## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (82-68) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (81-69)

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 21, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Had their five-game winning streak snapped last night...are 8-4 over the last 12 games but are 14-19 dating back to Aug. 15...are 82-68 (.547) overall, which is the seventh best record in the American League but 10th best in the majors...have clinched a winning record in four straight seasons for the first time since 1999-2006 when they did it eight straight years...are in fourth place in the AL Wild Card race and are two games behind the second Wild Card team, Toronto...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are in second place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by a season-high tying seven games...the A's tragic number for elimination in the AL West is six...held at least a share of first in the West for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 and spent 71 consecutive days in sole possession of second place from June 21 to Sept. 3...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 77 days in second, six days tied for second, nine days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

**AGAINST LEFTIES:** The A's have faced a left-handed starting pitcher in four of the previous five games and are scheduled to face lefties in two of the final three games against Seattle...have won seven of the last 11 games in which the opponent starts a lefty and are 35-23 (.603) for the season, which is the second best record in the American League to the White Sox (25-15, .625)...are 47-45 (.511) when the opponent starts a right-hander.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are hitting .256 (349-for-1361) with 210 runs scored over the last 40 games dating back to Aug. 7 (5.25 runs per game)...rank fifth in the American League in runs scored over that span...overall, lead the AL in hit by pitches (92), are tied for third in sacrifice flies (46), rank fourth in fewest strikeouts (1248) and fifth in doubles (257) and walks (506)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (30) and plate appearances (148), rank second in RBI (20) and tied for second in home runs (3).

**ON THE BASES:** The A's have stolen 41 bases in 47 games since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29, which is third most in the majors...Marte has accounted for 23 of the 41 steals...are 84-for-102 (82.4%) for the season...rank second in the American League in stolen base percentage and fourth in steals...were successful in 89.7% of their stolen base attempts last year but the highest percentage in a full season in Athletics history is 80.7% in 2008...the 84 steals are the most by an A's team since 2012 (122).

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 1.76 ERA (9 er in 46.0 ip) over the last five games but have a 5.53 ERA (97 er in 158.0 ip) in September, which is second highest in the American League (Orioles, 6.38)...overall, rank fifth in the AL in opponents OPS (.703) and slugging percentage (.396)...have the fewest walks (402), the second fewest home runs (169) and the second fewest pitches per inning (16.0)...have 1,232 strikeouts, which is fourth most in Athletics history (1299 in 2019, 1244 in 2014, 1237 in 2018).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in 21 of the last 35 games but lead the majors with 837.0 innings pitched for the season (Astros, 819.0)...the fewest innings pitched by a ML leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 Mets...are 6-2 with a 3.80 ERA (29 er in 68.2 ip) over the last 13 games and 55-48 with a 3.88 ERA (361 er in 837.0 ip) overall...are tied for second in the American League in wins, rank fourth in opponents OPS (.711) and fifth in ERA...are tied for second in complete games (3).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has allowed just three runs in the last five games (2 er in 17.0 ip, 1.06 ERA)...however, is 4-9 with seven saves, 10 blown saves and a 5.83 ERA (65 er in 100.1 ip) over the last 25 contests...had just 11 losses over the first 123 games and now has 20 for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and tied for second fewest in the majors (Brewers, 18)...has 27 blown saves, which is second most in the AL (Mariners, 30) and third most in Oakland history (30 in 2019, 28 in 2004)...has a save percentage of 58.5%, which is second lowest in the AL...ranks fifth in the AL in opponents OPS (.688)...has the second highest slugging percentage (.428) and fifth highest batting average (.246) against first batters faced...has the third fewest inherited runners (163).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed four errors in the last four games but have just 65 for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to the Astros (61)...are on pace to break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...the errors have led to 42 unearned runs, which is tied with the Orioles for second fewest in the majors (Pirates, 39)...have 14 outfield assists, which is second fewest in the American League...have the fifth fewest double plays in the AL (111).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-1 on the final homestand of the season, a seven-game stand against Seattle (0-1) and Houston (three games)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Chicago-AL (2-1) and Texas (1-1) and are 40-35 (.533) at home...need one more win to clinch a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season and 10th time in the last 12 years...went 5-1 on the last road trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0) and are 42-33 (.560) on the road, which is tied with the Astros for the second best road record in the American League (Rays, 45-30/.600)...have clinched a .500 record on the road for the fourth straight season, which is the second longest such streak by an A's team over the last 89 years (had five straight from 1971-75)...the A's have the second lowest batting average at home in the AL (.228), the third lowest OPS (.698) and third fewest runs scored (311)...have the third best OPS on the road (.750), the fourth best batting average (.249) and the fourth most runs scored (378).

**CLOSE CALLS:** Each of the A's last four games and seven of the last nine have been decided by two runs or fewer...are 34-39 (.466) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 48-29 (.623) in games decided by three runs or more...are 21-25 (.457) in one-run games, which is the fifth worst record in the American League...lead the AL in one-run losses and the 46 one-run decisions are second most to the Mariners (49)...have a six-game winning streak in extra innings and are 8-3 (.727) overall, which is the second best record in the majors to the Cardinals (7-2, .778)...are 14-4 (.778) in extra innings over the last two years...are 17-11 in games decided in the last at bat...have eight losses when leading at the conclusion of seven innings of play (including five in the last 27 games), which is tied with the Mariners and Red Sox for the most in the AL...are tied with the Mariners and Yankees for the most walk-off wins in the AL (10)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's have used the injured list 24 times and currently have six players on the IL (Bassitt, Fiers, Jefferies, Moreland, Piscotty, Rosenthal)...have missed just 719 games to IL placements, an average of 30.0 games per stint...excluding the shortened 2020 season, the averaged games missed will be the fewest by an A's team since 2002 (26.3)...have used 143 different lineups in 150 games...have used 48 players (Michael Felix would be number 49 and the 998th in Oakland history), which is tied for fourth fewest in the majors...have six pitchers with eight or more wins, which matches the most in Oakland history (1975, 1988, 2003)...have five pitchers with 100 or more strikeouts, which matches the most in Athletics history (sixth time, last: 2013).

**A's vs. MARINERS:** The A's are 4-9 against Seattle and with one more loss, will lose the season series for the seventh time in the last nine years...are 66-90 (.423) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the A's worst mark against any American League team over that span...are 1-5 in Oakland this year and 3-4 in Seattle...eight of the nine losses have been by two runs or fewer...have lost each of the last six games, which matches the third longest losing streak to the Mariners in Oakland history...have dropped seven of the last nine in Oakland...all-time, the A's are 370-314 against the Mariners...that includes 198-141 in Oakland, 171-170 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 95-106 at T-Mobile Park.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Andrew Chafin** ranks sixth among Major League relievers in ERA (1.83)...**Matt Chapman** leads ML third basemen in fielding percentage (.988), total chances (419) and putouts (157), ranks second in double plays (37) and fourth in assists (257)...the putouts are the most by a ML third baseman since Tim Wallach had 162 for Montreal in 1984...**Starling Marte** leads the majors in stolen bases (45), ranks sixth in on-base percentage (.385) and eighth in batting average (.311)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.915), fifth in on-base percentage (.371), tied for fifth in extra base hits (69) and walks (78), sixth in home runs (36) and RBI (103), seventh in slugging percentage (.544) and eighth in runs (96).

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1970** Vida Blue no hits the Minnesota Twins in the A's 5-0 win at the Coliseum...only a fourth inning, two out walk to Harmon Killebrew prevented Blue from tossing a perfect game...in **1992** Dennis Eckersley becomes the second pitcher in baseball history to record 50 saves when he preserves Ron Darling's 6-5 win at Chicago...he would go on to save a franchise record 51 games and win both the AL MVP and Cy Young awards...in **2019** Marcus Semien goes 3-for-3 with three walks in the A's 12-3 win over Texas to become the first Athletic with three hits and three walks in a game since Jimmie Foxx on July 13, 1935.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Paul Blackburn (1-2, 4.94 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas Aug. 18 went 0-1 with a 2.81 ERA and .250 opponents batting average in three starts in August... is 1-1 with a 7.94 ERA (10 er in 11.1 ip) and .389 (21-for-54) opponents average in three starts in September...was a non-roster invitee with Oakland this spring after being outrighted on Feb. 27 following the Mitch Moreland signing.

**SIX-GAME LOSING STREAK SNAPPED:** Picked up his first win since June 29, 2018 against Cleveland last Thursday at Kansas City...it snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to July 6, 2018...posted an 8.62 ERA and .351 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 11 games (including eight starts).

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss at Chicago (AL) on Aug. 18...allowed a RBI double to Jimenez in the first but then retired nine straight and Oakland tied the game with a run in the fourth...then allowed a RBI single to Robert in the fourth and was relieved by Romo with runners on first and second and one out in the sixth...Romo allowed one of those runs to score.

**SECOND START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-3 loss to Seattle on Aug. 23 in Oakland...struck out a career-high tying five batters in 5.2 innings (also June 29, 2018 vs. Cleveland)...shut out the Mariners on three hits over the first five innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Haniger in the sixth...was relieved by Chafin with two outs in the sixth inning, the bases empty and the score tied 2-2.

**THIRD START:** He had a no decision in the A's 3-1 win over New York (AL) on Aug. 29 in Oakland...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings but allowed at least one base runner in each inning as he yielded five hits and a walk...only one base runner advanced as far as second base...was relieved by Petit to start the sixth inning with the A's leading 1-0...Diekman was charged with an unearned run in the seventh for the blown save.

**FOURTH START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-8 loss at Toronto on Sept. 4...allowed three home runs in a game for the first time in his career...surrendered solo home runs to Gurriel in the second and Jansen in the third, and a two-run home run to Valera in the fourth...was relieved by Jefferies with two outs in the fourth and the A's trailing 4-0.

**FIFTH START:** He had a no decision in the A's 10-5 win over Texas on Sept. 10 in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Garcia in the first and the A's scored six times in the second to give him a 6-1 lead...yielded a two-run double to Lowe and a RBI single to Solak in the third and was relieved by Guerra with two outs in the third inning, a runner on first and the A's leading 6-4.

**LAST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 victory at Kansas City last Thursday...allowed a two-run home run to Perez in the first innings but those were the only runs he would allow in five innings of work...Oakland scored four times in the third inning and he was relieved by Guerra with no outs in the sixth inning and runners on first and second.

**BLACKBURN vs. SEATTLE:** Is 1-1 with a 5.74 ERA (15.2 ip, 18 h, 10 r, 10 er, 3 bb, 7 so, 2 hr) in three career appearances, all starts...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 5-3 A's loss in Oakland on Aug. 23...shut out the Mariners on three hits over the first five innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Haniger in the sixth...was relieved by Chafin with two outs in the sixth inning, the bases empty and the score tied 2-2...the loss came in his only start last year, a 12-3 A's loss in the second game of a Sept. 26, 2020 doubleheader against Seattle in Oakland where the A's were the visiting team...retired each of the first seven batters he faced before allowing seven of the Mariners eighth runs in the third inning...the win was his first Major League victory, a 7-4 A's win at Seattle on July 6, 2017...Oakland scored three times in the first inning and he allowed a hit in each of the first four innings...did not allow a run as he was aided by three double plays and a pickoff...allowed his only run in 7.2 innings of work in the fifth inning on a two-out solo home run by Haniger.

**WITH LAS VEGAS:** Was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA and .311 opponents batting average in 17 games, including 16 starts, with Las Vegas...the seven losses are his most as a minor leaguer and his opponents batting average is a career high...surrendered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings, an average of 0.81 per nine innings...ranked second in the Triple-A West in innings pitched (88.2), tied for second in games started (16) and fifth in ERA and strikeouts (80) at the time of his Aug. 18 promotion to Oakland.

**LAS VEGAS OPPONENTS BATTING:** His opponents batting average broke down to .300 (61-for-203) against left-handed hitters and .323 (53-for-164) against right-handers...yielded six of his eight home runs and issued 18 of his 27 walks to lefties...opponents hit .311 with the bases empty, .311 with runners on...six of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots...had a .296 opponents average and allowed one home run the first time through the order, .307 with three home runs the second time and .337 with four home runs after that.

**LAS VEGAS THIS AND THAT:** Went 2-3 with a 4.24 ERA, .287 opponents batting average and .737 OPS in nine starts at home, 2-4 with a 5.79 ERA, .333 opponent average and .867 OPS on the road...tossed six innings or fewer in each of his 17 appearances...the Aviators were 5-11 (.313) in his starting assignments.

**LAS VEGAS HIGHLIGHTS:** Issued a season-high three walks in his first start on May 9 against Sacramento, his first of four games with three walks...tossed a season-high 6.0 innings May 15 at Reno, his first of five outings of 6.0 innings...picked up his first win of the season May 27 against Sacramento in his only relief appearance of the season...relieved a rehabbing Jesús Luzardo in the second inning and allowed two runs on six hits in 4.2 innings...finished May with a 1-1 record and a 3.74 ERA in four games, three starts...logged a season-high 106 pitches on June 1 against Sacramento...picked up his second win June 7 against Albuquerque for his only winning streak of the season...allowed six runs in a season-low 4.0 innings but had a no decision in a 10-9 loss at Salt Lake on June 25...had a season-high three-game losing streak from July 12-31...posted a 7.08 ERA and .360 opponents batting average during that four-start streak...including July 18 against El Paso when he tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 12 hits in a 10-1 loss to Tacoma on July 31 and finished July 1-4 with a 6.23 ERA in six starts...struck out a season-high nine in 5.0 innings in his final Triple-A start on Aug. 13 against Tacoma but allowed four runs in and was the losing pitcher in a 4-3 loss.
