ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept by Seattle in a four-game series to start the homestand...it was the second time the A's were swept in a four-game series this year...the other was the season-opening four-game series against Houston, also in Oakland...it was just the fourth time the A's were swept in a series of any length this year...have now lost four straight after winning five in a row...started the year 0-6, went a Major League best 44-21 (.677) from April 7-June 18 (first game at New York-AL), and are 38-44 (.463) since then...are 82-71 (.536) overall and have clinched a winning record in four straight seasons for the first time since 1999-2006 when they did it eight straight years...are in fifth place in the AL Wild Card race and are four games behind the second Wild Card team, New York...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are in third place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by a season-high nine games for the second consecutive day...held at least a share of first in the West for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 and spent 71 consecutive days in sole possession of second place from June 21 to Sept. 3...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 77 days in second, seven days tied for second, 11 days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

TRAGIC NUMBERS: The A's loss yesterday reduced their tragic number for elimination in the American League West to one game...have a tragic number of five to be eliminated in the AL Wild Card race (New York and Toronto still have a three-game series remaining with each other).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .185 (36-for-195) with 16 runs scored over the last six games...are hitting .237 overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League and second lowest in Oakland history in a full season (.236 in 1982, .238 in 2012)...however, lead the AL with an Athletics record 93 hit by pitches and rank fifth with 517 walks...are in the middle of the pack in on-base percentage (7th, .317) and OPS (8th, .723)...are tied for second in the AL in sacrifice flies (47) and rank fourth in fewest strikeouts (1273).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters lead the American League in hits (32) and plate appearances (153), rank second in RBI (20) and extra base hits (9) and tied for second in doubles (6) and home runs (3)...the 32 hits are tied for second most by A's pinch hitters over the last 23 years (had 34 in 2015).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 85-for-103 (82.5%) in stolen base attempts...rank second in the American League in stolen base percentage (Cleveland, 85.8%) and fourth in steals...were successful in 89.7% of their stolen base attempts last year but the highest percentage in a full season in Athletics history is 80.7% in 2008...the 85 steals are the most by an A's team since 2012 (122).

PITCHING: The A's have a 5.40 ERA (111 er in 185.0 ip) in September, which is third highest in the American League...have the highest opponents OPS (.824), batting average (.285) and slugging percentage (.481)...overall, rank fifth in the AL in opponents OPS (.705) and slugging percentage (.398)...have the fewest walks (410), the second fewest pitches per inning (16.0) and are tied for the second fewest home runs (175)...have 1,263 strikeouts, which is second most in Athletics history to the record of 1,299 set in 2019.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in 24 of the last 38 games but lead the majors with 849.0 innings pitched for the season (Astros, 836.1)...the fewest innings pitched by a ML leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 Mets...are 55-50 with a 3.89 ERA (367 er in 849.0 ip) overall...are tied for third in the American League in wins and rank fifth in ERA and opponents OPS (.714)...are tied for second in complete games (3).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 4-10 with seven saves, 11 blown saves and a 5.70 ERA (73 er in 115.1 ip) over the last 30 games...had just 11 losses over the first 123 games and has 21 for the season, which is tied with Boston for the fewest in the American League...has 28 blown saves, which is second most in the AL (Mariners, 30) and tied for second most in Oakland history to the record of 30 in 2019...has a save percentage of 57.6%, which is third lowest in the AL...ranks fifth in the AL in opponents OPS (.690)...has the second highest slugging percentage (.432) and fifth highest batting average (.246) against first batters faced...has the third fewest inherited runners (167).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last seven games but have just 66 for the season, which is second fewest in the majors to the Astros (62)...are on pace to break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...the errors have led to 43 unearned runs, which is tied with the Orioles for second fewest in the majors (Pirates, 39)...have 14 outfield assists, which is second fewest in the American League (Tigers, 13)...have the fourth fewest double plays in the AL (111).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-4 on the final homestand of the season, a seven-game stand against Seattle (0-4) and Houston (three games)...now have

a season-high tying six-game home losing streak (April 1-6 and Aug. 21-27)...have not lost more than six straight home games since June 19-July 3, 2017 when they lost eight in a row...are 5-13 over the last 18 home games and are 40-38 (.513) overall...need one more win to clinch a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season and 10th time in the last 12 years...went 5-1 on the last road trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0) and are 42-33 (.560) on the road, which is the third best road record in the American League...the A's have the second lowest batting average at home in the AL (.226), the third lowest OPS (.695) and third fewest runs scored (319)...the home batting average is currently second lowest in Oakland history (.225 in 1979, .229 in 1982 and 2020)...have the third best OPS on the road (.750), the fourth best batting average (.249) and the fourth most runs scored (378).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost 6-5 yesterday and are now 21-26 (.447) in one-run games, which is the third worst record in the American League...lead the AL in one-run losses and the 47 one-run decisions are second most to the Mariners (50)...are 34-40 (.459) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 48-31 (.608) in games decided by three runs or more...have a six-game winning streak in extra innings and are 8-3 (.727) overall, which is the second best record in the majors to the Cardinals (7-2, .778)...are 14-4 (.778) in extra innings over the last two years...are 17-11 in games decided in the last at bat...have eight losses when leading at the conclusion of seven innings of play (including five in the last 30 games), which is tied with the Mariners and Red Sox for the most in the AL...are tied with the Mariners and Yankees for the most walk-off wins in the AL (10)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

AGAINST LEFTIES: The A's have faced a left-handed starting pitcher in six of the previous eight games...are 35-25 (.583) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second best record in the American League to the White Sox (25-16, .610)...are 47-46 (.505) when the opponent starts a right-hander.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 24 times and currently have five players on the IL (Fiers, Jefferies, Moreland, Piscotty, Rosenthal)...have missed just 736 games to IL placements, an average of 30.7 games per stint...excluding the shortened 2020 season, the averaged games missed will be the fewest by an A's team since 2002 (26.3)...used the IL just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest.

PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 49 players, which is tied for fifth fewest in the majors...are tied for the second fewest starting pitchers (9), have the third fewest relievers (21) and the fourth fewest pitchers (27)...have used 146 different lineups in 153 games...have five pitchers with 100 or more strikeouts, which matches the most in Athletics history (sixth time, last: 2013)...have six pitchers with eight or more wins, which matches the most in Oakland history (1975, 1988, 2003)...six different players have played shortstop, which is the most by an A's team since 1998 (also 6).

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 4-9 against the Astros and with one more loss, will lose the season series for the sixth time in the last seven years (went 7-3 last year)...are 1-6 in Oakland and 3-3 in Houston...the A's worst home record against Houston is 2-7 in 2018...are now 48-70 (.407) against Houston over the last seven years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 79-83 all-time, including 43-41 in Oakland and 36-42 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks sixth among Major League relievers in ERA (1.78), ninth in opponents OPS (.521) and 10th in on-base percentage (.245)...**Matt Chapman** leads ML third basemen in fielding percentage (.988), total chances (427) and putouts (160), ranks second in double plays (37) and fourth in assists (262)...the putouts are the most by a ML third baseman since Tim Wallach had 162 for Montreal in 1984...**Starling Marte** leads the majors in stolen bases (45), ranks sixth in on-base percentage (.385) and seventh in batting average (.310)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.920), fourth in slugging percentage (.549), tied for fourth in RBI (105) and extra base hits (71), tied for fifth in home runs (38) and walks (81), sixth in on-base percentage (.371) and eighth in runs scored (99).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1975** Vida Blue wins his 21st game and Reggie Jackson hits two home runs as the A's defeat the Chicago White Sox 13-2 to clinch their fifth consecutive AL West title...in **1988** Dave Stewart strikes out 11 in the A's 5-2 win at Milwaukee to win his 20th game of the season...in **2000** Jason Giambi hits the 5000th home run in Oakland history, a two-run shot in the sixth inning of a 3-2 A's loss at Seattle.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (12-9, 3.57 ERA)

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Is 4-2 with a 2.43 ERA (20 er in 74.0 ip) and .210 (55-for-262) opponents batting average in 12 starts since the All-Star Break... has struck out 87 and walked 25 while yielding five home runs in 74.0 innings...has the lowest opponents OPS in the American League since the break (.596), ranks second in slugging percentage (.317), third in ERA and batting average and fifth in strikeouts and on-base percentage (.279)...was 8-7 with a 4.41 ERA, .258 opponents average, .737 OPS and 14 home runs in 18 starts before the break.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for the American League in games started (30), ranks third in innings pitched (174.0), tied for fourth in strikeouts (192), fifth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.98), tied for fifth in wins (12), sixth in opponents slugging percentage (.382), seventh in ERA (3.57) and OPS (.681), eighth in batting average (.239), ninth in on-base percentage (.299) and 10th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.62)

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .197 (47-for-238) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .262 (111-for-424) with 14 of his 19 home runs after that...has held the opponents three hitter to a .182 (14-for-77) average, which is second lowest in the American League.

SEVEN INNINGS OR FEWER: Has tossed seven innings or fewer in each of his 30 starts this year and now has a streak of 42 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to Sept. 25, 2019...that is the longest such streak in Athletics history, topping the previous long of 41 by Chris Bassitt from May 21, 2019-May 16, 2021...last tossed more than seven innings on June 20, 2019 against Tampa Bay (8.0 ip).

THIS AND THAT: Has tossed 7.0 scoreless innings in four of his last 10 starts and his hit totals in those starts are 3, 2, 2 and 1...had a no decision in his last start, a 3-2 A's win in 10 innings...has seven no decisions this year, five of which have come in extra inning games...the A's have won four of his no decisions and are 16-14 (.533) in his starting assignments...has four games of 10 or more strikeouts this year, which is tied for the fourth most 10-strikeout games in a season in Oakland history...has seven in his career, which is tied for fifth in Oakland history...has career highs in all categories including wins (12), starts (30) and strikeouts (192).

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start on April 5 against Los Angeles (NL)...the loss extended his losing streak to a career-high three games dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...then picked up the win in each of his next two starts and allowed just one run on eight hits in 12.0 innings...went 3-3 with a 3.18 ERA in six starts in May...the three wins matched his most ever in a month...won each of his first three starts in May and posted a 3.12 ERA over that stretch from May 3-14...then went 0-3 with a 3.24 ERA over his next three starts from May 19-29...the losing streak matched his career high...struck out 11 batters in 6.0 innings in a 4-2 loss to Seattle on May 24...it was one of four games with 10 or more strikeouts (10, July 8 at Houston; 10, July 23 at Seattle; 10, July 29 at Los Angeles-AL) and the second highest single-game total of his career...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings June 15 against Los Angeles (AL) and allowed just two runs for the win...it was his first of six starts of 7.0 innings...struck out 10 batters in back-to-back starts on July 23 at Seattle and July 29 at Los Angeles (AL) to become the first A's pitcher with consecutive games of 10 or more strikeouts since Brandon McCarthy (Aug. 29-Sept. 3, 2011)...combined with Romo and Trivino on a three-hit shutout in the latter contest against the Angels, a 4-0 win...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed all three of the hits...struck out 10 and logged a season-high 109 pitches...finished July with a 2-1 record, a 2.30 ERA and .204 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 40 in 31.1 innings and walked just nine while surrendering two home runs...his strikeouts ranked fifth in the AL and fifth in Oakland history in the month of July...then went 1-1 with a 2.03 ERA and .212 opponents batting average in five starts in August...did not allow a home run in 31.0 innings...the ERA was his lowest in a month with more than one game and ranked fifth in the AL in August...also ranked second in opponents slugging percentage (.240) and third in OPS (.512)...struck out eight batters on Aug. 4th against San Diego, giving him 45 strikeouts over a five-start stretch from July 8-Aug. 4...those were the second most strikeouts by an A's pitcher over a five-game span over the last 35 years...only Todd Stottlemire, with 46 from June 16-July 6, 1995, had more...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed two hits in back-to-back starts on Aug. 22 against San Francisco (ND) and Aug. 28 against New York-AL (W)...joins Bobby Witt (June 23-28, 1994) and Daniel Mengden (May 20-26, 2018) as the only pitchers in Athletics history with back-to-back starts of at least seven scoreless innings and two hits or fewer...left with a 1-0 lead in his start on the 22nd but the bullpen blew the save...it was the first of two times he left with the lead in one of his starts only to have

the bullpen blow the save (Sept. 19 at Los Angeles-AL)...did not allow a run over his first four innings on Sept. 2 at Detroit to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 18.0 innings.

LAST START: He had a no decision in his 100th career appearance, a 3-2 A's win in 10 innings at Los Angeles (AL) last Sunday...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit but issued a season-high four walks...the lone hit was a two-out double by Marsh in the third and he was the only baserunner to get as far as second base...was relieved by Diekman to start the eighth with the A's leading 2-0 and Romo allowed two runs in the ninth for the blown save.
