Homestand Highlights – Promotions and Events

- A's Promotional Giveaway Items: On Sunday, Aug. 14, 10,000 fans will receive a Gio Gonzalez Atléticos hat, courtesy of Chevy, and on Sunday, Aug. 21, 7,500 kids will receive an A's exercise mat, courtesy of Washington Hospital.
- Ray Fosse Bobblehead: In honor of Ray Fosse's storied baseball history as a player and broadcaster, 10,000 fans will receive a Ray Fosse bobblehead, courtesy of Comcast SportsNet California, on Saturday, Aug. 13. Fifty lucky fans through the gates will find a "golden ticket" attached to their bobblehead which enables the recipient and one guest to attend a special pre-game autograph signing with Fosse. A two-time All Star and Gold Glove winner, Fosse is in his 25th consecutive season on the radio and 23rd season in the television booth covering A's games as an Emmy Award-winning broadcaster. - A's Post-Game Fireworks Show: After the game against Toronto on Saturday, Aug. 20, fans will be invited down to the field to enjoy a post-game fireworks show. The Elvis-themed fireworks show was chosen by fans in an online vote and is presented by Chevron. There is one remaining post-game fireworks show this season which is set for Sept. 16 and features songs chosen by A's players.
- Italian Heritage Night: The A's will be celebrating their Inaugural Italian Heritage Night on Friday, Aug. 12. Autographs will be limited to one item per fan and fans are encouraged to bring an item for Bailey to autograph.
- Law Enforcement Day: The A's Law Enforcement Day is set for Saturday, Aug. 13, when the A's take on the Texas Rangers at 1:10 p.m. Fans that pre-purchased designated tickets will receive an entry voucher to a pre-game BBQ tailgate in B Lot. Inside the stadium, the Oakland Police Department and Rotary Day honor guards will be featured in a pre-game presentation of colors. The Mission Gold Jazz Band will be performing at Gate D prior to the game and roaming the concourse during the game. Prior to the first pitch, a motorcade will drive around the warning track of the field. In addition, \$2 of each ticket purchased through the link online will be donated back to the Oakland Police Department.
- A's Fiesta Day: A's Fiesta Day, presented by Chevy, is set for Sunday, Aug. 14, when the A's play the Texas Rangers at 1:05 p.m. The event begins at 10:00 a.m. in A Lot and will feature mariachi music, interactive booths and games, a Chevy Ride and Drive event, and the chance to win an authentic Atléticos jersey and to throw out the ceremonial first pitch. A's pitchers Gio Gonzalez and Guillermo Moscoso will be on hand to sign autographs at the Fiesta Day event. One of the first Mexican-American NASA astronauts in outer space, Jose Hernandez, will also be signing autographs at the pre-game event and will be throwing out the ceremonial first pitch of the game. A's players and coaches will don Atléticos jerseys during the game and 10,000 fans in attendance will receive a Gio Gonzalez Atléticos hat, sponsored by Chevy. - Richmond Police Activities League: The Richmond Police Activities League (RPAL) will be distributing donated backpacks containing school supplies, in addition to an A's water bottle, to 300 children from the RPAL and Building Blocks for Kids beginning at 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday, Aug. 16. A's All-Star starting pitcher **Gio Gonzalez** and relief pitcher **Fautino De Los Santos** will sign autographs and meet with the children as they pick up their backpacks at the RPAL gymnasium (2200 Macdonald Avenue) from 12:00-12:45 p.m. Tuesday. RPAL is a non-profit organization that was formed in 1982 to provide a positive alternative to the streets for boys and girls between five and 18 years of age while Building Blocks for Kids supports the development of healthy children and the self-sufficiency of families living in the Iron Triangle area of Richmond.
- Dinner on the Diamond: The A's Community Fund will hold their fifth annual Dinner on the Diamond event on the field, which will be hosted by Lew and Kari Wolff on Saturday, Aug. 13, at 6:30 p.m. This dinner brings together sponsors, investors and fans along with the A's owners, players, staff and their families in a casual family environment with the collective goal of making a difference in the community. The proceeds from this year's event will benefit the A's Community Fund and Juma Ventures. This event is closed to the public.
