A's players have brought the "Bernie" dance to Oakland as a celebration this season, inspiring a visit by Kiser. Petaluma National Little League: The A's will honor the Petaluma National Little League Team, which finished third in the Little League World Series in South Williamsport, Pa., this Friday before the game. Petaluma's team, along with head coach Eric Smith and his staff, will be honored in a special pre-game on-field ceremony and each Little Leaguer will receive an A's team autographed baseball. The team will take the field with A's players, standing alongside the big leaguers at their positions during the national anthem. The Little Leaguers and their families will watch the game from luxury suites at the Coliseum, courtesy of A's outfielder Jonny Gomes. Petaluma's team went 4-0 to win the West Regional Championship and finished 5-2 in the Little League World Series, finishing in third place. [SEE SEPARATE ADVISORY]

A's Breast Cancer Awareness Day: The A's will host the 14th Annual Breast Cancer Awareness Day Sunday, Sept. 2, as the A's play the Red Sox. A's Breast Cancer Awareness Day is a daylong celebration of survivorship, honoring those who have courageously battled breast cancer. The event raises funds to support research, education, advocacy and free services for cancer patients and their families throughout the Bay Area. Pre-game festivities will begin at 12:40 p.m. with over 500 Bay Area breast cancer survivors forming a symbolic human ribbon on the field and the release of white doves as a symbol of hope. As a part of "A Gift of Faith" grant, the A's will donate \$5,000 in memory of longtime KTVU Channel 2 reporter, the late Faith Fancher, to the Friends of Faith organization. In addition, 10,000 fans attending the game will receive an A's breast cancer awareness pink and white umbrella. Since 1999, the A's have raised over \$1.2 million to help further advance breast cancer education and research.
