 5-9 with a 5.23 ERA (69 er in 118.2 ip) and .285 (136-for-477) opponents batting average over that span...that includes 3-1 with a 1.93 ERA (7 er in 32.2 ip) in five starts by Frankie Montas and 2-8 with a 6.49 ERA (62 er in 86.0 ip) in 19 starts by everyone else...starters lead the majors with 779.1 innings pitched...the fewest innings pitched by a Major League leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 Mets...are 50-46 with a 3.86 ERA (334 er in 779.1 ip)...rank third in the American League in wins and fifth in opponents OPS (.708) and ERA...are tied for second in complete games (3).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 2-7 with three saves, seven blown saves and a 6.86 ERA (45 er in 59.0 ip) over the last 16 games...had just 11 losses over the first 123 games and now have 18 for the season, which is the fewest in the American League...have 24 blown saves, which is second most in the AL...ranks fourth in the AL in opponents OPS (.687) and fifth in ERA (3.97)...has the second highest slugging percentage (.428) and batting average (.251) against first batters faced...has the fourth highest percentage of inherited runners scored (37.3%).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's had their five-game errorless streak snapped last night and now have 59 errors for the season...that is second fewest in the majors to Houston (54)...are on pace for 69 errors, which would break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...have 11 outfield assists, which is tied with the Dodgers and Padres for the fewest in the majors...are tied for the fourth fewest double plays in the AL (103).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 19-24 (.442) in one-run games, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...lead the AL in one-run losses and rank second in one-run decisions (43)...are 29-36 (.446) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 46-28 (.622) in games decided by three runs or more...have a five-game winning streak in extra-inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with Seattle for the best record in the AL (Seattle, 14-6/.700)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are tied with Seattle for the most walk-off wins in the AL (10)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...are 16-11 in games decided in the last at bat.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on the penultimate homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Chicago-AL (1-1) and Texas (three games)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against San Francisco (1-2), Seattle (0-2) and New York-AL (2-2) and are 38-32 (.543) at home...went 2-4 on the last road trip to Detroit (2-1) and Toronto (0-3) and are 37-32 (.536) on the road...have the second lowest home batting average (.226) and OPS (.696) in the American League but the fourth best road OPS (.749) and batting average (.247).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Five of the A's last six wins have come in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 32-20 (.615) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 43-44 (.494) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to the White Sox (23-14/.622).

THIS AND THAT: After using a different lineup in 74 consecutive games, the A's lineup in each of the first two games against the White Sox has been a repeat from earlier this season...have used 134 different lineups in 139 games...have used the injured list 23 times this year and currently have six players on the IL (Bassitt, Brown, Fiers, Moreland, Piscotty, Rosenthal)...used it eight times last year and 17 times in 2019...the 23 players have combined to miss 658 games, an average of 28.6 games per stint...are 14-6 (.700) following a day off, which is the second best record in the majors (San Francisco, 16-4/.800)...will have next Monday off before finishing the season with 19 games in 20 days...have used just nine starting pitchers, which is tied for third fewest in the majors...are the only team with four pitchers with 25 or more starts

A's vs. WHITE SOX: The A's have lost the season series for the first time since 2016 as they are 2-4 entering the final game today...had gone 15-4 over the previous three season series...have split the first two games in Oakland after going 1-3 in Chicago...squared off in the American League Wild Card Series last year, with the A's winning two of three in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 319-294 against the White Sox...that breaks down to 168-139 in Oakland and 151-155 in Chicago...including 69-67 at Guaranteed Rate Field...all-time, the A's are 996-1049 against Chicago.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks second among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.469), third in on-base percentage (.225), fifth in slugging percentage (.244), sixth in ERA (1.67) and seventh in batting average (.166)...
Matt Chapman leads ML third basemen in fielding percentage (.987), total chances (397) and putouts (151), ranks second in double plays (37) and tied for third in assists (241)...his 151 putouts are the most by a ML third baseman since Ryan Zimmerman had 152 for Washington in 2006...
Starling Marte leads the majors in stolen bases (43), ranks fourth in batting average (.315), fifth in on-base percentage (.391) and eighth in batting with runners in scoring position (.346)...**Matt Olson** ranks fourth in the American League in OPS (.908), tied for fifth in extra base hits (64), tied for sixth in walks (70), seventh in on-base percentage (.369), eighth in slugging percentage (.538), tied for eighth in doubles and home runs (32) and ninth in runs (88) and RBI (91).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1945** Dick Fowler no-hits the St. Louis Browns, 1-0...in **1958** Preston Ward hits three consecutive home runs in Kansas City's 8-6 win against Baltimore...in **1985** Jose Canseco hits his first major league home run off the Rangers Jeff Russell in the A's 3-1 loss to Texas...in **1988** Luis Polonia becomes the third player in Oakland history to score five runs in a game in the A's 14-6 win at Kansas City...he is a perfect 5 for 5 on the day and also drives in three runs...in **1990** the A's defeat the New York Yankees 7-3 to complete a sweep of the season series, 12-0...in **1995** Stan Javier ties an Oakland record with a pair of triples in the A's 8-2 win at Chicago.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (8-9, 3.91 ERA)

THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-3 with an 8.00 ERA (24 er in 27.0 ip), .310 (36-for-116) opponents batting average and nine home runs allowed over his last six starts...the losing streak is one short of his career high of four, which he established earlier this year from June 20 to July 7...is now 2-7 with a 5.00 ERA (38 er in 68.1 ip) over his last 13 starts dating back to June 20 after going 6-2 with a 2.99 ERA over his first 14 starts...has allowed 15 home runs over his last 13 starts after yielding eight of his first 14.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fourth in the American League in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.58), tied for sixth in games started (27), eighth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.16) and ninth in strikeouts (165)...the 165 strikeouts are a career-high...is the only AL pitcher and one of four in the majors with two shutouts...is one of two AL pitchers with two complete games (Cole, NYY).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .171 (24-for-140) batting average and .534 OPS against left-handed hitters compared to .276 (123-for-445) with a .774 OPS against right-handers...his batting average and OPS against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Kikuchi, SEA .129/.434)...has issued 29 of his 36 walks to righties.

AUGUST AND SEPTEMBER: Had a no decision in his first start in September after allowing two runs in 7.0 innings (2.57 ERA)...went 0-3 with a 9.90 ERA and .344 opponents batting average in five starts in August...his August ERA was the highest by an Athletics pitcher in a month with 20 or more innings pitched since Carl Scheib posted a 9.99 ERA in July of 1947...tossed five innings or fewer in all five starts...is now 8-12 with a 6.01 ERA in 26 career starts in August...the losses are his most in any month and the ERA is his highest...is 10-3 with a 2.20 ERA (26 er in 106.1 ip) in 18 career starts in September...the ERA is his lowest for any month of the season and the wins are second only to his 11 in June.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Is 2-0 with a 3.60 ERA (8 er in 20.0 ip) in four starts against American League Central teams this year and now has a 10-game winning streak against the Central dating back to Aug. 23, 2016...has a 2.07 ERA (18 er in 78.1 ip) and .209 (60-for-287) opponents batting average during the streak, which spans 13 starts...his last loss came on July 5, 2016 at Minnesota...is 11-2 with a 2.64 ERA (28 er in 95.1 ip) in 16 career starts vs. AL Central teams.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest...is 5-6 with a 4.87 ERA (44 er in 81.1 ip) in 16 starts on five days rest or more compared to 3-2 with a 2.26 ERA (16 er in 63.2 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest...over the last three years, he is 10-7 with a 4.04 ERA (57 er in 127.0 ip) in 24 starts on five days rest or more compared to 9-3 with a 2.72 ERA (35 er in 115.2 ip) in 20 starts on four days rest.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed three home runs in two of his last four starts and has yielded eight home runs total over that span...never allowed more than two home runs in his first 119 starts...now has 23 home runs for the season, which is a career high (previous: 21 in 2018)...the A's are 7-3 in his no decisions and are 15-12 (.556) in his starting assignments...are 26-17 (.605) when he starts over the last three years...has allowed one run or fewer in 12 of his 27 starts but has received one run of support or fewer in 11 of his starts...is 0-7 with one run of support or fewer, 8-2 with two runs of support or more...has walked two batters or fewer 21 times, including eight starts with one walk and eight with no walks...has three games of 10 or more strikeouts this year and six in his career...the six 10-strikeout games are tied for seventh most in Oakland history.

CAREER NOTES: Is scheduled to make the 124th start of his career today, which are the most by an A's pitcher over the last 18 years...his 612 strikeouts are also the most by an A's pitcher over that span and his 47 wins match Trevor Cahill and Joe Blanton for the most...in the Wild Card era (1995-present), the only A's pitchers with more starts and wins are Barry Zito (224 starts, 102 wins), Tim Hudson (183, 92) and Mark Mulder (150, 81) and the only pitchers with more strikeouts are Zito (1098), Hudson (899), Mulder (668) and Rich Harden (614).

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start but then went 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA over his next four starts...tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the doubleheader April 20...it was the 11th complete game shutout of fewer than eight innings in Oakland history and his second career complete game and shutout...had 10 strikeouts on May 7 against Tampa Bay, but had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win...retired each of the first 18 batters he faced before walking Arozarena to start the seventh...allowed one run or fewer in five consecutive starts from May 23 to June 14 and went 3-0 with a 0.84 ERA over that span...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on May 23...left with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was the first of three times the pen blew the save in a game in which he was the pitcher of record (July 16 vs. Cleveland, Sept. 3 at Toronto)...fanned Taylor Ward to end the fourth inning for his 500th career strikeout...tossed a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at

Seattle on June 2...it was his third career complete game and shutout, his second this year...then combined with Petit, Trivino and Diekman on a two-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win on June 9 against Arizona...it was the second time in his career he did not allow a run in back-to-back starts (Sept. 14-20, 2016)...had a career-high 16.0-inning scoreless streak from June 2 to 14...struck out 11 batters in 5.1 innings June 20 at New York (AL) but was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss...the 11 strikeouts match the most in Athletics history by a pitcher with fewer than six innings pitched...went 2-for-2 with a double June 25 at San Francisco...it was the first extra base hit by an A's pitcher since Joe Kennedy doubled on June 12, 2007 at Houston...was named American League Pitcher of the Month for June after going 3-2 with a 1.13 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 34 batters in 32.0 innings and allowed just one home run...it was the second time he was named Pitcher of the Month (April, 2018)...struck out a career-high 13 batters in 7.0 innings in a 4-1 win at Seattle on July 22...matched the most strikeouts in Athletics history by a pitcher with seven innings or fewer and equaled the seventh highest single-game total in Oakland history...went 2-2 with a 3.30 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in five starts in July...struck out 41 and walked just five in 30.0 innings... the strikeouts tied for third in the American League in July and tied Mike Moore (1989) for the third highest total in July in Oakland history behind Vida Blue (55 in 1971, 42 in 1976).

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 11-10 loss at Toronto last Friday... had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Hernandez in the fourth inning...those were the only runs he would allow in seven innings of work and he left with an 8-2 lead...the pen allowed six runs in the eighth for the blown save, the A's scored twice in the ninth and the pen allowed three in the bottom of the ninth for another blown save and the loss.

RHP Paul Blackburn (0-2, 4.12 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas Aug. 18 and is 0-2 with a 4.12 ERA and .300 opponents batting average in four starts...is scheduled to make the 26th appearance and 23rd start of his career, which has spanned five seasons...has a 2.25 ERA in innings 1-3, a 7.04 ERA from the fourth inning on...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 10-8 A's loss at Toronto on Saturday (3.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 so)...is 0-1 with a 12.60 ERA (5.0 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 7 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, one start, against the Rangers...both outings came in Texas in 2019...was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA and .311 opponents batting average in 17 games, including 16 starts, with Las Vegas...surrendered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings, an average of 0.81 per nine innings...ranked second in the Triple-A West in innings pitched (88.2), tied for second in games started (16) and fifth in ERA and strikeouts (80) at the time of his Aug. 18 promotion to Oakland.
