



OAKLAND ATHLETICS (86-75) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (94-67)

ABOUT THE A'S: Each of the A's last four series have been sweeps as the A's swept Los Angeles-AL (Sept. 17-19) and Houston (Sept. 24-26) and were swept by Seattle twice (Sept. 20-23 and Sept. 27-29)...have swept 10 series this year and been swept five times...are 18-26 (.409) dating back to Aug. 15...started the year 0-6, went a Major League best 44-21 (.677) from April 7-June 18 (first game at New York-AL), and are 42-48 (.467) since then...are 86-75 (.534) overall and have clinched a winning record in four straight seasons for the first time since 1999-2006 when they did it eight straight years...it is the first time the A's had a winning record and did not make the playoffs since 2005 (88-74)...will finish in third place in the American League West after three straight top two finishes (1st in 2020, 2nd in 2018 and 2019)...held at least a share of first in the West for 61 of 62 days from April 20 to June 20 and spent 71 consecutive days in sole possession of second place from June 21 to Sept. 3...held at least a share of a playoff spot each day from April 17-Aug. 22...overall, have spent 58 days alone in first place in the West, three days tied for first, 77 days in second, seven days tied for second, 20 days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...were eliminated from the AL West in game 157 on Monday and the AL Wild Card in game 159 on Wednesday...it was just the third time in Oakland history the A's were eliminated from the playoffs in game 159 or later (159 in 1976, 161 in 2004).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .238, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have hit under .240 in a full season just three times in Oakland history (.236 in 1982, .238 in 2012, .239 in 1979)...have 195 home runs and need five in the final game to reach 200 for the eighth time in Oakland history...have 1,276 hits, matching the fewest hits in a full season in Oakland history in 1979...lead the AL with an Athletics record 97 hit by pitches, are tied for third in sacrifice flies (48), rank fourth in fewest strikeouts (1343) and fifth in walks (544)...are sixth runs scored (737) and doubles (271) seventh in on-base percentage (.317), eighth in OPS (.722) and 10th in slugging (.405).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters lead the American League in hits (34) and plate appearances (157), are tied for the lead in home runs (4), rank second in RBI (25) and extra base hits (10) and tied for second in doubles (6)...the 34 hits and 25 RBI are tied for most by A's pinch hitters over the last 23 years (had 34 hits in 2015 and 25 RBI in 2019).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 88-for-108 (81.5%) in stolen base attempts...rank second in the American League in stolen base percentage (Cleveland, 86.1%) and fourth in steals...were successful in 89.7% of their stolen base attempts last year but the highest percentage in a full season in Athletics history is 80.7% in 2008...the 88 steals are the most by an A's team since 2012 (122).

PITCHING: The A's rank fifth in the American League in opponents OPS (.709) and slugging percentage (.400), sixth in ERA (4.00) and on-base percentage (.308) and eighth in opponents batting average (.247)...have a franchise record 1326 strikeouts, breaking the mark of 1299 set in 2019...have walked 436 batters, which second to the Rays for the fewest in the AL...it is fifth fewest in Oakland history in a full season (6th fewest is 440, 7th fewest is 462)...have allowed 187 home runs, which is tied for fifth fewest in the AL but is fifth most in Oakland history (4th is 197).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 57-52 with a 3.89 ERA (384 er in 888.0 ip)...rank fourth in the American League in ERA and wins and fifth in opponents OPS (.713)...are tied for second in complete games (3)...lead the majors with 888.0 innings pitched, which is 12.1 innings more than the next closest team (Astros, 875.2)...the fewest innings pitched by a ML leader in a season of at least 154 games is 941.1 by the 2019 Mets.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has a .701 opponents OPS, which is sixth lowest in the American League...ranks 10th in ERA (4.18)...has converted 39-of-67 (58.2%) save opportunities, which is the third lowest percentage...the 28 blown saves are tied for second most in the AL (Mariners, 33) and tied for second most in Oakland history to the record of 30 in 2019...has 23 losses, which is tied with the Red Sox for the fewest in the AL...has the second highest slugging percentage (.433) and fifth highest batting average (.242) against first batters faced...has the third fewest inherited runners (179).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 72 errors, which is second fewest in the American League to the Astros (71)...the Athletics record for fewest errors in a season is 80 in 2019...also have the second fewest unearned runs (47), are tied for the second fewest outfield assists (16) and are tied for third fewest double plays (115)...the 115 double plays are currently tied for third fewest in a full season in Oakland history (4th fewest is 120 in 1986, tied for fifth fewest is 123, seventh fewest is 125).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-4 on the final road trip of the season, a six-game trip to Seattle (0-3) and Houston (1-1 + one game)...are 43-37 (.538) on the road and have clinched a .500 record on the road for the fourth straight season...that is the second longest such streak by an A's team over the last 89 years (had five straight from 1971-75)...finished the season with a 43-38 (.531) record in Oakland, which marks the fifth consecutive season and 10th time in the last 12 years the A's have finished with a winning record at home...need to win today to finish with a better record on the road for the fifth time in Oakland history (1971, 1990, 1994, 2016)...rank fourth in the AL in road OPS (.743), batting average (.247) and runs scored (398)...have the second lowest home batting average (.229), third lowest OPS (.699)SSS and fourth fewest runs (339).

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 23-26 (.469) in one-run games...lead the American League in one-run losses and the 49 one-run decisions are second most to the Mariners (52)...are 37-42 (.468) in games decided by two runs or fewer, 49-33 (.598) in games decided by three runs or more...have a six-game winning streak in extra innings and are 8-3 (.727) overall, which is the second best record in the majors to the Cardinals (7-2, .778)...are 14-4 (.778) in extra innings over the last two years...have eight losses when leading at the conclusion of seven innings of play, which is tied with the Mariners for second most in the AL (Red Sox, 10)...are 19-11 in games decided in the last at bat...finished the season with 12 walk-off wins, which tied for third most in Oakland history...are tied with the Rockies and Phillies for the most walk-off wins this year...have 95 walk-off wins in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span.

PLAYER NOTES: The A's have used 50 players, which is sixth fewest in the majors (Kozma is number 50 and the 999th in Oakland history)...are tied with the Astros and White Sox for the fewest starting pitchers (9), have the third fewest relievers (21) and the fourth fewest pitchers (27)...have used 154 different lineups in 161 games...have five pitchers with 100 or more strikeouts, which matches the most in Athletics history (sixth time, last: 2013)...have six pitchers with eight or more wins, which matches the most in Oakland history (1975, 1988, 2003)...seven different players have played shortstop, which ties the Oakland record for most shortstops in a season (also: 1975, 1991, 1997).

A'S IN SEPTEMBER: The A's went 12-15 (.444) in September, which tied for the third worst record in the American League...it was their first losing September since 2016 when they went 10-17...hit .247 with a .719 OPS...ranked fourth in the AL in runs (137) and walks (90)...had the third fewest stolen bases (7) and tied for the third fewest extra base hits (77)...had the second highest opponents OPS (.795) and third highest ERA (5.15)...the bullpen was 5-8 with five saves, seven blown saves and a 6.37 ERA.

A'S vs. ASTROS: The A's are 8-10 against the Astros...went 4-6 in Oakland and are 4-4 in Houston...won the season last year 7-3 but lost each of the five season series prior to that...are 52-71 (.419) against Houston over the last seven years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 83-84 all-time, including 46-41 in Oakland and 37-43 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Tony Kemp is batting .345 (39-for-113) with 14 walks and two hit by pitches over his last 41 games dating back to Aug. 12...**Lou Trivino** has not allowed a run in nine of his last 10 games (12.0 ip, 8 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 15 so, 0.75 ERA)...**Starling Marte** leads the majors with 47 stolen bases, which matches his career high of 47 in 2016...is tied for fourth in the National League in steals (22) and tied for sixth in the American League (25)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, no player has ever finished in the top 10 in steals in the AL and NL in the same season...his 25 steals are the most by an Athletic since Rajai Davis had 26 in 2017...**Matt Olson** leads the majors in home runs (22) and RBI (50) against left-handed pitchers...the home runs are an Oakland record and the RBI match the Oakland record (Reggie, 1973)...has the most home runs in a single season as a left-handed hitter against left-handed pitching ever.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1925 Al Simmons goes 2-for-5 and Stan Baumgartner tosses a six-hit shutout in the A's 10-0 win over New York...the two hits bring Simmons' season total to 250 and he added three more the next day to finish the season with an Athletics record 253...in 1930 George Earnshaw tosses a six-hitter as the A's defeat St. Louis 6-1 in Game 2 of the World Series...in 2001 Miguel Tejada hits his 30th home run of the season, making the A's the first team in major league history to have both their shortstop and third baseman (Eric Chavez) hit 30 home runs.

PITCHING PROBABLES

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (10-15, 4.18 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was acquired by the A's from Philadelphia for cash considerations on Jan. 30 and is 10-15 with a 4.18 ERA in 31 starts after going 2-2 with a 6.75 ERA in 19 games, including three starts, in two seasons with the Phillies...his 15 losses are the most in the American League and the most by an A's pitcher since Jesse Chavez had 15 in 2015...a loss today would tie him for the seventh most losses in a season in Oakland history...the last A's pitcher to lose 16 games is Greg Smith in 2008.

THREE TRUE OUTCOMES: Has a .276 opponents batting average but has walked just 41 batters in 172.1 innings...his average of 2.14 walks per nine innings is eighth lowest in the AL...has walked just 55 batters in 217.2 career innings (2.27 per nine innings)...has struck out just 121 this year and his average of 6.32 strikeouts per nine innings is fourth lowest in the AL...has allowed 20 home runs and is seventh in the AL in fewest home runs per nine innings (1.04).

MORE LEADERS: Is tied for sixth in the AL in games started (31) and 10th in innings pitched (172.1)...is averaging 15.1 pitches per inning, which is the fewest in the AL and second fewest in the majors to the Cardinals Adam Wainwright (14.8)...has allowed the second most hits in the AL (190) and his opponents batting average and on-base percentage (.324) are third highest among the 17 qualifiers.

UPS AND DOWNS: Went 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA and .868 OPS over his first two starts, 3-2 with a 1.89 ERA and .586 OPS over his next six starts from April 17 to May 15, 2-3 with a 5.17 ERA and .820 OPS over a seven-start stretch from May 20 to June 22, 3-3 with a 2.44 ERA and .522 OPS over a seven-start span from June 27 to Aug. 7 and is 2-5 with a 6.43 ERA (30 er in 42.0 ip) and .950 OPS over his last nine starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average breaks down to .270 (139-for-514) with a .732 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .293 (51-for-174) with a .764 OPS against left-handers...has surrendered 16 of his 20 home runs to righties...15 have been solo shots...has allowed a .324 (45-for-139) average with runners in scoring position, which is second highest in the AL (Minor, KC .375) and fifth highest in Oakland history...now has a .335 career opponents average with RISP.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 4-12 with a 5.25 ERA (55 er in 94.1 ip) in 18 starts against AL West competition, 6-3 with a 2.88 ERA in 13 starts against everyone else...his 12 intradivision losses match the most in the majors over the last 34 years (last: Porcello, BOS in 2017) and are an Athletics record, topping the previous mark of 11 by Brian Kingman (1980) and Rick Langford (1977 and 1979)...the last pitcher to lose more than 12 intradivision games is Dave LaPoint, who lost 13 for the Giants in 1985...his 5.25 intradivision ERA is fifth highest in the majors this year...went 0-5 with an 8.69 ERA in five starts against Seattle and is 0-3 with a 7.98 ERA in three starts against Houston.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 1-10 with a 6.60 ERA (44 er in 60.0 ip) and .890 OPS in 12 starts on four days rest compared to 9-4 with a 2.67 ERA (32 er in 108.0 ip) and .641 OPS in 18 starts on five days rest or more...his 10 losses on four days rest are the most in the majors...has the highest OPS in the AL and the third highest ERA...is tied for second in the AL in wins on five days rest or more, ranks third in ERA and seventh in OPS.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 6-7 with a 3.84 ERA (35 er in 82.0 ip) in 15 starts at night compared to 4-8 with a 4.48 ERA (45 er in 90.1 ip) in 16 starts during the day...is tied for the most starts during the day in the majors (Stroman, NYM) and ranks second in most losses (Castillo, CIN 9)...the losses are the most by an A's pitcher during the day since Tom Candiotti also had 8 in 1998...however, has a .705 opponents OPS during the day, .779 at night.

THIS AND THAT: Has 20 assists, which is tied for fifth most among AL pitchers...has walked two batters or fewer in 28 of his 31 starts...has five starts with no walks and 15 with one...the A's are 4-2 in his no decisions and are 14-17 (.452) in his starting assignments...has left with the lead only to have the pen blow the save in five of his starts...is 10-3 in 17 starts with more than two runs of support, 0-12 in 14 starts with support of two runs or fewer.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in a 7-0 win on April 17 against Detroit...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto and had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102)...left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of five times the pen blew a save in one of his starts (June 11 vs. Kansas City, July 9 at Texas, Aug. 13 at Texas, Sept. 11 vs. Texas)...compiled a 3-0 record and a 2.64 ERA in five starts in June...the ERA was fourth lowest in the American League and the three-game winning streak was the longest of his career...allowed a run in the first inning on June 5 at Colorado and did not allow another run until the seventh inning of his next start on June 11 against Kansas City for a career-high tying 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings and did

not allow a run in a 6-2 win at San Francisco on June 27...did not allow a run over the first three innings of his next start on July 3 against Boston for another 11.0-inning scoreless streak...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters (13th time, last: Bassitt, April 29, 2021 at Tampa Bay) in a 3-2 loss at Texas on July 9.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 13-4 loss at Seattle on Monday... Oakland scored three times in the first inning and he blanked the Mariners on a walk and two hits over the first two innings...then allowed three runs in the third on a RBI double by France and a two-run single by Torrens...walked the first two batters in the fourth inning and was relieved by Guerra, who allowed both runners to score.

the first loss came in a 9-1 decision in Oakland on April 3...it was his first start since May 22, 2019 with Philadelphia at Chicago (NL)...allowed a RBI single to Tucker in the first but the A's came back to tie the game with a run in the bottom of the first...then allowed a RBI single to Altuve in the second...was relieved by Trivino with runners on first and second and one out in the fifth and Trivino allowed a three-run home run...then lost his next start on April 8 at Houston, 6-2...allowed a leadoff home run to Correa in the second, a RBI double to Correa in the fourth and a solo home run to Alvarez in the sixth...walked the next batter (Correa) and was relieved by Wendelken with a runner on first and one out in the sixth with the A's trailing 3-0...Wendelken allowed Correa to score plus a run of his own...lost for a third time in an 8-4 decision in Oakland on May 20...the A's scored a run in the first, but he allowed three runs in the third inning on a Maldonado RBI double and back-to-back RBI singles by Brantley and Bregman... Oakland got one of those runs back in the bottom of the third but Maldonado hit a two-run home run in the fourth.

- Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas Sept. 14 for his second stint with the A's this year and has pitched six times since his return without allowing a run (7.0 ip, 2 h, 3 bb, 6 so)...did not allow a run in 11 of his last 12 appearances with the Aviators (12.1 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 19 so, 0.73 ERA).
