OAKLAND ATHLETICS (76-64) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (51-88)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won two of three from the White Sox to start the homestand after being swept at Toronto in a three-game series last weekend...are 6-5 over the last 11 games but are 8-15 over the last 23...are tied for second in the American League West and trail first place Houston by 5½ games...are tied for fourth in the AL Wild Card and trail the Yankees for the second Wild Card spot by two games...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...held at least a share of first in the West for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 and spent 71 consecutive days in sole possession of second place from June 21 to Sept. 3...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 71 days in second, three days tied for second, seven days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .252 (257-for-1018) with 152 runs scored over the last 30 games (5.07 runs per game)...are batting .237 overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 83 times, which is the most in the AL, tied for fourth most in the majors and third most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019)...rank fourth in the AL in doubles (239), sacrifice flies (40) and fewest grounded into double plays (87) and tied for fourth in fewest strikeouts (1179)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (28) and plate appearances (132), rank second in RBI (18) and tied for second in home runs (3).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 38-for-42 (90.5%) in stolen base attempts since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29...rank third in the majors in steals over that span...Marte has accounted for 22 of the 38 steals...are 81-for-96 (84.4%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 87.4%)...were successful in 89.7% of their stolen base attempts last year but the highest percentage in a full season in Athletics history is 80.7% in 2008...the 81 steals rank fourth in the American League and are the most by an A's team since 2014 (83).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed one run in each of the last two games after yielding at least six runs in each of the previous six contests...now have a 6.75 ERA (51 er in 68.0 ip) in September, which is the highest in the majors...have allowed 15 home runs in eight games this month and 43 over the last 25 games...overall, rank fifth in the American League in opponents OPS (.699) and slugging percentage (.394)...have the fewest walks (377) and fewest pitches per inning (16.0), are tied for second in shutouts (11) and rank third in fewest home runs (160).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed seven innings in back-to-back games but have logged five innings or fewer in 15 of the last 25 contests...have a Major League leading 786.1 innings pitched for the season...the fewest innings pitched by a ML leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 Mets...starters are 6-9 with a 5.01 ERA (70 er in 125.2 ip) over the last 25 games, which includes 3-1 with a 1.93 ERA (7 er in 32.2 ip) in five starts by Frankie Montas and 3-8 with a 6.10 ERA (63 er in 93.0 ip) in 20 starts by everyone else...are 51-46 with a 3.83 ERA (335 er in 786.1 ip) overall...rank third in the American League in wins, fourth in opponents OPS (.707) and fifth in ERA...are tied for second in complete games (3).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 2-7 with four saves, seven blown saves and a 6.64 ERA (45 er in 61.0 ip) over the last 17 games...had just 11 losses over the first 123 games and now have 18 for the season, which is the fewest in the American League...have 24 blown saves, which is second most in the AL...ranks fourth in the AL in opponents OPS (.686) and fifth in ERA (3.95)...has the second highest slugging percentage (.426) and third highest batting average (.249) against first batters faced...has the fourth highest percentage of inherited runners scored (37.3%).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just five errors in the last 18 games and have 59 for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to Houston (54)...are on pace to break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...the errors have lead to 38 unearned runs, which is tied with the Pirates for the fewest in the majors...have 11 outfield assists, which is tied with the Dodgers and Padres for the fewest in the majors...have the fourth fewest double plays in the AL (104)...the fewest double plays in a full season in Oakland history is 112 in 2013.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 19-24 (.442) in one-run games, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...lead the AL in one-run losses and rank second in one-run decisions (43)...are 30-36 (.455) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 46-28 (.622) in games decided by three runs or more...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with Seattle for the best record in the AL (Seattle, 14-6/.700)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are

tied with Seattle for the most walk-off wins in the AL (10)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...are 16-11 in games decided in the last at bat.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on the penultimate homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Chicago-AL (2-1) and Texas (three games)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against San Francisco (1-2), Seattle (0-2) and New York-AL (2-2) and are 39-32 (.549) at home...leave following the game Sunday for a six-game road trip to Kansas City (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games) that begins on Tuesday...went 2-4 on the last road trip to Detroit (2-1) and Toronto (0-3) and are 37-32 (.536) on the road...have the second lowest home batting average (.225) and OPS (.694) in the American League but the fourth best road OPS (.749) and batting average (.247).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Five of the A's last seven wins have come in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 32-20 (.615) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 44-44 (.500) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to the Dodgers (27-14/.659).

PLAYERS USED: The A's have used 48 players this year (Miguel Romero would be number 49 and the 998th in Oakland history)...have employed just nine starting pitchers, which is tied for third fewest in the majors...are the only team with four pitchers with 25 or more starts...have used 19 relievers, which is third fewest, and 26 pitchers overall, which is fifth fewest...six different players have played shortstop, which is the most by an A's team since 1998 (also 6).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 23 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have five players on the IL (Bassitt, Fiers, Moreland, Piscotty, Rosenthal)...have missed just 664 games to IL placements, an average of 28.8 games per stint.

THIS AND THAT: After using a different lineup in 74 consecutive games, the A's lineup in each of the three games against the White Sox was a repeat from earlier this season...have used 134 different lineups in 140 games...are 14-6 (.700) following a day off, which is the second best record in the majors (San Francisco, 16-4/.800)...will have next Monday off before finishing the season with 19 games in 20 days

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series 9-7 and need one more win to clinch their fifth consecutive season series win over the Rangers...have never won five consecutive season series against the Rangers/Senators (previous: 4, 2002-05)...are 4-2 in Oakland and went 5-5 in Texas...are 53-30 (.639) against the Rangers over the last five years, including 29-9 (.763) in Oakland...are 394-383 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 207-178 in Oakland and 187-205 in Texas...are 9-8 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 491-465 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks second among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.474), fourth in on-base percentage (.226) and ERA (1.64), sixth in slugging percentage (.249) and seventh in batting average (.167)...**Matt Chapman** leads ML third basemen in fielding percentage (.988), total chances (400) and putouts (152), ranks second in double plays (37) and tied for third in assists (243)...his 152 putouts are the most by a ML third baseman since Ryan Zimmerman had 152 for Washington in 2006...**Starling Marte** stole his 22nd base in his 36th game with the A's yesterday after stealing 22 bases in 64 games with the Marlins...leads the majors with 43 stolen bases, which is three short of his career high of 47 in 2016...ranks fourth in the National League in steals and fifth in the American League...**Matt Olson** ranks fifth in the AL in OPS (.903) sixth in walks (71), tied for sixth in extra base hits (64), seventh in on-base percentage (.38), ninth in slugging percentage (.535), tied for eighth in doubles (32) and runs (89) and ninth in home runs (32) and RBI (91).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1948** Barney McCosky collects seven hits in a doubleheader sweep at Washington...he goes 4-for-4 in a 9-6 win in game one and collects three hits in four at bats in a 3-0 win in the night cap...in **1961** Dick Howser is a perfect 5-for-5 in the A's 13-1 win over Minnesota in the first game of a doubleheader...In **1976** Vida Blue strikes out Danny Thompson of Texas for his 1140th as an Athletic, breaking Catfish Hunter's Oakland record...he would go on to strike out 1315 batters in his A's career which is still an Oakland record...in **2019** the A's set an Oakland record for total bases in a game (46) and tie the record for hits in a nine-inning game (25) in a 21-7 win at Houston.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (0-2, 4.12 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas Aug. 18 and is 0-2 with a 4.12 ERA (9 er in 19.2 ip) and .300 (24-for-80) opponents batting average in four starts...is scheduled to make the 26th appearance and 23rd start of his career, which has spanned five seasons...began his career with 17 starts, pitched in relief in his final three outings of 2019 and his last five outings have been starts...was a non-roster invitee with Oakland this spring after being outrighted on Feb. 27 following the Mitch Moreland signing.

SIX-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-6 with a 8.27 ERA (34 er in 37.0 ip) and .343 (55-for-160) opponents batting average over his last 10 games, including seven starts, dating back to July 6, 2018...the six-game losing streak is a career high and the longest by an A's pitcher since Chris Bassitt had a nine-game losing streak from Aug. 21, 2015-June 22, 2018...his last win came on June 29, 2018 against Cleveland.

THIS AND THAT: Has a .277 (13-for-47) opponents batting average against right-handed hitters, .333 (11-for-33) against left-handers...has a 2.25 ERA (3 er in 12.0 ip) in innings 1-3, a 7.04 ERA (6 er in 7.2 ip) from the fourth inning on...is 0-0 with a 1.69 ERA (2 er in 10.2 ip) in two starts in Oakland, 0-2 with a 7.00 ERA (7 er in 9.0 ip) in two starts on the road.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss at Chicago (AL) on Aug. 18...allowed a RBI double to Jimenez in the first but then retired nine straight and Oakland tied the game with a run in the fourth...then allowed a RBI single to Robert in the fourth and was relieved by Romo with runners on first and second and one out in the sixth...Romo allowed one of those runs to score.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-3 loss to Seattle on Aug. 23 in Oakland...struck out a career-high tying five batters in 5.2 innings (also June 29, 2018 vs. Cleveland)...shut out the Mariners on three hits over the first five innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Haniger in the sixth...was relieved by Chafin with two outs in the sixth inning, the bases empty and the score tied 2-2.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-1 win over New York (AL) on Aug. 29 in Oakland...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings but allowed at least one base runner in each inning as he yielded five hits and a walk...only one base runner advanced as far as second base...was relieved by Petit to start the sixth inning with the A's leading 1-0...Diekman was charged with an unearned run in the seventh for the blown save.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-8 loss at Toronto last Saturday...allowed three home runs in a game for the first time in his career...surrendered solo home runs to Gurriel in the second and Jansen in the third, and a two-run home run to Valera in the fourth...was relieved by Jefferies with two outs in the fourth and the A's trailing 4-0.

BLACKBURN vs. TEXAS: Is 0-1 with a 12.60 ERA (5.0 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 7 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, one start...both outings came in Texas in 2019...the loss came in his start on

June 8, a 10-5 decision...allowed three runs in the first on a Mazara sacrifice fly and a Cabrera two-run single...also yielded a two-run home run to Mazara in the third...then pitched in relief later that year on Sept. 14 (2.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 so).

WITH LAS VEGAS: Was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA and .311 opponents batting average in 17 games, including 16 starts, with Las Vegas...the seven losses are his most as a minor leaguer and his opponents batting average is a career high...surrendered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings, an average of 0.81 per nine innings...ranked second in the Triple-A West in innings pitched (88.2), tied for second in games started (16) and fifth in ERA and strikeouts (80) at the time of his Aug. 18 promotion to Oakland.

LAS VEGAS OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .300 (61-for-203) against left-handed hitters and .323 (53-for-164)

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Cole Irvin (9-13, 4.10 ERA): Is 2-5 with a 6.10 ERA and .311 opponents batting average over his last eight starts...has walked 13 and struck out just 20 in 38.1 innings over that span and has pitched fewer than five innings four times...now has 13 losses for the season, which are third most in the American League and the most by an A's pitcher since Jesse Chavez had 15 in 2015...has walked 33 batters in 151.1 innings for an average of 1.96 per nine innings...that is the sixth lowest mark in the AL...is averaging 14.9 pitches per inning, which are second fewest in the majors...has yielded 17 home runs and his average of 1.01 home runs per nine innings is fifth lowest in the AL...has the 10th lowest opponents slugging percentage (.409)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 8-0 A's loss at Toronto last Sunday (2.1 ip, 8 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 so)...is 2-2 with a 4.50 ERA (22.0 ip, 22 h, 14 r, 11 er, 4 bb, 15 so, 1 hr) in four career starts against Texas, all this year.

against right-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs and issued 18 of his 27 walks to lefties...opponents hit .311 with the bases empty, .311 with runners on...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots...had a .296 opponents average and allowed one home run the first time through the order, .307 with three home runs the second time and .337 with four home runs after that.

LAS VEGAS THIS AND THAT: Went 2-3 with a 4.24 ERA, .287 opponents batting average and .737 OPS in nine starts at home, 2-4 with a 5.79 ERA, .333 opponent average and .867 OPS on the road...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his 17 appearances...the Aviators were 5-11 (.313) in his starting assignments.

LAS VEGAS HIGHLIGHTS: Issued a season-high three walks in his first start on May 9 against Sacramento, his first of four games with three walks...tossed a season-high 6.0 innings May 15 at Reno, his first of five outings of 6.0 innings...picked up his first win of the season May 27 against Sacramento in his only relief appearance of the season...relieved a rehabbing Jesús Luzardo in the second inning and allowed two runs on six hits in 4.2 innings...finished May with a 1-1 record and a 3.74 ERA in four games, three starts...logged a season-high 106 pitches on June 1 against Sacramento...picked up his second win June 7 against Albuquerque for his only winning streak of the season...allowed six runs in a season-low 4.0 innings but had a no decision in a 10-9 loss at Salt Lake on June 25...had a season-high three-game losing streak from July 12-31...posted a 7.08 ERA and .360 opponents batting average during that four-start streak...including July 18 against El Paso when he tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 12 hits in a 10-1 loss to Tacoma on July 31 and finished July 1-4 with a 6.23 ERA in six starts...struck out a season-high nine in 5.0 innings in his final Triple-A start on Aug. 13 against Tacoma but allowed four runs in and was the losing pitcher in a 4-3 loss.
