## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (82-67) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (80-69)

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 20, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Defeated the Angels yesterday to clinch a winning record for the fourth consecutive season...this is the first time the A's have finished with a winning record in four straight seasons since 1999-2006 when they did it eight straight years...swept the three-game series from Los Angeles (AL) and now have a five-game winning streak...have won eight of the last 11 games but are 14-18 dating back to Aug. 15...are 82-67 (.541) overall, which is the seventh best record in the American League but 10th best in the majors...are in fourth place in the AL Wild Card race and are two games behind the second Wild Card team, Toronto...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are in second place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by six games...the A's tragic number for elimination in the AL West is eight...held at least a share of first in the West for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 and spent 71 consecutive days in sole possession of second place from June 21 to Sept. 3...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 76 days in second, six days tied for second, nine days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

**AGAINST LEFTIES:** The A's faced a left-handed starting pitcher in three of the previous four games and are scheduled to face lefties in three of the four games against Seattle...have won seven of the last 10 games in which the opponent starts a lefty and are 35-22 (.614) for the season, which is the second best record in the American League to the White Sox (25-15, .625)...are 47-45 (.511) when the opponent starts a right-hander.

**EXTRA INNINGS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's extended their winning streak in extra inning games to six yesterday and are now 8-3 (.727) in extra innings games, which is the second best record in the majors to the Cardinals (7-2, .778)...are 14-4 (.778) in extra innings over the last two years...are 17-11 in games decided in the last at bat...are 21-25 (.457) in one-run games, which is the fifth worst record in the American League...lead the AL in one-run losses and the 46 one-run decisions are second most to the Mariners (49)...are 34-38 (.472) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 48-29 (.623) in games decided by three runs or more...have eight losses when leading at the conclusion of seven innings of play (including five in the last 26 games), which is tied with the Mariners and Red Sox for the most in the AL...are tied with the Mariners and Yankees for the most walk-off wins in the AL (10)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's begin the final homestand of the season tonight, a seven-game stand against Seattle (four games) and Houston (three games)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Chicago-AL (2-1) and Texas (1-1) and are 40-34 (.541) at home...need one more win to clinch a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season and 10th time in the last 12 years...went 5-1 on the last road trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0) and are 42-33 (.560) on the road, which is the second best road record in the American League to the Rays (45-30, .600)...have clinched a .500 record on the road for the fourth straight season, which is the second longest such streak by an A's team over the last 89 years (had five straight from 1971-75)...the A's have the second lowest batting average at home in the AL (.228), the third lowest OPS (.700) and third fewest runs scored (309)...have the third best OPS on the road (.750), the fourth best batting average (.249) and the fourth most runs scored (378).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are hitting .257 (342-for-1329) with 208 runs scored over the last 39 games dating back to Aug. 7 (5.33 runs per game)...rank fourth in the American League in runs scored over that span...overall, are tied for second in the AL in sacrifice flies (46), rank fourth in fewest strikeouts (1238) and fifth in doubles (255) and walks (505)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (30) and plate appearances (145), rank second in RBI (20) and tied for second in home runs (3).

**OUCH:** The A's have been hit by a pitch 92 times, which breaks the Athletics record of 88 set in 2001...the hit by pitches are tied with the 1996 Blue Jays for third most in American League history...the record is 103 by Cleveland in 2008 and the second highest is 101 by the Rays in 2018...rank third in the majors this year.

**ON THE BASES:** The A's have stolen 41 bases in 46 games since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29, which is third most in the majors...Marte has accounted for 23 of the 41 steals...are 84-for-102 (82.4%) for the season...rank second in the American League in stolen base percentage and fourth in steals...were successful in 89.7% of their stolen base attempts last year but the highest percentage in a full season in Athletics history is 80.7% in 2008...the 84 steals are the most by an A's team since 2012 (122).

**PITCHING:** The A's allowed just three earned runs in the three-game series at Los Angeles-AL (28.0 ip, 0.96 ERA) but have a 5.62 ERA (93 er in 149.0 ip) in September, which is second highest in the American League (Orioles, 6.75)...overall, rank fifth in the American League in opponents OPS (.703) and slugging percentage (.396)...have the fewest walks (401), the second fewest home runs (169) and the second fewest pitches per inning (16.0)...have 1,227 strikeouts, which is fourth most in Athletics history (1299 in 2019, 1244 in 2014, 1237 in 2018).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have not allowed a run in the last two games (13.0 ip) and are 6-1 with a 3.53 ERA (25 er in 63.2 ip) over the last 12 contests...are 55-47 with a 3.86 ERA (357 er in 832.0 ip) overall...are tied for second in the American League in wins, rank fourth in opponents OPS (.710) and fifth in ERA...have tossed five innings or fewer in 20 of the last 34 games but lead the majors with 832.0 innings pitched for the season (Astros, 812.0)...the fewest innings pitched by a ML leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 Mets...are tied for second in the AL in complete games (3).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen is 4-9 with seven saves, 10 blown saves and a 6.07 ERA (65 er in 96.1 ip) over the last 24 games...had just 11 losses over the first 123 games and now has 20 for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and tied for second fewest in the majors (Brewers, 18)...has 27 blown saves, which is second most in the AL (Mariners, 30) and third most in Oakland history (30 in 2019, 28 in 2004)...has a save percentage of 58.5%, which is second lowest in the AL...ranks fifth in the AL in opponents OPS (.690)...has the second highest slugging percentage (.429) and fifth highest batting average (.246) against first batters faced...has the third fewest inherited runners (163).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's committed four errors in the three-game series at Los Angeles (AL) but have just 65 for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to the Astros (60)...are on pace to break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...the errors have led to 42 unearned runs, which is tied with the Orioles for second fewest in the majors (Pirates, 39)...have 12 outfield assists, which is tied with the Tigers for the fewest in the American League...it matches the 2003 A's for the fewest in Oakland history...have the fifth fewest double plays in the AL (110).

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's have used the injured list 24 times and currently have six players on the IL (Bassitt, Fiers, Jefferies, Moreland, Piscotty, Rosenthal)...have missed just 713 games to IL placements, an average of 29.7 games per stint...have used 142 different lineups in 149 games...have used 48 players (Miguel Romero would be number 49 and the 998th in Oakland history), which is fifth fewest in the majors.

**A's vs. MARINERS:** The A's are 4-8 against the Mariners...are 1-4 in Oakland and 3-4 in Seattle...have lost each of the last five games and have dropped six of the last eight in Oakland...won each of the previous two season series but are 20-21 against Seattle over the last three years...are 66-89 (.426) dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the A's worst mark against any American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 370-313 against the Mariners...that includes 198-140 in Oakland, 171-170 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 95-106 at T-Mobile Park.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Andrew Chafin** ranks sixth among Major League relievers in ERA (1.83)...**Matt Chapman** leads ML third basemen in fielding percentage (.988), total chances (416) and putouts (156), ranks second in double plays (37) and tied for fourth in assists (255)...the putouts are the most by a ML third baseman since Tim Wallach had 162 for Montreal in 1984...**Starling Marte** leads the majors in stolen bases (45), ranks sixth in on-base percentage (.386) and seventh in batting average (.311)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.922), fourth in on-base percentage (.373), fifth in slugging percentage (.548), tied for fifth in extra base hits (69) and walks (78), sixth in home runs (36) and RBI (103) and eighth in runs (96)

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1902** the A's clinch their first American League Pennant...in **1975** Vida Blue wins 20 games for the third time in his career as he pitches eight innings in the A's 16-4 win at Kansas City...he would go on to win each of his final two starts to finish at 22-11...in **1991** Rickey Henderson walks for the 776<sup>th</sup> time in an A's uniform, breaking Sal Bando's Oakland career record...Henderson would finish his A's career with 1227 walks...in **2018** the A's defeated the Los Angeles Angels, 21-3...Marcus Semien has five RBI, Stephen Piscotty drives in four and eight players score two or more runs.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (10-9, 3.95 ERA)

**AUGUST AND SEPTEMBER:** Is 2-0 with a 3.79 ERA (8 er in 19.0 ip) and .260 (19-for-73) opponents batting average in three starts in September after going 0-3 with a 9.90 ERA and .344 opponents batting average in five starts in August...his August ERA was the highest by an Athletics pitcher in a month with 20 or more innings pitched since Carl Scheib posted a 9.99 ERA in July of 1947...tossed five innings or fewer in all five starts...is now 12-3 with a 2.43 ERA (32 er in 118.1 ip) in 20 career starts in September compared to 8-12 with a 6.01 ERA in 26 career starts in August...his September ERA is his lowest for any month and the wins are his most...his August losses are his most in any month and the ERA is his highest.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Ranks fourth in the American League in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.66), tied for fifth in games started (29), eighth in strikeouts (177) and fewest walks per nine innings (2.12) and 10th in opponents OPS (.720)...is the only AL pitcher and one of four in the majors with two shutouts...is one of two AL pitchers with two complete games (Cole, NYY).

**10-GAME WINNER:** Picked up his 10th win of the season in his last start, which is two short of his career high of 12 in 2017 and 2018...this is his third 10-win season and he joins Trevor Cahill as the only A's pitchers over the last 16 years with three 10-win seasons...has career highs in strikeouts (177), innings pitched (161.2) and home runs (24) and is scheduled to make his 30th start today, which will be a career high (had 29 in 2017).

**THE FIRST 14 AND THE LAST 15:** Was 6-2 with a 2.99 ERA over his first 14 starts through June 14 but is 4-7 with a 4.93 ERA (44 er in 80.1 ip) in 15 starts since then...allowed eight home runs over his first 14 starts, 16 since then...struck out 78 over his first 14 (8.63 per nine innings) but has 99 since then (11.09 per nine innings).

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** Has allowed a .185 (27-for-146) batting average and .553 OPS against left-handed hitters compared to .276 (134-for-486) with a .770 OPS against right-handers...his OPS against lefties is second lowest in the American League (Kikuchi, SEA .467) and the batting average is third lowest...has issued 31 of his 38 walks to righties.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 7-3 in his no decisions and are 17-12 (.586) in his starting assignments...are 28-17 (.622) when he starts over the last three years...has walked two batters or fewer 23 times, including 10 starts with one walk and eight with no walks...has three games of 10 or more strikeouts this year and six in his career...the six 10-strikeout games are tied for seventh most in Oakland history...has received one run of support or fewer in 11 of his starts...is 0-7 with one run of support or fewer, 10-2 with two runs of support or more

**CAREER NOTES:** Has 49 wins, 624 strikeouts and 125 starts in his career, all of which are the most by an A's pitcher over the last 18 years...in the Wild Card era (1995-present), the only A's pitchers with more wins, strikeouts are starts are Barry Zito (102 wins, 1098 strikeouts, 224 starts), Tim Hudson (92, 899, 183) and Mark Mulder (81, 668 and 150).

**2021 HIGHLIGHTS:** Lost his first start but then went 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA over his next four starts...tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the doubleheader April 20, his second career complete game and shutout...had 10 strikeouts on May 7 against Tampa Bay, but had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win...retired each of the first 18 batters he faced before walking Arozarena to start the seventh...allowed one run or fewer in five consecutive starts from May 23 to June 14 and went 3-0 with a 0.84 ERA over that span...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on May 23...left with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save... it was the first of three times the pen blew the save in a game in which he was the pitcher of record (July 16 vs. Cleveland, Sept. 3 at Toronto)...tossed a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Seattle on June 2...it was his third career complete game and shutout, his second this year...then combined with Petit, Trivino and Diekmann on a two-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win on June 9 against Arizona...it was the second time in his career he did not allow a run in back-to-back starts (Sept. 14-20, 2016)...had a career-high 16.0-inning scoreless streak from June 2 to 14...struck out 11 batters in 5.1 innings June 20 at New York (AL) but was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss...went 2-for-2 with a double June 25 at San Francisco...it was the first extra base hit by an A's pitcher since Joe Kennedy doubled on June 12, 2007 at Houston...was named American League Pitcher of the Month for June after going 3-2 with a 1.13 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 34 batters in 32.0 innings and allowed just one home run...it was the second time he was named Pitcher of the Month (April, 2018)...struck out a career-high 13 batters in 7.0 innings in a 4-1 win at Seattle on July 22, which equaled the seventh highest single-game strikeout total in Oakland history...went 2-2 with a 3.30 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in five starts in July...

struck out 41 and walked just five in 30.0 innings...the strikeouts tied for third in the American League in July and tied Mike Moore (1989) for the third highest total in July in Oakland history behind Vida Blue (55 in 1971, 42 in 1976).

**LAST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 12-10 win at Kansas City last Wednesday...allowed a RBI single to Benintendi in the first inning but took a 5-1 lead into the bottom of the fourth...allowed three runs in the fourth on a fielders choice and an Alberto four-run single...the A's scored three times in the fifth to increase their lead to 8-4 and he allowed a run in the bottom of the fifth on a Perez home run...was relieved by Trevino to start the sixth with an 8-5 lead.

**MANAEA vs. SEATTLE:** Is 8-5 with a 3.25 ERA (88.2 ip, 67 h, 34 r, 32 er, 26 bb, 76 so, 7 hr) in 14 career starts...is 3-0 with a 3.65 ERA (10 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland and has not started here against the Mariners since Aug. 13, 2018...is 5-5 with a 3.10 ERA (22 er in 64.0 ip) in 10 starts in Seattle...is 2-0 with a 0.56 ERA (16.0 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 21 so, 1 hr) in two starts this year...the first win was a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Seattle on June 2...did not allow a hit until Murphy singled to lead off the fifth...loaded the bases in the fifth inning, but that was the only time Seattle would get a runner in scoring position...also picked up the victory in a 4-1 win at Seattle on July 22...struck out a career-high 13 batters in 7.0 innings...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed his only run on a leadoff home run by Murphy in the seventh.
