OAKLAND ATHLETICS (81-67) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (72-76)

SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 19, 2021 — ANGEL STADIUM — 1:07 PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four straight and seven of the last 10 but are 13-18 dating back to Aug. 15...are 81-67 (.547) overall, which is the seventh best record in the American League but 10th best in the majors...are in fourth place in the AL Wild Card race...are two games behind the Blue Jays and three games behind the Red Sox, who currently hold the two Wild Card spots...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are in second place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by six games...the A's tragic number for elimination in the AL West is nine...held at least a share of first in the West for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 and spent 71 consecutive days in sole possession of second place from June 21 to Sept. 3...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 75 days in second, six days tied for second, nine days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

OFFENSE: The A's have gone 48-for-171 (.281) with 34 runs scored on the five games of this road trip to boost their overall batting average to .239, just shy of the season-high of .240...that is the highest the A's average has been since finishing the 2019 season with a .249 average...are now hitting .259 (335-for-1293) with 205 runs scored over the last 38 games dating back to Aug. 7 (5.46 runs per game)...rank fourth in the majors in runs scored over that span...overall, are tied for third in the AL in sacrifice flies (45), rank fourth in fewest strikeouts (1226) and fifth in doubles (253) and walks (499)...have the fifth lowest batting average (.239)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (30) and plate appearances (144), rank second in RBI (20) and tied for second in home runs (3).

OUCH: The A's have been hit by a pitch five times in the last three games to bring their season total to 91...that breaks the Athletics single season record of 88 set in 2001...lead the American League and rank third in the majors in hit by pitches...over the last 13 years, the only AL team with more hit by pitches in a season is Tampa Bay (101 in 2018).

ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen 41 bases in 45 games since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29, which is third most in the majors...Marte has accounted for 23 of the 41 steals...are 84-for-102 (82.4%) for the season and rank second in the American League in stolen base percentage and fourth in steals...were successful in 89.7% of their stolen base attempts last year but the highest percentage in a full season in Athletics history is 80.7% in 2008...the 84 steals are the most by an A's team since 2012 (122).

PITCHING: The A's have a 5.96 ERA (92 er in 139.0 ip) in September, which is the second highest in the majors (Orioles, 6.63)...have allowed 24 home runs in 16 games in September and 42 over the last 25 games...overall, rank fifth in the American League in opponents OPS (.705) and slugging percentage (.397)...have the fewest walks (397), the second fewest home runs (169) and the second fewest pitches per inning (16.1)...are tied for fourth in shutouts (11)...have 1,217 strikeouts, which is fourth most in Athletics history (1299 in 2019, 1244 in 2014, 1237 in 2018).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in 20 of the last 33 games and are 10-10 with a 5.04 ERA (92 er in 164.1 ip) and .292 (198-for-678) opponents batting average over that span...are 55-47 with a 3.91 ERA (358 er in 825.0 ip) overall...rank second in the American League in wins and rank fifth in ERA...lead the majors with 825.0 innings (Astros, 808.0)...the fewest innings pitched by a ML leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 Mets...are tied for second in the AL in complete games (3).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 3-9 with seven saves, nine blown saves and a 6.17 ERA (64 er in 93.1 ip) over the last 25 games...had just 11 losses over the first 123 games and now has 20 for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and tied for second fewest in the majors (Brewers, 18)...has 26 blown saves, which is second most in the AL (Mariners, 30) and third most in Oakland history (30 in 2019, 28 in 2004)...has a save percentage of 59.4%, which is fifth lowest in the AL...ranks fifth in the AL in opponents OPS (.691)...has the second highest lugging percentage (.427) and fifth highest batting average (.245) against first batters faced...has the third fewest inherited runners (162).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed three errors Friday night after having committing just three errors in their previous 14 games...have 64 for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to the Astros (61)...are on pace to shatter the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...the errors have led to 41 unearned runs, which is the second fewest in the majors...have 13 outfield assists, which is the second fewest in the American League

(Tigers, 12)...it is the second lowest mark in Oakland history, only more than the 2003 A's...have the fifth fewest double plays in the AL (110).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 20-25 (.444) in one-run games, which is the third worst record in the American League...lead the AL in one-run losses and rank for second in one-run decisions (45)...are 33-38 (.465) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 48-29 (.623) in games decided by three runs or more...have eight losses when leading at the conclusion of seven innings of play (including five in the last 24 games), which is tied with the Mariners and Red Sox for the most in the AL...have a five-game winning streak in extra inning games and are 7-3 (.700) overall, which is the best record in the AL and third best in the majors...are 13-4 (.765) in extra innings over the last two years...are 16-11 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Mariners and Yankees for the most walk-off wins in the AL (10)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on the penultimate road trip of the season, a six-game trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-0 + one game)...went 2-4 on the last road trip to Detroit (2-1) and Toronto (0-3) and are 39-33 (.542) on the road...with last night's win, clinched a winning record on the road...have finished .500 or better on the road in each of the previous three seasons and have not finished at least .500 on the road in four straight seasons since 1971-75 when they did it five straight years...return home following the game Sunday for the final homestand of the season, a seven-game stand against Seattle (four games) and Houston (three games)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Chicago-AL (2-1) and Texas (1-1) and are 40-34 (.541 at home)...rank third in the American League in OPS on the road (.751) and fourth in batting average (.249) and runs (375)...have the second lowest batting average (.228) at home, the third lowest OPS (.700) and the third fewest runs (309).

PLAYERS USED: The A's have used 48 players (Miguel Romero would be number 49 and the 998th in Oakland history), which is fifth fewest in the majors...have the third fewest relievers (19) and are tied for the third fewest starters (9) and pitchers (26)...are one of two teams with four pitchers with 25 or more starts (White Sox)...six different players have played shortstop, which is the most by an A's team since 1998 (also 6).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 35-22 (.614) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 46-45 (.505) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to the White Sox (25-15/.625)...have used the injured list 24 times and currently have six players on the IL (Bassitt, Fiers, Jefferies, Moreland, Piscotty, Rosenthal)...have missed just 705 games to IL placements, an average of 29.4 games per stint...have used 141 different lineups in 148 games.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's have won the season series for the third consecutive year as they are 14-4 with one game remaining...went 7-2 in Oakland and are 7-2 in Anaheim...have tied the Oakland record for most wins against the Angels (14 in 2001) and most road wins against the Angels (four times previous, last: 2012) with one game to play...the seven home wins match the A's most against the Angels...have a 2.08 ERA (37 er in 160.0 ip) and have outscored the Angels 83-44...have not finished with an ERA under 2.29 against the Angels since 1972 (2.11)...are 33-14 (.702) against the Angels over the last three years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 470-390 against the Angels...that includes 247-184 in Oakland and 223-206 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 519-467 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Tony Kemp has a .379 on-base percentage, which ranks fifth in the American League among players with 300 or more plate appearances...**Matt Olson** is hitting .336 (73-for-217) with 20 home runs and 51 RBI in 60 day games...ranks second in the majors in home runs and is tied for first in RBI in day games, second in OPS (1.121), third in slugging percentage (.687) and on-base percentage (.434) and fourth in batting.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1972** Dick Williams uses a club record 30 players and 10 pinch hitters in the A's 8-7, 15 inning loss to Chicago...in **1974** Reggie Jackson collects three hits, including the 1000th of his career, in a 4-3 loss at Kansas City...in **1988** Dave Stewart wins his 19th as the A's defeat the Minnesota Twins 5-3 to clinch their seventh AL West championship...in **2017** Matt Olson ties a Major League rookie record by homering in his fifth consecutive game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (12-9, 3.72 ERA)

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Is 4-2 with a 2.69 ERA (20 er in 67.0 ip) and .225 (54-for-240) opponents batting average in 11 starts since the All-Star Break...has struck out 80 and walked just 21 while yielding five home runs in 67.0 innings...has the fourth lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League since the break (.338), fifth lowest OPS (.625) and ERA, fifth most strikeouts, sixth lowest on-base percentage (.270) and eighth lowest batting average...was 8-7 with a 4.41 ERA, .258 opponents average, .737 OPS and 14 home runs in 18 starts before the break.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for second in the American League in games started (29), tied for fourth in wins (12) and innings pitched (167.0), ranks fifth in strikeouts (185), eighth in opponents slugging percentage (.392), seventh in fewest home runs per nine innings (1.02), 10th in ERA (3.72), OPS (.695), batting average (.245) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.78) and 11th in on-base percentage (.303).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .204 (47-for-230) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .265 (108-for-407) with 14 of his 19 home runs after that...has held the opponents three hitter to a .189 (14-for-74) average, which is second lowest in the American League to Chris Bassitt (.174).

SEVEN INNINGS OR FEWER: Has tossed seven innings or fewer in each of his 29 starts this year and now has a streak of 41 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer, topping back to Sept. 25, 2019...that is the longest such streak in Athletics history, topping the previous long of 41 by Chris Bassitt from May 21, 2019-May 16, 2021...last tossed more than seven innings on June 20, 2019 against Tampa Bay (8.0 ip).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 8-4 with a 3.06 ERA (37 er in 108.2 ip) and .226 (91-for-403) opponents batting average in 18 starts on five days rest or more compared to 4-4 with a 4.04 ERA (25 er in 55.2 ip) and .265 (59-for-223) opponents average in 10 starts on four days rest.

THIS AND THAT: Has career highs in all categories including wins (12), starts (29) and strikeouts (185)...has four games of 10 or more strikeouts this year, which is tied for the fourth most 10-strikeout games in a season in Oakland history...has seven in his career, which is tied for fifth in Oakland history...has six no decisions this year, four of which have come in extra inning games...the A's have won three of his no decisions and are 15-14 (.517) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start on April 5 against Los Angeles (NL)...the loss extended his losing streak to a career-high three games dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...then picked up the win in each of his next two starts and allowed just one run on eight hits in 12.0 innings...finished April 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts...then went 3-3 with a 3.18 ERA in six starts in May...the three wins matched his most ever in a month and he had 38 strikeouts, which tied for eighth in the American League...won each of his first three starts in May and posted a 3.12 ERA over that stretch from May 3-14...then went 0-3 with a 3.24 ERA over his next three starts from May 19-29...the losing streak matched his career high...struck out 11 batters in 6.0 innings in a 4-2 loss to Seattle on May 24...it was one of four games with 10 or more strikeouts (10, July 8 at Houston; 10, July 23 at Seattle; 10, July 29 at Los Angeles-AL) and the second highest single-game total of his career to his 13 against the Mariners in the final game of the 2020 season...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings June 15 against Los Angeles (AL) and allowed just two runs for the win...it was his first of five starts of 7.0 innings...struck out 10 batters in back-to-back starts on July 23 at Seattle and July 29 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the first A's pitcher with consecutive games of 10 or more strikeouts since Brandon McCarthy (Aug. 29-Sept. 3, 2011)...combined with Romo and Trivino on a three-hit shutout in the latter contest against the Angels, a 4-0 win...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...struck out 10 and logged a season-high 109 pitches...finished July with a 2-1 record, a 2.30 ERA and .204 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 40 in 31.1 innings and walked just nine while surrendering two home runs...his strikeouts ranked fifth in the AL and fifth in Oakland history in the month of July...then went 1-1 with a 2.03 ERA and .212 opponents batting average in five starts in August...did not allow a home run in 31.0 innings, walked nine and struck out 35...the ERA was his lowest in a month with more than one game and ranked fifth in the AL in August...also ranked second in opponents slugging percentage (.240) and third in OPS (.512)...struck out eight batters on Aug. 4th against San Diego, giving him 45 strikeouts over a five-start stretch from July 8-Aug. 4...those were the second most strikeouts by an A's pitcher over a five-game span over the last 35 years...only Todd Stottlemyre, with 46 from June 16-July 6, 1995, had more...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed two hits in back-to-back starts on Aug. 22 against San Francisco (ND) and Aug. 28 against New York-AL (W)...joins Bobby Witt (June 23-28, 1994) and Daniel Mengden (May 20-26, 2018) as the only pitchers in Athletics history with back-to-back starts of at least seven scoreless

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 10-7 loss at Kansas City last Tuesday...had a 6-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the third inning on a Merrifield RBI single, a Perez RBI single and a Mondesi RBI ground out in the third...also allowed a leadoff home run to Dozier in the fourth and was relieved by Guerra with one out in the fourth inning, runners on first and second and the A's leading 6-4.
