ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight after winning five in a row...are 8-5 over the last 13 games but are 14-20 dating back to Aug. 15...are 82-69 (.543) overall, which is tied for the seventh best record in the American League but tied for 10th best in the majors...have clinched a winning record in four straight seasons for the first time since 1999-2006 when they did it eight straight years...are tied for fourth place in the AL Wild Card race and are three games behind the second Wild Card team, Toronto...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are tied for second place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by a season-high eight games...the A's tragic number for elimination in the AL West is four...held at least a share of first in the West for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 and spent 71 consecutive days in sole possession of second place from June 21 to Sept. 3...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 77 days in second, seven days tied for second, nine days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored just 10 runs over the last four games and are 26-for-133 (.195) over that span...however, are hitting .255 (355-for-1394) with 212 runs scored over the last 41 games dating back to Aug. 7 (5.17 runs per game)...rank fifth in the majors in runs scored over that span...overall, lead the AL in hit by pitches (93), are tied for third in sacrifice flies (46), rank fourth in fewest strikeouts (1253) and fifth in doubles (259) and walks (508)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (31) and plate appearances (151), rank second in RBI (20) and tied for second in doubles (5), home runs (3) and extra base hits (8).

ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen 41 bases in 48 games since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29, which is third most in the majors...Marte has accounted for 23 of the 41 steals...are 84-for-102 (82.4%) for the season...rank second in the American League in stolen base percentage and fourth in steals...were successful in 89.7% of their stolen base attempts last year but the highest percentage in a full season in Athletics history is 80.7% in 2008...the 84 steals are the most by an A's team since 2012 (122).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.13 ERA (13 er in 55.0 ip) over the last six games but have a 5.44 ERA (101 er in 167.0 ip) in September, which is third highest in the American League...overall, rank fifth in the AL in opponents OPS (.704) and slugging percentage (.397)...have the fewest walks (404), the second fewest home runs (170) and the second fewest pitches per inning (16.0)...have 1,243 strikeouts, which is third most in Athletics history (1299 in 2019, 1244 in 2014).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in 22 of the last 36 games but lead the majors with 841.0 innings pitched for the season (Astros, 824.1)...the fewest innings pitched by a ML leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 Mets...are 55-49 with a 3.90 ERA (364 er in 841.0 ip) overall...are tied for second in the American League in wins and rank fifth in ERA and opponents OPS (.713)...are tied for second in complete games (3).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has allowed just four runs in the last six games (3 er in 22.0 ip, 1.23 ERA)...however, is 4-9 with seven saves, 10 blown saves and a 5.64 ERA (66 er in 105.1 ip) over the last 28 contests...had just 11 losses over the first 123 games and now has 20 for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and tied for second fewest in the majors (Brewers, 18)...has 27 blown saves, which is second most in the AL (Mariners, 30) and third most in Oakland history (30 in 2019, 28 in 2004)...has a save percentage of 58.5%, which is second lowest in the AL...ranks fifth in the AL in opponents OPS (.688)...has the second highest slugging percentage (.429) and fifth highest batting average (.246) against first batters faced...has the third fewest inherited runners (163).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last five games but have just 66 for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to the Astros (61)...are on pace to break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...the errors have led to 43 unearned runs, which is tied with the Orioles for second fewest in the majors (Pirates, 39)...have 14 out-field assists, which is second fewest in the American League...have the fifth fewest double plays in the AL (111).

AGAINST LEFTIES: The A's have faced a left-handed starting pitcher in five of the previous six games and are scheduled to face another lefty tomorrow...have won seven of the last 12 games in which the opponent starts a lefty and are 35-24 (.593) for the season, which is the second best record in the

American League to the White Sox (25-16, .610)...are 47-45 (.511) when the opponent starts a right-hander.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on the final homestand of the season, a seven-game stand against Seattle (0-2) and Houston (three games)...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Chicago-AL (2-1) and Texas (1-1) and are 40-36 (.526) at home...need one more win to clinch a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season and 10th time in the last 12 years...went 5-1 on the last road trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0) and are 42-33 (.560) on the road, which is the third best road record in the American League...the A's have the second lowest batting average at home in the AL (.227), the third lowest OPS (.697) and third fewest runs scored (313)...the home batting average is currently second lowest in Oakland history (.225 in 1979, .229 in 1982 and 2020)...have the third best OPS on the road (.750), the fourth best batting average (.249) and the fourth most runs scored (378).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 34-39 (.466) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 48-30 (.615) in games decided by three runs or more...are 21-25 (.457) in one-run games, which is the fifth worst record in the American League...lead the AL in one-run losses and the 46 one-run decisions are second most to the Mariners (49)...have a six-game winning streak in extra innings and are 8-3 (.727) overall, which is the second best record in the majors to the Cardinals (7-2, .778)...are 14-4 (.778) in extra innings over the last two years...are 17-11 in games decided in the last at bat...have eight losses when leading at the conclusion of seven innings of play (including five in the last 28 games), which is tied with the Mariners and Red Sox for the most in the AL...are tied with the Mariners and Yankees for the most walk-off wins in the AL (10)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have used the injured list 24 times and currently have six players on the IL (Bassitt, Fiers, Jefferies, Moreland, Piscotty, Rosenthal)...have missed just 725 games to IL placements, an average of 30.2 games per stint...excluding the shortened 2020 season, the averaged games missed will be the fewest by an A's team since 2002 (26.3)...have used 144 different lineups in 151 games...have used 48 players (Michael Felix would be number 49 and the 998th in Oakland history), which is tied for fourth fewest in the majors.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's have lost the season series for the seventh time in the last nine years as they are 4-10 with five games remaining...are 1-6 in Oakland and 3-4 in Seattle...eight of the 10 losses have been by two runs or fewer...have lost each of the last seven games, which is one short of the A's longest losing streak against the Mariners (8, July 9-Sept. 26, 2017)...have dropped eight of the last 10 games in Oakland...are 66-91 (.420) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the A's worst mark against any American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 370-315 against the Mariners...that includes 198-142 in Oakland, 171-170 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 95-106 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks sixth among Major League relievers in ERA (1.83)...**Matt Chapman** leads ML third basemen in fielding percentage (.988), total chances (422) and putouts (157), ranks second in double plays (37) and tied for fourth in assists (260)...the putouts are the most by a ML third baseman since Tim Wallach had 162 for Montreal in 1984...**Starling Marte** leads the majors in stolen bases (45) and ranks sixth in batting average (.313) and on-base percentage (.388)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.920), fifth in slugging percentage (.549) and extra base hits (70), tied for fifth in walks (79), sixth in home runs (37), RBI (103) and on-base percentage (.372) and eighth in runs (97).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1912** Eddie Collins steals six bases in a game for the second time in 11 days, an American League record that still stands today...in **1913** 19-year old Herb Pennock and Eddie Plank combine to blank Detroit 1-0 to clinch the AL pennant...in **1970** Joe Rudi has five hits in five at bats, including a pair of doubles, but the A's lose to Minnesota, 5-3...in **1989** Dave Stewart pitches seven innings in the A's 5-2 win at Minnesota to win his 20th game of the season and the 100th of his career...it is his third consecutive 20 win season with the A's...in **1996** Mark McGwire ties a major league record by homering twice in the 5th inning of the A's 13-11 win at Seattle...the second homer is a grand slam and his 52nd and final of the season.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (10-13, 3.94 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 3-5 with a 5.08 ERA (29 er in 51.1 ip) and .298 (64-for-215) opponents batting average over his last 10 starts...has walked 15 and struck out just 31 in 51.1 innings over that span and has pitched fewer than five innings four times...was 4-1 with a 2.54 ERA over his previous eight starts...now has 13 losses for the season, which are third most in the American League and the most by an A's pitcher since Jesse Chavez had 15 in 2015.

DON'T WALK: Has walked 35 batters in 164.1 innings for an average of 1.92 per nine innings...that is the second lowest mark in the American League...is averaging 14.8 pitches per inning, which are second fewest in the majors (Wainwright, STL 14.7)...has walked two batters or fewer in 28 of his 29 starts...has walked just 49 batters in 209.2 career innings (2.10 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed six home runs in 20.0 innings over his last four starts after yielding three home runs in 63.1 innings over his previous 11 starts...has yielded 18 home runs for the season and his average of 0.99 home runs per nine innings is fifth lowest in the American League...has the eighth lowest opponents slugging percentage (.406)...13 of the 18 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...opponents are hitting .328 (42-for-128) with runners in scoring position, which is second highest in the AL (Minor, KC .375).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-8 with a 6.23 ERA (36 er in 52.0 ip) in 10 starts on four days rest compared to 9-4 with a 2.67 ERA (32 er in 108.0 ip) in 18 starts on five days rest or more...is tied for the American League lead in most losses on four days rest and has the third highest ERA...is tied for second in wins on five days rest or more and ranks third in ERA.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 4-10 with a 4.90 ERA (47 er in 86.1 ip) and .294 (104-for-354) opponents batting average in 16 starts against American League West competition, 6-3 with a 2.88 ERA (25 er in 78.0 ip) and .245 (73-for-298) opponents average in 13 starts against everyone else...his 10 intradivision losses are the most in the majors and one short of the Athletics record of 11 held by Brian Kingman (1980) and Rick Langford (1977 and 1979)...his 4.90 intradivision ERA is fifth highest in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 4-2 in his no decisions and are 14-15 (.483) in his starting assignments...the pen has blown a save in five of his starts...is 10-2 in 16 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-11 in 13 starts with support of two runs or fewer...has two wild pitches, which match the fewest in the American League among pitchers with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and lost each of his first two starts, allowing four runs in each contest for a 7.45 ERA...went 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA over his first two starts on April 3 and 8, both against Houston...did not pitch again until April 17 against Detroit when he combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in a 7-0 win...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...that began a four-start stretch where he went 3-1 with a 1.42 ERA and .232 opponents batting average through May 4...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his start against the Tigers and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...lost on April 28 at Tampa Bay but then picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102) against the Blue Jays...then went 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA and .284 opponents batting average over his next five starts from May 9 to 30...the losing streak matched his career high (also May 22, 2019-April 8, 2021)...left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of five times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (June 11 vs. Kansas City, July 9 at Texas, Aug. 13 at Texas, Sept. 11 vs. Texas)...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings of work in a 4-3 loss to Seattle on May 25...went 1-4 with a 4.46 ERA in six starts in May...tied for second in the American League in losses in May...then compiled a 3-0 record and a 2.64 ERA in five starts in the month of June...the ERA was fourth lowest in the American League and the three-game winning streak was the longest of his career...allowed a run in the first inning on June 5 at Colorado and did not allow another run until the seventh inning of his next start on June 11 against Kansas City for a career-high tying 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and did not allow a run in a 6-2 win at San Francisco on June 27...did not allow a run over the first three innings of his next start on July 3 against Boston for another 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters (13th time, last: Bassitt, April 29, 2021 at Tampa Bay) in a 3-2 loss at Texas on July 9...finished July with a 1-3 record despite a 3.07 ERA and .227 opponents batting average...walked a career-high four batters but picked up the win in a 5-4 victory at Chicago (AL) on Aug. 19...it snapped a season-opening streak of 23 consecutive starts with two walks or fewer, which was the second longest streak by a starting pitcher in Oakland history to Gil Heredia, who had a 26-start streak from April 10-Aug. 28, 1999...allowed three home runs in a

game for the first time in his career in a no decision at Detroit on Aug. 31...tossed 4.2 innings and did not qualify for the win in the A's 9-3 victory...finished August 2-2 in five starts but had a 4.91 ERA, which was his highest single-month ERA in 2021...allowed a career-high tying seven runs (May 22, 2019 at Chicago-NL) in a career-low 2.1 innings in an 8-0 loss at Toronto on Sept. 5

LAST START: He picked up his 10th win of the season in the A's 5-4 win at Los Angeles (AL) last Friday...Oakland scored twice in the second but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the second...only one of the runs was earned, a Suzuki leadoff home run...the other three runs were unearned as the A's committed two errors...those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work and Oakland scored once in the third and twice in the sixth for the win.

IRVIN vs. SEATTLE: Is 0-3 with an 8.49

ERA (11.2 ip, 22 h, 11 r, 11 er, 4 bb, 5 so) in three career starts, all this year and all fewer than five innings...the first loss came in a 4-3 decision in Oakland on May 25...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings of work...yielded two runs in the first inning on RBI singles by France and Crawford...the A's tied the game with two runs in the second but he allowed two runs in the third on a RBI double by Murphy and a RBI single by Kelenic...was relieved by Smith with runners on first and second and two outs in the fifth and the A's trailing 4-2...also lost a 4-3 decision at Seattle on July 25...retired eight of the first nine batters and had a 2-0 lead with two outs and the bases empty in the third inning...the next six batters went single, walk, hit by pitch, two-run single, RBI single and RBI single...left after four innings with the A's trailing 4-2...then dropped a 5-1 decision in Oakland on Aug. 24...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed a RBI single to Kelenic in the second...then allowed a two-run single to Torrens in the third and left after allowing three runs on seven hits and two walks in 3.0 innings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Bassitt (12-4, 3.22 ERA): Will be reinstated from the 10-day injured list tomorrow and will be making his first start since Aug. 17 at Chicago (AL) when he was hit in the face by a Brian Goodwin line drive in the second inning...was placed on the IL Aug. 18 with a right facial fracture...had surgery on Aug. 24...when he was placed on the IL on Aug. 18, he was leading the American League in wins (12), innings pitched (151.0) and games started (25), ranked second in opponents OPS (.628), slugging percentage (.351) and winning percentage (.750), third in ERA (3.22), on-base percentage (.277) and batting average (.219) and sixth in strikeouts (154)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 9-0 A's loss at Chicago (AL) on Aug. 17 (1.0 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 so)...is 1-4 with a 4.26 ERA (57.0 ip, 52 h, 29 r, 27 er, 27 bb, 45 so, 5 hr) in 12 career appearances, including 10 starts, against Seattle...is 0-0 with an 8.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 11 h, 8 r, 8 er, 4 bb, 12 so, 3 hr) in two starts this year.
