DAVE STEWART COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD: A's infielder Tony Kemp has been named the recipient of the 2020 Dave Stewart Community Service Award. Kemp will be recognized on field as the 24th annual award recipient prior to the game on Friday, Sept. 25. The Dave Stewart Community Service Award is given annually to an A's player in recognition of charitable contributions throughout Northern California and across the nation. It was established in 1996 in honor of Stewart's years of community service in the Bay Area. Throughout the years, Stewart has been involved in many nonprofit organizations, including the Oakland Boys & Girls Clubs and Team-Up for Youth.

The Mariners will be the home team for the first game, which is scheduled to begin at 1:10 p.m.; the A's will be the home team for the second game. Both games will be regulation seven-inning games.
