OAKLAND ATHLETICS (83-71) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (91-63)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their four-game losing streak last night and are now 6-4 over the last 10 games...started the year 0-6, went a Major League best 44-21 (.677) from April 7-June 18 (first game at New York-AL), and are 39-44 (.470) since then...are 83-71 (.539) overall and have clinched a winning record in four straight seasons for the first time since 1999-2006 when they did it eight straight years...are in fifth place in the AL Wild Card race and are four games behind the second Wild Card team, New York...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are in third place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by eight games with eight games remaining...held at least a share of first in the West for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 and spent 71 consecutive days in sole possession of second place from June 21 to Sept. 3...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 77 days in second, seven days tied for second, 12 days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

TRAGIC NUMBERS: After defeating Houston last night, the A's tragic number for elimination in the American League West remains at one...have a tragic number of five to be eliminated in the AL Wild Card race but that number is guaranteed to drop by one when the Yankees and Blue Jays square off in a three-game series beginning Tuesday.

OFFENSE: The A's scored 14 runs last night after tallying 13 runs over the previous five games...have scored 232 runs in 44 games dating back to Aug. 7 (5.27 per game), which is sixth most in the majors over that span...are hitting .239 overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have hit under .240 in a full season just three times in Oakland history (.236 in 1982, .238 in 2012, .239 in 1979)...however, lead the AL with an Athletics record 93 hit by pitches and rank fifth with 523 walks...are in the middle of the pack in on-base percentage (7th, .318) and OPS (8th, .726)...rank third in the AL in sacrifice flies (48) and fourth in fewest strikeouts (1284).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters lead the American League in hits (33) and plate appearances (154), are tied for the lead in home runs (4), rank second in RBI (24) and extra base hits (10) and tied for second in doubles (6)...the 33 hits and 24 RBI are second most by A's pinch hitters over the last 23 years (hade 34 hits in 2015 and 25 RBI in 2019).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 85-for-105 (81.0%) in stolen base attempts...rank second in the American League in stolen base percentage (Cleveland, 86.0%) and fourth in steals...were successful in 89.7% of their stolen base attempts last year but the highest percentage in a full season in Athletics history is 80.7% in 2008...the 85 steals are the most by an A's team since 2012 (122).

PITCHING: The A's have a 5.20 ERA (112 er in 194.0 ip) in September, which is third highest in the American League...overall, rank fifth in the AL in opponents OPS (.704) and slugging percentage (.397)...have the fewest walks (416), the second fewest pitches per inning (16.0) and are tied for the second fewest home runs (176)...have 1,274 strikeouts, which is second most in Athletics history to the record of 1,299 set in 2019.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed five innings or fewer in 24 of the last 39 games but lead the majors with 856.0 innings pitched for the season (Astros, 839.1)...the fewest innings pitched by a ML leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 Mets...are 56-50 with a 3.87 ERA (368 er in 856.0 ip) overall...are tied for second in the American League in wins and rank fifth in ERA and opponents OPS (.712)...are tied for second in complete games (3).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 4-10 with seven saves, 11 blown saves and a 5.60 ERA (73 er in 117.1 ip) over the last 31 games...had just 11 losses over the first 123 games and has 21 for the season, which is tied with Boston for the fewest in the American League...has 28 blown saves, which is second most in the AL (Mariners, 31) and tied for second most in Oakland history to the record of 30 in 2019...has a save percentage of 57.6%, which is second lowest in the AL (Orioles, 46.2%)...ranks fifth in the AL in opponents OPS (.689)...has the second highest slugging percentage (.431) and fifth highest batting average (.245) against first batters faced...has the third fewest inherited runners (167).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed six errors in the last eight games but have just 67 for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the majors to the Astros (62)...are on pace to break the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season (80 in 2019)...the errors have led to 44 unearned runs, which is second fewest in the American League (Orioles, 43)...have 14 outfield assists,

which is second fewest in the AL (Tigers, 13)...have the fourth fewest double plays (112).

HOME AND AWAY: With the win last night, the A's clinched a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season and 10th time in the last 12 years as they are 41-38 (.519) with two games remaining...are 1-4 on the final home-stand of the season, a seven-game stand against Seattle (0-4) and Houston (1-0)...are 6-13 over the last 19 home games...leave following the game tomorrow for the final road trip, a six-game trip to Seattle (three games) and Houston (three games)...went 5-1 on the last road trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0) and are 42-33 (.560) on the road, which is the second best road record in the American League to the Rays (45-30, .600)...the A's have the second lowest batting average at home in the AL (.228), third lowest OPS (.700) and fifth fewest runs scored (333)...the home batting average is currently second lowest in Oakland history (.225 in 1979, .229 in 1982 and 2020)...have the third best OPS on the road (.750), the fourth best batting average (.249) and the fourth most runs scored (378).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 21-26 (.447) in one-run games, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...lead the AL in one-run losses and the 47 one-run decisions are second most to the Mariners (51)...are 34-40 (.459) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 49-31 (.613) in games decided by three runs or more...have a six-game winning streak in extra innings and are 8-3 (.727) overall, which is the second best record in the majors to the Cardinals (7-2, .778)...are 14-4 (.778) in extra innings over the last two years...are 17-11 in games decided in the last at bat...have eight losses when leading at the conclusion of seven innings of play (including five in the last 31 games), which is tied with the Mariners and Red Sox for the most in the AL...are tied with the Mariners and Yankees for the most walk-off wins in the AL (10)...have 93 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

AGAINST LEFTIES: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the seventh time in the last 10 games today...are 35-25 (.583) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second best record in the American League to the White Sox (25-16, .610)...are 48-46 (.511) when the opponent starts a right-hander.

PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 49 players, which is tied for fifth fewest in the majors...are tied for the second fewest starting pitchers (9), have the third fewest relievers (21) and the fourth fewest pitchers (27)...have used 147 different lineups in 154 games...have five pitchers with 100 or more strikeouts, which matches the most in Athletics history (sixth time, last: 2013)...have six pitchers with eight or more wins, which matches the most in Oakland history (1975, 1988, 2003)...six different players have played short-stop, which is the most by an A's team since 1998 (also 6).

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's are 5-9 against the Astros and with one more loss, will lose the season series for the sixth time in the last seven years (went 7-3 last year)...are 2-6 in Oakland and 3-3 in Houston...the A's worst home record against Houston is 2-7 in 2018...are now 49-70 (.412) against Houston over the last seven years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 80-83 all-time, including 44-41 in Oakland and 36-42 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Last night was the fourth time in Oakland history the A's had three players with at least four RBI in a game (last: Aug. 31, 2012 vs. Boston)...**Andrew Chafin** ranks sixth among Major League relievers in ERA (1.78) and 10th in opponents OPS (.521)...**Matt Chapman** leads ML third basemen with 162 putouts, which are the most by a ML third baseman since Tim Wallach also had 162 for Montreal in 1984...**Tony Kemp** has a streak of 88 consecutive plate appearances without a strikeout, which is the longest by an Athletic since Jesus Alou had a streak of 106 from June 17-Aug. 21, 1974...**Starling Marte** leads the majors in stolen bases (45), ranks fourth in batting average (.315) and sixth in on-base percentage (.389) and batting with runners in scoring position (.347)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.921), fourth in slugging percentage (.549) and RBI (109), tied for fourth in extra base hits (72), tied for fifth in home runs (38) and walks (81), sixth in on-base percentage (.371) and eighth in runs scored (99)

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1987 Mark McGwire's ninth inning game tying homer breaks Reggie Jackson's Oakland home run record as it is his 48th of the year...he would go on to hit what was then a Major League rookie record 49 home runs...in 1990 Dave Stewart tosses a five-hit shutout at Kansas City to win his 22nd game and clinch the A's third consecutive AL West title.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (10-10, 4.05 ERA)

THE FIRST 14 AND THE LAST 16: Was 6-2 with a 2.99 ERA over his first 14 starts through June 14 but is 4-8 with a 5.06 ERA (48 er in 85.1 ip) in 16 starts since then...allowed eight home runs over his first 14 starts, 16 since then...struck out 78 over his first 14 (8.63 per nine innings) but has 102 since then (10.76 per nine innings).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fourth in the American League in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.62), tied for fifth in games started (30), eighth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.11) and 10th in strikeouts (180)...is the only AL pitcher and one of five in the majors with two shutouts...is one of two AL pitchers with two complete games (Cole, NYY).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .195 (30-for-154) batting average and .569 OPS against left-handed hitters compared to .278 (139-for-500) with a .774 OPS against right-handers...his OPS and batting against lefties is third lowest in the American League...has issued 32 of his 39 walks to righties.

10-GAME WINNER: Picked up his 10th win of the season Sept. 15, which is two short of his career high of 12 in 2017 and 2018...this is his third 10-win season and he joins Trevor Cahill as the only A's pitchers over the last 16 years with three 10-win seasons...has career highs in strikeouts (180), innings pitched (166.2), games started (30), hits (169) and home runs (24) and has matched his high in losses (10).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 7-3 in his no decisions and are 17-13 (.567) in his starting assignments...are 28-18 (.609) when he starts over the last three years...has walked two batters or fewer 24 times, including 11 starts with one walk and eight with no walks...has three games of 10 or more strikeouts this year and six in his career...the six 10-strikeout games are tied for seventh most in Oakland history...has received one run of support or fewer in 12 of his starts...is 0-8 with one run of support or fewer, 10-2 with two runs of support or more

CAREER NOTES: Has 49 wins, 627 strikeouts and 126 starts in his career, all of which are the most by an A's pitcher over the last 18 years...in the Wild Card era (1995-present), the only A's pitchers with more wins, strikeouts are starts are Barry Zito (102 wins, 1098 strikeouts, 224 starts), Tim Hudson (92, 899, 183) and Mark Mulder (81, 668 and 150).

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Lost his first start but then went 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA over his next four starts...tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the doubleheader April 20, his second career complete game and shutout...had 10 strikeouts on May 7 against Tampa Bay, but had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win...retired each of the first 18 batters he faced before walking Arozarena to start the seventh...allowed one run or fewer in five consecutive starts from May 23 to June 14 and went 3-0 with a 0.84 ERA over that span...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on May 23...left with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...it was the first of three times the pen blew the save in a game in which he was the pitcher of record (July 16 vs. Cleveland, Sept. 3 at Toronto)...tossed a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Seattle on June 2...it was his third career complete game and shutout, his second this year...then combined with Petit, Trivino and Diekman on a two-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win on June 9 against Arizona...had a career-high 16.0-inning scoreless streak from June 2 to 14...struck out 11 batters in 5.1 innings June 20 at New York (AL) but was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss...went 2-for-2 with a double June 25 at San Francisco...it was the first extra base hit by an A's pitcher since Joe Kennedy doubled on June 12, 2007 at Houston...was named American League Pitcher of the Month for June after going 3-2 with a 1.13 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 34 batters in 32.0 innings and allowed just one home run...it was the second time he was named Pitcher of the Month (April, 2018)...struck out a career-high 13 batters in 7.0 innings in a 4-1 win at Seattle on July 22, which equaled the seventh highest single-game strikeout total in Oakland history...went 2-2 with a 3.30 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in five starts in July...struck out 41 and walked just five in 30.0 innings...the strikeouts tied for third in the American League in July and tied Mike Moore (1989) for the third highest total in July in Oakland history.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss to Seattle on Monday in Oakland...allowed three runs in the third inning on a RBI single by France and a two-run double by Seager...Oakland got one of those runs back in the bottom of third and he allowed a RBI single to Seager in the fifth...was relieved by Acevedo to start the sixth with the A's trailing 4-1.

MANAEA vs. HOUSTON: Is 3-7 with a 3.60 ERA (95.0 ip, 90 h, 43 r, 38 er, 25 bb, 79 so, 12 hr) in 17 career regular season starts...has received no run support in four of those starts and two runs or fewer 10 times...also started Game 2 of the 2020 ALDS and was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss (4.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...is 1-4 with a 4.93 ERA (27 er in 49.1 ip) in nine starts in Oakland, 2-3 with a 2.17 ERA (11 er in 45.2 ip) in eight starts in Houston...is 0-2 with a 4.63 ERA (23.1 ip, 26 h, 13 r, 12 er, 4 bb, 17 so, 5 hr) in four starts this year...the first loss came in a 9-2 decision in Oakland on April 4...allowed a solo home run to Tucker in the first inning, a two-run home run to Castro in the second and a two-run double to Gurriel in the third...then had a no decision in the A's 6-2 win at Houston on April 9...allowed his only run in the fourth when Gurriel walked, went to third on a Correa single and scored on a Tucker ground out...left after six innings with the score tied 1-1...also had a no decision in the A's 6-5 win in Oakland on May 18...allowed 10 hits but did not walk a batter...allowed a two-run double to Alvarez in the first and a lead-off home run to Tucker in the fourth...left after six innings with the score tied 3-3...then lost a 4-3 decision at Houston on July 7...allowed just four hits and did not walk a batter in 6.2 innings but yielded four runs...allowed a three-run home run to Altuve in the third and a solo home run to Tucker in the seventh.

RHP Paul Blackburn (1-3, 5.17 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas Aug. 18 went 0-1 with a 2.81 ERA and .250 opponents batting average in three starts in August...is 1-2 with a 7.63 ERA and .375 opponents average in four starts in September...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-2 A's loss to Seattle on Tuesday in Oakland (4.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...is 0-1 with an 18.47 ERA (6.1 ip, 16 h, 14 r, 13 er, 3 bb, 0 so, 2 hr) in two career appearances, including one start, against Houston...pitched in relief in his last outing, a 15-0 A's loss on Sept. 9, 2019 at Houston (5.0 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 0 so)...was 4-7 with a 4.97 ERA and .311 opponents batting average in 17 games, including 16 starts, with Las Vegas...ranked second in the Triple-A West in innings (88.2), tied for second in games started (16) and fifth in ERA and strikeouts (80) at the time of his Aug. 18 promotion to Oakland...surrendered just eight home runs in 88.2 innings, an average of 0.81 per nine innings.
