Twelve of the other 37 spent the majority of their careers in an Athletics uniform including Frank Baker (1908-1914), Chief Bender (1903-1914), Mickey Cochrane (1925-1933), Rollie Fingers (1968-1976), Jimmie Foxx (1925-1935), Lefty Grove (1925-1933), Catfish Hunter (1965-1974), Reggie Jackson (1967-1975, 1987), Connie Mack (1901-1950), Eddie Plank (1901-1914), Al Simmons (1924-1932) and Rube Waddell (1902-1907).
