OAKLAND ATHLETICS (85-73) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (88-70)

WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 29, 2021 — T-MOBILE PARK — 7:10 PDT RHP FRANKIE MONTAS (13-9, 3.48) VS. RHP LOGAN GILBERT (6-5, 4.83) NBCSCA — A'S CAST ON IHEART RADIO — A'S RADIO NETWORK (960 AM, 103.7 FM HD2, 1140 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight and six of the last nine games...are 8-6 over the last 14 games and are 17-24 dating back to Aug. 15...started the year 0-6, went a Major League best 44-21 (.677) from April 7-June 18 (first game at New York-AL), and are 41-46 (.471) since then...are 85-73 (.538) overall and have clinched a winning record in four straight seasons for the first time since 1999-2006 when they did it eight straight years...are in fifth place in the AL Wild Card race and are 3½ games behind the second wild card team, Boston...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...are in third place in the AL West and with a loss today, will clinch a third place finish after three straight top two finishes (1st in 2020, 2nd in 2018 and 2019)...were eliminated from the West in game 157 on Monday...held at least a share of first in the West for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 and spent 71 consecutive days in sole possession of second place from June 21 to Sept. 3...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 77 days in second, seven days tied for second, 16 days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

UNTIL THE END: The A's have a tragic number of two to be eliminated in the AL Wild Card race...can be eliminated with a loss today in game 159 as that would put the A's four games behind the Mariners with three to play...the only times in Oakland history the A's have been eliminated in game 159 or later is 1976 (159) and 2004 (161)...the earliest they could clinch a Wild Card is the final game and the only time they have clinched a playoff berth in game 162 was in 2014.

A's IN SEPTEMBER: The A's are 12-14 (.462) in September, which is the fifth worst record in the American League and their first losing September since 2016 when they went 10-17...are hitting .250 (219-for-876) with a .724 OPS...rank third in the AL in runs (135) and fewest stolen bases (7)...have a 5.25 ERA (133 er in 228.0 ip) and .803 opponents OPS, both of which are second highest to the Orioles (5.61 and .811)...the bullpen is 5-7 with five saves, seven blown saves and a 6.32 ERA (69 er in 98.1 ip).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .238, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have hit under .240 in a full season just three times in Oakland history (.236 in 1982, .238 in 2012, .239 in 1979)...rank sixth in runs scored (723), seventh in on-base percentage (.317), eighth in OPS (.722) and 10th in slugging (.405)...lead the AL with an Athletics record 96 hit by pitches...also rank third in sacrifice flies (48), fourth in fewest strikeouts (1317),

fifth in doubles (268) and walks (534) and tied for fifth in sacrifice hits (17).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters lead the American League in hits (33) and plate appearances (156), are tied for the lead in home runs (4), rank second in RBI (24) and extra base hits (10) and tied for second in doubles (6)...the 33 hits and 24 RBI are second most by A's pinch hitters over the last 23 years (had 34 hits in 2015 and 25 RBI in 2019).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 85-for-105 (81.0%) in stolen base attempts...rank second in the American League in stolen base percentage (Cleveland, 86.3%) and fourth in steals...were successful in 89.7% of their stolen base attempts last year but the highest percentage in a full season in Athletics history is 80.7% in 2008... the 85 steals are the most by an A's team since 2012 (122).

PITCHING: Jake Diekman struck out Kyle Seager in the seventh inning last night for the A's 1,300th strikeout of the season...that broke the Athletics single-season record of 1,299 set in 2019...now have 1,302...the A's rank fifth in the American League in opponents OPS (.705) and slugging percentage (.398), sixth in ERA (3.96) and on-base percentage (.308) and seventh in opponents batting average (.246)...have walked 429 batters, which is tied with the Rays for the fewest in the AL...it is fourth fewest in Oakland history in a full season (5th fewest is 430, 6th fewest is 440)...have allowed 181 home runs, which is tied for third fewest in the AL but is seventh most in Oakland history (6th is 184, 5th is 185, 4th is 197).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 56-51 with a 3.87 ERA (376 er in 874.1 ip)...rank fourth in the American League in wins and fifth in ERA and opponents OPS (.711)...are tied for second in complete games (3)...lead the majors with 874.0 innings pitched, which is 19.1 innings more than the next closest team (Astros, 855.0)...the fewest innings pitched by a ML leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 Mets.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has a .695 opponents OPS, which is fifth lowest in the American League...ranks ninth in ERA (4.11)...has converted 38-of-66 (57.6%) save opportunities, which is the third lowest percentage...the 28 blown saves are tied for second most in the AL (Mariners, 31) and tied for second most in Oakland history to the record of 30 in 2019...has 22 losses, which is the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors (Brewers and Giants, 21)...has the sec-

ond highest slugging percentage (.429) and fifth highest batting average (.243) against first batters faced...has the third fewest inherited runners (174).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 69 errors, which is second fewest in the American League to the Astros (64)...the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season is 80 in 2019...also have the second fewest unearned runs (45), are tied for the second fewest outfield assists (16) and have the fourth fewest double plays (114).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on the final road trip of the season, a six-game trip to Seattle (0-2) and Houston (three games)...are 42-35 (.545) on the road, which is the third best road record in the American League...have clinched a .500 record on the road for the fourth straight season, which is the second longest such streak by an A's team over the last 89 years (had five straight from 1971-75)...finished the season with a 43-38 (.531) record in Oakland, which marks the fifth consecutive season and 10th time in the last 12 years the A's have finished with a winning record at home...rank fourth in the AL in road OPS (.745), batting average (.247) and runs scored (384)...have the second lowest home batting average (.229), third lowest OPS (.699) and fourth fewest runs (339).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 23-26 (.469) in one-run games...lead the American League in one-run losses and the 49 one-run decisions are second most to the Mariners (51)...are 36-41 (.468) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 49-32 (.605) in games decided by three runs or more...have a six-game winning streak in extra innings and are 8-3 (.727) overall, which is the second best record in the majors to the Cardinals (7-2, .778)...are 14-4 (.778) in extra innings over the last two years...have eight losses when leading at the conclusion of seven innings of play, which is tied with the Mariners for second most in the AL (Red Sox, 10)...are 19-11 in games decided in the last at bat... finished the season with 12 walk-off wins, which tied for third most in Oakland history...are tied with the Rockies and Phillies for the most walk-off wins this year...have 95 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's have lost the season series for the seventh time in the last nine years as they are 4-14 entering the final game today...the 14 losses match the most in A's history against any team since divisional play began in 1969 (Seattle, 2007 and 2009; Minnesota, 1973)...have not lost more than 14 games to one team in one season since 1964 when they went 2-16 against the White Sox...have lost each of the last 11 games, which is the A's longest losing streak against the Mariners and tied for fifth longest against any team in Oakland history...it is their longest since losing 11 straight to the Yankees from July 5, 2010-July 22, 2011...have not lost more than 11 straight games to one team since dropping 12 straight to the Angels from Sept. 18, 1996-Sept. 17, 1997 (the Oakland record is 13)...10 of the 14 losses to Seattle this year have been by two runs or fewer...are 3-6 in Seattle and went 1-8 in Oakland, which matches the A's worst home record against the Mariners (2007 and 2016)...are 66-95 (.410) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the A's worst mark against any American League team over that span...all-time, the A's are 370-319 against the Mariners...that includes 198-144 in Oakland, 171-172 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 95-108 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Andrew Chafin ranks sixth among Major League relievers in ERA (1.73) and opponents OPS (.517) and tied for 10th in games (70)...Matt Chapman leads ML third basemen with 165 putouts, which are the most by a ML third baseman since Darrell Evans had 185 for Atlanta in 1974...Starling Marte leads the majors in stolen bases (45), ranks sixth in on-base percentage (.384) and seventh in batting average (.311)...Matt Olson ranks third in the American League in OPS (.921), tied for third in extra base hits (73), fourth in RBI (109), walks (87) and on-base percentage (.376), fifth in slugging percentage (.546), tied for fifth in home runs (38) and eighth in runs scored (100).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1962 Bill Fischer walks Detroit's Bubba Morton on four pitches, snapping a string of 84 1/3 consecutive innings without walking a batter...in 1983 rookie pitcher Mike Warren, who started the year in Double-A, no hits the Western Division Champion Chicago White Sox in the A's 3-0 win...in 1988 the A's defeat the Minnesota Twins 6-2 for their 102nd win of the season, breaking the Oakland record of 101 set in 1971...in 1991 Rickey Henderson is a perfect 5 for 5 as the A's defeat Texas 19-5...Jose Canseco is 4 for 4 and Henderson, Canseco and Dave Henderson drive in four runs each...in 2001 Miguel Tejada hits for the cycle, capping the feat with a seventh inning grand slam in the A's 8-4 win at Seattle.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (13-9, 3.48 ERA)

LAST SEVEN STARTS: Is 4-0 with a 1.80 ERA (9 er in 45.0 ip) and .168 (26-for-155) opponents batting average over his last seven starts...left with the lead in two of those starts only to have the bullpen blow the save...the four-game winning streak is one short of his career high of five (May 17-June 15, 2019).

TWO TEAMMATES

STRIKEOUTS: Struck out his 200th batter of the season in his last start to become the fifth pitcher in Oakland history and 14th in Athletics history to reach the 200 plateau...needs six strikeouts today to finish with the second best strikeout total in Oakland history to Vida Blue's record of 301 in 1971...his average of 9.94 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in Athletics history ahead of Sean Manaea's 9.74 this year...the previous record was 8.80 by Todd Stottlemyre in 1995...now has 462 career strikeouts in 442.0 innings, an average of 9.41 per nine innings.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for the American League lead in games started, ranks third in ERA, opponents slugging percentage (.378), innings pitched (181.0) and fewest home runs per nine innings

(0.99), tied for third in wins, fourth in strikeouts, fifth in opponents OPS (.675), sixth in batting average (.234), eighth in on-base percentage (.297) and ninth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.57).

CAREER BESTS: Is scheduled to make his 32nd start of the season today, which doubles his previous career high of 16 in 2019...his 181.0 innings pitched nearly doubles his previous best of 96.0 in 2019...has career highs in every category...has the second lowest ERA, opponents OPS, batting average and on-base percentage to his numbers in 2019 (2.63, .646, .230, .282).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Was 8-7 with a 4.41 ERA, .258 opponents batting average, .737 OPS and 14 home runs in 100.0 innings and 18 starts before the All-Star Break...is 5-2 with a 2.33 ERA (21 er in 81.0 ip), .201 (57-for-283) opponents average, .589 OPS and six home runs in 81.0 innings and 13 starts since the break...has the lowest opponents OPS and batting average in the AL since the break, ranks second in slugging percentage (.311), third in ERA and strikeouts (95) and fifth in on-base percentage (.278)...the batting average is sixth lowest in Oakland history after the break and the strikeout are seventh most.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average breaks down to .230 (76-for-331) with a .677 OPS against left-handed hitters and .239 (84-for-352) with a .673 OPS against right-handers...has a .235 opponents average and 11 home runs with the bases empty, .233 with nine home runs with runners on base...opponents are hitting .193 the first time through the order, .274 the second time and .233 after that...the opponents three, four and five hitters have a combined .194 batting average against him...has the lowest batting average against the three hitter in the AL (.177) and the second lowest mark against the four hitter (.195)... has a .164 opponents average with two strikes and has a .164 career average in that situation.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 5-4 with a 2.87 ERA (22 er in 69.0 ip) and .211 (54-for-256) opponents batting average in 11 starts against AL West teams compared to 8-5 with a 3.86 ERA and .248 opponents average in 20 starts against all other teams...is now 15-9 with a 3.42 ERA (77 er in 202.2 ip) in 44 career appearances against the AL West, 16-14 with a 4.32 ERA in 57 games against all other teams... is 3-5 with a 6.42 ERA in 15 career interleague appearances.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 5-2 with a 2.41 ERA in 11 starts during the day compared to 8-7 with a 4.12 ERA (52 er in 113.2 ip) in 20 starts at night...his day ERA is third lowest in the AL.

BY INNING: Has allowed 20 of his 77 runs in the third inning for a 5.87 ERA, .323 opponents batting average and .869 OPS...has a 2.61 ERA, .183 average and .595 OPS in innings 1-2, and a 3.26 ERA, .233 opponents average and .652 OPS from the fourth inning on.

SEVEN INNINGS: Has tossed seven innings or fewer in each of his 31 starts and now has a streak of 43 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to Sept. 25, 2019...that is the longest such streak in Athletics history, topping the previous long of 40 by Chris Bassitt from May 21, 2019-May 16, 2021...last tossed more than seven innings on June 20, 2019 against Tampa Bay (8.0 ip)...has seven starts of 7.0 innings and is 5-0 with a 0.73 ERA (4 er in 49.0 ip) and .130 (21-for-161) opponents average in those starts.

THIS AND THAT: Has nine no decisions, five of which have come in extra inning games...the A's are 17-14 (.548) in his starting assignments...has four games of 10 or more strikeouts, which is tied for the fourth most 10-strikeout games in a

season in Oakland history...now has seven in his career, which is tied for fifth in Oakland history...according to TruMedia, has thrown 657 splitters, which is second most in the majors (Gausman, SF 1029)...opponents are hitting .130 with a .365 OPS off his splitter and he has allowed just one home run.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 14-2 victory over Houston last Friday in Oakland...allowed an unearned run in the first inning when Altuve reached third on a Chapman error and scored on a Gurriel sacrifice fly...then surrendered a leadoff home run to Altuve in the third but that would be the last run he would allow in seven innings of work...the A's scored three times in the bottom of the third to take the lead for good.

in a 4-2 decision in Oakland on May 24...allowed a RBI double to Kelenic in the first, a two-run home run to Lewis in the third and a lead off home run to Kelenic in the fifth...struck out 11 batters...then had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss at Seattle on July 23...struck out 10 batters and walked just one in 6.0 innings...yielded back-to-back home runs to Raleigh (two-run) and Torrens (solo) in the second innings, but those were the only runs he would allow...retired 15 of the final 17 batters he faced...the A's scored single runs in the third, fourth and fifth innings and he was relieved by Diekman to start the seventh with the score tied 3-3.
