## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (79-67) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (72-74)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won two straight and five of the last eight but are 11-18 dating back to Aug. 15...are 79-67 (.541) overall, which is the seventh best record in the American League but 10th best in the majors...are in fourth place in the AL Wild Card race...are three games behind the Blue Jays and Red Sox, who are in a virtual tie for the first Wild Card spot...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are in second place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by a season-high seven games for the fourth consecutive day...the A's tragic number for elimination in the AL West is 10...held at least a share of first in the West for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 and spent 71 consecutive days in sole possession of second place from June 21 to Sept. 3...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 73 days in second, six days tied for second, nine days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

**OFFENSE:** The A's went 35-for-109 (.321) with 26 runs scored in the three-game series at Kansas City to boost their overall batting average to a season-high .240...that is the highest the A's average has been since finishing the 2019 season with a .249 average...are now hitting .262 (322-for-1231) with 197 runs scored over the last 36 games dating back to Aug. 7 (5.47 runs per game)...rank fourth in the American League in runs scored over that span...overall, rank fourth in the AL in sacrifice flies (43) and fewest strikeouts (1215) and fifth in doubles (250) and walks (487)...have the fifth lowest batting average (.240)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (30) and plate appearances (141), rank second in RBI (19) and tied for second in home runs (3).

**OUCH:** The A's were hit by a pitch three times yesterday to bring their season total to 89...that breaks the Athletics single season record of 88 set in 2001...lead the American League and rank third in the majors in hit by pitches...over the last 13 years, the only AL team with more hit by pitches in a season is Tampa Bay (101 in 2018).

**ON THE BASES:** The A's have stolen 40 bases in 43 games since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29, which is third most in the majors...Marte has accounted for 23 of the 40 steals...are 83-for-100 (83.0%) for the season and rank second in the American League in stolen base percentage and fourth in steals...were successful in 89.7% of their stolen base attempts last year but the highest percentage in a full season in Athletics history is 80.7% in 2008...the 83 steals are the most by an A's team since 2014 (83)...last had more than 83 in 2012 (122).

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 6.69 ERA (90 er in 121.0 ip) in September, which is the highest in the majors (Orioles, 6.34)...have allowed 23 home runs in 14 games in September and 41 over the last 23 games...overall, rank fifth in the American League in opponents OPS (.706) and slugging percentage (.398)...have the fewest walks (395), the second fewest home runs (168) and the second fewest pitches per inning (16.1)...are tied for second in shutouts (11)...have 1,205 strikeouts, which is fourth most in Athletics history (1299 in 2019, 1244 in 2014, 1237 in 2018).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in 20 of the last 31 games and are 8-10 with a 5.38 ERA (91 er in 152.1 ip) and .297 (184-for-620) opponents batting average over that span...are 53-47 with a 3.94 ERA (356 er in 813.0 ip) overall...are tied for second in the American League in wins and rank fifth in ERA...lead the majors with 813.0 innings (Astros, 799.1)...the fewest innings pitched by a ML leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 Mets...are tied for second in the AL in complete games (3).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen is 3-9 with five saves, nine blown saves and a 6.48 ERA (63 er in 87.1 ip) over the last 23 games...had just 11 losses over the first 123 games and now has 20 for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and tied for second fewest in the majors (Brewers, 18)...has 26 blown saves, which is second most in the AL (Mariners, 30) and third most in Oakland history (30 in 2019, 28 in 2004)...has a save percentage of 58.1%, which is third lowest in the AL...ranks fifth in the AL in opponents OPS (.691)...has the second highest slugging percentage (.429) and fifth highest batting average (.244) against first batters faced...has the third fewest inherited runners (162).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed just three errors in the last 13 games and have 61 for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to the Astros (60)...are on pace to shatter the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...the errors have led to 38 unearned runs, which is tied with the Pirates for the fewest in the majors...have 12 outfield assists, which is tied with the Tigers for the fewest in the American League...it matches the 2003 A's for the fewest in Oakland history...have the fifth fewest double plays in the AL (109).

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 19-25 (.432) in one-run games, which is the third worst record in the American League...lead the AL in one-run losses and are tied for second in one-run decisions (44)...are 31-38 (.449) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 48-29 (.623) in games decided by three runs or more...have eight losses when leading at the conclusion of seven innings of play (including five in the last 23 games), which is tied with the Mariners and Red Sox for the most in the AL...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is the best record in the AL and third best in the majors...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 16-11 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Mariners and Yankees for the most walk-off wins in the AL (10)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 2-1 on the penultimate road trip of the season, a six-game trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 2-4 on the last road trip to Detroit (2-1) and Toronto (0-3) and are 39-33 (.542) on the road...need two more wins to clinch a winning record on the road...have finished .500 or better on the road in each of the previous three seasons and have not finished at least .500 on the road in four straight seasons since 1971-75 when they did it five straight years...return home following the game Sunday for the final homestand of the season, a seven-game stand against Seattle (four games) and Houston (three games)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Chicago-AL (2-1) and Texas (1-1) and are 40-34 (.541 at home)...rank third in the American League in OPS on the road (.753) and fourth in batting average (.250) and runs (367)...have the second lowest batting average (.228) at home, the third lowest OPS (.700) and the third fewest runs (309).

**PLAYERS USED:** The A's have used 48 players (Miguel Romero would be number 49 and the 998th in Oakland history), which is fifth fewest in the majors...have the third fewest relievers (19) and are tied for the third fewest starters (9) and pitchers (26)...are one of two teams with four pitchers with 25 or more starts (White Sox)...six different players have played shortstop, which is the most by an A's team since 1998 (also 6).

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 33-22 (.600) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 46-45 (.505) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to the White Sox (24-15/.615)...have used the injured list 23 times and currently have five players on the IL (Bassitt, Fiers, Moreland, Piscotty, Rosenthal)...have missed just 694 games to IL placements, an average of 30.2 games per stint...have used 139 different lineups in 146 games.

**A's vs. ANGELS:** The A's have won the season series for the third consecutive year as they are 12-4 with three games remaining...went 7-2 in Oakland and are 5-2 in Anaheim...the Oakland record for most wins against the Angels is 14 in 2001...the seven home wins match the A's most against the Angels and the Oakland record for most road wins against the Angels is seven (four times, last: 2012)...have a 2.22 ERA (35 er in 142.0 ip) and have outscored the Angels 75-39...have not finished with an ERA under 2.29 against the Angels since 1972 (2.11)...are 31-14 (.689) against the Angels over the last three years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 468-390 against the Angels...that includes 247-184 in Oakland and 221-206 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 517-467 against the Angels.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Andrew Chafin** ranks sixth among Major League relievers in ERA (1.86), ninth in opponents OPS (.515) and 10th in on-base percentage (.241)...**Matt Chapman** leads ML third basemen in fielding percentage (.988) and putouts (152), is tied for the lead in total chances (403) and ranks second in double plays (37)...**Starling Marte** leads the majors in batting (.321) and stolen bases (45) and ranks fourth in on-base percentage (.396)...is batting .343 (61-for-178) with 23 stolen bases in 42 games since he was acquired from Miami on July 28...the highest single season batting average in Oakland history by a player with at least 100 plate appearances is .350 by Catfish Hunter in 1971...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.917), fifth in slugging (.546), on-base percentage (.370) and extra base hits (68), tied for fifth in home runs (35), sixth in RBI (101), seventh in walks (74), eighth in runs (93) and tied for ninth in doubles (33).

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1972** Jim "Catfish" Hunter pitches a two hitter as the A's defeat Texas 4-1...it is Hunter's 20th victory, his second of four straight 20 win seasons with the A's...in **1973** Bill North sets a club record by drawing five walks in the A's 3-2, 13 inning win against California.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (9-13, 4.04 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is 2-5 with a 5.56 ERA (28 er in 45.1 ip) and .294 (57-for-194) opponents batting average over his last nine starts...has walked 14 and struck out just 28 in 45.1 innings over that span and has pitched fewer than five innings four times...was 4-1 with a 2.54 ERA over his previous eight starts...now has 13 losses for the season, which are third most in the American League and the most by an A's pitcher since Jesse Chavez had 15 in 2015.

**DON'T WALK:** Has walked 34 batters in 158.1 innings for an average of 1.93 per nine innings...that is the third lowest mark in the American League...is averaging 14.8 pitches per inning, which are second fewest in the majors (Wainwright, STL 14.6)...has walked two batters or fewer in 27 of his 28 starts...has walked just 48 batters in 203.2 career innings (2.12 per nine innings).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed five home runs in 14.0 innings over his last three starts after yielding three home runs in 63.1 innings over his previous 11 starts...has yielded 17 home runs for the season and his average of 0.97 home runs per nine innings is fourth lowest in the American League...has the eighth lowest opponents slugging percentage (.404)...12 of the 17 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...opponents are hitting .336 (41-for-122) with runners in scoring position, which is second highest (Minor, KC .375) and matches Joe Blanton (2008) for the highest in Oakland history.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 8-4 with a 2.74 ERA (31 er in 102.0 ip) in 17 starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-8 with a 6.23 ERA (36 er in 52.0 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest...ranks third in the American League in ERA on five days rest or more and tied for fifth in wins...is tied for the lead in most losses on four days rest and has the second highest ERA.

**THE WEST AND THE REST:** Is 3-10 with a 5.15 ERA (46 er in 80.1 ip) and .294 (97-for-330) opponents batting average in 15 starts against American League West competition, 6-3 with a 2.88 ERA (25 er in 78.0 ip) and .245 (73-for-298) opponents average in 13 starts against everyone else...his 10 intradivision losses are the most in the majors and one short of the Athletics record of 11 held by Brian Kingman (1980) and Rick Langford (1977 and 1979)...his 5.15 intradivision ERA is fifth highest in the majors.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 4-2 in his no decisions and are 13-15 (.464) in his starting assignments...the pen has blown a save in five of his starts...is 9-2 in 15 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-10 in 13 starts with support of two runs or fewer...has two wild pitches, which match the fewest in the American League among pitchers with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title.

**2021 HIGHLIGHTS:** Was on the A's Opening Day roster and lost each of his first two starts, allowing four runs in each contest for a 7.45 ERA...went 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA over his first two starts on April 3 and 8, both against Houston...did not pitch again until April 17 against Detroit when he combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in a 7-0 win...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...that began a four-start stretch where he went 3-1 with a 1.42 ERA and .232 opponents batting average through May 4...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his start against the Tigers and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...lost on April 28 at Tampa Bay but then picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto...had career highs in innings pitched (9), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102) against the Blue Jays...then went 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA and .284 opponents batting average over his next five starts from May 9 to 30...the losing streak matched his career high (also May 22, 2019-April 8, 2021)...left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of five times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (June 11 vs. Kansas City, July 9 at Texas, Aug. 13 at Texas, Sept. 11 vs. Texas)...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings of work in a 4-3 loss to Seattle on May 25...went 1-4 with a 4.46 ERA in six starts in May...tied for second in the American League in losses in May...then compiled a 3-0 record and a 2.64 ERA in five starts in the month of June...the ERA was fourth lowest in the American League and the three-game winning streak was the longest of his career...allowed a run in the first inning on June 5 at Colorado and did not allow another run until the seventh inning of his next start on June 11 against Kansas City for a career-high tying 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and did not allow a run in a 6-2 win at San Francisco on June 27...did not allow a run over the first three innings of his next start on July 3 against Boston for another 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters (13th time, last: Bassitt, April 29, 2021 at Tampa Bay) in a 3-2 loss at Texas on July 9...finished July with a 1-3 record despite a 3.07 ERA and .227 opponents batting average...walked a career-high four batters but picked up the win in a 5-4 victory at Chicago (AL) on Aug. 19...it snapped a season-opening streak of 23 consecutive starts with two walks or fewer, which was the second lon-

gest streak by a starting pitcher in Oakland history to Gil Heredia, who had a 26-start streak from April 10-Aug. 28, 1999...allowed three home runs in a game for the first time in his career in a no decision at Detroit on Aug. 31...tossed 4.2 innings and did not qualify for the win in the A's 9-3 victory...finished August 2-2 in five starts but had a 4.91 ERA, which was his highest single-month ERA in 2021...allowed a career-high tying seven runs (May 22, 2019 at Chicago-NL) in a career-low 2.1 innings in an 8-0 loss at Toronto on Sept. 5

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 8-6 loss to Texas last Saturday in Oakland...the A's scored single runs in each of the first three innings and he allowed two runs in the fourth on a Solak RBI double and a Pozo RBI single...those were the only runs he would allow in seven innings of work and he left with a 6-2 lead...then pen allowed five runs in the eighth for the blown save.

**IRVIN vs. LOS ANGELES:** Is 1-2 with a 3.24 ERA (25.0 ip, 27 h, 9 r, 9 er, 4 bb, 14 so, 2 hr) in four career starts, all this year...the first loss came in a 4-2 decision in Oakland on May 30...allowed four runs in the second inning on a leadoff home run by Walsh, a two-run double by Fletcher and an RBI single by Gosselin...retired each of the final nine batters and 14 of the last 15...then had a no decision in the A's 8-4 win in Oakland on June 16...allowed three runs in the first inning on RBI singles by Stassi, Ward and Gosselin, and one more run in the second on a solo home run by Ohtani...then retired 12 of the final 16 batters he faced...the win came in the A's 4-1 victory in Oakland on July 19...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed seven hits while walking one...Ohtani shut out the A's over the first six innings but Oakland scored three times off the Angels bullpen in the seventh...then took the loss in the A's 1-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on July 31...allowed his only run in 6.1 innings of work on an Ohtani RBI double in the third inning...the A's were shut out on six hits by Barria and three Angels relievers.

**TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER**  
**RHP Daulton Jefferies (1-0, 3.60 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his sixth appearance and second start of the season...his first start came during his first stint in early August...was recalled for the first time on Aug. 1 when James Kaprielian went on the injured list and started and picked up his first Major League win that day at Los Angeles-AL (5.0 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 3 so) in his only career appearance against the Angels...was optioned back to the Aviators on Aug. 8 when Kaprielian returned but was recalled a second time on Aug. 27...has a 2.70 ERA and .222 opponents batting average in four relief appearances since his return...went 5-1 with a 4.91 ERA in 15 games, all starts, with Las Vegas in his Triple-A debut...allowed a .288 opponents batting average but walked just 11 batters in 77.0 innings, an average 1.29 per nine innings...had a .316 opponents on-base percentage...struck out 68 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.18.
