FREE PARKING TUESDAY: All fans will enjoy free parking.

BRAVE GOWN DISTRIBUTION: Oakland A’s players and Stomper will visit patients at Kaiser Permanente Medical Center from 11 a.m. to noon to distribute 200 A’s branded “Brave Gowns,” pass out A’s goodies, and play with kids in the playground. The visit is in partnership with Major League Baseball and is part of the Starlight Children’s Foundation’s “Brave Gowns” program, which replaces unattractive, uncomfortable, and embarrassing hospital gowns with high quality, comfortable gowns for children to wear while undergoing treatment.

The A’s will be the road team for the remainder of the game, which will pick up in the bottom of the seventh inning with the A’s leading 5-3. The regularly scheduled game will begin at 7:07 p.m. or 30 minutes following the completion of the first game.
