



OAKLAND ATHLETICS (85-71) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (86-70)

ABOUT THE A'S: Swept a three-game series from Houston over the weekend after being swept in a four-game series by Seattle to start the week...are 8-4 over the last 12 games but are 17-22 dating back to Aug. 15...started the year 0-6, went a Major League best 44-21 (.677) from April 7-June 18 (first game at New York-AL), and are 41-44 (.488) since then...are 85-71 (.545) overall and have clinched a winning record in four straight seasons for the first time since 1999-2006 when they did it eight straight years...are in fifth place in the AL Wild Card race and are three games behind the second wild card team, Boston...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are in third place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by six games with six games remaining...held at least a share of first in the West for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 and spent 71 consecutive days in sole possession of second place from June 21 to Sept. 3...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 77 days in second, seven days tied for second, 14 days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

UNTIL THE END: After sweeping the Astros, the A's tragic number for elimination in the American League West remains at one...have a tragic number of four to be eliminated in the AL Wild Card race...the earliest the A's can clinch a playoff spot is Saturday and the earliest they can be eliminated from the playoffs is Wednesday...the only times in Oakland history the A's have clinched a playoff berth in game 161 or later is 2000 (161) and 2014 (162) and the only times they have been eliminated in game 159 or later is 1976 (159) and 2004 (161).

STRIKEOUTS: The A's pitching staff had seven strikeouts yesterday and now has 1,290 for the season, which is nine short of the Athletics single-season record of 1,299 set in 2019...have five pitchers (Montas, Manaea, Bassitt, Irvin and Kaprielian) with 100 or more strikeouts for the sixth time in Athletics history (1963, 1968, 1980, 2004, 2013).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 238 runs in 46 games dating back to Aug. 7 (5.17 per game), which is tied for sixth most in the majors over that span...are hitting .239 overall, which is fifth lowest in the American League...have hit under .240 in a full season just three times in Oakland history (.236 in 1982, .238 in 2012, .239 in 1979)...however, lead the AL with an Athletics record 95 hit by pitches and rank fifth with 533 walks...are in the middle of the pack in on-base percentage (7th, .318) and OPS (8th, .724)...rank third in the AL in sacrifice flies (48), fourth in fewest strikeouts (1299) and tied for fifth in sacrifice hits (17).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters lead the American League in hits (33) and plate appearances (156), are tied for the lead in home runs (4), rank second in RBI (24) and extra base hits (10) and tied for second in doubles (6)...the 33 hits and 24 RBI are second most by A's pinch hitters over the last 23 years (had 34 hits in 2015 and 25 RBI in 2019).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 85-for-105 (81.0%) in stolen base attempts...rank second in the American League in stolen base percentage (Cleveland, 86.3%) and fourth in steals...were successful in 89.7% of their stolen base attempts last year but the highest percentage in a full season in Athletics history is 80.7% in 2008...the 85 steals are the most by an A's team since 2012 (122).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.52 ERA (28 er in 100.0 ip) and .214 (79-for-369) opponents batting average over the last 11 games...overall, rank fifth in the AL in opponents OPS (.702) and slugging percentage (.396)...have the fewest walks (420), the second fewest pitches per inning (16.0) and the third fewest home runs (178).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in six of the last nine games and are 2-3 with a 2.39 ERA (13 er in 49.0 ip) and .186 (33-for-177) opponents batting average over that span...are 56-50 with a 3.84 ERA (370 er in 868.0 ip) overall...rank fourth in the American League in wins and fifth in ERA and opponents OPS (.709)...are tied for second in complete games (3)...have tossed five innings or fewer in 25 of the last 41 games but lead the majors with 868.0 innings pitched for the season (Astros, 850.0)...the fewest innings pitched by a ML leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 Mets.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 4-10 with eight saves, 11 blown saves and a 5.47 ERA (75 er in 123.1 ip) over the last 33 games...had just 11 losses over the first 123 games and has 21 for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and tied for second fewest in the majors (Brewers, 20)...has 28 blown saves, which is tied for second most in the AL (Mariners, 31) and tied for second most in Oakland history to the record of 30 in 2019...has a save percentage of 57.6%, which is third lowest in the AL...ranks fourth in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.307) and fifth in OPS (.690)...has the second highest slugging

percentage (.435) and fifth highest batting average (.245) against first batters faced...has the third fewest inherited runners (169).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 67 errors, which is tied for second fewest in the majors to the Astros (63)...the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season is 80 in 2019...have 44 unearned runs, which is second fewest in the American League (Orioles, 43)...have 15 outfield assists, which is second fewest (Tigers, 13)...have the fourth fewest double plays (112).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin the final road trip of the season tonight, a six-game trip to Seattle (three games) and Houston (three games)...went 5-1 on the last road trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (3-0) and are 42-33 (.560) on the road, which is the third best road record in the American League...have clinched a .500 record on the road for the fourth straight season, which is the second longest such streak by an A's team over the last 89 years (had five straight from 1971-75)...went 3-4 on the final homestand against Seattle (0-4) and Houston (3-0) and are 43-38 (.531) in Oakland...will finish with a winning record at home for the fifth consecutive season and 10th time in the last 12 years...have the third best road OPS in the AL (.750), the fourth best batting average (.249) and fourth most runs scored (378)...have the second lowest home batting average (.229), third lowest OPS (.699) and fifth fewest runs (339).

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had back-to-back walk-off wins to close out the last homestand and have 12 walk-off wins for the season, which is tied with the Rockies and Phillies for the most in the majors and tied for third most in Oakland history...now have 95 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...are 19-11 in games decided in the last at bat...are 23-26 (.469) in one-run games...lead the AL in one-run losses and the 49 one-run decisions are second most to the Mariners (51)...are 36-40 (.474) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 49-31 (.613) in games decided by three runs or more...have a six-game winning streak in extra innings and are 8-3 (.727) overall, which is the second best record in the majors to the Cardinals (7-2, .778)...are 14-4 (.778) in extra innings over the last two years...have eight losses when leading at the conclusion of seven innings of play (including five in the last 32 games), which is tied with the Mariners for second most in the AL (Red Sox, 10).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 36-25 (.590) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 49-46 (.516) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to the White Sox (25-16, .610)...have used 49 players, which is tied for fifth fewest in the majors...have used 149 different lineups in 156 games.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's have lost the season series for the seventh time in the last nine years as they are 4-12 entering this final three-game series...have been outscored 66-62 and nine of the 12 losses have been by two runs or fewer...have lost each of the last nine games, which is the A's longest losing streak against the Mariners and their longest against any team since losing 10 straight to the Astros from July 20, 2016-April 28, 2017...have dropped 10 of the last 12 games in Oakland...are 3-4 in Seattle and went 1-8 in Oakland, which matches the A's worst home record against the Mariners (2007 and 2016)...are 66-93 (.415) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the A's worst mark against any American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 370-317 against the Mariners...that includes 198-144 in Oakland, 171-170 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 95-106 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks sixth among Major League relievers in ERA (1.73) and opponents OPS (.517), tied for eighth in games (70) and tied for 10th in on-base percentage (.245)...**Matt Chapman** leads ML third basemen with 163 putouts, which are the most by a ML third baseman since Darrell Evans had 185 for Atlanta in 1974...**Starling Marte** leads the majors in stolen bases (45), ranks fifth in on-base percentage (.384) and seventh in batting average (.311)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.922), fourth in RBI (109), walks (87) and on-base percentage (.372), fifth in extra base hits (72) and slugging percentage (.547), tied for fifth in home runs (38) and tied for eighth in runs scored (99).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1912** Eddie Plank pitches 19 innings but the A's lose to Washington 5-4...in **1914** the A's defeat the St. Louis Browns 6-0 to clinch the American League pennant...in **1970** Reggie Jackson hits his 100th career home run in a 9-4 loss at California...he would go on to hit 563 home runs in his career...in **1989** Mike Moore, Rick Honeycutt and Gene Nelson combine on a four-hit shutout in a 5-0 victory over Texas to clinch the A's second consecutive AL West Championship.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (10-14, 3.99 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was acquired by the A's from Philadelphia for cash considerations on Jan. 30 and is 10-14 with a 3.99 ERA in 30 starts after going 2-2 with a 6.75 ERA in 19 games, including three starts, in two seasons with the Phillies...his 14 losses are tied for the most in the American League and are the most by an A's pitcher since Jesse Chavez had 15 in 2015.

THREE TRUE OUTCOMES: Has a .273 opponents batting average but has walked just 38 batters in 169.1 innings...his average of 2.02 walks per nine innings is tied for fourth lowest in the AL...has walked just 52 batters in 214.2 career innings (2.18 per nine innings)...has struck out just 117 this year and his average of 6.22 strikeouts per nine innings is second lowest in the AL...has allowed 20 home runs and is fifth in the AL in fewest home runs per nine innings (1.06).

MORE LEADERS: Is tied for seventh in the AL in games started (30) and tied for ninth in innings pitched (169.1)...is averaging 15.0 pitches per inning, which is the fewest in the AL and second fewest in the majors to the Cardinals Adam Wainwright (14.8)...has allowed the second most hits in the AL (184) and his opponents batting average and on-base percentage (.320) are third highest among the 18 qualifiers.

UPS AND DOWNS: Went 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA and .868 OPS over his first two starts, 3-2 with a 1.89 ERA and .586 OPS over his next six starts from April 17 to May 15, 2-3 with a 5.17 ERA and .820 OPS over a seven-start stretch from May 20 to June 22, 3-3 with a 2.44 ERA and .522 OPS over a seven-start span from June 27 to Aug. 7 and is 2-4 with a 5.77 ERA (25 er in 39.0 ip) and .943 OPS over his last eight starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average breaks down to .267 135-for-505) with a .759 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .290 (49-for-169) with a .725 OPS against left-handers...has surrendered 16 of his 20 home runs to righties...15 have been solo shots...has allowed a .321 (43-for-134) average with runners in scoring position, which is second highest in the AL (Minor, KC .375) and fifth highest in Oakland history...now has a .333 career opponents average with RISP.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 4-11 with a 4.93 ERA (47 er in 86.1 ip) in 17 starts against AL West competition, 6-3 with a 2.88 ERA in 13 starts against everyone else...his 11 intradivision losses are the most in the majors over the last four years and tie the Athletics record held by Brian Kingman (1980) and Rick Langford (1977 and 1979)...his 4.90 intradivision ERA is fifth highest in the majors this year...is 0-4 with a 7.56 ERA in four starts against Seattle and 0-3 with a 7.98 ERA in three starts against Houston.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-9 with a 6.16 ERA (39 er in 57.0 ip) and .881 OPS in 11 starts on four days rest compared to 9-4 with a 2.67 ERA (32 er in 108.0 ip) and .641 OPS in 18 starts on five days rest or more...his nine losses on four days rest are the most in the American League and tied for the most in the majors (Alcantara, MIA)...has the highest OPS in the AL and the third highest ERA...is tied for second in the AL in wins on five days rest or more, ranks third in ERA and seventh in OPS.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 6-6 with a 3.42 ERA (30 er in 79.0 ip) in 14 starts at night compared to 4-8 with a 4.48 ERA (45 er in 90.1 ip) in 16 starts during the day...is tied for the most starts during the day in the majors (Stroman, NYM) and ranks second in most losses (Castillo, CIN 9)...the losses are the most by an A's pitcher during the day since Tom Candiotti also had 8 in 1998...however, has a .705 opponents OPS during the day, .766 at night.

THIS AND THAT: Has 20 assists, which is tied for fifth most among AL pitchers...has walked two batters or fewer in 28 of his 30 starts...has five starts with no walks and 15 with one...the A's are 4-2 in his no decisions and are 14-16 (.467) in his starting assignments...has left with the lead only to have the pen blow the save in five of his starts...is 10-2 in 16 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-12 in 14 starts with support of two runs or fewer...has thrown 76 curveballs according to TruMedia and opponents are hitting .435 with a 1.502 OPS...the OPS is second highest in the majors among pitchers with 75 or more curveballs (Alcantara, MIA 1.667).

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in a 7-0 win on April 17 against Detroit...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto and had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102)...left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of five times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (June 11 vs. Kansas City, July 9 at Texas, Aug. 13 at Texas, Sept. 11 vs. Texas)...compiled a 3-0 record and a 2.64 ERA in five starts in June...the ERA was fourth lowest in the American League and the three-game winning streak was the longest of his career...allowed a run in the first inning on June 5 at Colorado and did not allow another run until the seventh inning of his

next start on June 11 against Kansas City for a career-high tying 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and did not allow a run in a 6-2 win at San Francisco on June 27...did not allow a run over the first three innings of his next start on July 3 against Boston for another 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters (13th time, last: Bassitt, April 29, 2021 at Tampa Bay) in a 3-2 loss at Texas on July 9.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Seattle last Wednesday in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first three innings...allowed a leadoff home run to Seager in the fourth and Murphy added a RBI single...also yielded a solo home run to France in the fifth and was relieved by Guerra after issuing a leadoff walk in the sixth inning.

IRVIN vs. SEATTLE: Is 0-4 with a 7.56 ERA (16.2 ip, 29 h, 14 r, 14 er, 7 bb, 10 so) in four career starts, all this year...the first loss came in a 4-3 decision in Oakland on May 25...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings of work...yielded two runs in the first inning on

RBI singles by France and Crawford...the A's tied the game with two runs in the second but he allowed two runs in the third on a RBI double by Murphy and a RBI single by Kelenic...was relieved by Smith with runners on first and second and two outs in the fifth and the A's trailing 4-2...also lost a 4-3 decision at Seattle on July 25...retired eight of the first nine batters and had a 2-0 lead with two outs and the bases empty in the third inning...the next six batters went single, walk, hit by pitch, two-run single, RBI single and RBI single...left after four innings with the A's trailing 4-2...then dropped a 5-1 decision in Oakland on Aug. 24...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed a RBI single to Kelenic in the second...then allowed a two-run single to Torrens in the third and left after allowing three runs on seven hits and two walks in 3.0 innings...lost at Oakland in a 4-1 decision last Wednesday (see last start above).

RHP Chris Bassitt (12-4, 3.16 ERA): Was reinstated from the 10-day injured list last Thursday and started that day against the Mariners...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 4 so)...it was his first start since Aug. 17 at Chicago (AL) when he was hit in the face by a Brian Goodwin line drive in the second inning...was placed on the IL Aug. 18 with a right facial fracture...had surgery on Aug. 24...when he was placed on the IL on Aug. 18, he was leading the American League in wins (12), innings pitched (151.0) and games started (25), ranked second in opponents OPS (.628), slugging percentage (.351) and winning percentage (.750), third in ERA (3.22), on-base percentage (.277) and batting average (.219) and sixth in strikeouts (154)...is 1-4 with a 4.05 ERA (60.0 ip, 53 h, 29 r, 27 er, 28 bb, 49 so, 5 hr) in 13 career appearances, including 11 starts, against Seattle...is 0-0 with a 5.00 ERA (12.0 ip, 12 h, 8 r, 8 er, 5 bb, 16 so, 3 hr) in three starts this year.
