



## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (85-74) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (93-66)

FRIDAY, OCTOBER 1, 2021 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 7:10 CDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Each of the A's last four series have been sweeps as the A's swept Los Angeles-AL (Sept. 17-19) and Houston (Sept. 24-26) and were swept by Seattle twice (Sept. 20-23 and Sept. 27-29)...have swept 10 series this year and been swept five times...are 17-25 (.405) dating back to Aug. 15...started the year 0-6, went a Major League best 44-21 (.677) from April 7-June 18 (first game at New York-AL), and are 41-47 (.465) since then...are 85-74 (.535) overall and have clinched a winning record in four straight seasons for the first time since 1999-2006 when they did it eight straight years...it is the first the A's had a winning record and did not make the playoffs since 2005 (88-74)...will finish in third place in the American League West after three straight top two finishes (1st in 2020, 2nd in 2018 and 2019)...held at least a share of first in the West for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 and spent 71 consecutive days in sole possession of second place from June 21 to Sept. 3...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 77 days in second, seven days tied for second, 18 days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...were eliminated from the AL West in game 157 on Monday and the AL Wild Card in game 159 on Wednesday...it was just the third time in Oakland history the A's were eliminated from the playoffs in game 159 or later (159 in 1976, 161 in 2004).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .238, which is third lowest in the American League...have hit under .240 in a full season just three times in Oakland history (.236 in 1982, .238 in 2012, .239 in 1979)...have 193 home runs and need seven in the final three games to reach 200 for the eighth time in Oakland history...have 1,257 hits and the fewest hits in a full season in Oakland history is 1,276 in 1979...lead the AL with an Athletics record 96 hit by pitches, are tied for third in sacrifice flies (48), rank fourth in fewest strikeouts (1323) and fifth in doubles (268) and walks (537)...are sixth runs scored (725), seventh in on-base percentage (.317), eighth in OPS (.721) and 10th in slugging (.405).

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters lead the American League in hits (33) and plate appearances (156), are tied for the lead in home runs (4), rank second in RBI (24) and extra base hits (10) and tied for second in doubles (6)...the 33 hits and 24 RBI are second most by A's pinch hitters over the last 23 years (had 34 hits in 2015 and 25 RBI in 2019).

**ON THE BASES:** The A's are 85-for-105 (81.0%) in stolen base attempts...rank second in the American League in stolen base percentage (Cleveland, 86.6%) and fourth in steals...were successful in 89.7% of their stolen base attempts last year but the highest percentage in a full season in Athletics history is 80.7% in 2008...the 85 steals are the most by an A's team since 2012 (122).

**PITCHING:** The A's rank fifth in the American League in opponents OPS (.704) and slugging percentage (.397), sixth in ERA (3.95) and on-base percentage (.307) and seventh in opponents batting average (.245)...have a franchise record 1311 strikeouts, breaking the mark of 1299 set in 2019...have walked 431 batters, which is tied with the Rays for the fewest in the AL...it is fifth fewest in Oakland history in a full season (6th fewest is 440, 7th fewest is 462)...have allowed 182 home runs, which is fourth fewest in the AL but is seventh most in Oakland history (6th is 184, 5th is 185, 4th is 197).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 56-51 with a 3.84 ERA (376 er in 880.1 ip)...rank fourth in the American League in ERA and wins and fifth in opponents OPS (.709)...are tied for second in complete games (3)...lead the majors with 880.1 innings pitched, which is 13.2 innings more than the next closest team (Astros, 866.0)...the fewest innings pitched by a ML leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 Mets.

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has a .697 opponents OPS, which is fifth lowest in the American League...ranks ninth in ERA (4.13)...has converted 38-of-66 (57.6%) save opportunities, which is the third lowest percentage...the 28 blown saves are tied for second most in the AL (Mariners, 31) and tied for second most in Oakland history to the record of 30 in 2019...has 23 losses, which is tied with the Red Sox for the fewest in the AL...has the second highest slugging percentage (.428) and fifth highest batting average (.242) against first batters faced...has the third fewest inherited runners (174).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 71 errors, which is second fewest in the American League to the Astros (66)...the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season is 80 in 2019...also have the second fewest unearned runs (46), are tied for the second fewest outfield assists (16) and have the fourth fewest double plays (114)...the 114 double plays are currently second fewest in a full season in Oakland history (3rd fewest is 115, 4th fewest is 120 in 1986, tied for fifth fewest is 123, seventh fewest is 125).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-3 on the final road trip of the season, a six-game trip to Seattle (0-3) and Houston (three games)...are 42-36 (.545) on the road and have clinched a .500 record on the road for the fourth straight season...that is the second longest such streak by an A's team over the last 89 years (had five straight from 1971-75)...finished the season with a 43-38 (.531) record in Oakland, which marks the fifth consecutive season and 10th time in the last 12 years the A's have finished with a winning record at home...need to win two of the final three games to finish with a better record on the road for the fifth time in Oakland history (1971, 1990, 1994, 2016)...rank fourth in the AL in road OPS (.743), batting average (.246) and runs scored (386)...have the second lowest home batting average (.229), third lowest OPS (.699) and fourth fewest runs (339).

**ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 23-26 (.469) in one-run games...lead the American League in one-run losses and the 49 one-run decisions are second most to the Mariners (51)...are 36-42 (.462) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 49-32 (.605) in games decided by three runs or more...have a six-game winning streak in extra innings and are 8-3 (.727) overall, which is the second best record in the majors to the Cardinals (7-2, .778)...are 14-4 (.778) in extra innings over the last two years...have eight losses when leading at the conclusion of seven innings of play, which is tied with the Mariners for second most in the AL (Red Sox, 10)...are 19-11 in games decided in the last at bat...finished the season with 12 walk-off wins, which tied for third most in Oakland history...are tied with the Rockies and Phillies for the most walk-off wins this year...have 95 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

**PLAYER NOTES:** The A's have used 49 players, which is tied for fifth fewest in the majors (Kozma would be number 50 and the 999th in Oakland history)...are tied with the Astros and White Sox for the fewest starting pitchers (9), have the third fewest relievers (21) and the fourth fewest pitchers (27)...have used 152 different lineups in 159 games...have five pitchers with 100 or more strikeouts, which matches the most in Athletics history (sixth time, last: 2013)...have six pitchers with eight or more wins, which matches the most in Oakland history (1975, 1988, 2003)...six different players have played shortstop, which is the most by an A's team since 1998 (also 6).

**A'S IN SEPTEMBER:** The A's went 12-15 (.444) in September, which tied for the third worst record in the American League...it was their first losing September since 2016 when they went 10-17...hit .247 with a .719 OPS...ranked fourth in the AL in runs (137) and walks (90)...had the third fewest stolen bases (7) and tied for the third fewest extra base hits (77)...had the second highest opponents OPS (.795) and third highest ERA (5.15)...the bullpen was 5-8 with five saves, seven blown saves and a 6.37 ERA.

**A'S vs. ASTROS:** The A's are 7-9 against the Astros...went 4-6 in Oakland and are 3-3 in Houston...won the season last year 7-3 but lost each of the five season series prior to that...are 51-70 (.421) against Houston over the last seven years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 82-83 all-time, including 46-41 in Oakland and 36-42 in Houston.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Andrew Chafin** ranks sixth among Major League relievers in ERA (1.83), eighth in opponents OPS (.521) and tied for ninth in games (71)...**Matt Chapman** leads ML third basemen with 166 putouts, which are the most by a ML third baseman since Darrell Evans had 185 for Atlanta in 1974 and third most in Oakland history behind Sal Bando (188 in 1968, 178 in 1969)...**Starling Marte** leads the majors in stolen bases (45) and ranks seventh in batting average (.308) and on-base percentage (.381)...**Matt Olson** ranks fourth in the American League in OPS (.918), on-base percentage (.375), RBI (109) and walks (88), tied for fourth in extra base hits (73), sixth in slugging (.543), tied for sixth in home runs (38), eighth in total bases (299) and ninth in runs scored (100).

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1931** Lefty Grove defeats St. Louis 6-2 in the first game of the World Series... in **1950** Gus Zernial hits three home runs in the first game of a doubleheader against Chicago but the A's lose 4-3...he adds another home run in the nightcap, a 10-6 loss...in **2000** Tim Hudson combines with Jason Isringhausen on a six-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over Texas in the final game of the season... it is Hudson's 20<sup>th</sup> win of the season and it clinches the A's 11<sup>th</sup> AL West Championship...in **2003** Ramon Hernandez has a "walk-off" bunt in the 12<sup>th</sup> inning as the A's defeat Boston 5-4 in Game 1 of the ALDS...in **2020** the A's snap their Major League record nine-game losing streak in winner-take-all postseason games with a 6-4 win over Chicago to win the AL Wild Card Series.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (10-10, 3.94 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is 10-10 with a 3.94 ERA in 31 starts entering his final start of the season...has posted a winning record in each of his previous four seasons and is attempting to become the fifth pitcher in Oakland history with at least five straight winning seasons...the last to do it was Tim Hudson, who had an Oakland record six straight winning seasons from 1999-2004...the others are Catfish Hunter (1970-74), Dave Stewart (1986-1990) and Dennis Eckersley (1988-92)...has not finished .500 or worse since going 7-9 as a rookie in 2016...this is his third 10-win season and he joins Trevor Cahill as the only A's pitchers over the last 16 years with three 10-win seasons.

**CAREER NOTES:** Is 49-41 with a 3.87 ERA and 635 strikeouts in 128 games, including 127 starts, in six seasons with the A's...the wins, strikeouts and games started are the most by an A's pitcher over the last 18 years...in the Wild Card era (1995-present), the only A's pitchers with more wins, strikeouts or starts are Barry Zito (102 wins, 1098 strikeouts, 224 starts), Tim Hudson (92, 899, 183) and Mark Mulder (81, 668 and 150).

**WALKS AND STRIKEOUTS:** Has a career-high 188 strikeouts and has walked just 40 in a career-high 173.2 innings...the strikeouts rank eighth in the American League and 11th in Oakland history...his average of 9.74 strikeouts per nine innings is the second best mark in Athletics history to Frankie Montas, who averaged 9.96 this year...his 4.70 strikeout-to-walk ratio ranks fourth in the AL and is second best in Oakland history to Brandon McCarthy's 4.92 in 2011...his average of 2.07 walks per nine innings is sixth lowest in the AL...now has an average of 2.23 walks per nine innings in his career, which is fourth lowest in Oakland history (min. 500 ip).

**MORE LEADERS AND BESTS:** His career-high 31 starts are tied for fifth in the AL...is the only AL pitcher and one of five in the majors with two shutouts...is one of two AL pitchers with two complete games (Cole, NYY)...the complete games and shutouts are career highs as are his 172 hits and 25 home runs...has matched his high in losses.

**THE FIRST 14 AND THE LAST 17:** Was 6-2 with a 2.99 ERA over his first 14 starts through June 14 but is 4-8 with a 4.78 ERA (49 er in 92.1 ip) in 17 starts since then...allowed eight home runs over his first 14 starts, 17 since then...struck out 78 over his first 14 (8.63 per nine innings) but has 110 since then (10.72 per nine innings)...was seventh in the AL in ERA and tied for 10th in wins through June 14...is tied for fifth in losses dating back to June 15.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** His opponents batting average breaks down to .194 (31-for-160) with a .579 OPS against left-handed hitters compared to .272 (141-for-518) with a .759 OPS against right-handers...his OPS and batting average against lefties is second lowest in the AL...has issued 33 of his 40 walks and yielded 48 of his 58 extra base hits to righties.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents are batting .229 with a .655 OPS the first time through the order, .267 with a .733 OPS the second time and .273 with a .789 OPS after that...his career splits are .227/.646 the first time, .253/.720 the second time and .275/.787 after that...has a .182 opponents batting average with two strikes...his .254 opponents batting average increases slightly to .273 with runners in scoring position...the opponents three and four hitter have combined for a .313 batting average.

**THIS AND THAT:** Has a career-high 11 no decisions and the A's are 8-3 in those games...are 18-13 (.581) in his starting assignments and are 29-18 (.617) when he starts over the last three years...has walked two batters or fewer in 25 of his 31 starts, including eight starts with no walks and 12 starts with one...has three 10-strikeout games and is the 11th pitcher (12th time) in Oakland history with three or more 10-strikeout games...now has six in his career, which is tied for seventh most in Oakland history...has just one unearned run, which matches the fewest in Oakland history by a qualifier for the ERA title...has a 5-5 record at home, 5-5 on the road...is 4-4 during the day, 6-6 at night...was 6-6 before the All-Star Break and is 4-4 since the break...has received one run of support or fewer in 13 of his starts...is 0-8 with one run of support or fewer, 10-2 with two runs of support or more.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win over Houston last Saturday in Oakland...shut out the Astros on a hit, a walk and a hit batter over the first six innings but Valdez blanked the A's on two hits and four walks over that stretch...Manaea allowed a one-out solo home run to Tucker in the seventh but the A's came back to tie the game in the bottom of the inning...was relieved by Trivino to start the eighth.

**MANAEA vs. HOUSTON:** Is 3-7 with a 3.44 ERA (102.0 ip, 93 h, 44 r, 39 er, 26 bb, 87 so, 13 hr) in 18 career regular season starts...has received no run support in four of those starts and two runs or fewer 11 times...also started Game 2 of the 2020 ALDS and was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss (4.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...is 1-4 with a 4.47 ERA (28 er in 56.1 ip) in 10 starts in Oakland, 2-3 with a 2.17 ERA (11 er in 45.2 ip) in eight starts in Houston...is 0-2 with a 3.86 ERA (30.1 ip, 29 h, 14 r, 13 er, 5 bb, 25 so, 6 hr) in five starts this year...the first loss came in a 9-2 decision in Oakland on April 4...allowed a solo home run to Tucker in the first inning, a two-run home run to Castro in the second and a two-run double to Gurriel in the third...then had a no decision in the A's 6-2 win at Houston on April 9...allowed his only run in the fourth when Gurriel walked, went to third on a Correa single and scored on a Tucker ground out...also had a no decision in the A's 6-5 win in Oakland on May 18...allowed 10 hits but did not walk a batter...allowed a two-run double to Alvarez in the first and a lead-off home run to Tucker in the fourth...then lost a 4-3 decision at Houston on July 7...allowed a three-run home run to Altuve in the third and a solo home run to Tucker in the seventh...then had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win in Oakland in his last start last Saturday (see last start above).
