Oakland A's PLAY BALL Weekend, Pride Night Set for Upcoming Homestand

OAKLAND, Calif. – On Friday, June 2 the Oakland A's will open a six-game homestand against the Washington Nationals and Toronto Blue Jays. Highlights of the homestand include a pair of giveaways, the celebration of PLAY BALL Weekend and the third annual Pride Night.

On Saturday, June 3, 15,000 fans will receive a Khris Davis bobblehead, presented by XFINITY. The following day, 15,000 fans will receive a PLAY BALL bat/ball set, presented by Chevrolet, as part of the PLAY BALL Weekend.

The A's will celebrate PLAY BALL Weekend June 3 – 4, a league-wide effort by MLB and all 30 Clubs to engage young baseball fans and celebrate the continued support of youth participation in baseball and softball. In addition to the PLAY BALL bat/ball set giveaway, the team will host a baseball game with the Oakland Cal Ripken Baseball League on Saturday, June 3 at Greenman Field and an equipment drive in partnership with the Baseball Tomorrow Fund.

PLAY BALL WEEKEND: The A's will celebrate PLAY BALL Weekend, proudly supported by Chevrolet and Scotts. PLAY BALL is a joint initiative between MLB and USA Baseball. In addition to encouraging participation in both formal and casual baseball activities, PLAY BALL aims to give kids the opportunity to enjoy the game in a fun environment by highlighting the many ways baseball can be played and providing memorable experiences; introduce young people to the sport who otherwise may not have the chance to experience it; and offer healthy and active lifestyle options where many of those opportunities are being offered less frequently.

MLB PITCH HIT AND RUN COMPETITION: This spring, over 650,000 children have participated nationwide in Major League Baseball's free PITCH HIT RUN. Prior to today's game, the top 12 baseball and top 12 softball qualifiers from Northern California and Nevada will compete at Coliseum in hopes of advancing to the National Finals during 2017 Major League Baseball All-Star Week in Miami.

CAL RIPKEN DAY: All uniformed players and coaches that purchase a special ticket for this event will be able to attend a pregame festival and participate in an on-field pregame parade. The event will begin with a pregame rally in B Lot at 10:45 a.m. hosted by Youth Sports Nation and Mr. Community. After the rally, the Cal Ripken Day on-field parade for uniformed players and coaches will begin promptly at noon. This event is open to all Cal Ripken players, as well as coaches, families and friends.

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PLAY BALL WEEKEND BAT AND BALL SET GIVEAWAY: 15,000 fans will receive a PLAY BALL Weekend bat and ball giveaway, presented by Chevrolet.

BASEBALL EQUIPMENT DRIVE: Donate new or used baseball and softball equipment at C Gate, D Gate and the BART Plaza before the game. All donations will benefit the Oakland Cal Ripken Baseball League. This initiative is in partnership with the Baseball Tomorrow Fund.

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TAKE THE FIELD WITH THE A's: The Take the Field with the A's program gives youth baseball and softball teams the chance to live out their Major League dreams. Members of the Rohnert Park Cal Ripken League will join Oakland A's players on the field during the National Anthem.

The program will also include Youth Sports Nation's three pledges: get an education, love my parents and respect my elders.

A's AMIGOS: The A's Amigos program gives our community's bilingual Spanish speaking children from nonprofit organizations the opportunity to interact with bilingual A's players.
