ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight after losing four in a row...are 7-5 over the last 12 games but are 9-15 over the last 24...are tied for fourth in the American League Wild Card race...are one game behind the second Wild Card (Yankees) and two games behind the first Wild Card (Red Sox)...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are tied for second in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 5½ games...held at least a share of first in the West for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 and spent 71 consecutive days in sole possession of second place from June 21 to Sept. 3...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 71 days in second, four days tied for second, seven days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's improved to 40-32 (.556) at home with the win last night and need one more win to clinch a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season and 10th time in the last 12 years...are 3-1 on the penultimate homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Chicago-AL (2-1) and Texas (1-0)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against San Francisco (1-2), Seattle (0-2) and New York-AL (2-2)...leave following the game Sunday for a six-game road trip to Kansas City (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games) that begins on Tuesday...went 2-4 on the last road trip to Detroit (2-1) and Toronto (0-3) and are 37-32 (.536) on the road...have the second lowest home batting average (.228) and third lowest OPS (.698) in the American League but the fourth best road OPS (.749) and batting average (.247).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Five of the A's last eight wins have come in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 32-20 (.615) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 45-44 (.506) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the majors to the Dodgers (27-14/.659).

OFFENSE: The A's had a season-high tying 16 hits last night (also Aug. 7 vs. Texas) and are now hitting .258 (273-for-1058) with 162 runs scored over the last 31 games (5.23 runs per game)...are batting .238 overall, which is fifth lowest in the American League...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 85 times, which is the most in the AL, fourth most in the majors and third most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019)...rank fourth in the AL in doubles (240), sacrifice flies (40) and fewest grounded into double plays (87) and fifth in fewest strikeouts (1191)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (28) and plate appearances (133), rank second in RBI (18) and tied for second in home runs (3).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 38-for-42 (90.5%) in stolen base attempts since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29...rank third in the majors in steals over that span...Marte has accounted for 22 of the 38 steals...are 81-for-96 (84.4%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 88.1%)...were successful in 89.7% of their stolen base attempts last year but the highest percentage in a full season in Athletics history is 80.7% in 2008...the 81 steals rank fourth in the American League and are the most by an A's team since 2014 (83).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed seven runs in the last three games after yielding at least six runs in each of the previous six contests...now have a 6.55 ERA (56 er in 77.0 ip) in September, which is the highest in the majors...have not allowed a home run in the last four games after yielding 33 over the previous 14 contests...overall, rank fourth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.393) and fifth in OPS (.698) and on-base percentage (.305)...have the fewest walks (380) and fewest pitches per inning (16.0), rank second in fewest home runs (160) and tied for second in shutouts (11).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in 16 of the last 26 games but have a Major League leading 789.0 innings pitched for the season...the fewest innings pitched by a ML leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 Mets...starters are 6-9 with a 5.19 ERA (74 er in 128.1 ip) over the last 26 games, which includes 3-1 with a 1.93 ERA (7 er in 32.2 ip) in five starts by Frankie Montas and 3-8 with a 6.30 ERA (67 er in 95.2 ip) in 21 starts by everyone else...are 51-46 with a 3.87 ERA (339 er in 789.0 ip) overall...rank third in the American League in wins, fourth in opponents OPS (.708) and fifth in ERA...are tied for second in complete games (3).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has allowed one run in the last three games (10.1 ip) but is 3-7 with four saves, seven blown saves and a 6.15 ERA (46 er in 67.1 ip) over the last 18 games...had just 11 losses over the first 123 games and now have 18 for the season, which is the fewest in the American League...have 24 blown saves, which is second most in the AL...ranks fourth in the AL in opponents OPS (.682) and fifth in ERA (3.92)...has the second highest slug-

ging percentage (.421) and third highest batting average (.246) against first batters faced...has the fifth highest percentage of inherited runners scored (37.0%) but the third fewest inherited runners (154).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just five errors in the last 19 games and have 59 for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to Houston (58)...are on pace to break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...the errors have lead to 38 unearned runs, which is tied with the Pirates for the fewest in the majors...have 11 outfield assists, which is tied with the Dodgers and Padres for the fewest in the majors...are tied for the fourth fewest double plays in the AL (104)...the fewest double plays in a full season in Oakland history is 112 in 2013.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 19-24 (.442) in one-run games, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...lead the AL in one-run losses and rank second in one-run decisions (43)...are 30-36 (.455) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 47-28 (.627) in games decided by three runs or more...have a five-game winning streak in extra-inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with Seattle for the best record in the AL (14-6, .700)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are tied with Seattle for the most walk-off wins in the AL (10)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...are 16-11 in games decided in the last at bat.

PLAYERS USED: The A's have used 48 players this year (Miguel Romero would be number 49 and the 998th in Oakland history), which is fifth fewest in the majors...have the third fewest relievers (19), are tied for the third fewest starters (9) and have the fifth fewest pitchers (26)...are the only team with four pitchers with 25 or more starts...six different players have played shortstop, which is the most by an A's team since 1998 (also 6).

THIS AND THAT: The A's used the same lineup in back-to-back games for the third time this year last night...after using a different lineup in 74 consecutive games, the A's lineup in each of the four games on the homestand has been a repeat from earlier this season...have used 134 different lineups in 141 games...have used the injured list 23 times this year...have missed just 669 games to IL placements, an average of 29.1 games per stint...are 14-6 (.700) following a day off, which is the second best record in the majors (San Francisco, 17-4/.810)...will have Monday off before finishing the season with 19 games in 20 days

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's have won the season series for the fifth consecutive season as they lead 10-7 with two games remaining...it is the first time the A's have won five consecutive season series from the Rangers/Senators...are 5-2 in Oakland and went 5-5 in Texas...are 54-30 (.643) against the Rangers over the last five years, including 30-9 (.769) in Oakland...are 395-383 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 208-178 in Oakland and 187-205 in Texas...are 9-8 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 492-465 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks second among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.474), third in on-base percentage (.226), fourth in ERA (1.64), sixth in slugging percentage (.249) and seventh in batting average (.167)...**Matt Chapman** leads ML third basemen in fielding percentage (.988), total chances (402) and putouts (152), ranks second in double plays (37) and tied for third in assists (245)...**Starling Marte** leads the majors in batting average (.321) and ranks fifth in on-base percentage (.392) and batting with runners in scoring position (.363)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.910), sixth in on-base percentage (.372) and RBI (95), seventh in walks (71), tied for seventh in extra base hits (64), eighth in slugging percentage (.538), ninth in runs (89) and doubles (32) and tied for ninth in home runs (32).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1912** Eddie Collins steals six bases in the A's 9-7 win over Detroit, an American League record that he would match 11 days later...in **1936** Hod Lisenbee ties a major league record by allowing 26 hits in a 17-2 loss to Chicago...in **1970** Vida Blue tosses his first career complete game, a 3-0, one-hit shutout at Kansas City...he would go on to compile 105 complete games and 28 shutouts in an A's uniform, both Oakland career records...in **1976** Mike Torrez tosses his club record third consecutive shutout, a six-hit, 1-0 win at Texas...the streak is part of a string of 38 1/3 consecutive scoreless innings...in **1999** Doug Jones records the final out of the A's 5-4 victory at Tampa Bay to become the 11th pitcher in major league history to record 300 saves...in **2006** Frank Thomas homers in his sixth consecutive game to set an Athletics record for consecutive games with a home run.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (9-13, 4.10 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 2-5 with a 6.10 ERA (26 er in 38.1 ip) and .311 (51-for-164) opponents batting average over his last eight starts...has walked 13 and struck out just 20 in 38.1 innings over that span and has pitched fewer than five innings four times...was 4-1 with a 2.54 ERA over his previous eight starts...now has 13 losses for the season, which are third most in the American League and the most by an A's pitcher since Jesse Chavez had 15 in 2015.

DON'T WALK: Has walked 33 batters in 151.1 innings for an average of 1.96 per nine innings...that is the sixth lowest mark in the American League...is averaging 14.9 pitches per inning, which are second fewest in the majors (Wainwright, STL 14.6)...has walked two batters or fewer in 26 of his 27 starts...began the season with a streak of 23 consecutive starts with two walks or fewer, which was the second longest streak by a starting pitcher in Oakland history to Gil Heredia, who had a 26-start streak from April 10-Aug. 28, 1999...the streak ended Aug. 19 at Chicago (AL) when he walked a career-high four batters...has walked just 47 batters in 196.2 career innings (2.15 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed five home runs in 7.0 innings over his last two starts after yielding three home runs in 63.1 innings over his previous 11 starts...has yielded 17 home runs for the season and his average of 1.01 home runs per nine innings is fifth lowest in the American League...has the 10th lowest opponents slugging percentage (.409)...12 of the 17 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has hit nine batters, which is tied for eighth most in the AL...opponents are hitting .333 (40-for-120) with runners in scoring position, which is second highest (Minor, KC .375).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 8-4 with a 2.75 ERA (29 er in 95.0 ip) in 16 starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-8 with a 6.23 ERA (36 er in 52.0 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest...ranks third in the American League in ERA on five days rest or more and tied for fifth in wins...is tied for the lead in most losses on four days rest and has the second highest ERA.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 3-10 with a 5.40 ERA (44 er in 73.1 ip) and .300 (91-for-303) opponents batting average in 14 starts against American League West competition, 6-3 with a 2.88 ERA (25 er in 78.0 ip) and .245 (73-for-298) opponents average in 13 starts against everyone else...his 10 intradivision losses are the most in the majors and one short of the Athletics record of 11 held by Brian Kingman (1980) and Rick Langford (1977 and 1979)...his 5.40 intradivision ERA is fifth highest in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 4-1 in his no decisions and are 13-14 (.481) in his starting assignments...is 9-2 in 14 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-10 in 13 starts with support of two runs or fewer.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and lost each of his first two starts, allowing four runs in each contest for a 7.45 ERA...went 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA over his first two starts on April 3 and 8, both against Houston...did not pitch again until April 17 against Detroit when he combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in a 7-0 win...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...that began a four-start stretch where he went 3-1 with a 1.42 ERA and .232 opponents batting average through May 4...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his start against the Tigers and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...lost on April 28 at Tampa Bay but then picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102) against the Blue Jays...then went 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA and .284 opponents batting average over his next five starts from May 9 to 30...the losing streak matched his career high (also May 22, 2019-April 8, 2021)...left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of four times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (June 11 vs. Kansas City, July 9 at Texas, Aug. 13 at Texas)...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings of work in a 4-3 loss to Seattle on May 25...went 1-4 with a 4.46 ERA in six starts in May...tied for second in the American League in losses in May...then compiled a 3-0 record and a 2.64 ERA in five starts in the month of June...the ERA was fourth lowest in the American League and the three-game winning streak was the longest of his career...allowed a run in the first inning on June 5 at Colorado and did not allow another run until the seventh inning of his next start on June 11 against Kansas City for a career-high tying 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and did not allow a run in a 6-2 win at San Francisco on June 27...did not allow a run over the first three innings of his next start on July 3 against Boston for another 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters (13th time, last: Bassitt, April 29, 2021 at Tampa Bay) in a 3-2 loss at Texas on July 9...finished July with a 1-3 record despite a 3.07 ERA and .227 opponents batting average...walked a career-high four batters but picked up the win in a 5-4 victory at Chicago (AL) on Aug. 19...finished August 2-2 in five starts but had a 4.91 ERA, which was his highest single-month ERA in

2021... allowed three home runs in a game for the first time in his career in a no decision at Detroit on Aug. 31...tossed 4.2 innings and did not qualify for the win in the A's 9-3 victory.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-0 loss at Toronto last Sunday...allowed a career-high tying seven runs (May 22, 2019 at Chicago-NL) in a career-low 2.1 innings...yielded a two-run triple to Gurriel and a Grichuk RBI double in the second inning...then surrendered a leadoff home run to Semien and a three-run home run to Kirk in the third inning.

Culberson and RBI singles by White and Garcia...then took the loss in a 3-2 decision on July 9 in Texas...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters...did not allow a hit over the first five innings and had a 2-0 lead when he yielded a RBI single to Ibanez in the sixth...was relieved by Romo who allowed two inherited runners to score for the blown save...defeated the Rangers 12-3 on Aug. 7 in Oakland...allowed a two-run home run to Garcia in the first inning but then shut out the Rangers on one hit and two walks over his final six innings of work...then took the loss in his next start, an 8-6 decision at Texas on Aug. 13...surrendered three runs in the first inning on an error, a RBI ground out and a Peters sacrifice fly...blanked the Rangers on four hits and a walk over the next four innings and had a 4-3 lead when the first two batters in the sixth inning reached base...was relieved by Romo, who allowed a three-run home run to Pozo for the blown save.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP James Kaprielian (7-4, 3.81 ERA): Was reinstated from the injured list on Aug. 8 and is 2-0 despite a 5.22 ERA in six starts since his return...was 5-4 with a 3.24 ERA in 13 starts when he was placed on the 10-day IL July 31 retroactive to July 28 with a right shoulder impingement...missed just one start and did not have a rehab assignment...is scheduled to make his 20th start tomorrow, which are the most by an A's rookie since Jharel Cotton had 24 in 2017...has held right-handed hitters to a .179 average and .557 OPS, compared to .276 with an .891 OPS against left-handers...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-3 A's loss to Chicago (AL) on Tuesday here in Oakland (4.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...is scheduled to make the 20th start of his career, his sixth against Texas...is 1-1 with a 3.81 ERA (28.1 ip, 26 h, 12 r, 12 er, 8 bb, 18 so, 5 hr) in five career starts against the Rangers, all this year...has left with the lead in three of the no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save.
