OAKLAND ATHLETICS (82-70) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (83-69)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight after winning five in a row...are 8-6 over the last 14 games and 14-21 dating back to Aug. 15...are 82-70 (.539) overall and have clinched a winning record in four straight seasons for the first time since 1999-2006 when they did it eight straight years...are in fifth place in the AL Wild Card race and are 3½ games behind the second Wild Card team, New York...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are in third place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by a season-high nine games...held at least a share of first in the West for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 and spent 71 consecutive days in sole possession of second place from June 21 to Sept. 3...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 77 days in second, seven days tied for second, 10 days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

TRAGIC NUMBERS: The A's loss and the Houston win last night reduced the A's tragic number for elimination in the American League West to two games...have a tragic number of six to be eliminated in the AL Wild Card race (New York and Toronto still have a three-game series remaining with each other).

AGAINST LEFTIES: The A's have faced a left-handed starting pitcher in five of the previous seven games and are scheduled to face another lefty today...are 35-24 (.593) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second best record in the American League to the White Sox (25-16, .610)...are 47-46 (.505) when the opponent starts a right-hander.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored three runs or fewer in each of the last five games (11 runs total) and are batting .184 (30-for-163) over that span...however, are hitting .252 (359-for-1424) with 213 runs scored over the last 42 games dating back to Aug. 7 (5.07 runs per game)...rank sixth in the majors in runs scored over that span...overall, lead the AL in hit by pitches (93), are tied for third in sacrifice flies (46), rank fourth in fewest strikeouts (1262) and fifth in doubles (260) and walks (510)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (31) and plate appearances (151), rank second in RBI (20), tied for second in home runs (3) and extra base hits (8) and tied for third in doubles (5).

ON THE BASES: The A's have stolen 41 bases in 49 games since Starling Marte joined the club on July 29, which is third most in the majors...Marte has accounted for 23 of the 41 steals...are 84-for-102 (82.4%) for the season...rank second in the American League in stolen base percentage and fourth in steals...were successful in 89.7% of their stolen base attempts last year but the highest percentage in a full season in Athletics history is 80.7% in 2008...the 84 steals are the most by an A's team since 2012 (122).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.39 ERA (17 er in 64.0 ip) over the last seven games but have a 5.37 ERA (105 er in 176.0 ip) in September, which is third highest in the American League...overall, rank fifth in the AL in opponents OPS (.705) and slugging percentage (.397)...have the fewest walks (408), the second fewest home runs (172) and the second fewest pitches per inning (16.0)...have 1,251 strikeouts, which is second most in Athletics history to the record of 1,299 set in 2019.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in 23 of the last 37 games but lead the majors with 846.0 innings pitched for the season (Astros, 830.1)...the fewest innings pitched by a ML leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 Mets...are 55-50 with a 3.90 ERA (367 er in 846.0 ip) overall...rank third in the American League in wins and rank fifth in ERA...are tied for second in complete games (3).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has allowed just five runs in the last seven games (4 er in 26.0 ip, 1.38 ERA)...however, is 4-9 with seven saves, 10 blown saves and a 5.52 ERA (67 er in 109.1 ip) over the last 29 contests...had just 11 losses over the first 123 games and now has 20 for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and tied for second fewest in the majors (Brewers, 19)...has 27 blown saves, which is tied for second most in the AL (Mariners, 30) and is third most in Oakland history (30 in 2019, 28 in 2004)...has a save percentage of 58.5%, which is fourth lowest in the AL...ranks fourth in the AL in opponents OPS (.686)...has the second highest slugging percentage (.426) and fifth highest batting average (.246) against first batters faced...has the third fewest inherited runners (167).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last six games but have just 66 for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to the Astros (61)...are on pace to break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...the errors have led to 43 unearned runs, which is tied with the Orioles for second fewest in the majors (Pirates, 39)...have 14 outfield assists, which is second fewest in the American League...are tied for the fourth fewest double plays in the AL (111).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-3 on the final homestand of the season, a seven-game stand against Seattle (0-3) and Houston (three games)...now have a five-game home losing streak, which is one short of the season high of six (April 1-6 and Aug. 21-27)...are 5-12 over the last 17 home games and are 40-37 (.519) overall...need one more win to clinch a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season and 10th time in the last 12 years...went 5-1 on the last road trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0) and are 42-33 (.560) on the road, which is the third best road record in the American League...the A's have the second lowest batting average at home in the AL (.226), the third lowest OPS (.694) and third fewest runs scored (314)...the home batting average is currently second lowest in Oakland history (.225 in 1979, .229 in 1982 and 2020)...have the third best OPS on the road (.750), the fourth best batting average (.249) and the fourth most runs scored (378).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 34-39 (.466) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 48-31 (.608) in games decided by three runs or more...are 21-25 (.457) in one-run games, which is the fifth worst record in the American League...lead the AL in one-run losses and the 46 one-run decisions are second most to the Mariners (49)...have a six-game winning streak in extra innings and are 8-3 (.727) overall, which is the second best record in the majors to the Cardinals (7-2, .778)...are 14-4 (.778) in extra innings over the last two years...are 17-11 in games decided in the last at bat...have eight losses when leading at the conclusion of seven innings of play (including five in the last 29 games), which is tied with the Mariners and Red Sox for the most in the AL...are tied with the Mariners and Yankees for the most walk-off wins in the AL (10)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have used the injured list 24 times and currently have five players on the IL (Fiers, Jefferies, Moreland, Piscotty, Rosenthal)...have missed just 731 games to IL placements, an average of 30.5 games per stint...excluding the shortened 2020 season, the averaged games missed will be the fewest by an A's team since 2002 (26.3)...have used 145 different lineups in 152 games...last night, Michael Feliz became the 49th player to appear in a game for the A's this year and the 998th in Oakland history...the 49 players are tied for fifth fewest in the majors.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's have lost the season series for the seventh time in the last nine years as they are 4-11 with four games remaining...have lost each of the last eight games, which matches the A's longest losing streak against the Mariners (July 9-Sept. 26, 2017)...have dropped nine of the last 11 games in Oakland...have lost the first three games of this series, which is the 54th four-game series between the A's and the Mariners...Oakland has been swept in just one of the previous 53 (Aug. 12-15, 1991 at Seattle)...are 1-7 in Oakland this year and 3-4 in Seattle...the A's worst home record against the Mariners is 1-8 in 2007 and 2016...eight of the 11 losses this year have been by two runs or fewer...are 66-92 (.418) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the A's worst mark against any American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 370-316 against the Mariners...that includes 198-143 in Oakland, 171-170 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 95-106 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks sixth among Major League relievers in ERA (1.81)...**Matt Chapman** leads ML third basemen in fielding percentage (.988), total chances (424) and putouts (158), ranks second in double plays (37) and fourth in assists (261)...the putouts are the most by a ML third baseman since Tim Wallach had 162 for Montreal in 1984...**Starling Marte** leads the majors in stolen bases (45), ranks sixth in on-base percentage (.387) and seventh in batting average (.313)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.914), tied for fifth in extra base hits (70), sixth in slugging percentage (.544) and on-base percentage (.369), sixth in home runs (37) and RBI (103), tied for sixth in walks (79) and eighth in runs (97)

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1950** the A's score 12 runs in the sixth inning of a 16-5 win over Washington...Joe Astroth has a grand slam and six RBI in the inning...in **1973** Vida Blue wins his 20th as the A's win at Chicago 10-5 to clinch their third consecutive AL Western Division title...in **1988** Jose Canseco steals his 40th base of the season in the A's 9-8, 14-inning win at Milwaukee...he becomes the charter member of baseball's 40/40 club, hitting 42 home runs and stealing 40 bases...in **2001** Mark Mulder wins his 20th game and the A's clinch their first ever AL Wild Card with a 7-4 win at Seattle...in **2003** the A's clinch their third AL West title in four years and the 13th in Oakland history as they defeat Texas, 4-3 in 10 innings.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (12-4, 3.22 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 10-day injured list today and will be making his first start since Aug. 17 at Chicago (AL) when he was hit in the face by a Brian Goodwin line drive in the second inning...was placed on the IL Aug. 18 with a right facial fracture...had surgery on Aug. 24 to stabilize and plate the tripod fracture with good fixation and debride other small fractured bones from the incident...the surgery was performed by Dr. Peter Revenaugh at the Rush Medical Center in Chicago.

AT THE TIME OF THE INJURY...: When he was placed on the IL on Aug. 18, he was leading the American League in wins (12), innings pitched (151.0) and games started (25), ranked second in opponents OPS (.628), slugging percentage (.351) and winning percentage (.750), third in ERA (3.22), on-base percentage (.277) and batting average (.219) and sixth in strikeouts (154).

...AND NOW: Is currently tied for fifth in the AL in wins but his 151.0 innings pitched are 1.0 inning short of the qualifying for the league leaders...would need to pitch 11.0 more innings this year to qualify...based on a minimum of 150 innings, he is tied for the lead in winning percentage, ranks second in opponents OPS, slugging percentage and fewest pitches per inning (14.6), third in on-base percentage and fewest home runs per nine innings (0.89), fourth in ERA and batting average, fifth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.40) and seventh in walks per nine innings (2.09)...has hit 11 batters, which is tied for third most in the AL and two short of the Oakland record of 13...he also hit 13 batters in 2019, which tied the record set by Barry Zito (2001, 2005 and 2006).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-3 with a 2.55 ERA (19 er in 67.0 ip) in 10 starts at home compared to 8-1 with a 3.75 ERA (35 er in 84.0 ip) in 15 starts on the road...the one road loss came in his last start on Aug. 17 at Chicago (AL), which snapped an Oakland record-tying nine-game road winning streak dating back to Sept. 12, 2020...shares the mark with Bob Welch (Sept 21, 1989-June 30, 1990)...had a 3.34 ERA during the streak, which spanned 15 starts...has a 13-13 career record in the Coliseum, but has a 2.47 ERA (70 er in 255.1 ip), which is fifth lowest in Coliseum history among pitchers with 200 or more innings pitched.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .189 (23-for-122) batting average with runners in scoring position...has held left-handed hitters to a .196 (52-for-265) average...has allowed just four home runs in 296 at bats against right-handed hitters...has surrendered 11 of his 15 home runs this year and 29 of 42 over the last three years to lefties...10 of his 15 home runs have come with the bases empty...has a .143 opponents average with two strikes...has allowed a .174 (12-for-69) average to the opponents three hitter.

AMERICAN LEAGUE ALL-STAR: Was named to the American League All-Star Team for the first time on July 10 as a replacement...pitched the sixth inning in a 5-2 AL win (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 0 er, 2 bb, 1 so)...became the first A's starting pitcher to be named to the AL All-Star Team since Sonny Gray in 2015 and the first starter to pitch in the game since Scott Kazmir in 2014.

THIS AND THAT: Has career highs in wins (12), strikeouts (154) and innings pitched (151.0) and has matched his best in games started (25)...currently has the lowest opponents batting average (.219) and on-base percentage (.277) of his career...has 499 career strikeouts and needs one more for 500 career...has a 3.46 ERA (200 er in 519.2 ip) in 98 career appearances with the A's, which is the 10th lowest ERA in Oakland history (min. 500 ip)...the A's are 17-8 (.680) in his starting assignments...has left with the lead in three of his nine no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save (May 5 vs. Toronto, May 16 at Minnesota, June 19 at New York-AL)...has tossed at least seven innings in 11 of his 25 starts...has allowed two runs or fewer 17 times and six hits or fewer 22 times.

THE LAST THREE YEARS: Is 27-11 (.711) with a 3.27 ERA (130 er in 358.0 ip) in 64 games (61 starts) over the last three years...based on a minimum of 300 innings pitched, he ranks second in the American League in winning percentage over that span, fourth in ERA and fifth in opponents OPS (.662)...is eighth in wins...the A's are 40-21 (.656) in his starting assignments over the last three years...was 4-14 (.222) with a 3.86 ERA in 40 games (30 starts) over his first four seasons.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-0 loss at Chicago (AL) on Aug 17...tossed 1.0 inning, which was the shortest start of his career and

matched his shortest outing...retired the side in order in the first inning but then allowed singles to Jimenez and Moncada to start the second before he was struck by a Goodwin line drive...that loaded the bases and he was relieved by Smith who allowed all three runs to score.

BASSITT vs. SEATTLE: Is 1-4 with a 4.26 ERA (57.0 ip, 52 h, 29 r, 27 er, 27 bb, 45 so, 5 hr) in 12 career appearances, including 10 starts...is 1-2 with a 5.12 ERA (22 er in 38.2 ip) in nine games in Seattle and 0-2 with a 2.45 ERA (5 er in 18.1 ip) in three starts in Oakland...is 0-0 with an 8.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 11 h, 8 r, 8 er, 4 bb, 12 so, 3 hr) in two starts this year...the first no decision came in a 12-6 A's win at Seattle on June 1...had a 1-0 lead when he yielded three straight RBI doubles to Haniger, Seager and France in the third inning...also allowed a solo home run to Trammell in the fourth and was relieved by Luzardo to start the fifth with the A's trailing 4-2...also had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss at Seattle on July 21...allowed a RBI single to France in the first inning but Oakland scored three times in the third to take a 3-1 lead...he allowed a solo home run to Haniger in the bottom of the third and two-run home run to Haniger in the fifth...was relieved by Guerra to start the sixth with the A's trailing 4-3.

RHP Frankie Montas (12-9, 3.57 ERA): Is 4-2 with a 2.43 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in 12 starts since the All-Star Break after going 8-7 with a 4.41 ERA and .258 opponents average in 18 starts before the break...overall, is tied for the AL lead in games started (30), ranks third in innings pitched (174.0) and fewest home runs per nine innings (0.98), fourth in opponents slugging percentage (.382), tied for fourth in strikeouts (192), fifth in ERA (3.57) and OPS (.681), tied for fifth in wins (12), sixth in batting average (.239), eighth in on-base percentage (.299) and ninth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.62)...had a no decision in his last start, a 3-2 A's win in 10 innings at Los Angeles (AL) on Sunday (7.0 ip, 1 h, 4 bb, 7 so)...is 6-4 with a 3.75 ERA (57.2 ip, 61 h, 26 r, 24 er, 19 bb, 51 so, 7 hr) in 12 career appearances, including 10 starts, during the regular season against Houston...is 2-1 with a 2.04 ERA (17.2 ip, 18 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 21 so, 2 hr) in three starts this year.
