A's Post-Game Fireworks Show: A's fans will be invited down to the field after the game Saturday, May 18 to watch a special Star Trek Into Darkness themed fireworks show, presented by XFINITY.

Scout Day: The A's will host their annual Scout Day Sunday, May 19, when Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts of all ages have the opportunity to take part in a pre-game festival, parade around the field and receive a commemorative patch, in addition to receiving a kids beanie giveaway item, sponsored by Ross Dress For Less (distributed to 5,000 kids at the game).

Ross Dress For Less "Mathletics" Program: On Tuesday, May 14 at 1:15 p.m., Jerry Blevins will visit Claremont Middle School in Oakland (5750 College Ave.) as a part of the A's "Mathletics" program. Blevins will participate in an assembly with close to 50 students, featuring a Q&A session and trivia contest.
