MLB Fan Cave Ceremonial First Pitch: On Wednesday, July 18, A's fan and MLB Fan Cave contestant Ben Christensen will throw out the ceremonial first pitch before the A's vs. Rangers game. Christensen was one of nine original "Cave Dwellers" selected by fan voting from a field of 22,000 applicants to live in the MLB Fan Cave in New York City. Throughout the elimination-style competition, each Cave Dweller represents their favorite team, with Christensen being the only A's representative out of the original nine. Christensen was voted out of the Fan Cave on May 29. The Bakersfield, Calif. native and journalism student at the University of Oregon is most known for his elaborate torso tattoos recognizing every Major League Baseball team. *[SEE SEPARATE ADVISORY]*

- A's Post-Game Radio Show Live Remote: The A's post-game radio show, carried on 95.7 The GAME, will broadcast live on location from the Holiday Inn Oakland Airport Diamond Sports Bar and Grill (77 Hegenberger Rd.) - A's Dog Day at the Park: The A's Seventh Annual Dog Day at the Park, presented by AvoDerm, Adams, and Nylabone, is set for Thursday, July 19 as the A's host the Yankees at 7:05 p.m. Fans who pre-registered for this event can watch the game from the petfriendly Plaza Reserved section of the Coliseum. Prior to the game, fans and their canines will participate in a "Pup Rally" in the A Lot and "Pup Parade" around the warning track of the field. Each dog in attendance will receive an A's bandana and a goody bag of dog product samples.

Chevron STEM Zone Exhibit: The A's and Chevron will launch the **first-ever baseball-themed STEM Zone**, which will feature a hands-on learning experience that highlights the science behind the fundamentals of baseball, July 20-22 during the A's vs. Yankees games at the Oakland Coliseum. Launched in partnership with the Exploratorium, the STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) Zone aims to increase interest in math and the sciences among Bay Area youth. The STEM Zone, located to the south of the Eastside Club near Section 200, will feature learning stations exploring basic concepts of physics, biology, and mathematics behind our National Pastime. The exhibits investigate such topics as bat vibration and the "sweet spot," curveball and knuckleball aerodynamics, gravity and parabolic arcs, and a player's biological reaction time.
