OAKLAND ATHLETICS (77-66) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (65-78)

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 14, 2021 — KAUFFMAN STADIUM — 7:10 CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight and six of the last nine games...are 7-7 over the last 14 games but are 9-17 over the last 26...are in fifth place in the American League Wild Card race...are 2½ games behind the second Wild Card (Yankees/Red Sox) and 3½ games behind the first Wild Card (Blue Jays)...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are in third place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by a season-high tying seven games (also Sept. 7)...held at least a share of first in the West for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 and spent 71 consecutive days in sole possession of second place from June 21 to Sept. 3...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 71 days in second, six days tied for second, eight days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 21-9 (.700) against American League Central teams, which is the second best record in the majors (New York, 21-8/.724)...this three-game series with the Royals is the A's last series against a non-division foe...close out the season with 16 games against AL West teams (three vs. Angels, seven vs. Mariners, six vs. Astros)...are batting .252 (248-for-984) with a .796 OPS and an average of 5.3 runs per game (160 runs in 30 games) against teams from the Central compared to .234 with a .706 OPS and an average of 4.3 runs per game against all other teams...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 85-29 (.746) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .256 (287-for-1122) with 171 runs scored over the last 33 games (5.18 runs per game)...are batting .238 overall, which is fifth lowest in the American League...hit .225 last year but the lowest batting average in a full season in Oakland history is .236 in 1982...have been hit by a pitch 85 times, which is the most in the AL, fourth most in the majors and third most in Oakland history (88 in 2001, 87 in 2019)...rank fourth in the AL in sacrifice flies (41) and fewest strikeouts (1198) and fifth in doubles (243) and fewest grounded into double plays (90)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (29) and plate appearances (137), rank second in RBI (18) and tied for second in home runs (3).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 39-for-43 (90.7%) in stolen base attempts since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29...rank third in the majors in steals over that span...Marte has accounted for 23 of the 39 steals...are 82-for-97 (84.5%) for the season, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Cleveland, 88.1%)...were successful in 89.7% of their stolen base attempts last year but the highest percentage in a full season in Athletics history is 80.7% in 2008...the 82 steals rank fourth in the American League and are the most by an A's team since 2014 (83).

PITCHING: The A's have a 6.44 ERA (68 er in 95.0 ip) in September, which is second highest in the majors (Orioles, 6.92)...have allowed 18 home runs in 11 games in September and 36 over the last 20 games...overall, rank fifth in the American League in opponents OPS (.701) and slugging percentage (.395)...have the fewest walks (384) and fewest pitches per inning (16.0), the second fewest home runs (163) and are tied for second in shutouts (11).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than five innings in seven of the last 12 games and are 3-3 with a 5.43 ERA (36 er in 59.2 ip) over that span...however, have 799.2 innings pitched for the season, which is the most in the majors...the fewest innings pitched by a ML leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 Mets...are 51-47 with a 3.88 ERA (345 er in 799.2 ip)...rank fourth in the American League in wins and opponents OPS (.709) and fifth in ERA...are tied for second in complete games (3).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 3-8 with four saves, eight blown saves and a 6.27 ERA (52 er in 74.2 ip) over the last 20 games...had just 11 losses over the first 123 games and now has 19 for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Brewers, 17)...has 25 blown saves, which is second most in the AL (Mariners, 29)...ranks fourth in the AL in opponents OPS (.686)...has the second highest slugging percentage (.434) and third highest batting average (.247) against first batters faced...has the fifth highest percentage of inherited runners scored (37.2%) and the third fewest inherited runners (156).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 61 errors, which is second fewest in the majors to the Astros (59)...are on pace to break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...the errors have lead to 38 unearned runs, which is tied with the Pirates for the fewest in the majors...have 11 outfield assists, which is tied with the Dodgers and Padres for the fewest in the majors...have the fourth fewest double plays in the AL (106).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 19-25 (.432) in one-run games, which is the third worst record in the American League...lead the

AL in one-run losses and are tied for second in one-run decisions (44)...are 30-38 (.441) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 47-28 (.627) in games decided by three runs or more...have eight losses when leading at the conclusion of seven innings of play (including five in the last 20 games), which is tied with the Mariners and Red Sox for the most in the AL...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is tied with the Mariners for the best record in the AL (14-6, .700)...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 16-11 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Mariners and Yankees for the most walk-off wins in the AL (10)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their penultimate road trip of the season tonight, a six-game trip to Kansas City (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 2-4 on the last road trip to Detroit (2-1) and Toronto (0-3) and are 37-32 (.536) on the road...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Chicago-AL (2-1) and Texas (1-1) and are 40-34 (.541 at home)...rank fourth in the American League in batting average (.247), OPS (.749) and runs scored on the road (341) and tied for fourth in home runs (98)...have the second lowest batting average at home (.228), third lowest OPS (.700), tied for the third fewest home runs (81) and tied for the fourth fewest runs (309).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Five of the A's last eight wins have come in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 32-22 (.593) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 45-44 (.506) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to the White Sox (23-15/.605).

PLAYERS USED: The A's have used 48 players this year (Miguel Romero would be number 49 and the 998th in Oakland history), which is fifth fewest in the majors...have the third fewest relievers (19), are tied for the third fewest starters (9) and have the fifth fewest pitchers (26)...are one of two teams with four pitchers with 25 or more starts (White Sox)...six different players have played shortstop, which is the most by an A's team since 1998 (also 6).

THIS AND THAT: The A's had their second to last day off of the season yesterday...are 14-6 (.700) following a day off, which is the second best record in the majors (San Francisco, 17-4/.810)...have used 135 different lineups in 143 games...have used the injured list 23 times and currently have five players on the IL (Bassitt, Fiers, Moreland, Piscotty, Rosenthal)...have missed just 679 games to IL placements, an average of 29.5 games per stint.

A's vs. ROYALS: The A's won three of four in Oakland in June to open the season series...are making their first trip to Kansas City since Aug. 29, 2019, a span of 747 days...need one more win to clinch their third consecutive season series win and fourth in the last five years...have won 22 of their last 30 games against the Royals and have out-scored Kansas City 183-97 over that span (6.1 runs per game to 3.2 runs)...have won 11 of the last 14 games in Kansas City...all-time, the A's are 330-268 (.552) against the Royals...the only American League team the A's have a better record against is Tampa Bay (.589)...are 180-120 in Oakland and 150-148 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks third among Major League relievers in opponents OPS (.493) and on-base percentage (.228), seventh in ERA (1.78) and eighth in slugging (.265) and batting average (.171)...**Matt Chapman** leads ML third basemen in fielding percentage (.988), total chances (403) and putouts (152), ranks second in double plays (37) and fourth in assists (246)...**Starling Marte** is batting .342 (57-for-165) with 23 stolen bases and 17 multiple hit games in 39 games since he was acquired from Miami on July 28...the 57 hits are the most by a player in his first 39 games with the A's since Bing Miller had 60 in 1922...**Matt Olson** hit his 19th home run off a left-handed pitcher on Sunday, which matches the most by a Major Leaguer over the last 19 years...the last with more is Barry Bonds, who hit 21 in 2002.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1929** the A's clinch the American League pennant with a 5-0 win over the Chicago White Sox...in **1990** Dave Stewart tosses a five-hitter in the A's 9-1 victory over Minnesota to win his 20th for the fourth consecutive season...he would go on to win 22 games and combined with Bob Welch to record 49 of the A's 103 victories...in **1995** Mark McGwire hits his 269th career home run off Kansas City's Mark Gubicza, breaking Reggie Jackson's Oakland career record for home runs...in **1996** Mark McGwire homers in the first inning of both games of a double header at Cleveland, his 49th and 50th of the season, breaking the Oakland record of 49 which he previously held.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (12-9, 3.57 ERA)

LAST FOUR STARTS: Is 3-0 with a 1.30 ERA (4 er in 27.2 ip) and .160 (15-for-94) opponents batting average over his last four starts...has allowed no runs twice and one run once...the three-game winning streak matches his season high (May 3-14).

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Is 4-2 with a 2.26 ERA (16 er in 63.2 ip) and .207 (46-for-222) opponents batting average in 10 starts since the All-Star Break...has struck out 76 and walked just 19 while yielding four home runs in 63.2 innings...has the second lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League since the break (.306), third lowest OPS (.577) and ERA, fourth most strikeouts and sixth lowest batting average and on-base percentage (.270)...was 8-7 with a 4.41 ERA, .258 opponents average, .737 OPS and 14 home runs in 18 starts before the break.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for second in the American League in games started (28), tied for third in wins (12) and innings pitched (163.2), ranks fourth in strikeouts (181), sixth in opponents slugging percentage (.383) and fewest home runs per nine innings (0.99), tied for sixth in ERA (3.57), seventh in OPS (.680), eighth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.85) and ninth in on-base percentage (.297) and batting average (.240)...his 181 strikeouts are the most by an A's pitcher since Sonny Gray had 183 in 2014...the last with more than Gray is Gio Gonzalez, who had 197 in 2011.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 8-4 with a 2.82 ERA (33 er in 105.1 ip) and .216 (83-for-385) opponents batting average in 17 starts on five days rest or more compared to 4-4 with a 4.04 ERA (25 er in 55.2 ip) and .265 (59-for-223) opponents average in 10 starts on four days rest.

SEVEN INNINGS OR FEWER: Has tossed seven innings or fewer in each of his 28 starts this year and now has a streak of 40 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to Sept. 25, 2019...that matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (Chris Bassitt, May 21, 2019-May 16, 2021)...last tossed more than seven innings on June 20, 2019 against Tampa Bay (8.0 ip).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .203 (45-for-222) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .260 (104-for-400) with 13 of his 18 home runs after that...has held the opponents three hitter to a .181 (13-for-72) average and the four hitter to a mark of .200 (15-for-75)...the mark against the three hitter is second lowest in the American League and his average against the four hitter is third lowest.

THIS AND THAT: Has career highs in all categories including wins (12), starts (28) and strikeouts (181)...has four games of 10 or more strikeouts this year, which is tied for the fourth most 10-strikeout games in a season in Oakland history...has seven in his career, which is tied for fifth in Oakland history...has received two runs of support or fewer in 15 of his 28 starts...has six no decisions this year, four of which have come in extra inning games...the A's have won three of his no decisions and are 15-13 (.536) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start on April 5 against Los Angeles (NL)...the loss extended his losing streak to a career-high three games dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...then picked up the win in each of his next two starts and allowed just one run on eight hits in 12.0 innings...won 7-3 at Houston on April 10 and then combined with Romo, Diekman and Wendelken on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 victory over Detroit on April 16...finished April 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts...then went 3-3 with a 3.18 ERA in six starts in May...the three wins matched his most ever in a month and he had 38 strikeouts, which tied for eighth in the American League...won each of his first three starts in May and posted a 3.12 ERA over that stretch from May 3-14...then went 0-3 with a 3.24 ERA over his next three starts from May 19-29...the losing streak matched his career high...struck out 11 batters in 6.0 innings in a 4-2 loss to Seattle on May 24...it was one of four games with 10 or more strikeouts (10, July 8 at Houston; 10, July 23 at Seattle; 10, July 29 at Los Angeles-AL) and the second highest single-game total of his career to his 13 against the Mariners in the final game of the 2020 season...now has seven career 10-strikeout games...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings June 15 against Los Angeles (AL) and allowed just two runs for the win...it was his first of five starts of 7.0 innings...then surrendered a season-high eight runs on a season-high tying nine hits in 5.2 innings at Texas on June 21 for the loss...is 5-2 with a 2.33 ERA (21 er in 81.0 ip) in 13 starts since then...struck out 10 batters in back-to-back starts on July 23 at Seattle and July 29 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the first A's pitcher with consecutive games of 10 or more strikeouts since Brandon McCarthy (Aug. 29-Sept. 3, 2011)...combined with Romo and Trivino on a three-hit shutout in the latter contest against the Angels, a 4-0 win...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...struck out 10 and logged a season-high 109 pitches...finished July with a 2-1 record, a 2.30 ERA and .204 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 40 in 31.1 innings and walked just nine while surrendering two home runs...his strikeouts ranked fifth in the AL and fifth in Oakland history

in the month of July...also ranked seventh in the AL in ERA and opponents batting average, ninth in slugging percentage (.310) and 10th in OPS (.588)...then went 1-1 with a 2.03 ERA and .212 opponents batting average in five starts in August...did not allow a home run in 31.0 innings, walked nine and struck out 35...the ERA was his lowest in a month with more than one game and ranked fifth in the AL in August...also ranked second in opponents slugging percentage (.240) and third in OPS (.512)...struck out eight batters on Aug. 4th against San Diego, giving him 45 strikeouts over a five-start stretch from July 8-Aug. 4...those were the second most strikeouts by an A's pitcher over a five-game span over the last 35 years...only Todd Stottlemyre, with 46 from June 16-July 6, 1995, had more...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed two hits in back-to-back starts on Aug. 22 against San Francisco (ND) and Aug. 28 against New York-AL (W)...joins Bobby Witt (June 23-28, 1994) and Daniel Mengden (May 20-26, 2018) as the only pitchers in Athletics history with back-to-back starts of at least seven scoreless innings and two hits or fewer...did not allow a run over his first four innings on Sept. 2 at Detroit to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 18.0 innings.

LAST START: He won his third consecutive start in the A's 5-1 win over Chicago (AL) last Wednesday in Oakland...blanked the White Sox on three hits over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the fifth inning...Garcia doubled and scored on a fielders choice and the A's built a 5-1 lead before Montas was relieved by Chafin to start the eighth.

LHP Sean Manaea (9-9, 3.79 ERA): Is 1-0 with a 1.93 ERA and .196 opponents batting average in two starts in September after going 0-3 with a 9.90 ERA and .344 opponents batting average in five starts in August...is tied for second in the American League in games started (28), ranks fourth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.70), eighth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.13) and strikeouts (174) and 10th in opponents OPS (.710) and on-base percentage (.298)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 A's win over Chicago (AL) last Thursday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 9 so)...is 1-0 with a 1.46 ERA (12.1 ip, 9 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 11 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, both starts, against Kansas City...the last came on June 10, 2018, a no decision in the A's 3-2 win (7.1 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 6 so)...is 3-0 with a 3.00 ERA in five starts against AL Central teams this year and now has an 11-game winning streak against the Central dating back to Aug. 23, 2016.
