OAKLAND ATHLETICS (77-65) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (52-89)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their three-game winning streak snapped yesterday...are 7-6 over the last 13 game but are 9-16 over the last 25...are tied for fourth in the American League Wild Card race...are two games behind the second Wild Card (Yankees) and three games behind the first Wild Card (Red Sox)...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are tied for second in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 5½ games...held at least a share of first in the West for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 and spent 71 consecutive days in sole possession of second place from June 21 to Sept. 3...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 71 days in second, five days tied for second, seven days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's led 6-2 after seven innings yesterday but lost 8-6...it was the fifth time in the last 19 games the A's led after seven innings and lost...have eight losses when leading after seven innings this year, which is tied with the Mariners and Red Sox for the most in the American League...are now 30-37 (.448) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 47-28 (.627) in games decided by three runs or more...are 19-24 (.442) in one-run games, which is the fourth worst record in the AL...lead the AL in one-run losses and rank second in one-run decisions (43)...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with Seattle for the best record in the AL (14-6, .700)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are tied with Seattle for the most walk-off wins in the AL (10)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...are 16-11 in games decided in the last at bat.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 40-33 (.548) at home and need one more win to clinch a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season and 10th time in the last 12 years...are 3-2 on the penultimate homestand of the season, a six-game stand against Chicago-AL (2-1) and Texas (1-1)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against San Francisco (1-2), Seattle (0-2) and New York-AL (2-2)...leave following the game today for a six-game road trip to Kansas City (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games) that begins on Tuesday...went 2-4 on the last road trip to Detroit (2-1) and Toronto (0-3) and are 37-32 (.536) on the road...have the second lowest home batting average (.229) and third lowest OPS (.702) in the American League but the fourth best road OPS (.749) and batting average (.247).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Five of the A's last eight wins have come in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 32-21 (.604) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 45-44 (.506) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to the White Sox (23-15/.605).

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .258 (282-for-1092) with 168 runs scored over the last 32 games (5.25 runs per game)...are batting .238 overall, which is fifth lowest in the American League...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 85 times, which is the most in the AL, fourth most in the majors and third most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019)...rank fourth in the AL in doubles (243), sacrifice flies (41), fewest strikeouts (1196) and fewest grounded into double plays (88)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (29) and plate appearances (135), rank second in RBI (18) and tied for second in home runs (3).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 38-for-42 (90.5%) in stolen base attempts since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29...rank third in the majors in steals over that span...Marte has accounted for 22 of the 38 steals...are 81-for-96 (84.4%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 88.1%)...were successful in 89.7% of their stolen base attempts last year but the highest percentage in a full season in Athletics history is 80.7% in 2008...the 81 steals rank fourth in the American League and are the most by an A's team since 2014 (83).

PITCHING: The A's have a 6.70 ERA (64 er in 86.0 ip) in September, which is the highest in the majors...have allowed 18 home runs in 10 games in September and 36 over the last 19 games...overall, rank fifth in the American League in opponents OPS (.700), slugging percentage (.395) and on-base percentage (.305)...have the fewest walks (382) and fewest pitches per inning (16.0), are tied for second in shutouts (11) and rank third in fewest home runs (161).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in four of the last five games and are 2-0 with a 2.93 ERA (9 er in 27.2 ip) over that span...however, are 6-9 with a 5.05 ERA (76 er in 135.1 ip) over the last 27 games...are 51-46 with a 3.86 ERA (341 er in 796.0 ip) overall...lead the

majors with 796.0 innings pitched...the fewest innings pitched by a ML leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 Mets...rank third in the American League in wins, fourth in opponents OPS (.706) and fifth in ERA...are tied for second in complete games (3).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 3-8 with four saves, eight blown saves and a 6.75 ERA (52 er in 69.1 ip) over the last 19 games...had just 11 losses over the first 123 games and now has 19 for the season, which is tied with the Red Sox for the fewest in the American League...have 25 blown saves, which is second most in the AL...ranks fourth in the AL in opponents OPS (.689)...has the second highest slugging percentage (.438) and third highest batting average (.249) against first batters faced...has the fourth highest percentage of inherited runners scored (37.4%) and the third fewest inherited runners (155).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just one error in the last nine games and have 59 for the season, which is tied with the Astros for the fewest in the majors...are on pace to break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...the errors have lead to 38 unearned runs, which is tied with the Pirates for the fewest in the majors...have 11 outfield assists, which is tied with the Dodgers and Padres for the fewest in the majors...have the fourth fewest double plays in the AL (104)...the fewest double plays in a full season in Oakland history is 112 in 2013.

PLAYERS USED: The A's have used 48 players this year (Miguel Romero would be number 49 and the 998th in Oakland history), which is fifth fewest in the majors...have the third fewest relievers (19), are tied for the third fewest starters (9) and have the fifth fewest pitchers (26)...are the only team with four pitchers with 25 or more starts...six different players have played short-stop, which is the most by an A's team since 1998 (also 6).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have repeated a lineup four times on this homestand but have used 135 different lineups in 142 games this year...have used the injured list 23 times this year and currently have five players on the IL (Bassitt, Fiers, Moreland, Piscotty, Rosenthal)...have missed just 674 games to IL placements, an average of 29.3 games per stint...are 14-6 (.700) following a day off, which is the second best record in the majors (San Francisco, 17-4/.810)...will have Monday off before finishing the season with 19 games in 20 days.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's have won the season series for the fifth consecutive season as they lead 10-8 entering the final game today...it is the first time the A's have won five consecutive season series from the Rangers/Senators...are 5-3 in Oakland and went 5-5 in Texas...are 54-31 (.635) against the Rangers over the last five years, including 30-10 (.750) in Oakland...are 395-384 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 208-179 in Oakland and 187-205 in Texas...are 9-8 at Globe Life Field...have an all-time record of 492-466 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks third among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.493) and on-base percentage (.228), seventh in batting average (.171), eighth in ERA (1.78) and tied for ninth in slugging percentage (.265)...**Matt Chapman** leads ML third basemen in fielding percentage (.988), total chances (403) and putouts (152), ranks second in double plays (37) and fourth in assists (246)...**Starling Marte** is batting .342 (55-for-161) with 22 stolen bases and 16 multiple hit games in 38 games since he was acquired from Miami on July 28...the 55 hits are the most by a player in his first 38 games with the A's since Wally Moses had 56 in 1935...**Matt Olson** ranks fourth in the American League in OPS (.913), fifth in on-base percentage (.371), tied for fifth in extra base hits (65), tied for sixth in home runs (33), seventh in slugging percentage (.542), RBI (96) and walks (71) and ninth in runs (90) and doubles (32).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1964** Bob Meyer tosses a one-hitter but the A's lose to Baltimore 1-0 as the Orioles Frank Bertaina also tosses a one-hitter...in **1980** Rick Langford pitches his club record 22nd consecutive complete game in the A's 9-5 win against Kansas City...he would go on to pitch an Oakland record 28 complete games...in **1986** Terry Steinbach homers in his first major league at bat off the Indians Greg Swindell at Cleveland Stadium...he would also homer in his last at bat as an Oakland Athletic.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (7-4, 3.81 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the injured list on Aug. 8 and is 2-0 despite a 5.22 ERA (17 er in 29.1 ip) in six starts since his return...was 5-4 with a 3.24 ERA in 13 starts when he was placed on the 10-day IL July 31 retroactive to July 28 with a right shoulder impingement...missed just one start and did not have a rehab assignment...is scheduled to make his 20th start today, which are the most by an A's rookie since Jharel Cotton had 24 in 2017...began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and was recalled by the A's on May 12.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Is tied for sixth among American League rookies in wins (7), ranks seventh in strikeouts (103) and innings pitched (101.2) and eighth in games started (19)...based on a minimum of 0.5 innings per team game, his 3.81 ERA is sixth lowest in the AL among rookies...also ranks fifth in opponents batting average (.226) and seventh in on-base percentage (.303) and OPS (.723).

LEFT AND RIGHT: His opponents batting average breaks down to .179 (35-for-196) with a .557 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .276 (51-for-185) with an .891 OPS against left-handers...the batting average against right-handers is fourth lowest in the American League among pitchers with 100 or more innings and the OPS is sixth lowest...has issued 29 of his 39 walks and allowed 24 of his 38 extra base hits to lefties

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .194 (14-for-72) batting average with runners in scoring position...12 of the 17 home runs he has surrendered have been solo shots...opponents are 1-for-15 (.067) with two walks with the bases loaded...has a .178 (28-for-157) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .281 (41-for-146) the second time and .218 (17-for-78) after that...has allowed six of his 17 home runs to the opponents cleanup hitter but has held the five hitter to a .098 (4-for-41) batting average.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-2 with a 2.42 ERA (14 er in 52.0 ip) and .194 (37-for-191) opponents batting average in nine starts at home compared to 2-2 with a 5.26 ERA (29 er in 49.2 ip) and .258 (49-for-190) opponents average in 10 starts on the road...has allowed 11 of his 17 home runs on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 4-2 with a 2.17 ERA (11 er in 45.2 ip) and .190 (31-for-163) opponents batting average in eight starts during the day compared to 3-2 with a 5.14 ERA (32 er in 56.0 ip) and .252 (55-for-218) opponents batting average in 11 starts at night...has yielded 14 of his 17 home runs at night.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 4-3 with a 2.90 ERA and .200 opponents batting average in 11 starts before the All-Star Break...has gone 3-1 since then but has a 5.22 ERA (23 er in 39.2 ip) and .263 (41-for-156) opponents average in eight starts since then.

THIS AND THAT: Has a 2.13 ERA (9 er in 38.0 ip) and .188 (26-for-138) opponents batting average over the first two innings of a game, a 4.81 ERA (34 er in 63.2 ip) and .247 (60-for-243) opponents average from the third inning on...has allowed two runs or fewer in 12 of his 19 starts and five hits or fewer 15 times...has left with the lead and was the pitcher of record in four of his eight no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the A's are 10-9 (.526) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Began the year at Triple-A Las Vegas and went 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA in one start...was the Aviators Opening Day starter on May 6 at Las Vegas and was the losing pitcher in an 8-1 loss to Sacramento (4.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 0 hr, 76 pitches)...was recalled by Oakland on May 12 and made his first Major League start that day at Boston...allowed a run on four hits in 5.0 innings to earn his first ML win in the A's 4-1 victory over the Red Sox...would go 4-1 with a 2.84 ERA and .182 opponents batting average over his first seven starts through June 18...struck out nine batters in 5.2 innings in his second start on May 21 at Los Angeles (AL) but had a no decision in an 8-4 A's win...left with a 3-2 lead and two outs in the bottom of the sixth but Petit allowed a run for the blown save...it was the first of four starts in which he left with the lead and was the pitcher of record only to have the bullpen blow the save (June 23 at Texas, July 10 at Texas, Aug. 14 at Texas)...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings May 26 against Seattle for his second win...that matched his longest outing as a professional...also tossed 7.0 innings for Single-A Tampa at Charlotte on April 16, 2016, his second professional appearance...logged a season-low 3.2 innings May 31 at Seattle but had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss...was charged with the first loss of his career when he allowed two runs in 5.0 innings on June 6 at Colorado, a 3-1 A's loss...pitched 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits on June 12 to defeat Kansas City 11-2...walked a career-high four...tossed 105 pitches, which were his most as a professional, in a 5-4 loss to Texas on June 29...took the loss that day and went 0-2 despite a 3.00 ERA over his final three starts before the All-Star Break...struck out a career-high 10 batters in a career-high tying 7.0 innings on July 4 against Boston but was the losing pitcher in the A's 1-0 loss...it was the first 10-strikeout game by an A's rookie since Chris Bassitt on Aug. 9, 2015 against Houston (also 10)...issued a career-high tying four walks in 5.0 innings in a no decision at Texas on July 10...combined with Romo, Moll and Guerra on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Los Angeles (AL) on July 20 as part of a career-high 12.0-inning scoreless streak

from July 10 to 27...allowed a career-high six runs in 4.1 innings in a 7-4 loss at San Diego on July 27...it snapped a career-opening 14-game streak of 1.2 innings or more and six hits or fewer, which was the longest such streak in Athletics history...singled off Chris Paddock in the third inning for his first Major League hit...was placed on the 10-day injured list July 31 retroactive to July 28 with a right shoulder impingement...missed just one start, did not have a rehab assignment, and was reinstated from the IL on Aug. 8...allowed a career-high eight hits in 5.1 innings in a no decision in an 8-3 A's win at Texas on Aug. 14...did not walk or strikeout a batter to mark the 19th time in Oakland history a starting pitcher went at least five innings without a walk or strikeout (last: Dallas Braden, Aug. 25, 2008 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...issued a career-high tying four walks in 5.0 innings but picked up the win on Aug. 20 against San Francisco...allowed a career-high tying six runs in 5.0 innings on Aug. 26 against New York (AL) but had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss.

LAST START: He had his third straight no decision in an A's loss, a 6-3 decision to Chicago (AL) on Tuesday in Oakland...allowed just one run on five hits but tossed 92 pitches in 4.0 innings of work...the one run came on a bases loaded walk to Grandal in the first inning...stranded eight runners on base in his four innings.

KAPRIELIAN vs. TEXAS: Is scheduled to make the 20th start of his career, his sixth against Texas...is 1-1 with a 3.81 ERA (28.1 ip, 26 h, 12 r, 12 er, 8 bb, 18 so, 5 hr) in five career starts, all this year...has left with the lead in three of the no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save...the first no decision came in the A's 5-3 loss at Texas on June 23...allowing a RBI double to Heim in the fifth and a solo home run to Garcia in the sixth...left with a 3-2 lead but the bullpen blew the blown save...then took the loss in a 5-4 A's loss in Oakland on June 29...tossed 105 pitches, which were his most as a professional...allowed a two-out solo home run to Gallo in the fourth and two runs more in the sixth...had a no decision in the A's 8-4, 11-inning win at Texas on July 10...allowed back-to-back solo home runs to Garcia and Gallo in the first inning but left with a 3-2 lead before the bullpen blew the save...his win came in a 6-3 decision in Oakland on Aug. 8...allowed a RBI double to Lowe in the first and a Hernandez sacrifice fly in the sixth...had a no decision in the A's 8-3 win at Texas on Aug. 14...allowed a career-high eight hits in 5.1 innings...allowed a Lowe RBI double in the bottom of the first...left with a 3-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save.
