



## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (85-72) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (87-70)

TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 28, 2021 — T-MOBILE PARK — 7:10 PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's were eliminated from the American League West with a loss in game 157 last night as they now trail first place Houston by 6½ games with five games remaining...had their three-game winning streak snapped last night and have lost five of the last eight games...are 8-5 over the last 13 games but are 17-23 dating back to Aug. 15...started the year 0-6, went a Major League best 44-21 (.677) from April 7-June 18 (first game at New York-AL), and are 41-45 (.476) since then...are 85-72 (.541) overall and have clinched a winning record in four straight seasons for the first time since 1999-2006 when they did it eight straight years...are in fifth place in the AL Wild Card race and are 3½ games behind the second wild card team, Boston...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are in third place in the AL West...held at least a share of first in the West for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 and spent 71 consecutive days in sole possession of second place from June 21 to Sept. 3...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 77 days in second, seven days tied for second, 15 days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

**UNTIL THE END:** The A's have a tragic number of three to be eliminated in the AL Wild Card race...the earliest the A's can be eliminated is Wednesday and the only times in Oakland history they have been eliminated in game 159 or later is 1976 (159) and 2004 (161)...the earliest they could clinch a Wild Card is the final game and the only time they have clinched a playoff berth in game 162 was in 2014.

**STRIKEOUTS:** The A's pitching staff had seven strikeouts yesterday and now has 1,297 for the season, which is two short of the Athletics single-season record of 1,299 set in 2019...have five pitchers (Montas, Manaea, Bassitt, Irvin and Kaprielian) with 100 or more strikeouts for the sixth time in Athletics history (1963, 1968, 1980, 2004, 2013).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .238, which is fifth lowest in the American League...have hit under .240 in a full season just three times in Oakland history (.236 in 1982, .238 in 2012, .239 in 1979)...rank sixth in runs scored (721), seventh in on-base percentage (.318), eighth in OPS (.721) and 10th in slugging (.406)...lead the AL with an Athletics record 95 hit by pitches...also rank third in sacrifice flies (48), fourth in fewest strikeouts (1310), tied for fourth in doubles (268), fifth in walks (534) and tied for fifth in sacrifice hits (17).

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters lead the American League in hits (33) and plate appearances (156), are tied for the lead in home runs (4), rank second in RBI (24) and extra base hits (10) and tied for second in doubles (6)...the 33 hits and 24 RBI are second most by A's pinch hitters over the last 23 years (had 34 hits in 2015 and 25 RBI in 2019).

**ON THE BASES:** The A's are 85-for-105 (81.0%) in stolen base attempts...rank second in the American League in stolen base percentage (Cleveland, 86.3%) and fourth in steals...were successful in 89.7% of their stolen base attempts last year but the highest percentage in a full season in Athletics history is 80.7% in 2008...the 85 steals are the most by an A's team since 2012 (122).

**PITCHING:** The A's rank fifth in the American League in opponents OPS (.704) and slugging percentage (.397), sixth in ERA (3.71) and on-base percentage (.307) and seventh in opponents batting average (.245)...have walked 424 batters, which is tied with the Rays for the fewest in the AL...it is third fewest in Oakland history in a full season (4th fewest is 428, 5th fewest is 430, 6th fewest is 440)...have allowed 180 home runs, which is tied for third fewest in the AL but is seventh most in Oakland history (6th is 184, 5th is 185, 4th is 197).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 56-51 with a 3.87 ERA (375 er in 871.0 ip)...rank fourth in the American League in wins and fifth in ERA and opponents OPS (.710)...are tied for second in complete games (3)...lead the majors with 871.0 innings pitched, which is 21.0 innings more than the next closest team (Astros, 850.0)...the fewest innings pitched by a ML leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 Mets.

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has a .694 opponents OPS, which is fifth lowest in the American League...ranks ninth in ERA (4.10)...has converted 38-of-66 (57.6%) save opportunities, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL...the 28 blown saves are tied for second most in the AL (Mariners, 31) and tied for second most in Oakland history to the record of 30 in 2019...has 21 losses, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for second fewest in the majors...has the second highest slugging percentage (.431) and fifth highest batting average (.243) against first batters faced...has the third fewest inherited runners (171).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 67 errors, which is tied for second fewest in the majors to the Astros (63)...the Athletics record for fewest errors

in a season is 80 in 2019...have the second fewest unearned runs (44) and outfield assists (15) and the fourth fewest double plays (113).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-1 on the final road trip of the season, a six-game trip to Seattle (0-1) and Houston (three games)...are 42-34 (.553) on the road, which is the third best road record in the American League...have clinched a .500 record on the road for the fourth straight season, which is the second longest such streak by an A's team over the last 89 years (had five straight from 1971-75)...finished the season with a 43-38 (.531) record in Oakland, which marks the fifth consecutive season and 10th time in the last 12 years the A's have finished with a winning record at home...have the third best road OPS in the AL (.748), the fourth best batting average (.248) and fourth most runs scored (382)...have the second lowest home batting average (.229), third lowest OPS (.699) and fourth fewest runs (339).

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 23-26 (.469) in one-run games...lead the American League in one-run losses and the 49 one-run decisions are second most to the Mariners (51)...are 36-40 (.474) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 49-32 (.605) in games decided by three runs or more...have a six-game winning streak in extra innings and are 8-3 (.727) overall, which is the second best record in the majors to the Cardinals (7-2, .778)...are 14-4 (.778) in extra innings over the last two years...have eight losses when leading at the conclusion of seven innings of play, which is tied with the Mariners for second most in the AL (Red Sox, 10)...are 19-11 in games decided in the last at bat...finished the season with 12 walk-off wins, which tied for third most in Oakland history...are tied with the Rockies and Phillies for the most walk-off wins this year...have 95 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 36-25 (.590) when the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 49-47 (.510) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to the White Sox (25-16, .610)...have used 49 players, which is tied for fifth fewest in the majors...have used 150 different lineups in 157 games.

**A's vs. MARINERS:** The A's have lost the season series for the seventh time in the last nine years as they are 4-13 with two games remaining...the 13 losses are one short of the A's most to the Mariners in one season...went 5-14 in 2007 and 2009...have lost each of the last 10 games, which is the A's longest losing streak against the Mariners and their longest against any team since losing 10 straight to the Astros from July 20, 2016-April 28, 2017...have not lost more than 10 straight games to one team since dropping 11 straight to the Yankees from July 5, 2010-July 22, 2011...nine of the 13 losses to Seattle this year have been by two runs or fewer...are 3-5 in Seattle and went 1-8 in Oakland, which matches the A's worst home record against the Mariners (2007 and 2016)...are 66-94 (.413) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the A's worst mark against any American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 370-318 against the Mariners...that includes 198-144 in Oakland, 171-171 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 95-107 at T-Mobile Park.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Andrew Chafin** ranks sixth among Major League relievers in ERA (1.73) and opponents OPS (.517) and tied for eighth in games (70)...**Matt Chapman** leads ML third basemen with 165 putouts, which are the most by a ML third baseman since Darrell Evans had 185 for Atlanta in 1974...**Starling Marte** leads the majors in stolen bases (45), ranks fifth in on-base percentage (.384) and seventh in batting average (.311)...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in OPS (.924), tied for third in extra base hits (73), fourth in RBI (109), walks (87), slugging percentage (.548) and on-base percentage (.376), tied for fifth in home runs (38) and tied for seventh in runs scored (100).

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1971** the A's win the fastest game in Oakland history 2-1 as the A's defeat the Royals in 1 hour and 35 minutes...in **1972** the A's score six times in the final three innings to defeat Minnesota 8-7 and clinch their second consecutive AL West title...in **1975** Vida Blue, Glenn Abbott, Paul Lindblad and Rollie Fingers combine to no-hit the California Angels 5-0 in the first four-pitcher no-hitter in Major League history...in **1990** Dennis Eckersley breaks his own club record when he saves his 46th game of the season...he would go on to save 48 games while compiling a 0.61 ERA...in **1995** Terry Steinbach collects his 1000th career hit at California, a seventh inning single off Mark Langston...he becomes the seventh Oakland Athletic to reach the 1000 mark...in **1996**, in his final at bat as an Athletic, Terry Steinbach hits his 35th home run of the season...it is his 34th as a catcher which breaks Carlton Fisk's American League record for home runs by a catcher.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (12-4, 3.16 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was reinstated from the 10-day injured list last Thursday and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings in a start that day against Seattle...it was his first start since Aug. 17 at Chicago (AL) when he was hit in the face by a Brian Goodwin line drive in the second inning...was placed on the IL Aug. 18 with a right facial fracture...had surgery on Aug. 24 to stabilize and plate the tripod fracture with good fixation and debride other small fractured bones from the incident...the surgery was performed by Dr. Peter Revenaugh at the Rush Medical Center in Chicago.

**CAREER BESTS:** The first time American League All-Star has career highs in wins (12), strikeouts (158), winning percentage (.750), games started (26) and innings pitched (154.0) and has matched his high in wild pitches (5)...his .217 opponents batting is currently a career low as is his .275 on-base percentage, .347 slugging percentage and .622 OPS...has walked just 36 batters in 154.0 innings for a career-low average of 2.10 walks per nine innings...has a career best strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.39...has also tossed the first complete game and shutout of his career...based upon a minimum of 150 innings, his strikeout-to-walk ratio is third best in Oakland history, his on-base percentage is seventh lowest and his batting average is eighth lowest...now has a 3.44 ERA (200 er in 522.2 ip) in 99 career appearances with the A's, which is 10th lowest in Oakland history (min. 500 ip)...has hit 39 batters as an Athletic, which is sixth most in Oakland history.

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Was leading the American League in wins (12) and innings pitched (151.0) at the time of his injury and is currently tied for eighth in wins...is tied for third in hit batters (11)...has 154.0 innings pitched, which is three short of qualifying for the league leaders...would need to pitch eight more innings this year to qualify...based on a minimum of 150 innings, he leads the AL in winning percentage (.750) and fewest pitches per inning (15.0), ranks third in opponents OPS (.622), slugging percentage (.347) and fewest home runs per nine innings (0.88), fourth in ERA (3.16), opponents batting average (.217) and on-base percentage (.275), fifth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.39) and seventh in fewest walks per nine innings (2.10).

**THE LAST THREE YEARS:** Is 27-11 (.711) with a 3.27 ERA (131 er in 361.0 ip) in 65 games (62 starts) over the last three years...based on a minimum of 300 innings pitched, he ranks second in the American League in winning percentage over that span, third in ERA and fifth in opponents OPS (.662)...is eighth in wins...was 4-14 (.222) with a 3.86 ERA in 40 games (30 starts) over his first four seasons.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His opponents batting average breaks down to .195 (53-for-272) with a .605 OPS against left-handed hitters and .237 (71-for-299) with a .637 OPS against right-handers...has yielded just four home runs in 299 at bats against right-handed hitters...has surrendered 11 of his 15 home runs this year and 29 of 42 over the last three years to lefties...has allowed a .184 (23-for-125) batting average with runners in scoring position...10 of the 15 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...the opponents number three hitter is batting .171 (12-for-70) and he has a .207 career average against the three hitter...has a .139 opponents average with two strikes.

**BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK:** Took the loss in each of his first two starts (5.56 ERA) but then went 10-0 with a 3.04 ERA over his final 17 starts before the All-Star Break...was 10-2 with a 3.28 ERA in 17 starts before the All-Star Break and is 2-2 with a 2.75 ERA (11 er in 36.0 ip) in seven starts since the break...led the AL in innings before the break (118.0), tied for the lead in wins, tied for second in winning percentage (.833), ranked fifth in opponents OPS (.628), seventh in strikeouts (118) and eighth in ERA...the strikeouts were fourth most in Athletics history before the break and were the most since Vida Blue had 120 in 1975.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 8-1 with a 3.75 ERA (35 er in 84.0 ip) in 15 starts on the road compared to 4-3 with a 2.44 ERA in 11 starts at home...allowed a .196 opponents batting average and .549 OPS in the Coliseum (.234 and .680 on the road)...ranks third in the AL in road wins...is now 13-13 in 46 career appearances in Oakland, but has a 2.44 ERA, which is fourth lowest in Coliseum history among pitchers with at least 200 innings.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 8-1 with a 2.76 ERA (30 er in 98.0 ip) and .579 opponents OPS in 16 starts on five days rest or more compared to 4-2 with a 3.73 ERA (21 er in 50.2 ip) and .699 OPS in nine starts on four days rest.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 17-9 (.654) in his starting assignments and are 40-22 (.645) when he starts over the last three years...has tossed at least seven innings in 11 of his 26 starts...has allowed six hits or fewer 23 times,

two runs or fewer 18 times and walked one batter or fewer 17 times...has left with the lead and was the pitcher of record in three of his nine no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save (May 5 vs. Toronto, May 16 at Minnesota, June 19 at New York-AL)...according to TruMedia, has a .470 opponents OPS with his four-seam fastball, which is second lowest in the majors with a minimum of 400 pitches (Hader, MIL .403).

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss to Seattle last Thursday in Oakland...tossed 3.0 scoreless innings and allowed just one hit in his first start since being hit in the face by a line drive on Aug. 17 at Chicago (AL)...struck out Seager in the first inning for the 500th strikeout of his career...left after three innings with a 3-0 lead.

**BASSITT vs. SEATTLE:** Is 1-4 with a 4.05 ERA (60.0 ip, 53 h, 29 r, 27 er, 28 bb, 49 so, 5 hr) in 13 career appearances, including 11 starts...is 1-2 with a 5.12 ERA (22 er in 38.2 ip) in nine games in Seattle and 0-2 with a 2.11 ERA (5 er in 21.1 ip) in four starts in Oakland...is 0-0 with a 6.00 ERA (12.0 ip, 12 h, 8 r, 8 er, 5 bb, 16 so, 3 hr) in three starts this year...the first no decision came in a 12-6 A's win at Seattle on June 1...had a 1-0 lead when he yielded three straight RBI doubles to Haniger, Seager and France in the third inning...
